ulture today views Christmas as a time for ailing stores to boost their sales. It is viewed as a time for people to get together and take time off work. The whole message of Christmas has been lost by many, even by many in the church. It is just another time to get and give presents, go to church and be with friends.

Perhaps it might do us well to go back to the original Christmas and consider afresh what really took place. Since the fall of man in the Garden of Eden, mankind is alienated from God. They are born that way and will remain that way unless God does something. Being alienated from God means that mankind is under God's wrath because of their sins. This means that every person who will ever live is condemned to an everlasting place of fire, torment and separation from God. There is absolutely nothing that any man can do to change this. God is holy and He will judge each and every person in exact holiness. No one can stand before God in view of such standards, because "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Rom. 3:23) The reason that Christmas has lost its joy and real meaning is because mankind, and many in the church, have lost the view of the total depravity of man, and God's judgment upon them because of that.

When we read that an angel came to Joseph, he spoke of what would happen to the Virgin Mary. He said of Mary, "And she will bring forth a son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He shall save His people from their sins." (Matt. 1:21) Many people hear this old familiar line and just say, "Yea, I know that." But friend, do you really realize what it means? It means that God has done the impossible in making a virgin conceive. It means that a man child is coming into the world who has no sin. It means that God's plan of redemption for your eternal soul is under way. It means that this Jesus is the One, and Only One who can save you from the fierce wrath of God. It means that only this Jesus can save you from your sins. It means that God can now extend good will toward you and everyone else. It means that now, peace between God and man is made possible.

Were it not for this Jesus, life would have no hope. There would be no way for anyone to earn forgiveness of their sins. Life would be nothing more than a dreadful awaiting of death and hell. Even the happiest and greatest moments of life would bring no lasting joy, because the dreadful end awaits when everything life offers is suddenly taken away. When people realize the fierce control that sin has upon them ruining their lives, then the announcement of a coming Redeemer who will free them from sin's strong grip upon them brings anticipation of a better day.

Even in the face of death, this announcement of Christmas has power and life. When you stand at the grave of a loved one, you suddenly realize what an enemy

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death is against you. But then the coming of Jesus to save us from our sins and the death penalty against us is the only thing that can bring peace in the midst of grief.

As Christmas comes again this year, don't get lost in all the externals of the culture. The externals are not bad, but they can really distract you from the real joy and meaning found in the incarnation of the Son of God into humanity. I know of no better way to do this than to set time aside to really read the Christmas story afresh and realize that all this was done for you me. Read of the eternal destiny of mankind outside of Christ in Revelation 20:11-15. Hear the final verdict of the Judge, "Depart from Me, ye that work iniquity. I never knew you." (Matt. 7:23) Realize that everyone marches head down to an eternity in the lake of fire forever and ever. Then realize that this is where you would be if Jesus had not come. This will make you appreciate afresh the statement, "Unto you is born this day in the city of David, a Savior, which is Christ the Lord. " (Lk. 2:11)

The Secret Things

"The secret things belong unto the LORD our God, but those things which are revealed belong unto us and to our children for ever, that we may do all the works of this law." Deuteronomy 29:29

This portion of Scripture follows a lengthy restatement of the Covenant of God with His people, Israel. In this chapter, Moses reminded the people of the works that God had wrought on their behalf in their deliverance from Pharaoh, in His provision for them in the wilderness, and in His protection on the battlefield (vv. 2-8).

In this final address, he encouraged them to "keep therefore the words of this covenant, and do them, that ye may prosper in all that ye do" (v. 9), and stated the various blessings that would be theirs if they would do so. Lastly, he described, in graphic and burning words, the results of breaking the covenant and incurring the judgment of God (vv. 18-27). "And the LORD rooted them out of their land in anger, and in wrath, and in great indignation, and cast them into another land, as it is this day" (v. 28).

In recognition of the limitations of humankind, Moses wrote in our text that there are certain things known only to God, which He has veiled - things which cannot be understood by the human mind - things which He simply chooses to keep to Himself. But he goes on to say that He has revealed certain things to us, and these things we must obey. Consequently, our text consists of a great principle of life: We must do what we know to do. We don't know everything, but we must act responsibly and properly to that which He has told us, leaving the "secret things" and their consequences to God. Elsewhere, He promises that even the secret things will "work together for good to them that love God" (Romans 8:28) - in His sovereign plan. We must obey, doing what we know to do, and leave the results with Him. John D. Morris, Ph.D.

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The Law

"Do we then make the law of none effect through faith? God forbid; nay, we establish the law." Romans 3:31

Is not the command of the law, "Thou shalt, thou shalt not," out of order in connection with the believer's new attitude of heart and willing spirit?

Are not duty and love irreconcilable opposites? Does

not duty pass out when love enters in? And does not love go out when our relationship with God has become one based upon duty?

And if the law is written in our hearts, as the Scriptures say, is then any other commandment necessary?

Let us consider this briefly.

The new birth places a sinner in the right relationship to the requirements of God's law.

Old persons feel that the requirements of God are a burden, for they are strange and inimical to them.

New persons, on the other hand, love the law of God and, therefore, also their conscience, which in such a remarkable way brings the will of God into their very souls. Believers look upon their conscience as a friend helping them, with vigilance and without guile, both *to know and do* the will of God.

It is this to which James refers when he speaks of the law of liberty, speaking of it as perfect.

Here he unites liberty and law. They seem to be mutually exclusive. But life unites them. For love is this very union of liberty and law. God is bound to the law of love to such a degree that He cannot act contrary to it. But He has bound Himself voluntarily.

The miracle of the new birth is that it frees us from the compulsion of the law and writes the law into our hearts, enabling us to feel that we are the free children of God.

DOUBLE <u>DECEPTION</u> PLUS

"But evil men and impostors will grow worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. But you must continue in the things which you have learned and been assured of knowing from whom you have learned them." (II Timothy 3:13-14)

Our 'text' for this mediation, from God <u>is especially so</u> for us considering that likely we are living close to what we call the 'midnight hour' and/or the 'day' is far spent; therefore we need to 'redeem the time' for night cometh when no man can work.

Deception is a very subtle <u>enemy</u> of our eternal soul that we **are**! Can you imagine the **horror** of missing HEAVEN for ALL ETERNITY by only eighteen inches? Now *if you* don't really care where you will spend ETERNITY; don't read any further of this 'editorial'.

One definition of the word <u>deceive</u> is: "to cause to accept as true or valid what is false or invalid." <u>Deception</u> is "the act of deceiving, the fact or condition of being deceived." Generally, 'deception' is exercised/practiced by the telling of a lie in order to escape guilt or to gain an end.

NOW please <u>prayerfully</u> read the entire third chapter of II Timothy; because your heart and my heart is deceitful and desperately wicked. I don't say this; but GOD DID - **Jeremiah 17:9** *then notice verse* **10.** Now is this TRUTH telling only about some people, most people OR **all people?** (The latter is the Truth!). So we need to sit up and take notice *if you care* where <u>you</u> are going to spend Eternity! You know the institution of the Lord's Supper (Sacrament) when JESUS said one of the disciples was going to betray HIM, the apostles didn't immediately point their finger at Judas but asked the heart searching question: "Lord, Is It I?"

Scripture is very clear that we are to examine ourselves in the 'light' of the Bible. How we need to self-examine to check if we are abiding, continuing, residing **in Christ** OR *if* it is just 'head knowledge' and not 'heart' experience.

For example: remember that the Spirit of the Lord had left Samson and he knew it not! "*Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know y ourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you? unless indeed you are disqualified.*" II Corinthians 13:5. Here's where we notice the distinct line of demarcation which separates the righteous person from the hypocrite and the self-deceived person. Hypocrites fear self-examination and avoid it at almost any cost. Frequently they acquire much practice in comforting themselves and defending themselves against the restless thoughts which the Spirit of God puts into their conscience.

The 'righteous' (in Christ) somewhat fear also self-examination; but they desire nonetheless the 'Truth' and thus seek it. They want everything in the brilliant light of the Holy Scriptures. They desire to know the truth about themselves, even though it results in the passing of judgment upon their Christian life. They fear lest they have made a 'compact' with some sin. They do not want to defend or excuse some sin in their life. They have learned to have a holy lack of confidence in themselves – therefore they ask the Lord to try them! "Search me, O God and know my heart! ...And see if there be any wicked way in me, And lead me in the way everlasting!"

"Beware of dogs, beware of evil workers, beware of the mutilation! Philippians 3:2. "Then many false prophets will rise up and deceive many." "For false christs and false prophets will rise and show great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect. See, I have told you before hand" Matthew 24:11, 24-25, Please read also vv. 12 & 13. NOTICE: Colossians 2:8, 1 Timothy 1:19, 11 Peter 3:17, Matthew 7:15, 11 Corinthians 11:13, Titus 1:16, Matthew 7:22-23 & Isaiah 56:10-11.

"To the law and to the testimony! If they do not speak according to this word, it is because there is no light in them. Isaiah 8:20.

"Look to yourselves, that we do not lose those things we worked for, but that we may receive a full reward. Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son. If anyone comes to you and does not bring this doctrine, do not receive him into your house nor greet him; for he who greets him shares in his evil deeds" II John 8-11.

Martin Luther had <u>three</u> grave 'concerns' when it came to "Apostasy" (falling away/thus being deceived) and that is that we would believe others will be deceived, others are being deceived; but that I will not be deceived! Thus he shares that (semi-quote) 'he who does not fear himself, has the greatest reason to fear of ALL.'

Lord, is it I?

WHY SING HYMNS?

(Interesting!!)

Our Youth Are Growing up never Learning the Hymns!

The definite 'trend' today is to replace traditional hymns with contemporary praise choruses. But 'actually' is this trend good? All ages (youth) today need the strong focus on doctrine that the hymns and choruses provide. Hymns present a clear expression of the knowledge of God, and they teach Biblical truths as Scripture admonishes:

"Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs." Colossians 3:16.

Therefore, most contemporary praise choruses lack this emphasis. For example, a Muslim can sing many of the contemporary praise choruses today and never utter a contradiction of his faith because these praise choruses tend to focus on our affections for God rather than on Scriptural <u>doctrinal truth</u>. On the other hand, a Muslim cannot sing a Christian hymn without professing doctrine that contradicts his Islamic faith. Many of the contemporary praise choruses often omit the identity of the God to Whom we sing, as they are so vague they could be sung to any false god. <u>Good Gospel choruses are an appropriate role in our worship</u>, but they should not take the place of hymns so rich in <u>doctrine</u>.

Not only is it unwise to discard 'our' traditional hymns, but dangerous in that it gives us a doctrinal distinction and identification about 'our' God. This does not make 'us'; but it does make us distinctively different in our 'worship' of our living God.

"Our" first and major concern (conviction) should not be what is most pleasing to my emotions and flesh, but what Hymns, Gospel songs and Choruses are the most pleasing to our Living God!

Singing traditional Hymns, that are doctrinal sound, is one way of helping to protect our younger generations from 'drifting away', as is the indictment in Hosea 4:1: YES, 'we' stand in NEED of your Prayer Support, Encouragement & Financial Means! - but <u>"THANKS BE</u> <u>TO GOD FOR HIS INDESCRIBABLE GIFT!"</u> II Corinthians 9:15

What About This RAPTURE Business?

Two cars were sitting next to each other in the parking lot of a seminary near Milwaukee. The bumper sticker on one car said "Jesus is Coming." The bumper sticker on the other car said, "Escape to Wisconsin." This past spring a preacher by the name of Harold Camping falsely predicted that the world would end on May 21st. When it didn't happen, he promised it would end on October 21st. Sadly, he predicted the same thing about May 21st, 1988 and September 7th, 1994. Each time he falsely prophesied, he mentioned that the rapture would take place, followed by months of chaos and plagues on the earth with millions dying. Harold Camping is unfortunately confused about a Bible doctrine. Just what is the 'rapture'?

While speaking of the second coming Christ, the Bible says, "For the Lord himself shall descent from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first. Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord" (I Thess 4:16-17). These verses, along with others in the Bible, speak of a generation of people that will see Jesus come back to this earth, and how true Christians will be snatched up into heaven in an instant when He comes. There will be a heavenly homecoming. Jesus said in Luke 17:35-36, "Two women shall be grinding together; the one shall be taken, and the other left. "

A preacher from over a century ago made the following statement: "The first century church thought more about the second coming of Christ than they did His death. The early Christians weren't looking for a cleft in the ground (grave) but a cleft in the sky called glory. They were looking for the 'upper taker' more than the undertaker." Someone said, "Fear always looks backward, sorrow always looks down, but hope always looks up."

The Bible speaks of "Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Savior Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:13). Furthermore, the Bible says, "In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed." (I Cor 15:52).

Many would mock at such a supernatural and spectacular event, but the same God who spoke the universe into existence, and raised His Son from the dead can easily snatch away those who are true believers in Christ from off the earth in a moment's notice. While some may think they're too sophisticated to believe such a thing, Christian doctors, lawyers, engineers and college professors with PhDs all over the world believe it whole-heartedly. It's not a matter of prideful intellectualism, but humble faith!

The second coming of Christ could be at any moment. There are no Bible prophecies yet to be fulfilled for this event to take place. Jesus said in Matthew 24:38-39,44, "For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered in to the ark, And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh." The Bible speaks of many indications of the second coming of Christ when it mentions an increase in earthquakes and natural disasters, pestilence, economic problems, a one-world mentality, the increase of technology, fast modes of transportation, spiritual coldness and other things. But can we know the date the rapture will take place and Jesus will return?

Jesus Himself said in Matthew 21:36,42, "But of that day and hour knoweth no man, no not the angels of heaven, but my Father only. Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come." Jesus makes it clear that no one knows the date when He will return, including Harold Camping. Down through the years there have been a number who have predicted the end of the world. William Miller, the unofficial founder of the Seventh Day Adventists, predicted the world would end in October 1844, and then again in 1845. Joseph Smith, the founder of Mormonism, also prophesied a deadline for the end of the world, which never happened. The Jehovah's Witnesses followed with several false predictions. Pat Robertson predicted it would happen in 1982. Hal Lindsey said it would happen in 1984. Ed Whisenant followed with his book, "88 Reasons the Rapture Will Be in 1988." But God has never rewarded the 'date setters' because only He knows when it will take place. The Bible says, The secret things belong unto the LORD our God" (Deut 29:29).

So what harm can come from setting dates for the second coming of Christ? Sadly, it puts a question mark over those who believe in the doctrine and a shadow over the Bible. When Harold Camping falsely predicted the end of the world this past spring, the American Atheists Association held 'Rapture parties' in many major cities like Oakland, Houston and Ft. Lauderdale. They even put up their own billboards which stated, "The Rapture...You Know It's Nonsense!" The Bible says, *Because by this deed thou has given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to blaspheme*" (2 Samuel 12:14). It sounds like the story of the little boy who 'cried wolf' so many times, that no one believed him when the true emergency arose. Consequently, the Bible states, "*That there shall come in the last days scoffers, waling after their own lusts, and saying, Where is the promise of his coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation*" (2 Peter 3:3-4).

So, let's look at the facts. First of all, Jesus did come the first time to this earth, and there were 333 prophecies written earlier which said He would. He fulfilled all those predictions. Secondly, there are over 1800 prophecies that tell us that Christ is coming back again the second time. So, if we go with the Bible's past track record, we are definitely on a collision course with destiny...Jesus is coming back again and no one can afford to be caught unprepared. Jesus Himself said, "*Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh*" (Matthew 24:44). He added in Matthew 16:27, "*For the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels.*"

The best way to prepare for the coming of Christ is to never forget the presence of Christ. Do you believe in the rapture and the second coming of Christ: Do you believe it without shame or apology? The very last thing Jesus tells us in the Bible is "Surely I come quickly" followed by the last prayer in the Bible which is, "Amen, even so, come Lord Jesus" (Rev 22:20). Now that you've read the end of the 'last chapter of the book', I hope you're on the winning side.

"And also that every man should eat and drink, and enjoy the good of all his labour, it is the gift of God." Ecclesiastes 3:13

But the work itself would not be a punishment, for even before he sinned, God had given Adam the responsibility in his Edenic garden "to dress it and to keep it" (Genesis 2:15). Furthermore, we shall have work to do in the new earth in the ages to come, for we are told that "his servants shall serve him" there (Revelation 22:3), even though there will be no remnant of sinfulness there at all.

Even in this life, work is a blessing when we see it as "the gift of God." If we see it only as drudgery and hardship, then it can indeed be "in sorrow." But the Lord Jesus said, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

If having to work for a living will encourage us to come to Christ for salvation and peace of soul, then it is truly "for thy sake" that God's curse was pronounced on the ground. The key to joy in labor, instead of sorrow, is noted by the apostle Paul. "And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men …for ye serve the Lord Christ" (Colossians 3:23-24).

True Repentance

"Repent ye, and believe in the gospel." Mark 1:15

MOST people think that to ask an unconverted person to repent is as easy as slipping on a pair of hose. But let us for a moment think of how the Scriptures describe the unconverted.

"Every one that committeth sin is the *bondservant* of sin." Such persons are not "subject to the law of God." They are "born of the flesh, and are therefore flesh." And "the mind of the flesh is enmity against God." They are "dead through trespasses and sins."

How can any one then ask such a person to repent? Is not that as unreasonable as asking the lame to rise or the blind to see? Or as speaking to the dead?

Moreover, there is a great deal of evangelistic preaching in our day which is un-Biblical on this point. The unconverted are addressed as though they could convert themselves, yes, as though they desired to be converted.

My unconverted friend, permit me to tell you the terrible truth and you *cannot* covert yourself. You are a bond-servant of sin. You are bound with shackles from which you cannot free yourself.

I have more to say to you. You do not desire to be converted either. You no doubt try to make yourself believe that eventually you will, but not just at this time. If you are honest, you will tell yourself that such talk on your part is pure falsehood.

But how then can Jesus say, "Repent"? Well, we are afforded here our first glimpse into the mystery of conversion as well as into the *gospel* of conversion.

We can repent when God speaks to us. When He has done this, something has happened to us. God has *spoken* to us.

Repentance consists in this; that a sinner chooses to *listen* to God when He speaks. Then the Word of God transforms this person into a new person.

Hearken to this, you who are still unconverted. Your only possibility of being converted is to give heed now while God calls you!

Things Are Not Looking Good For Israel

Israel is facing increased isolation from a majority of nations through the world, following efforts in the Untied Nations by the Palestinian Authority to gain the recognition of a Palestinian state. The proposal to establish a Palestinian state has set the stage for protests in Arab streets, as well as a confrontation between the Israelis and the Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank. Ultimately, the goal is not a Palestinian state but the destruction of Israel.

Turkey and Israel enjoyed good relations for many years. Turkey was the first Muslim nation to recognize the Jewish state in 1949. Sadly, Turkey expelled Israel's ambassador this past September after Israel refused to apologize for an incident last year in which nine Turks were killed by Israeli forces, when a Turkish ship attempted to break an embargo imposed by Israel on the Gaza Strip. Over the past two years, the government of Turkey has grown increasingly hostile to Israel as moderate Muslims were replaced in national elections by radical Muslims. It is unlikely this attitude towards Israel will change anytime in the near future.

This past September, the Israeli embassy in Cairo was attacked and damaged while the Egyptian government did little to stop it. "Egypt is not going toward democracy but toward Islamization," said Eli Shaked, a former Israeli Ambassador to Cairo who reflected the government's view. "It is the same in Turkey and in Gaza. It is just like what happened in Iran in 1979." Add to these events the uprising in the region, as well as threats from Iran, Israel is facing a serious threat to her very survival.

There is not a city in Israel that cannot be hit by rockets and missiles. It is estimated that some 50,000 rockets and missiles are now aimed at Israeli cities by Hamas and Hezbollah. Even so Israel's arsenals are far superior to all who stand against her.

The next war between Israel and her enemies will likely be disastrous for all sides. The weapons are too numerous and powerful for anything less. In order to preserve her existence, Israel will have to respond with great force in the midst of highly populated areas. Israeli officials warned that a multi-front attack may be coming this winter, and that the attack likely will be greater than any known before.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada Follows the ELCA over the Cliff by Endorsing the Ordination and Marriage of Homosexuals

At their National Convention in Saskatoon this past July, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC) approved a resolution by a vote of 205 - 114 that permits the admission of practicing homosexuals onto their clergy roster. The ELCIC also passed a resolution recognizing same-sex marriages by a vote of 192 - 132. This resolution now allows ELCIC clergy to preside at or bless same-sex marriages "according to the dictates of their consciences and according to the laws of the province where they serve."

During the debate, one delegate stated: "Nowhere in the Bible do I see anything in support of same-sex relationships. One day we will stand before God and we will be judged not by the UN Declaration of Rights or the Canadian charter, but by God's holy laws."

A new program being funded by the Eastern North Dakota and Northwestern Minnesota synods of the ELCA, dubbed "Project F-M," (Fargo-Moorhead) centers on gatherings in the basement of a Moorhead bar, where people can enjoy an alcoholic beverage while discussing theology. Advertisements for the program announce, "Meetings are free. Drinks are extra."

It should not go unnoticed that both Fargo and Moorhead are filled with thousands of college students. Moorhead is home to the ELCA's own Concordia College.

Adam Copeland, the mission developer hired to run the project stated: "The ELCA understands that being creative is important to keeping the church vibrant."

"We have no future if we don't have the next generation coming aboard...If we really care about the next generation, we need ventures like Project F-M that open up new territory," said Bishop Larry Wohlrabe of the Northwestern Minnesota Synod. The bishop added, "*This is not your grandpa's new mission development.*"

SOUND THE WARNING

On September 1, 1894, John Craig galloped up main street shouting, "We can't save the town; don't lose a moment, but fly." By 3:45 p.m. everyone in Hinckley, Minnesota could hear a deep rumbling sound. A searing wind blew dense black smoke and cinders through the dusty streets. People were running outside, yelling, and looking for their spouses and children.

A number of people managed to get on the train leaving Hinckley, but many were left behind. The fire was 15 minutes behind them and pursuing them relentlessly. Traveling north, burning bridges and blazing ties threatened to heat the rails to the point that they would warp and spread. The train slid into the depot at Sandstone with whistles of both engines shrieking to attract the attention of the townspeople.

The people at the depot stared dumbfounded at the sight of the blackened coaches and sooty refugees from Hinckley. Box car doors slid open, revealing more frightened passengers, some coughing and gasping for air, calling to the bystanders for water and urging them to get their families and climb on board to save themselves. Almost without exception, the onlookers wandered away in stunned disbelief. Few got on the train.

While gaping at the desperate refugees, the astonished villagers at Sandstone were not ready to throw down whatever they were doing. They could not yet comprehend what was coming at them. It just didn't fit. Ten minutes later, the firestorm hit Sandstone and wiped out the town in mere minutes.

In Askov, Minnesota, it was the same. One Askov survivor wrote: "The train stopped briefly, and we were urged to get on board, but strangely we all refused like one man, for what reason I still fail to understand, and the train left."

This abbreviated account from Daniel Brown's Under a Flaming Sky reminds me of 2 Peter 3:9-10, "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar, the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything in it will be laid bare. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."

Christian, could it be our task on earth to mingle with the undecided at the depot and help them realize the imminent danger ahead without Christ? We know the end of the story. Doesn't that qualify us to tell it to those who don't?

Editor's Note: This challenging 'article' reminds us all who know Jesus as our personal Savior that 'we' <u>are *lights*</u> in a sin darkened world! *IF* a house were on fire with 'folks' inside not aware of the encompassing flames; how quietly would YOU knock on the door? Back to this 'article' account; according to reports, 418 people perished in the great fire of September 1, 1894 that swept not only Hinckley but five other towns as well.

GOD GAVE HIMSELF

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16

It is singularly appropriate that we look at this greatest of all on Christmas Day, for it records the greatest of all gifts. The theme of giving is very prominent in the Bible, with such words as "give," "gift," "gave," etc., occurring more than 2,100 times. The first is Genesis 1:16-17 when God created the sun, moon, and stars " to give light upon the earth," and the last is Revelation 22:12 when Christ will return with His rewards to "give every man according as his work shall be." "He ...gave us rain from heaven, and fruitful seasons," as well as "life, and breath, and all things" (Acts 14:17; 17:25).

But the greatest gift clearly was when God gave Himself for a lost and undeserving world. It was the greatest gift because it met the greatest need, revealed the greatest love, and had the greatest scope and purpose of any gift that could ever be conceived in the heart of an omniscient Creator.

That was not the end of His giving, of course. "He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?" (Romans 8:32). *"Trust ...in the living God, who giveth us richly all things to enjoy"* (1 Timothy 6:17).

This great gift of God is abundantly sufficient to provide salvation and everlasting life for the whole world. But a gift only becomes a gift when it is accepted, and the greatest of all tragedies is that this greatest of all gifts has been spurned and even ridiculed, or – worst of all – simply ignored by multitudes who need it so much. When they brazenly refuse God's free gift of everlasting life, they can only perish in everlasting death. God did all He could do when He gave His Son; for when He gave His Son, He gave Himself. HMM

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Erring in Vision

God is unmistakably forthright when He deals with error among His own. The priests and the prophets in Isaiah's day had a serious problem; they could not see straight, for they were 'erring in vision' (Isa. 28:7). These were the same kind of leaders Jesus Christ described in Matthew 15:14 as "blind leaders of the blind." The very religious leaders in Isaiah's day who should have been giving the people the truth and leading them in the paths of righteousness were instead, both by word and example, causing them to "stumble in judgment." Such blindness resulted in a false unity that brought these leaders together around tables with those whose filthiness would have been repulsive to anyone but a drunkard (Isa. 28:8). Likewise, even today, the errant saint will inevitably find himself in some awkward situations and fellowships. Clear spiritual vision will produce discernment that enables the believer to beware of such peril.

Today, many preachers are *'erring in vision.'* They are following and exalting the world rather than the Word. Yet the almost unbelievable increase of false teaching and false teachers in our day only serves to intensify the need for 20/20 spiritual vision. Perfect spiritual vision is available to every believer who is willing to view everything through the pure light of God's Word rather than through the wisdom of men. Those who walk in God's way will not be popular with the world, and the path may seem difficult at times. But the table that God sets before His faithful followers is pure and undefiled – it is a 'clean place' where those with clear vision can discern between right and wrong and can have genuine fellowship with others who do the same.

He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God shall give unto Him the throne of His father David Luke 1:32.

IT is a strange greatness that begins in a manger and ends on a cross, and that during the whole time between these two poles, knows nothing but poverty, contempt, and persecution. And still it is on this road that our Savior not only was great, but also became great. The way of suffering is the king's highway. That He came down to a helpless and lost race, and at last gave His life to save that race, that makes him great to us, too. That which finally more than anything else coaxes a proud sinner to give himself to Jesus voluntarily, is that He gave all for us.

In one sense it is easily learned that for us, too, it is necessary to step down to get on the road that goes upward. But to do this, which we know is right, is not learned so easily, because it means passing through death to life. For us the first step upward is to give ourselves wholly to him who gave Himself wholly for us; and from this point the road goes upward, away from sin, death, and the kingdom of Satan. It is also from this point that we must step down to helpless men, if we are to bring them to Him who can help all into the presence of God. Every new day opens a way for us to this serving love. *With* Jesus and *for* Jesus, there the road goes upward, there we become truly great.

God, give us the will and the power to go through life together with Him!
