Why Atheism is Growing Among Generation Z—and What We Can Do About It.

HE WORLD, THE FLESH, AND THE DEVIL ARE DOING THEIR BEST TO CONCOCT A RECIPE FOR THE REJECTION OF THE REDEEMER—AND IT'S POISONING A NEW GENERATION.

RULED BY EMOTIONS, GENERATION Z (Gen Z) is MADE UP OF INDIVIDUALS born between 1999 and 2015, is the most nonreligious generation in America yet, according to Barna's new study of teens 13-18 years old. While the trends are not necessarily stunning — given this age of anything goes, Lady Gaga, and dozens of new gender pronouns—they are alarming. These young people are our children, our grandchildren, and their peers. They are critiquing the church more than any generation before—and we need to understand why.

"The percentage of Gen Z that identifies as atheist is double that of the U.S. adult population – Barna"

Gen Z is growing up in a culture that values emotions over facts. They have become comfortable with the message of relativism so often preached by our culture—a message that values tolerance over Truth. What matters more to this generation is honesty and authenticity.

They trust their heart, which is "deceitful above all things" (Jeremiah 17:9). And they are embracing atheism more than any other generation in history.

While it's tempting to respond to these findings with the old dictum "Kids these days...", we must realize that before God opened our eyes, we were just as lost. Equipped with God's wisdom, compassion, and love, we can reach this growing mission field and lead them in the Truth of Christ.

ENGAGING GENERATION Z

It's easy to see that our society is not training the next generation to think critically. How could they when our culture no longer values Truth? But, according to our youth, the church isn't doing any better. Here are some critiques offered by churchgoing teens today:

49% say "the church seems to reject much of what science tells us about the world."

38 % believe "the church is overprotective of teenagers."

27% claim "the church is not a safe place to express doubts."

24% find church teachings to be "rather shallow."

Far from being offended, we must learn from these findings. We can't dismiss our youth and expect them to respect us for it. We must engage them and their questions.

3 CRITICAL QUESTIONS

When I first read these new statistics, the information was interesting—but it didn't hit home for me until I realized two of my own children fall in the Gen Z age group. Though my kids are not yet teens, this group represents the trends of their peers. Am I leaving the next generation and the next-next generation to be raised by their surrounding culture—or by the wisdom of God?

Here are some important questions to ask ourselves:

1. Are we too busy to be bothered?

Our lives are filled with devices, work, sports, lessons, time with friends, and a little sleep thrown in if all goes according to plan. It's easy to fall into a rhythm of just checking the boxes, neglecting the best thing while trying to

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ensure the good, but not needful, things are accomplished. It's time to look up—to relate—to listen intently and speak wisely.

2. Are we modeling for the next generation how to pursue Truth?

When our children or grandchildren ask difficult questions, it can be convenient to sweep them away. But this kind of attitude often communicates that we are afraid of how Scripture will hold up under scrutiny. It gives the impression that we are not confident in the Word of God—and maybe even ashamed of His Gospel.

3. Do we act as though God is boring?

When God is not our focus and delight, we are telling Gen Z that they are right—God is boring. Yet He is anything but! Are we captivated by His goodness or distracted by earthly pursuits? Are we trusting God to do the impossible in our lives—or are our lives as ordinary and mundane as the nonbeliever?

WE HAVE WORK TO DO

What can we, God's church, do to counteract the trends that Barna has brought before us? We can:

Read and relish God's Word.

Pray and dig deep into our faith.

Serve and engage the next generation, reaching out in love and hospitality whether in our neighborhoods, churches, or larger communities. We must allow God to work through us by living intentionally for Him. As we delight in Almighty God, worshiping Him, growing in faith, and proclaiming His Truth, He will soften hearts and draw Gen Z into His Kingdom.

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Persevering with Peace

I lie down and sleep; I wake again because the LORD sustains me. V. 5 — Please read all of Psalm 3

As I continue trusting God through my struggles with chronic pain even the simplest setback can feel like a fierce enemy attacker. Problem One jabs me from the right. Problem Two shoves me from behind. Problem Three punches me square in the nose. During these times, when my strength wanes and immediate relief evades me, running and hiding can seem like a good idea. But since I can't escape my pain, change my circumstances, or ignore my emotions, I'm learning slowly to rely on God to carry me through.

When I need encouragement, comfort, and courage, I prayerfully read through the songs of the psalmists, who honestly bring their situations to God. In one of my favorite psalms, King David flees from Absalom, his son who wanted to kill him and take his kingdom. Though David lamented his painful situation (Psalm 3:1-2), he trusted God's protection and expected Him to answer his prayers (vv. 3-4). The king didn't lose sleep worrying or fearing what could happen because he trusted God to sustain and save him (vv. 5-8).

Physical and emotional pain can often feel like aggressive adversaries we may be tempted to give up or wish we could escape when we're weary and can't see the end of our current battle. But, like David, we can learn to trust that God will hold us up and help us rest in His constant and loving presence.

Lord, thanks for giving us rest in the peace of your constant presence and assuring us of the victory you've already won.

God offers us peace as He holds us up and carries us through every trial.

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This Graduation Letter from the 1930's Would be Banned from Schools Today

A Yearbook from 1936 was discovered while cleaning an attic. The Graduation Address from that year will

blow you away.

The man who discovered it, Hank Wallace, explained that he was sorting through his late mother's estate when he came across it.

He gave a quick snapshot of what the world then looked like at the time before sharing the address itself.

In 1936, things were changing quickly. A picture of the principal of the school in the yearbook shows a black telephone on his desk, certainly a status symbol of the day. The Depression was wearing on, with New Deal socialism widely welcomed. Hitler was chancellor of Germany, and the Dachau concentration camp was open, both for over three years. Appeaser Neville Chamberlain was a year from becoming prime minister of the UK. And while slavery was gone, "separate but equal" was in force and racial division was the norm. And here is the speech he found inside:

"My Dear Friends:

"You are living now, not simply preparing to live. You can never turn back the page. The years will only provide opportunity to live more effectively. But the past can become inspiration, equipment and direction. The earth transmutes the foliage and flowers of the past into the beauty and fruit of the present.

"I wish for each one of you the finest that can be achieved in life, and the largest service possible to your capacity.

"Always be open to truth. Wherever you find it recognize it as the manifestation of God. There has never been, nor will there ever be, any conflict between science and religion. All come from the same heavenly Father. A child knows there is a difference between his father's pencil and his watch, but never doubts that both belong to his father. Never be afraid of any truth.

"Be sure you do more than seek truth. Find it. It is not the search for food that builds the body, but its assimilation. It is imperative that you believe some things so firmly that they become a part of you. Stability is rooted in integrity. Honor, virtue, courage and faith are eternal virtues, and without them your life will be a compromise.

"I believe you have as fine qualities as ever gave surety to the hopes of any generation. You face the world at a period of arresting questions, difficult problems and a restless social order. Yet, it is a period of growth, holding before you the challenge whose terms demand your best.

"Let that singing line from Tennyson's idylls of the king stay with you – "O Loyal to the royal in thyself."

Be Specific

"What wilt thou that I should do unto thee?" (Luke 18:41)

So easy as we pray, to just say, "God bless our Pastor, family, missionaries, etc." Now we know that IF this request truly comes from your heart and that you are on praying ground; then most certainly it is accepted before the Throne of GRACE!

BUT there is so much for us to learn with our walk of faith with JESUS! AND **GOD** clearly tells us in His Eternal Word (the BIBLE), that we should definitely pray specifically also! See James 4:3.

In the text that we have before us today; there is no doubt that JESUS already knew what this gentleman wanted and needed, but He asked him to exercise <u>specifically</u> what his request was; not only for his benefit, but for yours ALSO! Just like the very ill lady who had spent <u>all</u> her money in seeking doctors advice/wisdom/remedy for healing for a twelve year period.

The old saying goes, "Practice what you preach," and in God's provided GRACE, I am.

Seeking to do just that, we go through the school of *hard-knocks*, and the school colors are *back and blue*! The very significant truth though is when we don't even know how to pray; and the Disciples of Jesus requested 'teach us how to pray', and they had walked with JESUS for a period of time already! Then JESUS gave them, and us, what we call 'The Lord's Prayer'. In reality, this was an example for the disciples to use, because the specific prayer of the Lord Himself is found in John 17. Genuinely, what we call the "The Lord's Prayer" can only truly be prayed by born-again folk, or those who truly want to be 'saved', for it is addressed to "Our Father" and asks for the furtherance of the 'Kingdom of God' and the 'forgiveness of sin' etc.

In our text, a blind man (v. 35) cried and in the Greek it means "a cry for help," and he addressed Jesus with a proper title (Lord). This 'cry' also means a "loud cry" and caused a disturbance. In other words, it was a 'desperate-need'.

ALSO, in what we call 'The Lord's Prayer', we find Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Supplication and Intercession, which equals A C T S I.

It is MARVELOUS that we have the Holy Spirit seeking to lead us, and HE makes even our groanings

to be acceptable and in "harmony" with the Father's Will. "Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us: with groanings which cannot be uttered. Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God" Romans 8:26-27.

Please don't use this precious promise as an alibi to pray carelessly, indifferently or as an excuse, as the Holy Spirit will teach us how to pray if we are willing to listen and apply. One thing is for sure that we can pray for – and that is the Salvation of precious Souls as we know this is definitely in harmony with the will of God. "For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior who desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" 1 Timothy 2:3-4. IF, on a very, very rare occasion we come across a person whom God has given up on, the Holy Spirit will so lead and the direction would be so otherwise. You know that Jesus shed His Blood for the sins of the whole world and the unsaved are yet in the camp of the enemy – Satan, the deceiver and thief.

At the time I was working on this editorial, some hours ago the Underground Map predicted a fair quantity of rain (100%). Now it did not materialize exactly as predicted, which reminds me of Jude verse 12 & 13 as both the percentage and amount is down considerably. Our privilege and challenge is this: "But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith; praying in the Holy Spirit ...vv. 16-25.

The story is told (which in our immediate area, at the present time are experiencing a semi-drought weather wise), but at the time of this story taking effect, it was more than 'semi'. So a special prayer meeting was set in place to definitely pray for rain! An elderly Christian lady came with an umbrella and she was asked why in such warm, sunny dry weather why she brought that to the 'prayer-meeting'? Well, no doubt you know the answer, because they were praying specifically for "rain"! – EXPECTANTLY!!! Why worry when you can pray or why pray when you can

worry?

BUT you know for a lot of us Christians – we generalize in our prayer life, and so JESUS asks the question: "What do you want Me to do for you?" even though HE knows before-hand!

How we need to get back to preaching and practicing the <u>"old-time Christianity,"</u> where God's Law is preached in its fullness (naturally in LOVE) – because we care about where precious SOULS (individually) will spend all Eternity!

We are living in what is called "Perilous times", which

means 'very difficult times'. I am convinced it not only includes in the religious/Christian world but also in the natural, AND *Need* is the very essence of PRAYER: Some examples are: Forgiveness, Salvation, for our community and country, <u>discernment</u>, hunger for the Word of God, preachers sharing God's LAW in LOVE, The ministry of the Morning Glory, Hauge Lutheran Innermission Federation, we of the HLIF Board & Spouses, etc.

Those who must fight their way through opposition, storms, and darkness have the happiest and most healthful Christian life, and their condition is most conducive to growth and fruit-bearing.

Therefore God has not promised His people only good days. On the contrary, He has said that we must enter into the kingdom of God through many tribulations. When darkness envelopes us on the way that we are compelled to take, then we realize how helpless we are; but is also then that the Lord is our light. When the burden gets too heavy, we must get someone else to carry it for us. He who does not feel his helplessness needs no help.

When Jesus hides, we understand most clearly what we have lost by His absence; and when He reveals Himself anew, we learn to thank Him a little better than before. A Christian has no reason to lose courage if a dark cloud hides the sun of his life. The sun is not gone; a cloud has hid it from view. In a little while we shall see it again.

That is God's way with His people. Thy way and all thy sorrows Give thou into His hand, His gracious care unfailing, Who doth the heavens command; Their course and path He giveth To clouds and air and wind: A way thy feet may follow He too for thee will find.



Making careful decisions about what fills our minds is an excellent way to honor God and guard our hearts as well.


Father, open our eyes today to what's beautiful. Teach us to mediate on You.

Israeli Archaeologists Find 2,700 Year-Old Artifact That Backs Biblical Record

Dr. Shlomit Weksler-Bdolah, excavator of the Israel Antiquities Authority, holds a stamped piece of clay from the first Jewish temple period that belonged to the "governor of the city" of Jerusalem, about 2,700 years ago. The piece of clay was excavated at the northwestern part of the Western Wall plaza in Jerusalem's Old City....The extraordinary find is a lump of clay, stamped and preferred, measures 13 X15 mm and 2-3 mm thick. The upper part of the sealing depicts two figures facing each other, and the lower part holds an inscription in ancient Hebrew scrip.

For our wrestling is not against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against the powers, against the world-rulers of this darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Wherefore take up the whole armor of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and, having done all, to stand."

Ephesians 6:10-13.

For a Christian, life is a battle. No one who is desirous of doing the Lord's will can go through life without meeting opposition. The powers which still rule in and about the earth are enemies of God's people. The Bible admonishes us to fight the good fight so that we may stand after having emerged victorious over all opposition. "He that overcometh shall thus be arrayed in white garments; and I will in no wise blot his name out of the book of life, and I will confess his name before my Father, and before His angels." (Rev. 3:5).

It is possible that at times the Christian life has been pictured as being nothing else than toil and tears. But we should also remember those other times when all strife has been forgotten and there has been only joy, rest, and thanksgiving. It is so easy to go from one extreme to another; it is much more difficult to be normal and keep to the way that is true and sound.

If we would read the Bible and Church history with an honest mind, we would see that it is impossible for a Christian to get through this world without conflict; least of all would it be possible for those who are the best Christians.

No one will reach that sweet haven of rest Who earnestly presses not in. He who will fight for the faith that at last Will bring him to heaven shall win.

It is perhaps altogether too true that not all Christians are equally victorious in their battles. Many suffer crushing defeats; others "withstand on the evil day" and go forward in the power of God. He who suffers defeat is not privileged to taste the joys of victory. He walks about as David did when he fled from his own son. It is quite different with him who wins in the battle. He discovers some of the greatest treasures a Christian can find here below. When a soldier returns home with victory he is happy even if he still has many painful wounds from the battle. It is the same with the

victorious Christian.

In 1 Samuel 14 we have the story of Jonathan who together with his armor bearer, went against the enemy. By the help of God they defeated the enemy, but the battle was both long and hard. In the course of the battle they passed through a forest where there was honey both upon the ground and in the honeycomb. Jonathan put forth his rod into the honeycomb and tasted of the honey, and it is written that "his eyes were enlightened."

Many a Christian warrior has found life's sweetest honey in the midst of battle. He has been given a clearer vision, a new fire in the heart and a new power in his life. I dare say that if you want a Christian full of fresh vigor and with an unimpaired spiritual vision, search among those who have been in battle and have returned with victory. They have tasted the honey of life and their eyes have been enlightened.

The greatest joy and purest gratitude is found in the heart of a Christian who has been in battle and has won the victory. It is not in times of peace that a Christian comes closest to his God, but in the victorious battle. If this were clear to all of us, many problems would be solved, many tears wiped away, and many a discouraged soldier of the Cross would wield his sword with greater vigor.

The battle is not against flesh and blood. It is not a war among people as we usually think of war, such as... It is a spiritual warfare. No cannon is seen or heard, no sabre glitters in the sunshine, and no bayonet is used against the enemy. But it is war nevertheless; anyone who is anxious to save his soul will soon discover that.

The hosts of wickedness arrayed against the Christian can possibly be divided into two groups. The one group is described in our text as principalities, powers, and world rulers of this darkness. This must be those people who live outside of fellowship with God.

It is still true that in most places on this earth true Christianity has not penetrated very far into the life of the people. Those who rule are usually worldly people. They have the power in this age, and it is likely that we shall have no change until Christ returns. Only rarely do they rule in harmony with God's Word and Spirit. The spirit of the world is like a boa constrictor that is ready to crush its victim; Christians meet it on every hand. As long as there is a spark of spiritual life in your and my heart we shall have a battle against this evil spirit; if we do not, our Christianity will soon be a thing of the past.

The Christian <u>needs to be clad in the full armor of</u> God at all times; his battlefield is in the worldly home, the worldly business places, in worldly society, in town hall or the halls of Congress. Briefly, a Christian must be prepared for war wherever he is. He who thinks him-

self spiritually secure will soon discover that the world is a strong and dangerous enemy of everything that is from God.

Christians of a generation or two ago were very much afraid of keeping too much company with worldly people; possibly they went too far in that direction. They forgot that it was not human beings they were to turn away from, but the spirit which dominates in the world. It may be that we have gone to the opposite extreme; Christians today do not think of the world as being particularly worldly. Christianity has been made to fit into the scheme of things in the world. Christians of the present day are not afraid of being associated with worldly people in business or politics. When worldly people are reasonable in their attitudes, as they frequently are, it is so easy for the Christian to lay the sword aside. But then he does not have to go much further before he is a friend of the world and an enemy of God.

The friendship of the world is enmity with God.

It appears so innocent to be friendly with the world; it looks so refined too. But it is not long before the friendship of the world is found to be more delectable than the company of Christians. When that happens we are on slippery ice; only God's grace can keep us from falling. As a fly is caught and loses its life in a web of exceedingly fine threads woven by the spider, so have many Christians been caught in the web of worldliness and have lost their lives. They died quietly, yet so surely. They forgot that they were at war; this was the tragedy that spoiled their doom.

Here – precisely here – many present day Christians are in great danger; many have already been deceived perhaps even without knowing it. While they are boasting of having progressed far beyond the gloomy spirituality of the pietists they have landed in a veritable black death; they have pinned a Christian badge on the lapel of a worldly spirit. They still want to be known as Christians. This hum-bug is frequently paraded as Christianity that has been liberated from ignorance and superstition; it is Christianity that has grown to maturity.

Divine Moments in Our Nation's History

Abraham Lincoln, the Infidel Who Found God and Changed a Nation

Lincoln's Second Inaugural Address, the Day the Light Broke Through

After four devastating years of war, the nation had suffered more than a half million casualties as a result of the war to that point. On March 4, 1865, Lincoln made his second inaugural address. Rain and dark clouds hung low over Washington, DC that morning as a large crowd eagerly gathered to hear words of desperately needed perspective and hope. As the tall slender president rose to give the address, suddenly the rain stopped, and the sun broke through the clouds and shone brightly on the assembly during the message. It was as if God Himself was giving a sign of hope that the clouds of war would soon depart from the nation, and a new day would begin This was one of Lincoln's most memorable addresses, and many say it more resembled a sermon than a political speech Reflecting on his deeply held faith, Lincoln indicated that it was God's judgment against slavery that brought on the Civil War. He further said of the war,

"If God wills that it continue, until all the wealth piled up by the bond-man's two hundred and fifty years of unrequited toil shall be sunk and every drop of blood drawn with the lash, shall be paid by another drawn with the sword, as was said three thousand years ago, so still it must be said "the judgments of the Lord are true and righteous altogether." Lincoln was not bitter, but gracious toward the southern states. He famously concluded saying, "with malice toward none, and charity toward all... let us strive to finish the work that was begun, to bind up the nation's wounds, to care for the (soldier), his widow and his orphan... and work to achieve just and last peace. He ended by requesting that Americans pray that the seasons of judgment would pass quickly.

The End of the War and the End of a Life

National corporate repentance and prayer played a key role in bringing an end to the scourge of slavery in our nation and thus opened the way for the war to end Amazingly, only a month after the inauguration General Lee surrendered to Grant at the Appomattox Courthouse, bring the four-year-long conflict to an end. And then only five days after Lee's surrender, on Good Friday, the president's life was taken by an assassin's bullet. It is said that his last words were telling his wife he wanted to go to Jerusalem and walk in the Savior's footsteps. Although it ended in this national tragedy, the long and bloody war had come to an end and slavery was finally and fully abolished.

Public recognition of God

Most of us don't realize that Lincoln actually instituted many forms of public recognition of God that we take for granted today. The holiday of Thanksgiving became a national holiday only after Lincoln's proclamation in 1863. Through the Coinage Act of 1864, Lincoln was also responsible for putting "In God We Trust" on our coins and currency. As one of the greatest presidents in our history his image has been rightly honored and commemorated on some of our coins and currency. The Lincoln Memorial has a prominent place in Washington, DC.

The final Sacrifice

Please complete this statement: If I died today, I would go to **H...**

How and why do you know you will go to Heaven? What are you trusting? You cannot save yourself. Bad news: The Bible states that through Adam all inherit the curse of sin. All have sin (Rom. 5:12).

Good news: Through Jesus Christ the curse of sin is removed (vss. 12-17). God has provided only one solution for our sin. He sent His only begotten Son as the one perfect Sacrifice and Substitute for the sin of man (John 3:16). No more sacrifices for sin. "It is finished"! In my simple Southern words, "He done did it! What has been done cannot be undone or done again. What is done is done!" As my granddaughter says, "ALL DONE!" Sin is taken away. No more sacrifices! "All done!" A risen Saviour now offers the forgiveness of sin to whosoever (including you) will believe and receive Him as Saviour (1:12). You cannot save yourself or pay the penalty for your sin.
