here is an admirable conjunction of diverse excellencies in Jesus Christ. He is the lion and the lamb. The lion excels in strength and in majesty of his voice. The lamb excels in meekness and patience.

There do meet in Jesus Christ infinite highness and infinite condescension. Christ, as he is God, is infinitely great and high above all. He is higher than the kings of the earth; for he is King of kings and Lord of lords. He is higher than the heavens. All kings and princes are as worms of the dust before him. All nations are as a drop of the bucket, and the light dust of the balance; yea, and angels themselves are as nothing before him. He rules over the whole universe, and doth whatsoever pleaseth him: his knowledge is without bound: his wisdom is perfect, and what none can circumvent: his power is infinite, and none can resist him: his riches are immense and inexhaustible: his majesty is infinitely awful.

Yet he is of infinite condescension. None are so low or inferior but Christ's condescension is sufficient to take a gracious notice of them. He condescends, not only to princes and great men, but to the poor of the world. He takes a gracious notice of little children. In him we find infinite justice and infinite grace. He is the judge of the world and will not at all acquit the wicked, or by any means clear the guilty. Yet he is infinitely gracious and merciful. He has grace for every sinner and even for the chief of sinners. In the person of Christ do meet together infinite glory and the lowest humility. There is equal honor due to him with the Father. Yet what a wonderful spirit of humility appeared in him contentedly living in the family of Joseph the carpenter and Mary, his mother, and

afterwards choosing outward meanness and poverty and contempt rather than earthly greatness; in his washing his disciples' feet, in his cheerfully sustaining the form of a servant and submitting to such an immense humiliation at death! He was a lion in majesty and a lamb in meekness. In the person of Christ are conjoined absolute sovereignty and perfect resignation. Though he sweat, as it were, clots of blood, yet he said, "Not as I will, but as thou wilt." Though he be a consuming fire to sin, yet he is the life and light of sinners.

His infinite condescension marvelously appeared in the manner of his birth. The blessed Virgin was shut out by those who thought themselves her betters and would not give place to her. Lying in a manger, he appeared eminently as a lamb, he who was born to conquer and triumph over Satan, that roaring lion. He never so appeared as a lamb as when he was slain, and yet, in that act, he did in an especial manner appear as the Lion of the tribe of Judah. His humiliation was never so great as in his last sufferings. Never was he subject to so much ignominy as then. Never did he suffer so much pain in his body or so much sorrow in his soul. This act of his is celebrated by angels and hosts of heaven. "And behold I heard the voice of many angels around the throne; and the number of them was ten thousand and thousands of thousands; saying with a loud voice, 'Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory, and blessing." He will sit upon the great white throne. The devils tremble at the thoughts of that appearance. But to his saints, he will clothe himself wholly with sweetness and endearment. The church will then be admitted to him

Tradition

Well, my child, the figure of Santa Clause is actually a symbol of the holy Christian spirit of giving, in spite of what some people say about him. He represents a man named Nicholas who according to tradition, lived many, many years ago in Asia Minor. Nicholas' father was a very rich merchant who for years had no children. He and his wife prayed and promised God that if He would send them a child, they would train him to love and serve God. God answered their prayer and sent the boy, whom they named Nicholas. He was carefully and lovingly nurtured and well educated in the Christian faith.

His parents died, however, when he was quite young, and left him a great deal of money. The spirit of the Lord prompted Nicholas to give away all he had, with the exception of three small bags of gold, which at that time would have kept him nicely for the rest of his life.

One day he overheard the weeping of a neighbor's daughter, and he heard the father say to the girl that he was too poor to give her a dowry for her marriage. (In those days a girl could not marry unless she had a dowry, or a gift of money, to bring to her husband; if she could not do this, her father had to sell her as a slave.) There were three daughters in this family, and they all wept when they were told they could not have a dowry. The girl who was at the marriageable age wept loudest of all; she was the one Nicholas heard, and he couldn't bear it. He had all three bags of his gold at this time; he crept behind a bush under the window of the neighbor's home, and tossed one of his three bags of gold through the window. He did not want them to know who did it, for he remembered the words of Jesus: "When thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth: That thine alms may be in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret in secret himself shall reward thee openly."

He was depressed and irritable and made poor company for his wife, Anna, and his five-year-old daughter, Greta, as they sat around their coal stove on a cold December evening.

"Little Greta was seated on the floor, busily at work with her scissors, cardboard and paste, constructing a crude little 'manger set,' which she had spread on the floor in front of the stove. 'How do you like, it, Daddy?' she asked. 'Oh, fine,' said her father, 'And how do you like the manger?' she continued. 'I can't see it from here,' her father replied. Looking up into her father's face, Greta said, 'Daddy, if you want to see the Christ child, you'll have to get down on your knees.'"

I like that! If we want to see Christ, we have to get on our "knees" spiritually. Our Lord said "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, says the LORD, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope." (Jeremiah 29:11)

The above Bible verse is directed first towards the children of Israel (Jews), and secondly to the children of God.

Just as I was surprised at my timing malfunction, many folk are going to be surprised at God's exact timing.

Amazing Grace, GOD ALWAYS wanting the best for you and me; broke down eternity into what we call time, and this for our benefit! God has informed us that there are literally 24 hours in a day, seven days in a week and six days for labor and a day of rest Sabbath (Sunday – New Testament). We have a God of orderliness and it started with creation as God Himself rested on the seventh day! From a human stand point, even more marvelous than t his is the absolute TRUTH that HE gave us: The BIBLE (God's Grace). The story is told that many years ago that one of the great 'Caesars', riding on his stately white horse for military inspection, came upon one of his soldiers who was under the influence of alcohol who claimed his name was 'Caesar' also! Caesar the great commanded to the effect: "Either change your name OR life style OR I will have you killed!" Beware of what happens when you, I, a church or the nation get taken away with P r (I) d e. (See Genesis 3, 11:1-9, Isaiah 14, Obadiah 3-4)

Sometimes you hear folk say they deserve more time and they want what they have coming. Personally, most certainly not me! Martin Luther shared that if we got what we deserve, we would be like a blade of grass; and I don't believe we would be that fortunate!

Pay close attention to God's Grace manifested through His Holy Word that "'He who believes in Him (Jesus) is not condemned, but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God." "'He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him"' John 3:18 and 36.

WHAT LOVE, GRACE and MERCY from the sinless Holy and Just ONE: John 3:16, Titus 3:4-8. Every tick of the clock and heart beat are gifts from Him – James 1:17.

Now during the Advent and Christmas Season; we pause and marvel at (likely more so) the Incarnation of God in the person of JESUS, who is true God and true man. At Christmas time there are many times gifts laden under a Christmas Tree. BUT the greatest GIFT ever was born in a 'barn' and laid in a manger. Imagine the King of kings, Lord of lords being born in such circumstances! At this particular time in history it was not unusual for children of poor people to be born in such surroundings.

Wait a moment: the Lamb of God to be born in a 'stable'; which could have been filthy, dirty and not a pleasant smell, in order to be the perfect sacrifice to clean up (cleanse) our stinky, dirty, rotten filthy hearts and give us a heart transplant, which means a NEW one spiritually! For example: Isaiah 64:6, Romans 3:10-20 and Isaiah 1:18, II Corinthians 5:17, Isaiah 61:10. Most certainly the Christmas wrappings were not so attractive; but the content of the GIFT so 'marvelous' – Amazing Grace!

Another 'marvel' is that JESUS was named at (conception and before). "'And she will bring forth a Son, and you shall call His name, Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins" Matthew 1:21.

Notice God's timing: "But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying out, 'Abba, Father!'" Galatians 4:4-5.

physical and mental. Let us thank God that He has made us as we are.



If you want to hear God speak audibly - read the Holy Scriptures (Bible) out loud!!!

Work

And whatsoever ye do, in word or in deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. (Colossians 3:17)

THIS is one of the many passages of the Bible about our daily life and our daily work.

The Scriptures tell us that our daily work is a service unto God, yes, a means by which others may be saved – even those who are hard to win.

In Luther's day to marry and establish a Christian home was not considered holy, but to remain unmarried and enter a cloister, on the other hand, was holy. To be a *mother* was not holy, but to be a *nun* was. To do one's daily work was not holy, but to make pilgrimages and give gifts to monasteries and churches was.

In this connection, too, Luther brought to light once again the Biblical view: God looks on the *attitude of our hearts*. In the daily life of the faithful Christian there are therefore no acts which in themselves are holy and others which in themselves are unholy. No, all our deeds are well-pleasing to God if they are done in the right attitude of heart; to the glory of God in Jesus' name, in love toward God in zeal for the welfare of others.

Luther says therefore that it is just as well-pleasing to God that we sweep the floor as it is that we preach the Gospel, provided that both are done in the right attitude of heart. Whether we are to sweep or to preach is simply a question of the gift of grace that God has given us.

Do your ordinary daily work therefore, and rejoice that through it you are rendering a spiritual service every day. Bo so doing you shall also win souls for God, even the hardest. You shall win those who, the Scriptures tell us, cannot be won by words.

Thomas Jefferson, Our Third President and Author of the Declaration of Independence

God who gave us life gave us liberty. And can the liberties of a nation be thought secure when we have removed their only firm basis, a conviction in the minds of the people that these liberties are a gift from God? - 1781, Jefferson's Notes on the State of Virginia, Query XV111

Patrick Henry of the Famous "Give Me Liberty or Give Me Death" Speech

This is all the inheritance I can give my dear family. The religion of Christ can give them one which will make them rich indeed. – Last Will and Testament

Alexander Hamilton, the First Secretary of the U.S. Treasury

I have carefully examined the evidences of the Christian religion, and if I was sitting as a juror upon its authenticity I would unhesitatingly give my verdict in its favor. I can prove its truth as clearly as any proposition ever submitted to the mind of man. -1802, upon Co-founding the Christian Constitutional Society

I have a tender reliance on the mercy of Almighty, through the merits of the Lord Jesus Christ. I am a sinner. I look to Him for mercy – pray for me. – July 12, 1804, on his deathbed

It is safe for us to assume that these guys, eyewitnesses all, know just a tad more about our country than these thirty- and forty-year-old wet-behind-the-ears liberals who are pushing to get their communistic views enshrined in our national life.

"Someone Stole My God And Put A Bible In Its Place!"

"Someone stole my God and put a Bible in its place!" This convoluted title was given to an article posted on a blog of the Evangelical Lutheran Church (www.livingluthern.com). The article, written by ELCA pastor Tim Brown, claimed those who believe in biblical inerrancy have turned the Bible into God and are worshipping it. Pastor Brown's article was written in response to a comment someone sent to him concerning a previous article he had written on the same subject. The respondent said, "...the Scriptures themselves are the only hope we have." Brown replied: "I'm a Christian, a person of faith, and I have to say that my hope is not in the Scriptures."

Brown quotes 2 Timothy 3:16, "All Scripture is God breathed." Then he comments, "the writer of 2 Timothy didn't have a Bible. They only had the Torah, the Psalms and some wisdom writings." Brown obviously neither wants to admit that Paul is the author of 2 Timothy nor that Peter refers to Paul's writings as "Scripture" (2 Peter 3:14 - 16).

Brown concludes: "I take Scripture seriously, not literally. For me it is not some fable nor is it a golden book that fell from the sky. It holds the most intriguing story I've ever heard in which I put my hope — but it's not the story itself and is certainly not the hope." Brown claims his hope is based entirely on "a story" contained in the Bible, but still he insists that the Bible cannot be trusted.

Editor's Note: Everything we know of Christ — His life, death and resurrection — are based on the Bible's teachings. The ELCA has duped so many people over the years by their failed attempts to separate God from His Word. One wonders if Brown ever considered why the Scriptures are called "The Word of God." Jesus said, "Sanctify them in the truth, Your word is truth" (John 17:17). Triumph Over Temptation!

"There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear it" 1 Cor. 10:13

If we would emerge victoriously from a conflict with the enemy, we must know our weapons and how to use them against the tempter and his temptations. In His mercy, God has provided us with effective ways of escape. Praise His name, we are not left defenseless! Victory, it would seem, comes to us in various ways.

I. Watchfulness

Watchfulness is essential to victory. "Watch ... lest ye enter into temptation" (Mark 14:38). We often fail because we do not watch the beginnings of evil. One writer has it, "Our greatest security against sin lies in being shocked at it."

A good deal of our temptation comes as a surprise. Surprise attack is one of the principal methods the tempter employs, and because we are so often not on guard, Satan breaks through.

How we need to have our eyes constantly anointed in order to detect his faintest approach!

II. Prayerlessness

Prayerfulness is likewise a safe-guard. "Satan trembles when he sees the weakest saint upon his knees." A praying believer is a great hindrance to the Devil and his works. If we are constantly before God, that temptation may not overwhelm us and it will be difficult for Satan to take us unawares.

III. Resistance

Here is another avenue of victory. James reminds us that if we truly resist the Devil, he will flee from us (4:7). Resist we must, at the very gate, on his first knocking." But how can we successfully resist our subtle foe?

Memory has helped many a man to fight hard battles. Thoughts of home and God has compelled tempted souls to cry, "How can I be guilty of this wickedness and sin against God?"

The story is told of a transformed criminal who always carried in his pocket the photograph of the godly lady who led him to Christ. When sorely tempted, he would draw out the picture and say to himself, "No, I cannot do it. He would be grieved."

Our higher incentive is the thought of Christ's near-

ness.

IV. Conscience

Then there is conscience, which, when under divine control, is ever a deterrent force. Conscience would not suffer Joseph to take advantage of Potiphar's wife. Moral courage is ever greater than mere physical valor.

Exhausting struggles are secretly fought and won. Our neighbors may never learn of our secret conflicts, which shine more glorious than those of any battlefield. The world has no knowledge of our battles and victories. God, however, chronicles them in His book of honors.

V. Counterattraction

This is another way of victory. David sought to hide God's Word in his heart that he might not sin against the Lord. "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee" (Ps. 119:11).

A mind steeped in God's Word and a life filled with God's Spirit offer a most effective counteraction to temptation, as our Lord's experience in the wilderness clearly proves.

VI. The Blood of the Lamb

Here is the mightiest weapon we have to wield against our archenemy as he seeks our overthrow. The more Spirit-filled (Ed. - controlled) and blood-covered we are, the greater the Satan antagonism. The Devil is out to contest every inch of ground we yield to our conquering Lord.

Are you being tempted this very hour? Then plead the efficacious blood. Appropriate the victory of the cross.

Be careful, however, to watch the tactics of Satan. Before we fall, he whispers that one slip will not matter; to taste forbidden fruit just once is a mere trifle. But this is tragic reasoning, for once we fall, something is lost that we can never regain.

Then, after we have fallen, Satan whispers that we may as well go the whole road. By creating despair, he tells us that it is hopeless to try to resist. But in this he errs, for by the blood of the Lamb we can become more than conquerors (Rom. 8:37).

As we hurl his lie back at his face, we tell such a false accuser that defeat can be transformed into a glorious victory, that his fierce temptations can be made steppingstones to a higher, nobler life. Robert Browning declares:

Why comes temptation, but for Man to meet And master and make crouch Beneath his feet, And so he pedestaled in triumph?

Surely His goodness and mercy here daily attend thee; Ponder anew What the Almighty can do

If with His love He befriend thee.

In their warfare against sin they are equally anxious lest they be unfaithful. They are afraid lest they dress up their sins in some attractive manner, or explain away their disobedience. They strive against fine and unnoticed sins just as energetically as against the obvious ones.

In such a literal sense are they faithful in *little things* that they do the little and unnoticed things that other people prefer not to do. There is no work that they consider themselves too good to do. Nor do they sacrifice only on important occasions. On the contrary, they avail themselves of the thousands of lesser occasions in their daily life to say "no" to themselves and to render service to others.

Their life is occupied with those daily *little* acts of kindness which are of most value to those with whom they associate and which require most of those who perform them.

They are not sinless. But their faithfulness comes to light also when they err. How they humble themselves both before God and others when they have done wrong! Wherefore their lost peace and power are quickly restored to them.

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Tragic Ignorance

"And when he was come near, he beheld the city, and wept over it, saying, "If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! But now they are hid from thine eyes." Luke

19:41-42.

The Lord had finally acknowledged to the Jewish leaders that He was their promised Messiah, riding into the city on a donkey's colt in fulfillment of prophecy (Zechariah 9:9; Matthew 21:1-7), but they refused to accept Him and prepared to crucify Him. Therefore, Jesus wept over the city, for He knew it would soon be destroyed "because thou knewest not the time of thy visitation" Luke 19:44.

There are many other cases of such tragic ignorance in the Bible. For example, Samsonwist not that the LORD was departed from him: (Judges 16:20) and it cost him his great strength and finally his life.

The ungodly sinners in the days of Noah "knew not until the flood came, and took them all away" (Matthew 24;39). The picture of the inner life of a sinner who repents and begins to forsake sin.

The angel with the sword, representing the offered grace of God and of Jesus Christ, holds up before the sinner's mind the reward and the consequences of sin: namely, death and judgment. By the Word of God the sinner is convicted, "that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God. Be not deceived, neither fornicators, nor idolators, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God" (I Cor. 6:9-10). "Tribulation and anguish will come upon every soul that doeth evil" (Romans 2:9).

Terrified in conscience, the sinner will examine himself. Looking into his heart he finds nothing but sin and abomination. By the help of the higher light which now shines into his heart, he recognizes how hideous and ruinous sin is; he desires to be free from it. But he feels the power of sin, and he knows his own weakness and inclination to sin. Plaintively he cries from the depth of his heart: "*O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?*" (Rom. 7:24). "God's grace in Christ," comes the answer. The Holy Spirit, who again has visited the broken and contrite heart, will now illumine it with divine light and give grace and power.

When the light of the Holy Spirit and the beams of grace are diffused in the heart, the devil must flee with his demon followers. The loathsome figures, the repulsive animals, the seductive imaginations must depart. As soon as day dawns, the night vanishes. Grace is light; sin is darkness. When we begin to hate sin, Satan must leave. He rules only through sin and darkness. It is only by sin he can enter the heart. If we persist in wickedness, we open wide the gates and the doors for him. The love of God and the hatred of evil close the entrance and drive him away.

O sinners! Love the light, hate the sin, resist the evil, and Satan will leave you. Close your eyes to the world and to all temptation to evil. By the help of God's light, you will be made able to recognize the evil creatures and the shadows of sin in their hideousness. God's grace, which is powerful in the weak, will deliver you from them.

PRAYER

My God! Thou art the source of all light and all life. Thou alone with Thy Spirit can show me the abomination and perniciousness of my sins. Let the light of life enlighten my dark soul that I may see and live. Thou hast "no pleasure in the death of the wicked; but that the wicked turn from his way and live." Then show me the sin that blinds and destroys me, and holds me in Satan's bondage. Grant me Thy grace which Thou hast promised so graciously in Christ to all sinners. Let Thy grace penetrate my heart; wound and afflict it with pain and grief so that sin, death, and the devil must leave and give room for Thee.

Perhaps no more profound and important sentence has ever been uttered by man. Therefore, please join me in reflecting on those thirteen words.


