"Who was delivered up for our trespasses, and was raised for our justification." (Romans 4:25)

aster Sunday records the greatest event in the history of the world.

Made alive in the Spirit, Jesus breaks the portals of Hades and opens the way from the dark valley of death to the fair land of life.

The power of death is now broken. The powers of death must surrender also to the body.

That is what happened on Easter Sunday, when the *body* of Jesus was raised from the dead.

This is wonderful.

But the Easter Gospel has a still more glorious message to us who are not only marked by death but are also in ourselves death-sentenced criminals. It proclaims to us that the bodily resurrection of Christ is God's own signature affixed to the letter of pardon which Jesus applied on our behalf.

When God ushered Jesus out through the portals of death and brought forth His body from the tomb, He made it clear to heaven and earth, yes, to hell also, that He had put His seal of approval upon that reconciliation with the race which was effected by the death of Jesus. Therefore the apostle says: "Raised again for our justification."

Here we have Easter's most joyous message: my acquittal papers with God's own signature affixed thereto have been ready and waiting for me since Easter morning. If I stand beneath the cross of Jesus, I can read the charge that was against me; but I can see also that it has been transferred to my Savior's account.

In His open tomb I find again my God-given proof that

Jesus has paid for my sins, and I am free.

Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ Jesus who died, yea rather, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God! Alleluia!

Note: Easter gives us the greatest news we can hear. The greatest news is that Jesus has fully atoned for our sins through His death, and now He defeats the effects that sin brought to the human race. People fear the grave and death and the thought of an unknown eternity. Yet Jesus silences those fears because He has defeated the power of death and the consequent fear that goes along with it. "Since then the children share in flesh and blood, He Himself likewise also partook of the same, that through death He might render powerless him who had the power of death, that is, the devil; and might deliver those who through fear of death were subject to slavery all their lives." (Heb. 2:14-15)

Now anyone who will come to Jesus in repentance and faith can live without the fear of the grave and the question of eternity answered. This is how we can have a sure hope for the future. When people wonder why Christians can be so sure about death and eternity, it is because we know someone who has already been there. Christ points us both to the open grave and the open heaven to say: "Because I live, ye shall live also!" "I am the resurrection and the life: he that believeth in Me, though he were dead, yet shall he live!" "In My Father's house are many mansions: . . . I go to prepare a place for you" (John 14:19; II:25 14:2).

Take your sins and weaknesses, lay them at the foot of the cross, hasten to the open grave, and there you will find newness of life, forgiveness of your transgressions, a fortifying of your faith, and the joy of assured salvation! For Easter is yours for life and death.

Church Discipline

Chs. 5 and 6 (1 Corinthians)(Continued from last issue of the Morning Glory)

The Discipline – Ch. 5:3-8

The Authority – Ch. 5:3, 4

Although absent in the body the apostle has already decided what is to be done. The assembled congregation with the apostolic authority of Paul and in the name of (which means "in the presence of") the Lord Jesus, is to discipline the sinner. We notice here the recognition of the authority of the assembled congregation. With the exception of cases when the Spirit Himself steps in directly as in Acts 5, the authority is vested not in any individual as over and above the rest, but in the communion of saints, the priesthood of believers. This not because of any inherent virtue in them but because of the indwelling presence and power of the living Christ (see Matt. 18:18-20).

The Manner - Ch. 5:5a

The prescribed discipline seems to us very severe. So also the discipline meted out by the Spirit Himself in Acts 5. We are also reminded of God's dealing with Achan in Joshua 7. Sentimentalists, not seeing beyond the immediate welfare of the individual dealt with, will plead for mercy and appeal to the God who is Love. God, however, takes the long view, both in regard to the sinner and the body of which he is a member. Therefore, as we shall see later, the severe punishment. He is to be delivered unto Satan for the destruction of the flesh (Cf. 1 Tim. 1:20). He has yielded his body to sin. Now sin without the restraining grace of God through the means of grace in the church, is to bear its ultimate fruit in that body. Note how real Satan and his kingdom is to the apostle.

The Purpose – Ch. 5b - 8

The purpose, however, is not to get revenge but to save the individual from hell and the church from corruption; "that the spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus." Better that the body be destroyed and the spirit saved as a result of true repentance than to save the body and keep the sinner in his impenitent condition (Cf. Mk. 9:43-48). According to 2 Cor. 2:5-10 we find that this severe treatment was not in vain. It brought about overmuch sorrow. He was there forgiven and reinstated as a member of the church.

The purpose was not only to save that individual's soul but to purge out a leaven which threatened to leaven the whole lump. Leaven is ordinarily used in the Bible as a symbol of sin. Therefore the eating of the unleavened bread at the Passover. This explains the reference to the feast in this connection.

An Explanation – Ch. 5:9-13

The apostle has admonished the Christians not to have fellowship with the sinners as referred to above. This might be misunderstood. As long as the Christian is in the world he cannot escape association with sinners of different types. It was not with reference to sinners in general the apostle wrote. He wrote concerning the fellowship with sinners who claimed to be Christians and yet persisted in their sins. To eat as a brother with such would involve a sanction of their conduct and thus support them in their sins. The outsiders God will judge. In regard to our relation to these an admonition is found in 2 Cor. 6:14-7:1.

Lawsuits - Ch. 6

The principle of love is to govern them. They belong to a body of believers who, by virtue of their high calling, are even to judge the world and angels. ...

In the second place, the courts of that time were heathen, void of any Christian principle. The judges were unbelievers who were "of no account in the church." ...

The Solution – Ch. 6:7

The Christians would, however, not solve the difficulty simply by acknowledging this inconsistency. No, they are to recognize the fact that for a Christian it is in itself inconsistent to have lawsuits with a brother. Not that difficulties may not arise, but if so, Christians ought to be willing to suffer wrong rather than to dishonor the name of God by unbrotherly contentions. *The Christian is not under all conditions to insist on his rights.* If it can further the cause of Christ, better that he suffers loss, he is to be willing to do so. Otherwise he may suffer a greater loss spiritually by his insisting on his rights.

The Warning - Ch. 6:8-11

There is an easy step from fighting for one's own rights to that of overstepping the rights of others, from guarding against being defrauded to defrauding. Therefore, be on guard lest you be found among the unrighteous who thus will forfeit the kingdom. Well for the Christian to keep in mind one's former state in sin and what a glorious privilege one has entered into through Jesus Christ. Having been washed, do not again return to the mire (2 Pet. 2:22).

Memory Verses

"Or know ye not that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit which is in you, which ye have from God? And ye are not your own; for ye were bought with a price: glorify God therefore in your body" 1 Cor. 6:19, 20.

Questions Evolutionists Can't Answer

"The tongue of the wise makes knowledge acceptable, but the mouth of fools spouts folly." (Prov. 15:2)

On February 4, 2014, there was a debate in Kentucky on Creation versus Evolution. Bill Nye, the Science Guy, argued for the Big Bang Theory, which states that everything began with particles of matter and gas coming together. In one big "Bang," everything started into process. After this, the tiniest life forms evolved over billions of years into all the different life forms that we have today. This is the commonly accepted theory today in most schools.

Ken Ham, Director of Answers in Genesis, presented the Creation model from the Book of Genesis. In this model, God created everything out of nothing by the Power of His Word alone. He created the heavens and the earth, plant life, animal life and everything necessary to sustain it. Finally, on the sixth day, He created mankind in His own image. All of these creations were fully developed and ready to begin living and reproducing from the start. God did this in six 24-hour days, just like the days that we have today. Ken argued for a "young earth" creation, where the earth isn't billions of years old, but about 6,000 years old.

After both sides had a time to present their arguments and then a time for rebuttal, the moderator had questions from the audience which he addressed to each of the presenters. Bill Nye was asked, "Where did the particles at the Big Bang come from?" What was the answer from this man who has devoted his whole life to studying science and promoting all of the current scientific theories that are present today? His answer was this: "This is a great mystery. You hit the nail on the head. What was before the Big Bang? . . .This is what compels us to get up and go to work in the morning is to try and solve the mysteries of the universe. We are driven to try to answer this: Where did we come from? What was before the Big Bang?" In others words, he was saying, "I Don't Know."

This is where the people who support the Big Bang Theory run into trouble. They say that in the beginning there was nothing, and then there were particles and gasses that came together for the Big Bang. But where did these particles and gasses come from? They are forced to admit that their own reasoning has painted themselves into a corner. They must be forced to admit that at some point nothing created everything. That's right. Something came from nothing. In fact, if they are truly going to be consistent, this is what they are forced to believe: Nothing, working on nothing, working with nothing, with

no power and no knowledge, created everything that we have today! No wonder Bill said, "I Don't Know." Isn't it amazing that some of the keenest minds can spout forth such folly? Even a child can recognize that something doesn't come from nothing! Ken had no trouble pointing out that the Bible has the answer in the first verse: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." (Gen. 1:1)

Oh, but the fallacy isn't over yet! Bill was also asked, "Does conscience come from matter?" In other words, after the Big Bang supposedly happened, then there must be conscious life coming from matter that is without any life. It is only matter and can't think, reason, decide or do anything on its own. It is dead and lifeless. If evolution is going to work, then at some point dead matter must become life. Bill answered this: "I Don't Know. This is a great mystery. ... The joy of discovery. That is what drives us. We don't know where consciousness comes from, but we want to find out. . . . The nature of consciousness is a mystery I challenge the young people here to investigate that very question." Here he was direct in answering that he doesn't know.

Ken said that there is a book that tells us where life and conscience came from. In Genesis 2:7 it says, "And the Lord God formed man from the dust of the earth, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and man became a living soul." (Gen. 2:7) God created man in His image and this separates them from all the other creation. This is how mankind gets life and conscience.

Even a child knows that you don't get life and conscience from a dead hunk of matter. Go ahead and question a rock or a glass of water about anything and see what kind of a response you get! It is so utterly absurd that you can't even believe that people would consider such a thing. Yet this is what many of the keenest scientific minds today believe! Even harder to believe is that this is the commonly accepted theory today by almost all schools and people of higher learning!

The model that science presents is not a logical nor a working model. It is an empty theory that is full of holes and doesn't even make any sense. The science model turns mankind into an animal that is simply on a higher evolutionary plane. Is it any wonder that when people are taught this, they behave like animals?

The Bible model is the only one that answers every aspect of the world and mankind. God created everything

out of nothing by the Power of His Word. He then brought it into a complete working world with everything in place to support life. He then brought forth life in the earth and nature. The often repeated phrase through Genesis 1 is "they reproduce after their kind." God created full, complete and working plants and animals which had the ability to reproduce right from the start, and to reproduce "after their kind," which means "according to the seed that is in it." Trees reproduce trees and monkeys reproduce monkeys. Monkeys don't reproduce to become men.

This is what separates mankind from all the animal world: We are created in the image of God. This means that we have the ability to think, reason, create and live with a purpose. It also means that we are accountable to God for what He has given to us.

God created Adam and Eve as full, complete people with full re-creative abilities from the start. In fact, in Genesis 4:1, it says "Now the man had relations with his wife Eve, and she conceived and gave birth to Cain, and she said, 'I have gotten a manchild with the help of the Lord. " They didn't need to wait for billions of years for this to develop. Mankind would have died off if they weren't able to reproduce immediately. This is another impossibility of evolution. At some point (in their thinking), a single celled amoeba or plankton had to develop into both male and female species with different reproductive organs. How did these beings continue to reproduce for the millions or billions of years it took for these organs to develop? Or how did they eat and eliminate their waste for all those years that it took to develop a digestive tract? The scientific model is neither logical nor possible.

To the readers who have extended family who are being challenged in school or college about evolution being the correct understanding, they need only ask the instructors these questions for which they have no answer. The Biblical model is the ONLY working model and the only one that makes a lick of sense!

James 5:7 - 12

As far as 'my memory' recalls, I have never ridden in a passenger train; but what IF I had only missed the train leaving by FIVE minutes: WHAT IF??

What IF the LORD laid on my/your heart to 'witness' in spoken *word* and I 'failed' to do so, and that person died the next day! Matthew 4:19.

A couple of definitions of the word **IF** from the dictionary are: 1). A possibility, condition or stipulation, 2). Granting at: *If that is true, what should we do?* USAGE NOTE: In informal writing both <u>IF</u> and <u>WHETHER</u> are standard in their use to introduce a clause indicating uncertainty after a verb such as ask, ...

Some years ago my wife and I had a definite time with which to catch our ride on a specific Airplane and 'our' son was driving their vehicle of transporting 'us' to the Airport and suddenly far out in the rural area there was a large traffic jam caused by an 'accident' a long ways ahead of us. Well by the time we got to the 'airport' time was at a definite premium and thus 'we' tried to run down a long corridor. When we got to the 'air' attendant my 'better-half' asked IF we had missed the plane! "NO, but lady take a deep breath for we don't do CPR's!'

BEFORE <u>you</u> read any further, I request that <u>you</u> first read another article in this issue of the *Morning Glory* titled "What IF." (Right after this editorial)

At times a true 'believer' feels very lonely and longs for Christian Fellowship (and rightly so)! Ecc. 4:10.

Fairly frequently a person hears/reads that you should be a 'salt/light for 'our' Savior: but the BIBLE says YOU are. See Matthew 5:14 -16.

"OUR" Adversary is very good in telling *half-truths*: for example; <u>Genesis 3:1-7</u>, as when He got Eve (first) to stop, look, listen and finally took.

Another subtle example is the statement: 'we are in the world, but not of the world'! Sounds biblical, but you won't actually find such a Bible Verse OR that cleanliness is next to godliness.

Another is: 'He's always there'. NO there can come a time when God gives up on an individual/nation!

Proverbs 1:24 -33, Isaiah 55:6 – 7, Luke 19:41 – 44, Hebrews 2:1 – 3, 3:12 – 15. This is the Hardening of a person's heart!

Even in semi-quoting Scripture, some 'Christians' will

use David as an example in participating in "dancing." Well, please keep it in the 'context' and then notice what the 'results' were, and ask the question: Was God pleased? (See 2 Samuel 6)

Does GOD have a double standard of what is right or wrong; what is well pleasing to Him versus the lusts of the flesh? Deut. 32:3b-4, Psalm 19:7 -11, Prov. 30:5 – 6. YES, there is a 'difference' in sinners saved by GRACE like our growth, development, age in Christ, sensitivity/submission in regards to the leading of the Holy Spirit, back ground, etc. As 'we' water, plant, cultivate in the sowing/growing of the INCORRUPTIBLE WORD OF GOD, He promises 100% germination, as in the parable there are 'four' types of soil. What **IF** you and I don't sow this 'Incorruptible SEED; then what??

Anyway, let's go on: What IF we 'fail' to listen/hear/obey God's WORD? Please read chapter <u>Seven</u> of Matthew.

Actually there are 'followers/disciples' of Jesus Christ who are 'following' Him for the benefits, not as their personal Savior. See John 6:66-71.

What IF you are not at the spiritual battle-front where you ought to be? Martin Luther speaks of those who are not on the 'front lines', such as a fox, hireling and even as a weathervane!

What IF, those that want everything to run <u>smoothly</u> in their own life/congregation/etc.,and feel that it meets with God's whole-hearted approval? <u>GRANTED</u> God wants His children to dwell/work together in harmony. See Ps. 133:1, Ephesians 4:1-3. But many are 'deceived in thinking this is what Jesus' High-priestly prayer means in John 17:21 (HE is requesting that we live in the same "harmony" that He and His Father do). Martin Luther stated "cursed be that love for unity where the Word of God must be at stake." Romans 16:17 – 19, II Thess. 2:1 – 12, Jude 3.

IF we have it right vertically (between us and God); we can most certainly 'fellowship' horizontally; as long as 'we' are IN Christ Jesus! Likely Noah didn't put the elephants and mice in the same area, but they All were in the same ARK!

<u>NOW</u> I want to get to the 'heart' of this *editorial* and clearly state there are definitely many 'believers' who will not agree with 'us' on this *secondary doctrine*; but please let Scripture speak for itself and use Scripture to

interpret Scripture.

YES, there are 'believers' who believe 'once saved, always saved'! (Eternal Security) Is this scripturally sound?

First of all: 'we' do not believe in 'eternal security' in Infant Baptism nor Adult Baptism!! (Though as long as you are IN Christ Jesus, you are eternally secure)!

Those that 'believe' in <u>eternal security</u> will use as an illustration 'once a child always a child'; failing to release that a child can 'die' or 'be dis-owned/dis-inherited'!

As long as you abide/remain IN Christ Jesus, you are eternally 'secure'; but there are so many Bible references that give us the challenge to, *continue*, *in*, *abide*, *remain*; and so many indirect **IF's. NO**, I am not minimizing God's power; but the deceptiveness of our own hearts. See Proverbs14:12, **Jeremiah 17:9**, *castaway* = 1 Corinthians 9:27, *Hebrews 10:35-39*: for example. **Joshua 24:10**, **Jeremiah 17:5**, **12-15**, II Chronicles 7:12-20, Judges 16:20, II Chron. 28:9, Hosea 7:9, Psalm 101:3, Deuteronomy 8:10-9-20, 1 Samuel 7:3, Numbers 32:15, Genesis 4:16, John 13:27, Acts 1:17 & 25, 1 Corinthians 9:25-27, Colossians 1:19, 23; Chapter three of II Timothy, James 5:19 – 20; II Peter 3:16-18, Hebrews 3:6, 12, :8:9, 10:35-39, Revelation 2:5, 3:10, 16-17, 22:19 and *Apostasy/falling away!*

WHAT IF I try to reform, clean myself up before GOD, take my chances, sincerity, etc; Or the statement "IF you have never accepted Christ..." but LIFE has to have a present tense: so what is your relationship with JESUS now? "For though you wash yourself with lye, and use much soap, Yet your iniquity is marked before Me," says

the Lord God." Jeremiah 2:22. (Isaiah 64:6).

IF you have entered the spiritual race/battle but 'quit' before you arrive at the finish line; then what? Hebrews 10:35-39.

What can wash my sins away? I NEED JESUS!

The Lord had said, "I don't do crosses"?


You had not been saved?

"What if" has affected many. Some say, "If only I had not." Others says, "What if I had only?"




My husband has passed away, but I understand that my husband's father ...was one of the last of the Hauge Pastors (likely speaking of the Hauge Synod) in Oregon.

The Prepared Table

"THOU prepares a table before me in the presence of Mine Enemies." (Psalm 23:5)

Someone has suggested seven different positions in this Psalm: underneath me "green pastures," beside me "still waters," with me" the Lord," before me a "prepared table," around me "enemies," behind me "goodness and mercy," above me "the house of the Lord." ...

We repeat that the prepared table does not mean that you have to move into the banqueting house. The Hebrew word translated "table' means "spread out." I remember some of the old Pennsylvania Dutch picnics which I was privileged to enjoy as a boy. Several families would go to some grove where they would spread out several white tablecloths on the grass, and then place upon them fried chicken, pickled eggs, and all the other good things to eat. I stood around with my hands in my pockets, and literally had a table prepared before me, only in this case in the presence of my friends.

The pasture of the sheep is something "spread out." It is literally prepared in the presence of the enemies of the sheep. There are many poisonous plants in Palestine which endanger the life of the sheep. I read of one shepherd who lost three hundred sheep because of the little poisonous plants that grew in the pastures into which he led the flock. The shepherd must survey the pasture very carefully. He would use his staff to dig out or grub out the poisonous plants.

There are snake holes in some kinds of ground, or holes that moles have made just beneath the surface, in which snakes lie with their heads sticking out. As the sheep feed, the snakes, many of which are poisonous, bite the noses of the sheep. Death may result to a sheep within thirty minutes.

The land of Palestine is very mountainous and rocky. In the dens and caves lurk lions, and bears, and jackals, and hyenas, and panthers, and other wild beasts ready to spring upon the sheep. You can see from this that when a shepherd led his flock into a safe pasture, he literally prepared the table before them in the presence of their enemies.

APPLICATION

David had many enemies. When Saul hunted him like a partridge in the mountains, God prepared a table for him. On one occasion that table was the table of showbread from which he ate. In the cave of Adullam God spread a table for him and his four hundred faithful followers. David was a man of blood. He engaged in many wars with

his enemies and the enemies of his people, but God always provided for him and his followers a table.

In the wilderness God furnished a table for His people. Elijah had enemies. One of them was Jezebel, and when he fled in fear from his enemy and slept the sleep of exhaustion under the juniper tree, when he awoke an angel had brought a baked cake and a cruse of water that he might eat and drink. When famine stalked the streets of Samaria, in one day God set a table for the entire city out of the tents of the Syrians. After our Lord vanquished the enemy in the wilderness, angels came and ministered unto Him.

Even so today the Lord gives us our daily bread. All of our food is the gift of God. We never cease to wonder at the miracle of the food we eat. Bread is from heaven. Men may build skyscrapers, or cities, or even empires, but no man can build one single grain for wheat. But one grain of wheat will not make Bread! It must be planted in the soil. Men cannot make soil. They can modify it, but not make it. But a perfect seed in perfect soil is not sufficient! There must be moisture, heat and light. God must send these. All vegetation is of God. Take it away from the earth and you will take life from the earth. God spreads our table, and does it with abundance. ...

Men talk about food shortage today. If there is such, it is not because of failure on God's part. The earth is rich and fruitful. It responds with bountiful harvest to the industry of men. ...

So God prepares a table before us in the presence of our enemies – and the Christian has enemies. If not, he is not like his Savior Who said, "If the world hate Me it will hate you also." If we are without enemies, we might fear that we are the enemies of God. Friendship with the world is enmity with God.

COMMUNION

Spiritually, a table speaks of communion, or fellowship. We fellowship with God in prayer. What an illustration of such communion we have in that sheep of God named Daniel. Daniel was true to God. He was only a lad when he was carried into captivity, and yet he believed in his God and determined that he would be true to Him no matter what the outcome might be. He was chosen as a candidate for a position in the king's palace that meant honor and wealth. These candidates were put at a training table which was furnished with meat and wine from the king's own table. Daniel was a Jew and so was under a dietary law. There were certain foods and drinks of which he could not partake without breaking the law of God. For example, he could not eat swine's flesh, or meat that had been offered to idols, or flesh that had not been drained of blood. He could not drink wine that had been poured out

as a libation to some pagan deity. ...

"We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in the heavenlies."

These enemies face us today as we sit at this prepared Table. These foes did not vanish when we were saved. The flesh will war against us as long as we are in the flesh; the world will war against us as long as we are in the world; the hosts of Satan will war against us as long as they are free: yet, we have in this Table a promise of strength and support so that we need have no fear.

John Bunyan pictured Christian on the way to the Porter's Lodge. Christian saw two lions on the road. He was terrified with the sight, and half-minded to turn back, but then he plucked up courage and pressed forward. He kept on the straight way, and he found that the lions could not reach him. They could roar at him, but they could do no harm for they were chained. The death of Christ has chained our enemies. If we walk the straight path, they can do us no harm. God supplies us with strength to rise above all of our temptations. He imports grace to us so that we may have the world, the flesh, and the Devil beneath our feet.

No, gather your thoughts about the Word as you read. And thank God for the eternal truths which have coursed through your soul. The Spirit will see to it that the Word does its work within you, even though you do not always know what it works.

ISRAELI JETS ATTACK SYRIAN WEAPONS

Almost no attention was given by the media of an Israeli attack on a shipment of advanced missiles that Syria was transferring to Hezbollah, according to Kuwaiti newspaper Al Jareeda. The October 22 (2013) attack was the fifth known Israeli attack this year on Syrian weapons bound for Hezbollah. An official source in Jerusalem confirmed the attack took place but did not say where. The missiles were reportedly "long-range and accurate ones."

A few days later Israel also attacked a Russian airbase located on Syria's southern coast. The attack from the sea took out a surface-to-air missile battery supporting vehicles and structures.

HONK IF YOU NEED ME

Geese are a good illustration of how to help others during the rough times of life. When geese fly, they do so in a V formation. As the bird flaps its wings, it makes flying easier for the bird behind it by creating an uplift of air.

Flying in this way allows the flock to add seventy percent more distance to its range. These birds fly hundreds and even thousands of miles this way. Every so often the leader falls back, and another bird takes over the lead. Flying at the front takes the greatest strength; the further back you go, the easier it is because of the decreased wind resistance.

The birds keep trading off, thus sharing the work. Which geese do you her honking? It is not the leader as you might think. The ones in the back honk to encourage the leaders up front to keep going because they are doing the hardest work.

When the leader gets tired, it finally rotates back in the formation. Another goose then flies point. As a team, they take turns sharing the work. All are needed, and each one is important to the group. One goose simply cannot make the trip alone; he needs others to help him. They continually honk to help the leaders to keep up the speed.

Honking also reminds others that help is available when it is needed. If one becomes ill and has to drop out, it honks differently. As it falls behind, two others will follow it down to protect it until it recovers. Later the three take off and form their own V until they rejoin the group.

The geese cooperate with, encourage, support, and protect one another. They help as they honk. All are aware of the honk for help. They serve as a team –"Together Everyone Accomplishes More!"

Geese are a good example for Christians and our churches to follow. If Christians would stay within formation serving one another, every need in the (Ed. Biblical) church would be met. We should help when others honk. We should also honk when we need help.

We need to stay together so we can encourage and uplift one another, as the geese do. Likewise, when one is sick, weak or straying, we should seek to restore him. No one should suffer alone.

When leaders get tired and weary, others should honk to encourage them to keep going. Like the geese, we should honk to encourage and help one another in times of need.

Carlene (my wife) and I hiked the Grand Canyon. She had no problem going down, but the next day going up was very hard for her. The air was thin, and the climb was steep. She finally made the odd sound of "Honk, honk!" She remembered the story of the geese. I then encouraged and helped her. Together we finally made it to the top. At times we still honk to each other.

There are times you need to honk for help from the Lord (1 Pet. 5:7). Also, when you hear someone else honk, you should respond and help.

Notice geese do not fly alone because they know they need to help one another. Notice how the geese often honk as they fly overhead. You hear them before you see them.

We need to be like the geese and be aware of a honk for help. When you face difficulties, honk. Your family, friends, others, and your church can respond and help. Remember, you are not alone! So, like the geese, don't forget to honk when you need help. Sword of the Lord.



No sooner had the students moved into the new Newman Center at Troy University that staff attorney for the Freedom From Religion Foundation, Andrew L. Seidel, fired off a letter to Troy University stating that the faith-based housing was "a constitutional concern" and one that violates the Fair Housing Act.

The Freedom From Religion Foundation, based in Madison, Wisconsin, has become a major player in efforts to rid the nation of any public acknowledgments of God and Christianity. They had filed lawsuits and Amicus briefs with the local, state and federal courts dealing with any number of efforts to ban prayer and Christianity from public life. They are, in fact, involved in the present issue before the Supreme Court that would ban prayers from government meetings.

Other lawsuits the FFRF has filed include the removal of "In God We Trust" from our currency; asking the court to prevent Governor Rick Perry from participating in a prayer rally he initiated in Houston; asking the court to force the school board in Jackson, Ohio to remove a picture of Jesus; and the list goes on and on and on.

Viewing the FFRF web site makes clear they are out not only to remove Christianity from the nation's public life, but also to promote atheism. The sign shown here (In this article, the 'heading') is a sample of their efforts to attack and degrade Christianity.


