And as all that proceeded from the springs must be muddy, because the fountain was so, the Lord Jesus Christ came to take our natures upon Him, to die a shameful, a painful, and an accursed death for our sakes; He died for our sins, and to bring us to God: He cleansed us by His

blood from the guilt of sin. He satisfied for our imperfections; and now, my brethren, we have access unto Him with boldness. He is a mediator between us and his offended Father.

Therefore, if we do but consider into what state, and at how great a distance from God we are fallen - how vile our natures were; what a depravity, and how incapable to restore that image of God to our souls, which we lost in our first parents - when I consider these things, my brethren, and that the Lord Jesus Christ came to restore us to that favor with God which we had lost, and that Christ not only came down with an intent to do it, but actually accomplished all that was in His heart toward us - that He raised and brought us into favor with God, that we might find kindness and mercy in His sight – surely this calls for some return of thanks on our part to our dear Redeemer, for this love and kindness to our souls. How just would it have been of Him, to have left us in that deplorable state wherein we, by our guilt, had involved ourselves? For God could not, nor can receive any additional good by our salvation; but it was love, mere love; it was free love that brought the Lord Jesus Christ into our world about 1,700 years ago.

What, shall we not remember the birth of our Jesus? Shall we yearly celebrate the birth of our temporal king, and shall that of the King of kings be quite forgotten? — Shall that only, which ought to be had chiefly in remembrance, be, quite forgotten? God forbid! No, my dear brethren, let us celebrate and keep this festival of our church, with joy in our hearts: let the birth of a Redeemer,

A WORD from the Pastor

"I am afraid that, as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, your minds will be led astray from the simplicity and purity of devotion to Christ." [2 Cor. 11:3] Keep it simple! In intellectual matters you can think things out with your own logical understanding but in spiritual matters you must have the mind of Christ to see things clearly. Spiritually we can only think clearly when we are being obedient to Christ.

2 Corinthians 10:5 says, "...we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ." When God puts a conviction in your heart, obey, and then everything will become clear to you. Until you obey you will walk in spiritual darkness. Oswald Chambers puts it this way ... "The tiniest thing we allow in our lives that is not under the control of the Holy Spirit is quite sufficient to account for spiritual muddle, and all the thinking we like to spend on it will never make it clear. Spiritual muddle is only made plain by obedience. Immediately we obey, we discern. ...When the natural power of vision is devoted to the Holy Spirit, it becomes the power of perceiving God's will and the whole life is kept in simplicity."

The biblical truth Chambers is sharing is simply this, the smallest unconfessed sin will keep you in spiritual darkness. Only when you confess and repent of sin will you be able to see things clearly. If you want to know that your understanding of things is right, make sure your relationship with Christ is good, unhindered by sinful attitude or actions. Usually when people storm ahead with a lack of knowledge and understanding it is because they have not dealt with sin in their lives.

We need to pray the prayer of David, "Search me oh God and see if there be some wicked way in me." [Psalm 139:23]

WILL YOU HAVE A 'WHITE CHRISTMAS'?

"For He made him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (II Corinthians 5:21)

Some years ago, especially at this 'season' of the year, there was a secular song that was sung quite regularly that stated, '<u>I am dreaming of a white Christmas, just like the ones I used to know</u>'. Now what would you do IF there was no 'white snow' in your part of the world? A missionary friend of ours struggled with that a little in the area of the world where she was serving our crucified and risen Savior! Actually she ended up decorating a cactus as a 'Christmas Tree'! But the 'reality' of Christmas does not change IF there is 'snow' available or not.

According to the dictionary, the word 'snow' is: "Translucent crystals of ice that form from water vapor in the upper atmosphere and fall to earth." Actually, I understand that if you observe a 'snowflake' under a powerful microscope, a 'snowflake' is made up of numerous dazzling colors, not seen with the natural eye. Personally I doubt if the 'hills' around Bethlehem at the <u>time</u> the shepherds were keeping 'watch' over their flock by night were 'snow' covered. But without any debate on that, let us look at a 'snowflake' a little more in depth.

I remember as a child that my parents would tell us not to eat 'snow' because it was 'dirty'. To us the freshly fallen 'snow' looked so clean and pure, but our parents told us this because they cared about us and our well being. You know, we should have listened and obeyed because of their entrusted position as 'parents' and then been satisfied with that.

By the way, what 'symbolic color' is SIN? That is, IF we are going to give 'sin' a color! Often we describe 'sin' as 'black'; likely because SIN blinds our spiritual 'eyes' and plunges us in 'darkness' (black). But when it comes to a 'color' Scriptures seems to indicate that 'sin' is likely RED. "Come now, and let us reason together," Says the LORD: 'Though your sins are like scarlet, They shall be as white as snow; 'Though they are red lied like crimson, They shall be as wool. '" Isaiah 1:18. Notice first of all that our LORD says 'come now' and 'now' means 'now'. Also HE lets us use our 'reason'. It has been said IF you look through the right kind of <u>red</u> glass at the right fabric that is <u>red</u> in color, it will appear <u>WHITE!</u> But what a *miracle* when our <u>awesome holy</u> <u>GOD</u> looks through the shed **blood** of His SON at a repentant sinner who confesses his 'sins' to Him. In HIS Awesome GRACE, through His Beloved SON, that person appears pure before our thrice HOLY GOD as though he had never sinned. What a SAVIOR, What a Miracle! Isn't it amazing that JESUS made Heaven poor in order to make us rich! That Jesus was born to die, be crucified, and rise again for your 'sin' and 'my' sin and for the sins of the whole world! JESUS was born to DIE; you and I were born to LIVE and each of us will spend all eternity in one of two eternal eternities! "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich." II Corinthians 8:9, Daniel 12:3, Malachi 3:17. What a Christmas GIFT – but in order for a 'gift' to be effective YOU have to receive (accept) it. You see, it is only the LOST who need a Savior!

Let's get back to a 'snowflake'! Within every 'snowflake' there is a 'particle of dust'. YES, we are dirty (sinners to the very core) and we must be covered with the **blood** of JESUS in order to stand clean (white) before God. "But we are all like an unclean thing, And all our righteousnesses are like filthy rags..." before God, Isaiah 64:6. Let's also get back to a miracle found in Luke 15:22, Revelation 6:11, 7:9 7:14. (Not the speechless person found in the parable of Matthew 22:1-14). Just 'think' of what it means to be justified before a HOLY GOD! IN Luther's Small Catechism Explained, it asks the question, "What is Justification?" "Justification is the gracious act of God whereby He for Christ's sake acquits a repentant and believing sinner of his sin and guilt, and looks upon him, in Christ, as though he had never sinned." Notice God is the "Justifier" and it takes place in HEAVEN. Romans 3:24 & 1 John 1:7-10. No wonder some think of the beloved flag of our USA as standing for: Red - blood, Blue - Royalty or kingly & White - clean pure! YET our beloved Nation is made up of "individuals" as is 'Salvation', for only for those who are personally/individually LOST can truly be saved.

Wisconsin Attorney General Won't Defend Same-Sex Law in Court

A lawsuit seeking to overturn Wisconsin's same-sex domestic partnership registry as unconstitutional received a boost August 21 when the state's attorney general announced that he too believes the law conflicts with Wisconsin's constitutional marriage amendment.

Wisconsin Attorney General J. B. Van Hollen, a Republican, said he will not defend the law in court and is recommending that the state hire private attorneys. The law, which went into effect in early August, establishes a domestic partnership registry and grants homosexual couples some but not all of the legal benefits of marriage. Van Hollen drew sharp criticism from Democratic Governor Jim Doyle, who signed the law and says other attorneys believe it is constitutional.

Liberty Counsel wins victory over ACLU

On August 24, Federal District Judge Casey Rodgers ruled that Michelle Winkler was not in contempt of court for having her husband pray at an awards banquet.

In January 2009, Judge Rodgers had entered a broadly worded injunction against Santa Rosa County (Florida) School District, Winker's employer, regarding prayer and religious activities of school employees.

Winkler later attended a privately funded, off-campus event after school hours to honor instructional employees of the school district. She asked her husband to read a prayer blessing she wrote for the honorees.

The ACLU claimed Winkler should be held in civil contempt of the court order. Judge Rodgers ruled against

the ACLU, concluding that Winker's husband's prayer at a voluntary gathering outside the school did not violate the court's order.

What? AARP pushing porn?

The videos can have the same effect as run-of-the-mill hardcore pornography. And for millions of Americans, viewing hardcore pornography is a ruinous addiction....

President's 9/11 Proclamation?

On September 3, 2009, the White House released "a proclamation" by the President announcing "National Days of Prayer and Remembrance 2009."

In it he proclaimed "Friday, September 4 through Sunday, September 6" as days for "the people of the United States, each in their own way, (to) honor the victims of September 11, 2001..."

There are two things of note here:

1. Since the proclamation was released on Thursday, just one day ahead of the September 4-6 date, it seems like they did not expect many people to be involved.

2. The proclamation invited us "each in his own way" to pray, etc., and then three days were earmarked for it – Friday (that's the Muslim day of worship), Saturday (that's the Jewish Sabbath) and Sunday (that's for Christians). So without saying so, the President once again has given place to Muslims. It is all the more egregious in reference to September 11.

Bible Reading During Show and Tell Free Speech Case

Attorneys for the Rutherford Institute have asked the United States Supreme Court to hear the case of a Pennsylvania mother who was forbidden from reading a passage from Psalms as part of an "All about Me" kindergarten classroom program intended to spotlight her son and his favorite book, the Bible. In challenging a ruling by the Third Circuit Court of Appeals, Rutherford Institute attorneys argue that the appellate court's decision gives school officials too much discretion to discriminate against expression on the basis of its religious nature in violation of the First Amendment.

"By excluding religious expression, and Christian expression and symbols in particular, from the classroom, school officials have exhibited the kind of hostility toward religion that should never be found in an American public school," stated John W. Whitehead, president of the Rutherford Institute.

"If these acts of censorship and discrimination are allowed to continue, there will be absolutely no freedom for religious people in public schools in this country."

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SING A NEW SONG

Luke 1:67-80

(Jesus will) give light to those who sit in darkness..., to guide our feet into the way of peace. –Luke 1:79

Two passages in Luke related to the birth of Jesus are often called "songs" because of their similarity to Hebrew psalms of the Old Testament. The early church set them to music and used them in worship. One of them, the Magnificat of Mary (1:46-55), is well known. But the second "song" is a less familiar poem of praise, which was spoken by Zacharias, the father of John the Baptist (vv.67-79).

After 9 months of divinely imposed silence, Zacharias was finally able to speak. He announced that the miracle baby born to him and Elizabeth would be named John. Then, filled with the Holy Spirit, Zacharias spoke of God's faithfulness and the salvation He would bring through the Messiah.

Zacharias said that Jesus, "through the tender mercy of our God, with which the Dayspring from on high has visited us," would come "to give light to those who sit in darkness and the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace" (vv.78-79).

For a fresh look at the birth of Jesus this Christmas, consider Zacharias' words of prophecy and exultation. Read them aloud. Ponder their meaning. Let God use them to write a new song of praise deep in your heart. –David McCasland

This Christmas sing a new song That comes from deep within, A song that honors Christ the Lord, Who saves us from our sin. –Hess

"No Religion" Groups Growing in the USA

In a study released on September 22 by Hartford, Connecticut's Trinity College, 19 percent of men and 12 percent of women in the USA identify themselves as "faith free." Whether or not the study is completely accurate, it does pinpoint a growing trend in our country. It should be a flag of warning to all of us.

While the percentage of out-and-out atheists does not seem to be increasing, the growing "faith free" group seems to be a variety of agnostics and rationalists. About half of them in the survey that sampled over 54,000 adults believe in "God or a Higher Power," but they do not give place to the Bible or church.

As we review the study and as we observe what we see on the streets, several conclusions must be made.

1. We have competition!

The media, the educational system and the entertainment industry are all marching to the beat of a different drummer. They are rarely neutral on matters of faith. Increasingly, they are hostile and militant about it.

2. So many Christian have lost their way!

When the religious crowd adopts evolution, gives place to political correctness (alcohol, homosexuality, etc.), accommodates the culture (pleases the crowd more than God), waters down its message (contemporary) and refuses to engage itself in the issues, you can be sure that its influence will wain.

3. Many pulpits are lifeless!

Strong, Bible-centered, authoritative preaching is very hard to find today. The softball, ear-tickling, soft-soaping, rock-no-boat pulpiteers pander to the carnality of the crowd and leave things as they are.

4. Most churches are not soul saving stations!

Most, not all but most, of America's "churches" are social clubs with no biblical vision and no scriptural mandates.

Our nation is plunging into a "faith free" free fall and speeding on its way toward Hell while the churches play games, have fun and pursue their own self-centered interests.

5. Convictions are scarce!

A philosophy of pragmatism (do it if it works) has replaced Bible-based values, convictions and doctrines. With the value system in a constant state of flux, our society takes note of the wishy-washy mentality and laughs at it.

6. Convenience and comfort hold sway!

What has happened to the concepts of dedication including sacrifice? Who now is willing to pay the price and take the stand that will confront the world head-on?

Who will refuse the pleasures of the palace to be identified with the people of God (Heb. 11:25)?

When all we can see is our own situation, it's no wonder no one listens when we talk!

7. The shifting sands of compromise betray us!

Everything is changing! Change Bibles! Change music! Change standards! Change, change, change! Go ahead and see how many of the children of the world will change to become children of God. All the shifting and drifting betrays our cause, and a lost but longing world with disappointment in their eyes glances another way. They remain lost because we did not stand true!

IT'S TIME TO TRIM OUR LAMPS

(Storm Clouds Are Gathering Fast)

One verse out of the well-known parable of the ten virgins pinpoints a need of our day: "*Then all those virgins arose, and trimmed their lamps*" (Matt. 25:7). That action immediately revealed the sad state and condition of five of those persons: "....and the foolish said unto the wise, Give us of your oil: for our lamps are gone out;" (v. 8). It is time to trim our lamps, and we must not delay, for some may find as a consequence that their oil has run out.

Those who have grown up in that part of the country known as Tornado Alley can remember those times when a storm cloud would arise during the night. Mother or Dad would come in to the bedside of sound-asleep children and, with a gentle shaking, say, "Children, there's a storm coming, and it doesn't look good. We must go to the cellar." Father would get the old lantern, and with a creak, the globe would be raised so the wick could be lit. With the lighted lantern ready, Dad would say, "Let's go now; the storm is almost here." Down in the cellar we huddled around the light of the lamp, feeling a certain solace from the flickering light while the storm raged outside.

Is there any reasonable person today who does not feel that the storm clouds are gathering fast, and that they could soon break upon us? While some men are majoring in prophecy and making detailed predictions, we leave that to them. However, it is clear that the spirit and events of the world are falling into the general outline of the prophecies of the end times. Without question, it is time to trim our lamps so the True light can shine forth.

The wick of an oil-burning lamp becomes fouled with use. When the wick becomes fouled, the flame does not burn evenly. It begins to smoke and light is dimmed. The accumulation on the end of the wick needs to be cut away.

WITHOUT THE BIBLE, MEN WOULD BE IN UTTER IGNORANCE OF THE FUTURE!

Then the flame will burn evenly all the way across and will give a good amount of light without smoking.

Sanctification in the Christian's life does this for the believer. With daily living, one's Christian life begins to take on those hindrances that restrict the light. When those things that foul the flame are permitted and not taken away, an inconsistent Christian life results. An untrimmed wick might have a portion where the flame hardly burns. On the other side a finger of flame reaches up high, and from its tip comes smoke that blackens the lamp's globe. This well illustrates an inconsistent Christian life. The profession is there, but the condition of the flame is saying that something needs adjustment. It is time to trim our lamps.

We know not exactly what the approaching cloud will hold for the true Christians, except that the coming of the Lord is drawing near. The cry is sounding forth, heralding the Bridegroom's coming. We must trim our lamps now.

There may be points in the parable of the ten virgins not so clearly understood. But on the other hand, there are those things that cannot be misunderstood, and those we dare not ignore. One of these has to do with time, and finality of eternity.

In their carelessness, the five foolish virgins waited too long to do something about their need. They did not wait a year too long, or a month, or even a day. They waited just a **little** too long. When their desperate situation became apparent, they tried to borrow from the faithful. But as the Bridegroom was approaching, they quickly went to buy: "...and while they went to buy, the bridegroom came; and the door was shut ..." (vv. 10,11). They were just a little late – but too late. When the true Bridegroom comes, many shall make a desperate effort to buy, but it will be just a little too late, and that will be for all eternity.

"But he answered and said, Verily I say unto you, I know you not" (v.12). Man tends to look at this matter of carelessness with our lamps too lightly. We excuse our inconsistencies in many ways. But the truth is that according to Jesus it is a serious matter. Carelessness in Christian living is a sin. What else would cause the Lord, who died for sinners, redeemed them, made them His own, on the Last Day say to some of them, "I know you not" (see also Luke 13:24-29)? It is time to trim our lamps and deal with those areas that run counter to the faith as sin.

When the Lord comes again, He will return to a world darkened by sin. But as He comes, may He see the faithful with their lamps "*all trimmed and bright*."

A Power Name: "MIGHTY GOD"

Unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given ...And His name will be called ...Mighty God. (Isa. 9:6)

The name "Mighty God" is an Old Testament title here applied to the coming Messiah. It is the compound Hebrew term *El Gibbor*; and both parts of the name need to be understood.

God. The first part of the title is *El*. Even though Jesus himself pointed out that the title is sometimes used of mighty sons of men (John 10:34), *El* is so often used of God, and only God, that the prophet Hosea used *El* to set God in contrast to man in Hosea 11:9.

Isaiah 9:6 was predicting One who would be far more than a man. This is indicated not only by the third name "Everlasting Father: and by other prophetic references such as Isaiah 2:1-4, but by the New Testament record of Christ. Jesus said, "Before Abraham was, I AM" (John 8:58). He is the One of whom John wrote: *In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without Him nothing was made that was made* (John 1:1-3).

Mighty. The other part of the name is *Gibbor*, which means "strength, power, hero." What a statement! In a world where heroes are determined by their athletic prowess or financial power, we are told that the only One truly worthy to be adored is the One whose might is unparalleled! Isaiah 10:21 describes Him as the refuge of the remnant, and Deuteronomy 10:17 declares that He is the "great God, mighty and awesome."

The focus of Isaiah's prophecy is *El Gibbor*; the Mighty God who is our true Hero. What this prophet in the seventh century BC anticipated, the New Testament confirms. Because the Messiah would be God, He would have God's power. But to Isaiah, the amazing thing was that the Messiah would not only have the power of God, He would be the God of power!

In other parts of his prophecy, Isaiah gave more details of what this mighty power would look like. For instance, in a messianic section of his prophecy, Isaiah declared: *The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon Me, because the LORD has anointed Me to preach good tidings to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to those who are bound; to proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD, and the day of vengeance of our God' to comfort all who mourn, to console those who mourn in Zion, to give them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heavi-* ness; that they may be called trees of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, that He may be glorified (61:1-3).

Jesus used Isaiah 61:1-3 to make His claim as the Messiah (Luke 4:16-21). But because He only partially fulfilled this prophecy in His first coming, He was only partially recognized. By His resurrection, perfect life, sacrificial death, and many mighty signs He showed we could trust Him to return one day to rule the world. Most of His own people rejected Him. John wrote, "*He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him*" (John 1:11).

In many cases, however, Jesus was recognized as the long-awaited Messiah. Nicodemus, a rabbi of Israel, recognized Him (cp. John 3 with John 19). The disciples recognized Him (cp. Matthew 8:27 with 16:16). Mary Magdalene recognized Him, and her life was transformed (Luke 8:2). Others' lives were changed as well, even the life of the church's most feared persecutor, Saul of Tarsus (Acts 9).

These and thousands of other first-century Jews believed – and for good reason. Jesus Christ proved Himself to be *El Gibbor* as He displayed His life-changing might and power.

For those who see their need of a Savior, the evidence of Christ's mighty power is overwhelming. For those who sense their own weakness and inability to live up to God's standard, the apostle John wrote, "As many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: (John 1:12).

What the New Testament provides is an opportunity to see the fullness of the "Mighty God" Isaiah was predicting. The clear statement of the Word of God is that Christ displayed His might in the creation of the world before He physically entered the world. John 1:3 says, "All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made." Colossians 1:16 agrees: "For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him."

In the midst of evidence that shows Christ to be the Mighty God, it is important to remember that this is more than just theological data. It is divinely inspired evidence that urges us to see and respond to Christ as He is – our "Mighty God."

In view of the predictive evidence of Isaiah and the historic record of the Gospels, how can we see our Lord Jesus Christ as anything less than the Mighty God, *El Gibbor?*

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Silent Night, Holy Night

This carol, rated the most popular of all Christmas carols, came into being in a small Austrian town in 1818.

Joseph Mohr, its author, was priest of the Roman Catholic Church of St. Nicholas in Oberndorf, Austria. Franz Grüber, its composer, was the church organist.

A group of touring actors were traveling through the countryside presenting a play based on the Nativity. When they came to Oberndorf, they were shocked to find they could not use the Catholic church because the organ was being repaired. They looked, and sure enough, parts were strewn allover the floor! "You can meet in our home," one of the townspeople volunteered. So all the interested people, including Father Mohr, went to the home where the play was presented.

The actors portrayed the Nativity with unusual earnestness and feeling. Everyone was deeply moved, especially the priest.

After the play ended, Father Mohr hurried off to meditate high on a hillside overlooking the village. Suddenly, Oberndorf was Bethlehem; the still, clear night of Austria was the holy hush over the hills of Judea. As he walked and contemplated Christ's coming to earth, words took shape in his mind.

"Silent night! Holy night! All is calm, all is bright Round yon Virgin Mother and Child! Holy Infant so tender and mild. Sleep in heavenly peace; sleep in heavenly peace."

The next morning he handed these lines to Franz Grüber. "See if you can wed these words to a melody," he smiled and said.

A simple, haunting refrain sang itself into the soul of Grüber and he wrote down the notes of what later was called, "Song from Heaven."

When the parishioners gathered for the Christmas Eve service, Mohr and Grüber, accompanied by Grüber's guitar (because the organ still wasn't working), sang for the first time this beloved melody of the holy night when God came to earth in human form.

Over one hundred and fifty years have passed since that Christmas Eve in Oberndorf, but no Christmas anywhere seems complete without the singing of "Silent Night."
