The First Lay Witnesses in Norway 1708 - 1796

es, our people have been taught the living truth for 200 years, but how few have responded! The dead historical Christianity has been and still is prevalent. And how have the living witnesses been received?

The first living lay witnesses who came to Norway, that we know of, were two young spiritual men, Hammer and Funch - in 1706.

They came to Oslo and neighboring parishes and towns. They preached repentance; they preached life - in power and in the Holy Spirit. They preached against formalism and ritualism. The ministers soon called them in for examination and found some 15 wrong doctrines in their preaching, and had them chased out of Norway.

On October 2, 1706, they issued a law against the so-called "peculiar ones." They should never be tolerated. They were much more afraid of them than of the devil himself. But a few souls had been awakened to life in God.

God now raised up a few pietistic and living ministers – Anders Hoff, Johannes Gren and in the northern part Thomas von Westen. The living Christians would come long distances to hear them preach the living Truth from experience. Revivals followed and soon a number of lay witnesses appeared again, notably Nils Monich, Gert Hansen, and an unmarried lady, named "Jomfru Freymann," whose great-grandfather had died for his faith in Prague. So the voice of the turtle-dove was heard in the land and sinners were called to repentance. But the dead preachers got busy again and through the government issued a new ordinance not to forbid but strongly to regulate all lay-preaching. This was in 1741. "Let us not forbid, but let us control and regulate this new movement," because of the watchword of the ordained ministers. However, Jomfru Freymann and many Christians were led to prison through the streets of Oslo, while the mob laughed, scorned and sneered.

But now the heavy fog of infidelity and rationalism in addition to dead orthodoxy was creeping slowly from England and France and into Germany and up through Denmark, Sweden and Norway. It came mostly through the universities. God's own Word was tested by the human reason. Higher criticism, higher education, human enlightenment was to take the place of God's living truth. A cold and dark night was ushered in and settled down upon our people until 1796.

Hans Nielsen Hauge – the Father of Lay Activity and the Spiritual Life Movement Among the Norwegians in Norway and America

To describe the life of this great apostle of repentance and Christian testimony, about whom so many books have been written, cannot now be done. He was a great gift from heaven to the Norse people. He was born April 3, 1771, in the Tune parish, southeast of Oslo. The outstanding day for himself, for lay activity and Norse Church history was April 5, 1796, when out in the field, after a long spiritual struggle, he was born again, set free and filled with the Holy Spirit. He received the call from heaven to confess the name of Christ at all occasions and call sinners to repentance. The glory of God filled his soul for some three weeks in such a way that he hardly felt the need of eating, drinking or even sleeping - only a couple of hours a night, and people thought he was going crazy.

Then came a new fight. Then the testing. Then the fiery darts of the devil – while God pressed on with the high calling. "O, send someone else!" he cried. "Send a profes-

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sor! Send a bishop! How can I, a young ignorant farmer, go out preaching the Gospel? Let me die!" But God whispered: "Will you now die? Before you served sin. I have saved you from sin. Should you not serve me now?" So the call stood forth plain and big as a cloudless moon and Hauge was sent out by the Holy Ghost - out and out and out, through the length and breadth of Norway with a burning message from a burning heart: Repent ye, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

To sum it all up: From April 5, 1796, to his long imprisonment which began October 24, 1804, Hauge found a wonderful outlet for the spiritual power God had given Him. He went from house to house, from parish to parish, from one end of the country to another, preaching the living Truth. The 600 churches of Norway were there to be sure, and everybody was a church member. There was organization, but no life, no power. Now the Gospel was preached from experience and in living power. Not in a single church would Hauge be permitted to preach or was ever permitted. No, not one. But outside the churches after services, in market places, in high-ways and by-ways, in private houses, doing personal work, along the roads as he traveled, he went on in his most wonderful, soul-saving career. I doubt if he ever held a meeting, unless it led to the conversion of one or more souls.

But the progress he did make, he made on his knees. (To be continued)

Treacherous Thorns

"As for what was sown among the thorns, this is he who hears the word but the cares of the world, and the delight in riches choke the word and it proves unfruitful" Matthew 13:22.

Poverty and riches can be effective thorns to choke the good seed. But when these become thorns they are most effective when riches and pleasure take the place of poverty in a person's life.

A young man was earnest and God-fearing as long as his possessions were meager. Later he was thrust into a new world of temporal goods and business affairs. Soon it became impossible to identify him as the God-fearing man he once was.

A converted teacher became a lay-preacher in the church while his material possessions were scanty. He labored in season and out of season for the welfare of souls. Gradually his income increased. He came to possess a temporal fortune. But his heart was entranced by this fortune. His preaching became a repetition of his former meditations, and his concern for his flock waned.

Many similar examples could be related. Suffice this to show that the enticements and cares of riches can choke the Good Seed.

RISEN WITH CHRIST

"If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God." Colossians 3:1

The wise believer revels in the fact of Christ's resurrection. Some things in Scripture may be easier to identify with and apply, including Christ's substitutionary death, but it is the resurrection which gives us power to live victoriously. *"Like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life"* Romans 6:4.

We have been "crucified with him, that the body of sin might be destroyed" Romans 6:6. Nevertheless, we are risen with Him, as our text and elsewhere (Romans 6; Ephesians 2:1-10; etc) clearly teaches. This resurrection is an inward one, of course, but our bodily resurrection is also guaranteed by Christ's bodily resurrection, should we physically die. "Knowing that he which raised up the Lord Jesus shall raise up us also by Jesus" 2 Corinthians 4:14.

Power to serve Him effectively comes through His resurrection, for we have access to the "exceeding greatness of his power to us-ward who believe, according to the working of his mighty power. Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead" Ephesians 1:19-20. We have authority over all human and demonic institutions through Him who even now operates as head of the living church of His followers.

Lutherans Share the Faith of Abraham

The Law and works do not justify, and yet the Law is to be taught, and works are to be taught and done, that we may understand our misery and may the more eagerly embrace grace.

This theology was not born with us, as those blasphemers, the papists, clamor. It was neither thought up nor invented by us. The Holy Paul transmits it and cites Moses as a witness for it – Moses, who says that Abraham believed God and that this was counted unto him for righteousness, that is, Abraham was accounted just because God had mercy on him when he believed the promise. But now every promise of God includes Christ, for without this Mediator God has nothing to do with us.

The difference, then, between the faith of Abraham and our faith is none other than this: Abraham believed in the Christ to come, while we believe in the Christ who has already come. By this faith all of us are saved.

When "Lutheran" Dare Not Be Denied

It is true that you should never say: I am Lutheran or popish; for neither of them died for you; neither is your master. Only of Christ may this be said. Therefore you should profess to be a Christian. But if you believe that Luther's doctrine is evangelical and the pope's unevangelical, you must not flatly disown Luther; otherwise you also disown his doctrine, which you admittedly recognize as the doctrine of Christ. Rather you must say: Whether Luther personally is a scoundrel or a saint means nothing to me. His doctrine, however, is not his but Christ's own. For you see that the object of the tyrants is not only to slay Luther but also to extirpate the doctrine. They lay hands on you because of the doctrine, and for this reason they ask you whether you are Lutheran. Truly, here you should not speak in a weak whisper but should freely confess Christ, whether Luther, Nicholas, or George preached Him. Let the person go. But the doctrine you must confess.

Clouds and Rainbows

"It shall come to pass, when I bring a cloud over the earth, that the bow shall be seen in the cloud." Gen. 9:14.

God has given almost everything a tongue. The rising in the morning speaks to us of "*the Sun of righteousness* ... *with healing in His wings*" (Mal. 4:2). The stars in the heavens point to the Star of Bethlehem. The winds whisper to us of the work of the Spirit. The darkness of the night utters its gloomy prophecy of the sinner's doom.

The house in which we live reminds us of the "*house not made with hands*" (II Cor. 5:1), and the door through which we enter it tells of Him through whom we must enter the heavenly Home (John 10:9). The bread we eat and the water we drink preach to us of Him who is the Bread and Water of Life.

The flowers point to the Rose of Sharon and the Lily of the Valley. The clothes we wear suggest the robe of righteousness which we may have for the asking. The sparrow in the bush twitters to us of the care of our Heavenly Father. The sheep in the meadow remind us of Him who is the Good Shepherd who careth for the sheep (John 10:11).

To all in whose memory the destruction of the world by water was fresh, the appearance of a cloud would portend evil. While the cloud thus spoke to them of sin and death, God chose another preacher to proclaim at the same time His goodness and mercy. On the dark background of wrath, He paints for us a beautiful picture of loving-kindness. *"It shall come to pass, when I bring a cloud over the earth, that the bow shall be seen in the cloud,"* that their fear might give place to hope.

This is a world of clouds, but to the eye of faith, there is a bow on every cloud. It is my purpose now to look with you at these bows of promise.

1. SIN IS A CLOUD, BUT THERE IS A BOW OF **PROMISE UPON ORIGINAL SIN** "As in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive." 1 Cor. 15:22.

The sin we inherited from Adam is all atoned for by the death of Christ, without faith on our part. The infant that dies goes to Heaven because the death it has received from Adam is removed by the death of Christ. *(Editor:* I am not <u>so sure</u> without Infant Baptism: I'll leave that in the hands of our Sovereign, Almighty God – we are instructed to 'baptize''). In Christ, it is made alive to the same extent that it died in Adam.

We cannot be lost for Adam's sin. (*Editor:* We are born sinners as ALL means ALL and that includes everyone!) Christ is *"the true Light, which lighteth every man that com-* *eth into the world*" (John 1:9). Every mother who has laid away her child is permitted to gaze with delight upon this bow of promise on the cloud of her bereavement. David saw it when he said, *I shall go to him, but he shall not return to me*." II Sam. 12:23.

The darkest of all clouds, however, is that of our own sins. But it is spanned by a bow of brightest promise; and, as in the rainbow, there are seven colors blending into each other. I see on the cloud of my sins seven promises which blend into one and make such a bow of beauty as only God's hand can paint.**Color of Forgiveness**

"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins ... "1 John 1:9."

Guilt is a cloud, black as night. Confess it to God, and at once His forgiveness shines upon you. No formal prayer is demanded. Confession is the best sort of praying. It implies faith and penitence. A simple confession of a fault by your child without any prayer for pardon would make you hasten to forgive. And this forgiveness comes only through Christ.

"Him hath God exalted...to give...forgiveness of sins." "Through this man is preached to you the forgiveness of sins." Acts 5:31, 13:38.

Trying to atone for your sins by your penance only adds blackness to the cloud.

2. Color of Cleansing

"The blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin." 1 John 1:7.

Sin defiles. It pollutes the soul. If we could be forgiven without cleansing, we would be unfit for association with the pure in Heaven. Though forgiven and cleansed, the fact remains that we have once been guilty and defiled; but we are justified through Christ. We are to be treated now as if we had never sinned. In God's eyes, we are pure. We have been made *"the righteousness of God in him"* II Cor. 5:21.

This is a color, bright indeed, on the dark cloud of sin's guilt and defilement. And yet the color grows brighter.

3. Sin Covered Ocean-Deep

"Thou wilt cast all their sins into the depths of the sea." Mic. 7:19.

On the surface and in the shallows, the ocean is turbulent; and in the shallows it may cast up mire and dirt. But there are depths which are never disturbed by any storm, into these depths, our sins have been cast by the pierced hand of Christ, and they will never be thrown up to condemn us for *"there is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus"* Rom. 8:1.

A brighter color still is the fact that the very depths into which our sins are cast are:

4. Infinitely Removed From Us

"As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us." Ps. 103:12.

The east and the west can never be brought together. No more can the sins of a believer be brought against him.

5. Our Sins Are Blotted Out

"I have blotted out, as a thick cloud, thy transgressions, and, as a cloud, thy sins." Isa. 44:22

In Heaven, there is no cloud; only the rainbow remains. Sin is forever gone. Holiness reigns.

6. Our Sins Are Not to Be Mentioned to Us

"All his transgressions that he hath committed, they shall not be mentioned unto him." Ezek. 18:22.

Pardoned criminals not infrequently have their crimes thrown up at them. Their enemies may delight in reminding them that, though pardoned now, they have nevertheless committed crime. Not so when God has forgiven. He will never mention our sins!

Brightest of all is the promise that

7. Our Sins Will Be Forgotten

"I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more." Jer. 31:34.

He who knows all things chooses to forget the sins that have been washed away by the blood of Christ. The cup of cold water given to a disciple in His name, He will not forget; but the greatest ever committed, when it has been covered by the merit of Christ, passes out of the memory of God.

Our sins forgiven, cleansed, covered ocean-deep, infinitely removed, blotted out, not to be mentioned, forgotten!

All through Jesus Christ! What a bow of promise with its seven colors upon the blackest cloud of sin!

II. TEMPTATION IS ANOTHER CLOUD HANGING OVER MANY

After we have been born again, there remains with us the flesh which must be crucified; and it dies hard. Many a man's constant liability to sin is the grief of his life. His consciousness of weakness oppresses him. Tomorrow is a cloud, because he knows it will bring temptations which he may not be strong enough to bear. Well, there is a seven-colored bow of promise on this cloud also.

1. God Will, If It Is Best for Us, Keep Us From Temptation

"I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation." Rev. 3:10.

If He knows that the temptation is more than we can bear, He will certainly keep us from it, if we ask Him in faith.

2. If God Allows Us to Fall Into Temptation, He Will Deliver Us From It

"The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations." 11 Pet. 2:9.

"God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape." 1 Cor. 10:13.

3. He Has Delivered Thousands of Others Tempted As We Are

"There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man." 1 Cor. 10:13.

Take courage. Your case is not peculiar. Others have been tempted as you are, and they have been delivered. So will you be.

4. Jesus Sympathizes With the Tempted

"He himself hath suffered being tempted." Heb. 2:18.

He suffered not only on the cross, but in temptation, sinless as He was. Let our suffering in the same way draw us very close to Him.

5. Christ's Temptations Were the Same As Ours

"In all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin." Heb. 4:15.

Universally tempted He was – so that, even as a Man, He knows our case thoroughly and can help us.

6. Temptations, Resisted and Overcome, Develop Character

"My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations;

"knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience." Jas. 1:2-3.

7. Tempted Have Joys Others Cannot Experience

"Blessed is the man that endureth temptation." Jas. 1:12.

There can be no victory without struggle. And the joy of victory is in proportion to the intensity of the struggle.

Let us thank God for the temptations which yield us such when we have overcome them. Look, ye tempted, from the clouds of your weaknesses and failures to this bow of promise. Every promise of God is yea and amen (II Cor. 2:20). The God of the promise is able to fulfill it. Cease gazing at the cloud; gaze at the rainbow upon it.

III. SORROWS MAKES A VERY DARK CLOUD IN MANY LIVES

Adversity takes away money. Death takes away our loved ones. Disease takes away our health. Our friends forsake us, because they feel that they cannot afford to follow us into our changed surroundings. Responsibilities, which it seems we have not strength to bear, press upon us.

Is there a bow of promise for such a cloud? There is, and here is the promise that makes it: *My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness*" (II Cor. 12:9).

Paul prayed to be delivered from his thorn in the flesh. God answered his prayer by doing what He knew was best for Paul. He left the thorn and gave him grace to bear it.

God delivers from some things, and not others. He may

not see fit to bring the vessel into harbor, but with His hand on the rudder, He will guide it through the storm. "*Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee*" (Ps. 55:22).

He does not promise to bear all the weight of every burden, for He knows that burden bearing is what we need to give us solidity of character. But He will "sustain." He will not let its weight crush us. On the contrary, it lays up treasures for the future. "Our light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory" (II Cor. 4:17).

Indeed, we may put into one cloud, black as night, all the clouds of earth, and here is a bow of promise for it: *"All things work together for good to them that love God"* (Rom. 8:28). Can you think of a cloud not included among the "all things" of this text?

A life with clouds may be very beautiful. To a traveler in the mountains, cloudless skies are not the most attractive. When he watches the sunset, he is disappointed unless he looks upon the clouds painted in all the colors of the rainbow.

Cloudless lives are not the most beautiful. A life with clouds of struggle and sorrow, all lighted up with the rays from the sun of Righteousness, far excels in beauty any sunset ever seen. The spray thrown up by the rushing torrent of Niagara greatly adds to the beauty of the Falls, because the sun paints rainbows upon it. And so, lives with Niagara-like torrents of struggle are the more beautiful for the clouds raised by such struggle, if they are flooded with light from Heaven.

Clouds with rainbows upon them give refreshment and fertility. There is one place where clouds are never seen, and that is the desert of Sahara. Desolation and death are twin monarchs there. We see nothing but clouds of dust, and on such clouds, raised by our own feet, rainbows do not appear.

Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkedness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy. Islamic Countries Dominate World Watch List

Despite communist North Korea topping the annual Open Doors World Watch List (WWL) for the ninth consecutive year, the most dangerous countries in which to practice Christianity are overwhelmingly Islamic ones.

Of the top 10 countries on the 2011 WWL, eight have Islamic majorities. Persecution has increased in seven of them. They are Iran, which clamps down on a growing (Christian) movement; Afghanistan, where thousands of believers cluster deep underground; and Saudi Arabia, which still refuses to allow any Saudi person to convert to Christianity. Others are lawless Somalia, ruled by blood thirsty terrorists threatening to kill Christian aid workers who feed Somalia's starving, impoverished people; tiny Maldives, which mistakenly boasts it is 100 percent Islamic; Yemen, with its determination to expel all Christian workers; and Iraq, which saw extremists massacre 58 Christians ...on October 31. Of the top 30 countries, only seven have a source other than Islamic extremists as the main persecutors of Christians ...

The annual World Watch List is compiled by the research department of Open Doors International. It tracks the shifting conditions under which Christians live in 77 societies and then ranks the top 50 where it is hardest to practice the Christian faith.

The country that saw the greatest deterioration of Christian religious freedom in the reporting period from November 1, 2009 through October 31, 2010, was Iraq, jumping from No. 17 to No. 8...

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Question - Answered

Is It All Right to Take Liquor for a Cold?

First, it is silly for anybody to take alcoholic liquor for a cold. Liquor is not good medicine, and very few reputable doctors would recommend liquor for medicine in any case; and I do not know of a single one that thinks alcoholic drink has any virtue at all in the treatment of a cold.

A cold is a respiratory infection. Certain antibiotic drugs prepare the body to throw off the infection better. But alcohol leaves an acid reaction which would be harmful instead of helpful. Certain other drugs tend to keep the nasal passages open and relieve the symptoms of a cold. One who takes any kind of alcoholic drink for a cold simply seeks an excuse.

From the Bible viewpoint, one is not justified in keeping alcoholic liquor in the home or drinking it. The Scripture says, "Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise." Prov. 20:1.

Again, the Scripture says, "Look not thou upon the wine when it is red, when it giveth his colour in the cup, when it moveth itself aright." Prov. 23:31.

Again, anyone who drinks liquor is likely to be enslaved by it. And 1 Corinthians 6:10 plainly says, "Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God."

The drunkard is not to inherit the kingdom of God. Alcoholic beverages are not good for well people, and they are not good for sick people.

Is It All Right to Drink If You Do It in Moderation?

A moderate drinker is the only one a drunkard is made out of; a total abstainer never turns out to be a drunkard. Anything that is certain to ruin about one person out of nine that start it surely is a sin; and if you take even a little liquor and so encourage someone else to drink who will be ruined in body and mind and soul by it, then surely you would be accountable to God for the ruin of that one.

You say that someone argued, "Christ drank fermented wine at the Last Supper." Of course, the poor ignorant man knows nothing about it and probably doesn't want to know.

The Bible says nothing about Jesus' taking wine at the Last Supper. The Scripture says, "And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it." Matt. 26:27.

And the only time the Lord's Supper is mentioned in the Bible, the liquid is called "the cup" or "the fruit of the vine." I think it is obvious that Jesus would not have a certain thing written in the Bible and then go against it Himself.

GPS or GGS (God's Guidance System)

On autumn nights as we sleep peacefully in our beds, millions of songbirds are quietly traveling under cover of darkness, heading south for warmer climates. Take Baltimore orioles, for example. Every fall, they pack their bags, close up their homes, leave the key under the mat and, like senior citizens, head south. It's the weather patterns that tell the birds that it is time to move.

"As cold fronts move across eastern North America," wrote one expert, "they're sending waves of orioles, along the warblers and other songbirds, on their way to wintering grounds in Mexico and Latin America." As cold fronts pass, clear skies and north winds usually follow. These conditions are ideal for migration, allowing the birds to travel with no risk of storms, the wind at their backs and a clear view of the stars to help them find their way.

They fly over thousands of houses and highways, shopping centers and parking lots, passing state after state. If a particular oriole opts for a direct flight home, it will fly over the Gulf of Mexico in a single night, crossing six hundred miles of open water.

The entire trip from Baltimore (for example) to Mexico, Panama or Costa Rica takes about two weeks. But the oriole knows exactly where it is going. God planted within its little brain a perfect guidance system that tells it exactly where to go and when and how.

The Bible says that we are more valuable to the Lord than all the birds in the sky. We are worth more than many sparrows. If the Lord is pleased to guide the birds in their migrations, it's a safe bet that He also wants to guide our lives.

He who from zone to zone Guides through the boundless sky thy certain flight, In the long way that I must tread alone Will lead my steps aright!
