Jesus Lived For You, Too

id you know that? Did you know that Jesus not only died for you, but He lived for you, too? I didn't know this for so long. I grew up in a Christian home and I've gone to church for as long as I can remember. I was raised in two Bible-believing churches and yet, somehow, I missed this part. I knew that Jesus had died for my sins. I was told that. But I never knew that Jesus lived for me. Not until I was at AFLBS (Association Free Lutheran Bible School), and I was in a class on the Gospel of Luke led by Pastor Phil Haugen. He would tell us over and over again as we looked at what Jesus did - how He overcame temptation and how He would go and spend time alone with His Father and everything that He did in accordance with the Law of God – Pastor Phil would tell us that Jesus did this in our place. Over and over again he would tell us ... and I finally got it. I finally understood. Jesus lived for me - in my place.

So what's the significance? How important is this? Of utmost importance. You see, for many years I knew that Jesus had died for my sins and that by believing in Him I would be saved. However, I thought that I had to do good things and live up to the Law in order to be pleasing to God. You know how often I did this? Let's see ...how about never. I failed all the time. I would try so hard and fail so quickly. I got depressed; I despaired. I thought God was angry with me, and I wondered how He could ever use a failure like me. I would look at what Jesus said and I tried to copy that. I failed miserably. All the time. The Law is a heavy burden to carry. I can't carry it. It crushed me. I am too weak even when I think I am strong. I didn't know what to do with my predicament so I just lived with it. Until God used Pastor Phil Haugen to open my eyes to what I had been missing. Jesus lived for me.

You see, Jesus is my substitute not only in His death but in His life, too. He did everything I cannot do: He lived in perfect obedience to God and to His Law. He didn't do anything that I could do. He didn't sin. <u>All I can do</u> is sin until Christ makes me new by grace through faith in <u>His finished work on *Calvary*</u>. HIS finished work! What work? Dying on the cross! Yes, that's part of it. The other part of His work was living perfectly under the Law in my place because I could not ever do it. Not even close. After maintaining His righteousness under the Law, He went to Golgotha. And there something absolutely incredible happened. There was an exchange. All my sins and filthiness were transferred to Jesus, and Jesus' righteousness was given to me.

We often talk about Jesus' death with two words: 1) Propitiation and 2) Expiation. We also often speak of it as a penal, substitutionary death (Ed. Volutionaritily). Penal because He died as punishment from His Father upon sin not his sin, <u>but mine</u>. And yours. And the sins of the whole world. At that point Jesus became the vilest thing in the eyes of His Father because my sin and yours was placed upon him, along with the sins of the world, and the Father executed just punishment and put his sin to death. Substitutionary because it was done in my place, in your place. Propitiation and expiation take their imagery from Leviticus 16 and the Day of Atonement. There were two

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goats – both without blemish. One was killed on the altar to satisfy God's righteous wrath – propitiation.

The other was the scapegoat. All the sins of the people were transferred to it, and it was led outside the camp to the wilderness never to return – expiation ...the removal of sin. Jesus did both at Golgotha. II Corinthians 5:21 says, For our sake he (God the Father) made him (Jesus) to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." The Great Exchange. Jesus for me. Not only in death but also in His life.

So what does this mean? It means I am free! I do not have to keep the Law for God to be pleased with me because He is pleased with me on account of Christ's work. Christ's righteousness. My chains are gone. My burden is gone. I understand the Gospel. Jesus for me in His life and His death. I never had felt so free as I did that day in Luke class when I understood that Jesus lived for me. Do you understand? Jesus not only died for you but He lived for you. Do you believe it? Or are you trying to please God on your own? It won't work!

Do you despair of your attempts to please God through your good works? Rest on the work of Christ. Do you understand? Let me tell you again. Jesus lived for you.

1 Timothy 1:15a: "The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"

1 Peter 3:18: "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the"

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Consider Him...

Hebrews 12:1-3

We are to "consider Him" – "Jesus the author and finisher of our faith" (vv. 2-3). Why? "lest (we) be wearied and faint in (our) minds" (v. 3) as we run the difficult race that is set before us. What does the word *consider* mean? Does it imply a hurried, occasional look at our Savior? No, the word *consider* means so much more. We are to observe Christ carefully and continuously. We are to meditate in His Word "day and night" (Ps. 1:2), for that is the only way we can be sure we are considering and worshipping the true Christ of the Bible and not the many false christs invented in the minds of men. To properly "consider Him," we must ponder on His mighty works - past, present and future. We must recognize Jesus Christ as the only perfect example. And, as we truly "consider Him' in the biblical, spiritual sense, we naturally will be drawn closer to our Lord with each passing day. We will come to the realization that many of the "weights" we carry while running the Christian race are not only needless but are the root cause of the "sin which doth so easily beset us" (v. 1).

Are you tired, discouraged or defeated? Could it be that you are spending too much time considering the failures of those around you – of loved ones, leaders, pastors or other believers? Does it seem to you that most of your troubles are undeserved and appear to be unending? The sure cure – the only cure – for such feelings is to "consider Him." Jesus Christ, the Lord of Glory, deserved nothing but the best, yet He always received the worst. Nevertheless, He willingly endured the cross and despised the shame (v. 2). Let us "consider Him" (v. 3) when we are weary.

Dwight L. Moody was conducting a great religious campaign in Chicago during the World's Fair Exposition in 1893. On a certain day many bills and salaries had to be paid. Moody needed \$3,000 to meet his financial obligations. Mr. Moody, with some other Christian workers, knelt down and prayed about the matter.

The evangelist prayed in his unique way: "O Lord, I am sorely in need of money; I must have \$3,000 today. While he was on the stage waiting to preach, a lady came to one of the ushers and asked him to take her to Mr. Moody, for she had a message for him that must be delivered to him in person. The usher took her to Mr. Moody, to whom she handed an envelope. Mr. Moody, thinking it was a question someone wanted to ask him and not having time to attend to it at the moment, put the envelope in his pocket and proceeded to preach.

When Mr. Moody later came to the dinner table with his fellow workers, he remarked, "Oh, I had an envelope handed me today; I wonder what it is about?"

He opened it, and to his surprise there was a check for \$3,000 signed by Mrs. Cyrus W. McCormick, wife of the harvesting machine manufacturer.

Mr. Moody went at once to see Mrs. McCormick. She told him that at about eleven thirty (the very hour that Mr. Moody and his workers had been in prayer) something impressed her that Mr. Moody would be needing money since he was conducting such an extensive campaign. So she sat down and wrote a check for \$1,000. Then a second thought came to her - that she should enlarge the amount of the check. So she tore up the \$1,000 check and made a new one for \$2,000.

Another thought pressed upon her and led her to tear up that check also. She then made a new check for \$3,000, put it in an envelope, stamped it and rang for her servant to mail the letter. Then another thought came to her, *Perhaps Mr. Moody needs this money today.* So she found out where Mr.Moody was preaching at that hour and sent her maid with the letter, giving her strict instructions to see that the letter was placed Mr. Moody's own hands.

For the past several years Mrs. Prayer Meeting has been failing in health, gradually wasting away until rendered helpless by stiffness of knees, coldness of heart, inactivity, and weakness of purpose and will power. At the last she was but a shadow of her former happy self. Her last whispered words were inquiries concerning the strange absence of her loved ones now busy in the markets of trade and places of worldly amusements.

Experts, including Dr. Works, Dr. Reform and Dr. Joiner, disagreed as to the cause of her fatal illness. They had administered large does of organizations, socials, contests and drives, but to no avail. A postmortem showed that a deficiency of spiritual food, coupled with the lack of faith, heartfelt religion, and general support, were contributing causes. Only a few were present at her death, sobbing over memories of her past beauty and power.

In honor of her going, the church doors will be closed on Wednesday nights, except the third Wednesday night of each month when the Ladies Pink Lemonade Society serves refreshments to the Men's Handball Team.



The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Reinstates Partnered Gay Ministers

A partnered gay minister who was defrocked three years ago will be reinstated to the clergy roster of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).

The ELCA Southeastern Synod approved the reinstatement of both ...Bradley E. Schmeling and his partner, ...Darin Easter, according to the denomination's news service ...

The homosexual couple's reinstatement comes weeks after the denomination adopted revisions to its ministry policies, allow in those who are in "publicly accountable, lifelong, monogamous, same-gender relationships" to serve as clergy.

Last August, the ELCA's chief legislative body had voted to approve a resolution allowing noncelibate gays and lesbians to be ordained ...

Schmeling, pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Atlanta, was removed from the clergy roster in 2007 after he announced that he found a lifelong gay companion. At that time, he was in violation of an ELCA policy that banned openly gay clergy.

Later that year, the churchwide assembly voted to encourage its bishops to practice "restraint" in disciplining gay ministers who are in "faithful" same-sex relationships and suggested that such clergy who were removed be reinstated.

U.S. "Must Do More" for Religious Freedom

The United States government "must do more" to protect religious freedom around the world, according to the bipartisan U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF).

USCIRF, in its annual report, called on the Obama administration to correct the shortcomings it has demonstrated on global religious liberty in its first 15 months in office. The government's "foreign policy on religious freedom is missing the mark," USCIRF Chairman Leonard Leo said.

During a ...news conference April 29 in Washington, commissioners named by officeholders from both political parties pointed to the following examples of the Obama administration's inadequacies on the issue.

*President Obama has yet to nominate an ambassador -at-large for international religious freedom.

*The president and Secretary of State Hillary Clinton

have fallen short for nearly a year in defending religious liberty, referring to "freedom of worship" in speeches while largely being silent about the broader right of religious freedom.

*Clinton has not named "countries of particular concern (CPCs)": a designation that is to be made each year for the world's worst violators of religious liberty.

The failure of Obama and Clinton to speak out for religious liberty could be taken by others to imply policy changes on the issue, Leo told reporters. "Freedom of worship is only one aspect of religious freedom, and a purposeful change in language could mean a much narrower view of the right, ignoring such components as religiously motivated expressions and religious education," he said.

D. C. Court Battle Underway Over Marriage

Three weeks ago, news outlets yawned at the confirmation of Judge Marisa Demeo. An open lesbian, Demeo's nomination was stalled longer than any other White House appointee because of her extreme support for same-sex "marriage." Why is that significant? Because today, Demeo sits on the very bench that will decide the fate of marriage in our nation's capital: The D.C. Superior Court. As a liberal reporter put it, Demeo won a 15-year term to "lesbianify" the court ...

Congress may have let the country down on this issue - but Stand4MarriageDC refused to. After exhausting almost every legal avenue, (Bishop Jackson's) coalition sued the D.C. Board of Elections for standing between the people and their right to vote ...Nearly six out of 10 said the issue of marriage should be theirs to decide.

The arguments kicked off (May 4). In an unusual twist that reflected the importance of this case, all nine judges met to hear the suit ...Peter (Srigg) reports that Austin Nimocks of the Alliance Defense Fund (ADF) was brilliant in his defense of the people's right to vote - much stronger than the counsel for the District. The questioning of both attorneys by the judges was vigorous, so he said it was hard to get a read on how the case might turn out. The discussion involved a lot of technical points about the legislative history of the D.C., Character, Charter Amendments Act, Human Rights Act, and Initiative Procedures Act.

Interestingly enough, the District's claim that restoring a traditional definition of marriage would be "discrimination" based on "sexual orientation" was mentioned only in passing. The bottom line is that the D.C. Charter gives the people a right to legislate via initiative – and the Council can't take that right away from them.

The Perfect Plumbline

Amos 7:1-9

Faithful servants are needed in every generation of every dispensation. Their selection, however, is never based on the same criteria the world uses to determine potential greatness. Man naturally looks for credentials that conform to the external and carnal standards set by a Christ-rejection world. God, on the other hand, looks at the heart. In Amos we see the qualities of one whom God could use for His glory. Amos was resolved to speak the Word fearlessly and without compromise.

The vision of the plumbline (a weighted string used to determine if a wall is perfectly vertical or upright) was God's way of instructing Amos concerning His Word being the absolute standard

(vv. 7-9). The thoughts or opinions of Amos or anyone else were irrelevant. The understanding of God's Word (and its proper application) is man's only mandate. The Bible is the divine plumbline whereby we are to scrutinize the uprightness of all things pertaining to our walk and witness. A faithful servant of Christ will not call straight what the Word of God has clearly deemed to be crooked.

Amos was unrelenting in proclaiming the Lord's message of reproof, yet he was still tender-hearted and burdened for the brethren to whom he spoke (vv. 1-6). He knew Israel was still God's chosen people, that they had covenant promises yet to be fulfilled and that he was given the difficult task of calling disobedient brethren to repentance. Our sincere desire in sounding forth a "Thus saith the Lord!" to an erring brother should be for his restoration, not his condemnation. May we faithfully apply the perfect plumbline – the standard of God's inerrant Word – to all situations.

Enduring Hardness as Good Soldiers of Christ

In II Timothy 2:3, God instructs us to "*endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.*" In verse 4, our added instruction is to avoid becoming entangled with the affairs of this life. Why? Because that is the only way we can please the one who has chosen us to be His soldiers.

In verse 5, a very important warning is given - we must carry forward our ministry for Christ lawfully. We cannot cut corners; neither can we allow the world to have its way in our lives and produce a divided heart and mind. A good soldier of Jesus Christ has only one Commander, and he has only one Book of commands and promises that he must strive to know, believe and obey.

God never promised His obedient children that their lives on earth would be a "Sunday picnic." He did promise that those who suffer with Christ now will reign with Christ later (vs. 12). Believers are to expect hard things in this life (3:12).

At the same time, obedient believers are instructed to weigh present difficulties in the light of future benefits and never forget the time element - affliction "for a moment" in contrast to the future "eternal weight of glory" (II Cor. 4:16-18). Such a perspective is possible only for those who walk by faith, not by sight (5:7).

A study by Tufts University has called attention to the presence of Protestant pastors who do not believe what they preach, something the authors describe as a nearly "invisible phenomenon" of "unbelieving clergy."

Ambiguity regarding who is a believer in Jesus and who is a nonbeliever, the report said, is a result of the pluralism that has been fostered by many religious leaders for at least a century.

"God is many different things to different people, and since we can't know if one of these conceptions is the right one, we should honor them all," the authors wrote in summarizing the pluralistic view.

Rather than relying on statistical evidence to point to a conclusion, the study employs anecdotal stories of five ministers whose identities have been obscured. Even the authors admit they couldn't draw any reliable generalizations from such a small sample of clergy, but what they found, they said, does deserve a closer look.

One pastor, a Methodist, said he no longer believes that God exists, but his church members do not know that he is an atheist. Most of them, he said, don't even believe Jesus literally rose from the dead or literally was born of a virgin.

Another pastor, from the United Church of Christ, said he didn't even believe in the doctrinal content of the Christian faith at the beginning of his ministry, but he continues to preach as if he believes because it's the way of life he knows.

A Presbyterian pastor in the study said he remains in ministry largely for financial reasons and acknowledged that if he were to make known that he rejects most tenets of the Christian faith he would obliterate his "ability to earn a living this way."

A Church of Christ pastor explained how he continues to lead his church despite losing all theological confidence.

What is 'man' that he should judge the <u>Bible;</u> while the Bible will JUDGE him? Whoever attacks or questions the Word of God is an unbeliever!

"Unbelieving" Pastors? Product of Liberalism!

"Here's how I'm handling my job on Sunday mornings: I see it as play acting" the pastor said.

He describes himself as an atheistic agnostic and said he still needs the ministerial job and no longer believes hypocrisy is wrong.

A southern Baptist pastor included in the study said he was attracted to Christianity as a religion of love and now has become an atheist. If someone would offer him \$200,000, he said, he'd leave the ministry right away.

"Preachers Who Are Not Believers' is a stunning and revealing report that lays bare a level of heresy, apostasy and hypocrisy that staggers the mind," R. Albert Mohler, Jr., president of Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, wrote on his blog in March.

"In 1739, Gilbert Tennett preached his famous sermon, 'On the Danger of an Unconverted Ministry.'

In that sermon, Tennett described unbelieving pastors as a curse upon the church. They prey upon the faith and the faithful. 'These caterpillars labor to devour every green thing.'

"If they will not remove themselves from the ministry, they must be removed. If they lack the integrity to resign their pulpits, the churches must muster the integrity to eject them." Mohler wrote ... "If they will not 'out' themselves, it is the duty of faithful Christians to 'out' them. The caterpillars are hard at work. Will it take a report from an atheist to awaken the church to the danger?"

Of Faith and Works

Faith is not that human notion and dream that some hold for faith. Because they see that no betterment of life and no good works follow it, and yet they can hear and say much about faith, they fall into error, and say, "Faith is not enough; one must do works in order to be righteous and be saved." This is the reason that, when they hear the Gospel, they fall-to and make for themselves, by their own powers, an idea in their hearts, which says, "I believe." This they hold for true faith. But it is a human imagination and idea that never reaches the depths of the heart, and so nothing comes of it and no betterment follows it.

Faith, however, is a divine work in us. It changes us and makes us to be born anew of God (John 1); it kills the old Adam and makes altogether different men, in heart and sprit and mind and powers, and it brings with it the Holy Ghost. Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing this faith; and so it is impossible for it not to do good works incessantly. It does not ask whether there are good works to do, but before the question rises; it has already done them, and is always at the doing of them. He who does not these works is a faithless man. He gropes and looks about after faith and good works, and knows neither what faith is nor what good works are, though he talks and talks, with many words, about faith and good works.

Faith is a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that a man would stake his life on it a thousand times. This confidence in God's grace and knowledge of it makes men glad and bold and happy in dealing with God and all His creatures; and this is the work of the Holy Ghost in faith. Hence a man is ready and glad, without compulsion, to do good to everyone, to serve everyone, to suffer everything, in love and praise to God, who has shown him this grace; and thus it is impossible to separate works from faith, quite as impossible as to separate heat and light fires. Beware, therefore, of your own false notions and of the idle talkers, who would be wise enough to make decisions about faith and good works, and yet are the greatest fools. Pray God to work faith in you; else you will remain forever without faith, whatever you think or do.

"Righteousness, then, is such a faith and is called "God's righteousness," or "the righteousness that avails before God," because God gives it and counts it as righteousness for the sake of Christ, our Mediator, and makes a man give to every man what he owes him. For through faith a man becomes sinless and comes to take pleasure in God's commandments; thus he gives to God the honor that is His and pays Him what he owes Him; but he also serves man willingly, by whatever means he can, and thus pays his debt to everyone. Such righteousness, nature and free will and all our powers cannot bring into existence. No one can give himself faith, and no more can he take away his own unbelief; how, then, will he take away a single sin, even the very smallest? Therefore, all that is done apart from faith or in unbelief, is false; it is hypocrisy and sin, no matter how good a show it makes (Romans 14)."

Editor's Note: Luther's Preface to the Book of Romans is what was read at the meeting at Aldersgate Street when John Wesley's heart was "strangely warmed" and he was converted.

The Unchristian Walk of Many Persons in Our Day, is a Cause of the Rejection of Christ and of the True Faith

*"Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof" -*2 Tim. 3:5

Everyone calls himself by the Christian name, even though he do not perform the least part of what he thereby professes; and, by this means, the Savior is denied, contemned, blasphemed, scourged, crucified and, as it were, cast out of the sight of men, as dead. The Apostle expressly declares, that some persons "crucify the Son of God afresh" (Heb. 6:6).

2. Would to God that Christ were not, even in *our* days, crucified again and again among those who call themselves after his name, and honor him with their lips; and yet, by their antichristian lives and actions, utterly reject and deny him. His most holy, humble, and exemplary life is, at this day, to be found among but few; and wherever there is not the *life* of Christ, *there* Christ is not himself, however loudly the faith and the doctrine may be commended. For the Christian faith without a Christian life is a tree without fruit. True faith works by love (Gal. 5:6); and wherever it is found, there Christ dwells, with all his divine graces and virtues (Eph.3:17).

3. But when these are not expressed in the lives of those who profess his doctrine, there Christ himself is rooted up and denied; for it is only where true faith exists that Christ dwells.

4. Now Christ has said, "Whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father and the angels" (Matt. 10:33; Luke 12:9). This denial of Christ is not only made in words (as by those who renounce Christ and Christianity), but it is also done when, by our lives and actions, we willfully sin against the Savior and resist the Holy Ghost. St. Paul speaks of some who "profess that they know God, but in works deny him" (Tit. 1:16); and it is certain that Christ is no less denied by a wicked and satanic life, than he is by a verbal abjuration. It is with hypocrisy and an empty profession of the faith as it is with open wickedness; and this is strikingly illustrated by our Lord's parable of the two sons, who were commanded by their father to go and work in his 'vineyard. The one (openly denying) said, "I will not"; while the other (professing obedience) said, "I go, sir," and went not (Matt. 21:28-30).

5. This is a forcible representation of those Christians who make religion to consist in empty profession without obedience. They will cry "Yea, yea," and "Lord, Lord!" (Matt. 7:21), and yet are worse than others, because they pretend to be children of the Father, and yet do not, in any respect, obey his will. Their character is thus given by St.

Paul: "Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof' (2 Tim. 3:5). Now, what is it to deny the power of godliness but to deny Christ himself, and to shake off allegiance to him, and thus to act the part of a heathen under the mask and name of a Christian? These are "the children of unbelief or disobedience," in whom the spirit, not of Christ, but of *this world*, works (Eph. 2:2). They, therefore, who usurp a Christian's name, and yet do not a Christian's work, shall be denied, in their turn, by the Savior when he shall pronounce the sentence: "I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity" (Matt. 7:23).
