How to Get Assurance

he Word of God is full of examples of people who received assurance. We cannot find one case in the entire New Testament of a Christian who did not have assurance. Is it not then strange and peculiar that in our day there are many people who do not have assurance? All the New Testament Christians had a positive testimony of what Jesus had done for them. The blind man, for example, said, "One thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see" (John 9:25). What a positive assurance! The personal meeting with Jesus was such a glorious experience that nothing in all of life compared to it.

Jesus stated plainly, "I know mine own, and mine own know me, even as the Father knoweth me, and I know the Father" (John 10:14-15). Here in no uncertain words Jesus relates the true relationship between Himself and His own. He even compares our relationship that He had with the Father. If his is the pattern set before us by Jesus surely we should not be satisfied with anything less.

Jesus Christ has not changed, for He "is the same yesterday and today, yea and forever" (Heb. 13:8). It is the purpose of the Word to acquaint us today with this living Saviour, "whom to know is life eternal."

There is only one way. Remember the words of Christ when He said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). It is interesting to note here that Jesus is not only the way, but also the life. We want to know the way that leads us to the life. But this is the way of the cross, and it is not popular. Many ridicule those who take it. The one requirement to all who come to the cross is that they be sin-burdened. Self-righteous people are in no condition to be saved. They waste their time at the cross. They only find much there to criticize and ridicule. Their head

is overstuffed with their own ideas about salvation until there is no room for God's great plan of salvation. Such self-righteous sinners can never receive Holy Spiritwrought assurance; they must pass on and take to themselves false assurance. The sacred place at the cross is only for the lost. For Jesus "came to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). It is those who have nothing but sin who come here. The law has utterly undone them; they realize what the Word means when it says: "that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may be brought under the judgment of God" (Rom. 3:19). They have nothing good to say for themselves. They cry in despair like the publican of old, "God, be thou merciful to me a sinner." These are the Father's gift to Jesus, for He himself once said, "All that which the Father giveth me shall come unto me." Such, in their lowly position beneath the cross, confess their sins. There they find the cleansing power of Jesus' blood, for "if we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). I praise my God for the day He took me out of the class of the self-righteous who needed no salvation and revealed to me my lost condition. What a revelation! I thought I was too good to be lost. I was a faithful attendant at church; I was a teacher in the Sunday school; I took Communion; I did not drink and carouse like many whom I knew. Surely I must be a Christian. But one day I saw clearly that in spite of all my religion and morality, I was lost. After three months of struggling to better myself, I found my way to the cross. I found that "the way: led to "the truth." I experienced the verse, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). I

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found out also that it led to "the life." Now I praise God that He knocked the false foundation from under me, so that I sank in despair. That is what led me to the cross.

It is at the cross that the Holy Spirit can reveal Jesus to us.

We never see Jesus until we fall prostrate before the cross. Then the Holy Spirit, who is the Comforter, gently lifts our head and whispers, "Look." never appears more beautiful than to a prostrate sinner. A look at Him melts the hardest sinner. We begin to realize the price that He paid for our salvation. "Him who knew no sin he made to be sin on our behalf; that we might become the righteousness of God in him" II Cor. 5:21. What a wonderful Saviour! All of this He did because He loved us.

It is because of Jesus' dying on the cross that we can be sure. Jesus himself cried out before dying, "It is finished." Nothing else need be done. He tasted death for every man. "He died for all" (II Cor. 5:15). The price of redemption was paid so that no one need go lost because of his sins. All who come to Jesus Christ, the Saviour of "the whole world" (1 John 2:2), can be saved. Our assurance is based solely on what Jesus had done for us.

It is at the cross that "the Spirit himself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are children of God" (Rom. 8:16). Only as we look to Jesus does the Holy Spirit bear this witness; no other One is good enough. It is while looking to Jesus in the Word that we are given faith to believe. Bible verses we have read many times previous now unfold to us like flowers. How living and real

they become. A heavenly relaxation comes over us! "The old things are passed away; behold, they are become new" (II Cor. 5:17). Assurance is now our possession. Whereas we once "hoped" or "thought" we were saved, we now know that we are saved. A miracle has taken place. The horror of being lost has left us. We are "heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ" (Rom. 8:17). "The spirit of bondage" has been broken, for we have received "the spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father" (Rom. 8:15). What a blessed day, that day at the cross, when "the Spirit himself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are children of God." God then puts a new song into our hearts.

"Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine!
O what a foretaste of glory divine!
Heir of salvation, purchase of God,
Born of His Spirit, washed in His blood."

UNTIL!!!

"For as in the days before the flood, they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark, and did not know until the flood came and took them all away, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be." Matthew 24:38-39

(Please prayerfully read also: Matthew 24 & 25, & Luke 17 & 21).

Isn't it interesting as we read and re-read the Holy Scriptures, a portion that you have read/heard several times previously, that all of a 'sudden' a new insight is given unto you personally! ALSO 'marvelous' is the patience of the third person of the Trinity (The Holy Spirit). He is so patient, gentle and understanding with you and me under the 'tutoring' of the same! God tells 'us' to <u>search the Scriptures</u> (daily) and to *II Timothy* 2:15.

Make no mistake. God says what HE means and HE means what HE says! Thus 'we' are to be not only 'students' of His WORD, but *Spiritual sign* readers. NOW a 'sign' is not the 'event' itself, but indication of the coming event!

They <u>continued</u> witnessing UNTIL Noah entered the 'Ark' and **God shut the door!**

It is the great duty and interest of all the disciples to watch, to be awake and keep awake. As a sinful state or way is compared to sleep, senseless and inactive, so a gracious state or way is compared to watching and waking. We must watch for our Lord's coming. To watch implies not only to believe that our Lord will come, but to desire that he would come, to be often thinking of His coming.

Watching is necessary, but a person can be 'watching' and yet not be ready, because being ready is essential. How then does a person get ready?

First, admit/acknowledge before 'our' Holy God that I you are a LOST sinner (Isaiah 64:6,Luke 19:10, Romans 3:10, 6:23) and hopelessly 'lost' without the mercy and grace of God being mine, and then receive God's GIFT (Jesus) as your personal SAVIOR – Deliverer (Revelation 3:20, Ephesians 2:8-9, Titus 3:5 John 1:12-13, 1 John 5:11-13) God declares, "When I see the

BLOOD I will past over YOU," (Ex. 12:13) as there is power/cleansing power IN THE BLOOD OF THE LAMB. (See Romans 8:1 and II Corinthians 5:21) We 'watch' in vain, IF we do not get ready!

Turn with me to Matthew 25:1-13. ALL ten virgins were attempting to be 'watchful' and looking for the coming of the 'Bride-Groom'; but when the 'Bride-Groom' came, only five were barely 'ready'. The 'call' came at 'midnight', a time of sleepiness! Notice what is recorded of the 'foolish virgins' in verse 8: their oil was "going out'! Symbolically, they evidently had the Holy Spirit dwelling 'within' them; but had not steadfastly continued to 'contend earnestly for the faith'.

The gift given to us is a 'living faith' (when we receive Jesus as 'our' personal Savior). This faith struggles, but ends up at CALVARY where the ground is 'level' and Jesus paid it all – as He cried: It is finished! "But if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanses us from all sin" 1 John 1:7. Very serious as you notice the 'foolish virgins' came to the 'right' door and had the right 'words' BUT it was too late – UNTIL! God had shut the door AND when God shuts the door – no 'man' opens!

The 'foolish virgins' (knowing better) had NO NEED of oil **UNTIL the call at midnight** *and* the 'opportunity' of witnessing/testifying/evangelism was all over for the 'wise virgins'. Now where the rubber meets the road is the fact (as a whole) we think we have NO NEED of spiritual disciplines. We are complacent, self-satisfied, comfortable as 'individuals' and as a congregation! Very serious, but isn't this the truth – Be Honest?

Some churches make them officials Satan is determined to win.


All of this accepting of gross evil, all that is sickening vile, Has caused "God's stomach" to be seriously filled with bile.

Neither hot nor cold but claiming to be what they are not. On their judgment day, they will be among those God "Forgot."





Faith and Human Reason

Christians Should Unquestioningly Believe, As Children Do – Young and old, all who are Christians, must Become children – if not in age, then in mental attitude – so that they are satisfied not to comprehend more than young children; for as soon as they want to rule with wisdom, they suffer a fall. Therefore let the man who would be a Christian or a preacher by all means restrain his reason, surrender himself, so that he be not a man or a mature person but a young child. My Hans Luther does not study things out much; he takes the course which he is told to take; he simply allows himself to be led by words and does not ask many

questions about whether it is right or not. * Exposition of Ps. 8:2.

Christians Should Follow God's Revelation, Not Their Reason — Whoever would be a Christian should be careful to stop his reasoning and attach himself solely to the Word which the lips of Christ speak. For the articles of our faith sound so ridiculous and foolish to reason and appear to be so false that if reason is at hand to judge and decide, it cannot believe them but promptly leaves them, goes wrong, and considers them simply worthless. * Sermon on John 6:47.

Some Illustrations — We have the same experience a man has whose head is dizzy. When he is to climb a high tower or to pass over a bridge under which deep water is flowing, one must simply blind him, must hang a coat over his head and lead and carry him blindfolded; otherwise he falls from the tower and breaks his neck or falls into the water and drowns. Just so we, too, must follow our Guide if we would be saved. Then we are safe. We, too, must simply close our eyes, follow the leader, the divine Word, and say: I will let myself be wrapped in swaddling clothes, will let a coat be put about my head, and will let myself be led to that which I believe and do not see; and thus will I live and die. *Exposition of John 3:9-11.

Taxpayer Money is Now Funding "I Love Islam" Program

Secretary of State John Kerry has approved the funding of an "I love Islam" program in the Czech Republic. American taxpayers are now paying for children in the Czech Republic to learn and study Islam.

The Clarion Project stated the following about the "I love Islam" program: "The project – Muslims in the Eyes of Czech Schoolchildren – is being spearheaded by a Muslim advocacy group and is being financed by American taxpayers through a grant from the U.S. Embassy in Prague (the U.S. State Department is also promoting Islam in other European countries)."

The program has three levels of study. The Clarion Project gives the three levels on its website. The website states; "The first level acquaints the reader with the history of Islam, the basic religious concepts of tradition, and contemporary issues such as family law, the veiling of women and Islamophobia.

"The second level offers a deeper look at the issues ... Pupils will be divided into three groups within which they will study any of the following topics: the veiling of women, media coverage of Islam, and Muslims in the Czech Republic.

"The third level provides schools with artistically oriented projects or discussions with Muslims and professionals dealing with Islam."

Not only are we told to keep silent about Islam and its radical teachings, but now we are forced to pay for children to learn and study about it.

Medicare Ends 33-year Ban on Sex Reassignment Surgery

SAN FRANCISCO - Medicare can no longer automatically deny coverage requests for sex reassignment

surgeries, a federal board ruled Friday [May 30, 2014] in a groundbreaking decision that recognizes the procedures are medically necessary for people who don't identify with their biological sex.

Ruling in favor of a 74-year-old transgender Army veteran whose request to have Medicare pay for her genital reconstruction was denied two years ago, the agency's Departmental Appeals Board said there was no justification for a three-decade-old HHS rule excluding such surgeries from procedures covered by the national health program for the elderly and disabled.

Jennifer Levi, a lawyer who directs the Transgender Rights Project of Gay & Lesbian Advocates and Defenders in Boston, said the ruling does not mean Medicare recipients are necessarily entitled to have sex reassignment surgery paid for by the government. Instead, the lifting of the coverage ban means they now will be able to seek authorization by submitting documentation from a doctor and mental health professionals stating that surgery is recommended in their individual case, Levi said. ...

Gary Gates, a demographer with the Williams Institute, a think tank on LGBT issues based at the University of California, Los Angeles, has estimated that people who self-identify as transgender make up 03 percent of the U.S. adult population. More than 49 million Americans are enrolled in Medicare.

The cost of gender reassignment surgery varies, but typically ranges from \$7,000 to \$50,000, said the Transgender Law Center in Oakland, Calif ...

The panel went on to say that regardless of what the record showed then, studies and experts have since shown the efficacy of surgical interventions as a treatment for gender dysphoria, the diagnosis given to people who experience extreme distress due to the disconnect between their birth sex and their gender identity.

Psalm 51

"In this volume, which like the former, contains twenty-six sacred odes, we have several of the more memorable and precious of Zion's songs. In commenting upon some of them, I have been overwhelmed with awe, and said with Jacob, "How dreadful is this place, it is none other than the house of God." Especially was this the case with the fifty-first; I postponed expounding it week after week, feeling more and more my inability for the work. Often I sat down to it, and rose up again without having penned a line. It is a bush burning with fire yet not consumed, and out of it a voice seemed to cry to me, "Draw not nigh hither, put off thy shoes from off thy feet."

"The Psalm is very human, its cries and sobs are of one born of woman, but it is freighted with an inspiration all divine, as if the Great Father were putting words into his child's mouth. Such a Psalm may be wept over, absorbed into the soul, and exhaled again in devotion, but commented on — ah! where is he who having attempted it can do other than blush at his defeat? "

From the "Preface" of *The Treasury of David*, Vol. II by C.H.Spurgeon, 1882

Comment: In Psalm Fifty-one, David had sinned against Bathsheba with adultery and had her husband Uriah killed in battle. David attempted to cover it up, but the Lord saw the whole thing and sent the prophet Nathan to confront David about his sin. We read in this account that David said, "I have sinned against the Lord." (2 Sam. 12:13) Lest we think that this is all that was involved in his getting forgiveness for these sins, Psalm Fifty-one records what God did in David's life to bring him to repentance: "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit. A broken and a contrite heart, O God, Thou wilt not despise." (Ps. 51:17)

Brokenness

Brokenness is something that is foreign to many people today. To have your heart broken means the thing that is nearest and dearest to you is broken, like a young woman in love with her fiancee has her heart broken if he breaks up with her. So when God brings brokenness of heart, He takes the most precious and dearest things that reign paramount in your life and shatters them before your eyes. This would be all your dreams and aspirations, hopes and joys in life and have them brought to nothing. If there is anything in your life that is getting your attention before God, that is an affront to the First Commandment, and it must go. God will see that this happens.

God also takes all of your religious goodness and all your righteousness and has them crushed before your eyes.

You will be led to see that you are utterly hopeless and totally lost before God based on the greatest goodness you can muster, and you now have nothing to avail. Specifically, your life before the Commandments of God is laid bare and you realize how you stand before an all-holy God. "For my iniquities have gone over my head, they weigh like a burden too heavy for me. …I am utterly spent and crushed; I groan because of the tumult of my heart." (Ps. 38:4, 8)

After you are broken before God, suddenly, many of the things in the world that once held your life are now not very important at all – because the self-life has been broken.

Contrition

Contrition means that you are ground down – like putting graham crackers in a bag and crushing them with a rolling pin. It means that you are terrified before God of what you have done and what God will do to you as a result. It means that your life is laid bare before God and even the least passing thought is seen in all its blackness.

The time in my life when this happened to me, I laid in bed with sweat on my brow and dread in my heart that Jesus was coming and would cast me into hell. I would open my drape and look at a street light just so I didn't have to lay in darkness. "I'd rather die than live this way." I lived with that thought for a month under conviction of sin.

Conviction and contrition is absolutely foreign to many pastors and ministries today. The method today is to present a story with a biblical truth intertwined WITHOUT any talk of sin, condemnation, judgment, repentance – and no conviction of sin and no brokenness or contrition of heart. A church in the Twin Cities brought in a 600+ pound lion for Easter services and were going to set it on the stage with a lamb. The people were really excited about it. "What a novel approach - What innovative thinking - What great publicity - It even made the evening news!" They did it to add realism to the story, "The Lion and the Lamb," which was written by a Christian author. This isn't even in the Bible! Do you expect to convert people using this? Do you expect people to come under conviction of sin? Maybe the fear of being attacked by a lion, but little else. Isn't it interesting that the very method that God uses to convert people is what most won't do. "The Lord is near to the broken hearted, And saves those who are contrite in spirit" (Ps. 34:18)

Dear reader, are you broken and crushed over your sins before God?

Wisdom From a Watermelon

I was passing through Columbus, Ohio and stopped to eat in the depot restaurant. My attention was called to a slice of watermelon, and I ordered it and ate it. I was so pleased with the melon that I asked the waiter to dry some of the seeds that I might take them home and plant them in my garden.

That night a thought came into my mind – I would use the watermelon as an illustration. So the next morning when I reached Chicago, I had weighed enough seeds to find out that it would take more than two thousand of them to weigh a pound. Estimating the weight of the watermelon from which I had eaten, I applied the mathematics.

A few weeks before this time, someone unknown to me had planted a little seed in the ground. Under the influence of sunshine and shower, that little watermelon seed had taken off its coat and gone to work. It had gathered more than thirty thousand times its own weight and forced that enormous weight through a tiny stem and built a watermelon. On the outside it had put a covering of green, within that a rind of white, and within that a core of red. Then it had scattered little seeds throughout the red, each one capable of doing the same work over again.

What architect drew the plan? Where did that little watermelon seed get its tremendous strength? Where did it find its flavoring extract and its coloring matter? How did it build a watermelon?

Until you can explain a watermelon, do not be too sure you can set limits to the power of the Almighty or tell just what He will do or how He will do it. The most learned man in the world cannot explain a watermelon, but the most ignorant man in the world can eat a watermelon and enjoy it.

God has given us the things that we need, and He has given us the knowledge necessary to use those things. Receiving the truth that He has revealed to us is infinitely more important for our welfare than it would be to understand the mysteries that He has seen fit to conceal from us.

So it is with Christianity. If you ask me whether or not I can understand everything in the Bible, I answer no. I understand some things that I did not understand ten years ago; and if I live ten years longer I hope some things will then be clear that are obscure.

But there is something more important than understanding everything in the Bible. If we will only try to live up to the things that we do understand, we will not have time to worry about the things that we do not understand.

HEART MATTERS

Our hearts pump at a rate of 70-75 beats per minute. Though weighing only 11 ounces on average, a healthy heart pumps 2,000 gallons of blood through 60,000 miles of blood vessels each day. Every day, the heart creates enough energy to drive a truck 20 miles. In a lifetime, that is equivalent to driving to the moon and back. A healthy heart can do amazing things. Conversely, if our heart malfunctions, our whole body shuts down.

The same could be said of our "spiritual heart." In Scripture, the word <u>heart</u> represents the center of our emotions, thinking, and reasoning. It is the "command center" of our life.

So when we read, "Keep your heart with all diligence" (Prov. 4:23), it makes a lot of sense. But it's difficult advice to keep. Life will always make demands upon our time and energy that cry out for immediate attention. By comparison, taking time to hear God's Word and to do what it says may not shout quite so loudly. We may not notice the consequences of neglect right away, but over time it may give way to a spiritual heart attack.

I'm thankful God has given us His Word. We need this help not to neglect it, but to use it to align our hearts with His every day.

Balaam's Error

"Woe unto them! For they ... ran greedily after the error of Balaam for reward." (Jude 1:11)

Balaam is a very complex character recorded in Numbers 22 – 24. He is cited for an ability to communicate with "the LORD" and had a reputation for accurate prophecy (Numbers 22:6-8). As the new nation of Israel traveled northward into the Sinai Peninsula, Balak the king of Moab became worried that Israel would subjugate his nation and recruited Balaam to curse them.

Balaam "loved the wages of unrighteousness" (2 Peter 2:15) BUT WAS ASTUTE ENOUGH TO KNOW THAT HE COULD NOT TALK God into doing anything God did not want to do! But even though Balaam was aware of the dangers of getting involved on the wrong side of God's work, he wormed and squirmed through several interchanges with God until he was finally allowed to go. "God's anger was kindled" at the stubbornness of this man, and the famous interchange with the donkey took place (Numbers 22:22-31).

Still Balaam persisted with his venture for Balak of Moab and "ran greedily" after the reward that he had been promised. When he arrived at the place where he planned to curse Israel, Balaam knew enough about the correct sacrifices to build the right kind of altars and sacrifice the right kind of animals, then proceeded to seek God's "word" for Israel. Three times God "put a word" in Balaam's mouth to bless Israel, and three times Balak insisted that he try again to curse them.

Instead of repenting of his foolishness, Balaam bragged about his ability to know what God wanted and "taught Balak" to cast a stumbling-block before the children of Israel" (Revelation 2:14). Those who prostitute the gifts of God for their own profit will come under a "greater condemnation" (James 3:1). May God protect us from the Balaams among the churches.

CONCERNING SELF-DENIAL, THE CONDITION OF CHRISTIAN DISCIPLESHIP

"If any man will come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me."

(Matt. 16:24)

In Christ, liberty! How attractive such a promise to young (any age) Christians, at just the age when the desire for liberty is beginning to assert itself within! Be not servants of men! "If the Son, therefore, shall make you free, you shall be free indeed."

And yet, listen to the demand which at the very outset your Savior makes of you: "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself." Christ has many admirers, but few followers, for the very reason that few are willing to fulfill the condition of true discipleship. You know the story of the rich young ruler who came to Jesus asking about the Way of Life. When Jesus called on him to forsake all that he counted dearest, he turned away sorrowful. You too have vowed, in sacred earnest, we trust, "Lord, I will follow thee." But will you still be willing to follow him if he shall call upon you to renounce, it may be, your fondest inclinations, or to crucify this or that base passion? The Master demands complete possession of us. Deny thyself! Self-will must die in us; everything by which we are held in captivity to sin and the world, all that draws us away from Christ, must die: pride, self-righteousness, self-seeking. This is what Christ calls for, - Self-denial! (Ed. Not an excuse – please: but we have a three-fold enemy – the old nature, the world and the 'deceiver/Satan' to battle with).

It is not the work of an hour. The lesson which our Savior sets for us in that one word requires a life-time for its learning. But as we come more and more to know his love toward us, we shall find the lesson easier and our cross growing lighter. And doubt not that there will be crosses to bear; the world will see to that. Opposition, contempt, and many a smarting wound await him who means to prove himself a disciple indeed. God allows it to be so, since such things work in us the death of self. But although at the beginning of the way we may be prone to exclaim "It costs much to be a Christian," know that at the end we shall find it possible to say, "It is not hard to be a Christian."

It is such disciples whom Christ can (will) use in his service, and it is unto such that he reveals also the blessedness of his service, delivered from the world, they abide in constant fellowship with God. With such a vision of God's glory, Moses was then able to lead the Israelite multitude for 40 years in a terrible wilderness, transforming them from a mob of slaves into God's chosen nation, ready to bring God's Word, and God's Son, into the world.

We also can see His way and His glory. Jesus said, "I am the way" (John 14:6). Then He prayed: "Father, I will that they also, whom thou hast given me, be with me where I am; that they may behold my glory" (John 17:24).

In the first place, be kind, be willing to work, and be ready to make sacrifices. By so doing you will be doing the work of God. And in the next place, pray for eyes that see the needs of people wherever you are, both the spiritual and the physical can work."


Gideon answered God's call. He pulled down Baal's altar, destroyed his images, and then erected an altar for


When Jesus is in your heart, you are ready for life, for death and for the judgment. Are you ready?

Dr. Ben Carson, renown neurosurgeon at John Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore, Maryland, recently revealed that he had been the object of an audit by the Internal Revenue Service. His first such audit came just four months after he gave a speech that offered an alternative proposal to Obamacare at the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, DC, where Barrack Obama sat only a few feet away.

Dr. Carson, whose life and skills as a surgeon were the subject of a movie and a book entitled <u>Gifted Hands</u>, said the audit yielded nothing.

Earlier this year Dr. Franklin Graham wrote a letter to President Obama, stating that someone in his administration had targeted an IRS investigation on his organization, Samaritan's Purse and on his father's organization, the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association.

The IRS's audit of Dr. Carson has raised more red flags for people concerned over the number of conservatives who have been targeted for audits in the past couple of years. Officials at the IRS have admitted targeting conservatives, but the media has largely ignored the story and little has happened to those who gave and/or carried out the orders for such audits.
