The Unknown Saviour

he Name of Jesus is known around the world, the best known of all names. And still only a small minority really know Him. A book was once written "The Man Nobody Knows." The title was too strong and the book was too weak! There are some people who do know Him, and they know Him far better than the author portrayed, as merely a good man and a great teacher. To us He is known as the Son of God, the Saviour of the lost, the Lamb of God, who shed His blood to atone for sin. But we must add: He is not known, as such, by many.

When the Apostle Paul preached at Antioch, shortly after his ordination and call as God's missionary, as recorded in Acts 13, we find him making this significant statement, in verse 27: "For they that dwell in Jerusalem and their rulers, because they knew him not, nor yet the voices of the prophets, which are read every Sabbath day, they have fulfilled them in condemning him."

Here Paul dares to say that they knew not the Lord Jesus, and that's why they condemned Him. Had they known Him, they would not have done so; they would have been like the people Jesus described in John 10:27, "my sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me." And in verse 14, "I am the good shepherd, and know my sheep, and am known of mine."

The Difference

There was a vast difference between Christ's disciples and the rulers of Jerusalem: their difference in attitude is explained in only one way: they knew Him – the rulers didn't. And when we say that the disciples knew Him, we mean more than a casual acquaintance, such as having heard Him

speak. They knew Him not only as a man, not merely a "good man", for He was more than that. Like Peter they could say, "Thou art that Christ, the son of the living God." They knew Him as their personal Saviour, the Lamb of God, the sin-bearer and burden bearer, who had set them free. John 8:36. The rulers in Jerusalem did not know Him as such, nor the dwellers there. Had they known him so, they would not have crucified Him. Paul wasn't excusing them: for they could have known Him too, if they had not been so unwilling to know their sins! But, because they refused to know their sins, they could not know the Saviour.

What Paul explains is the plain fact that had they known Jesus, they would have been of a different nature: they would have worshipped Him, not crucified Him. "IF ye were Abraham's children, ye would do the works of Abraham. But now ye seek to kill me, a man that has told you the truth, which I have heard of God: this did not Abraham."

Here we have the key to some very perplexing problems today in so-called Christendom. How can people who call themselves Christians drink, dance, play cards, gamble, cheat, and in general live and act very much like the world of Christ rejecters? Why can they be church members in good standing, of good character, but still be enemies of spiritual awakening, conversion of sinners and Holy Spirit power? Why should a disciple of Christ never open his mouth in public to tell his fellowmen what Jesus has done for him? The answer is – they know Him not! For to know him is to love Him and His people, and to see sinners brought to Him. If you know Him you also know something about the experience Paul spoke of in Philippians 3, telling about the difference between being "religious" and "saved." As a

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religious man, Paul admits that he was proud of himself and of his religious ability; but now as a saved man he has one passion: "That I may know him and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death." Vs. 10. "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things have passed away, and behold, all things have become new." (2 Cor. 5:17)

See It?

You see – to know Him – doesn't merely put a nice coat on a dirty man. It is not a cloak for man's meanness and shame. To know Christ is to let Him in - into your heart, your thought life, emotions and will. It is surely possible for worldly people to copy the lives of saved people; they can quit questionable amusements, swearing and vulgar talk. They can train themselves in regular church attendance even keep awake if the sermons are lengthy, and remember parts of the talks. Some can also conduct a form of family worship, reading daily portions and a prayer. They can be honest in business, good neighbors kind and thoughtful of others. They can be all this, and more, and yet not know Jesus Christ! Yes, people can imitate born-again Christians in so many ways that we're not at all surprised to meet those who have made decisions, "taken a stand for Jesus", that know him not!

Splitting Hairs? No!

Some may have been spiritually awakened, but they went on their ways without experiencing repentance, sorrow for sin and a new born desire to turn away from every appearance of evil. There was very little difference before and after: in their thought life and in their hearts. To these He is still the Unknown God!

And so we have a problem today, harder to get at than any we've ever

faced: Why are there so many religious people who profess to know God, who really have not been saved? Born again? What can be done to awaken such people to actually see their lost condition? And how can they be brought to a real saving experience of the grace of God?

I know only one answer, and the key scripture is in Matthew 1:21, "Thou shalt call his name JESUS, for he shall save his people from their sins." Note two words: "save" and "sin." We must preach sin as sin before people can be saved from sin. The reason so few are saved is because so few have seen their sins! But once a sinner sees that he is lost, the Saviour will not find it difficult to save him.

But not even an Omnipotent God can save a sinless man! "They that be whole need not a physician, but they that are sick. For I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance." (Mk. 2:17)

A pioneer mother's hands would not have passed inspection in a college of beauticians. They were work-worn hands, often cracked and rough from much scrubbing and washing in strong lye water.

But those hands were beautiful in spite of this—beautiful for their ministry of sacrificial love. The feverish brow of a child felt those hands, and the fever seemed to subside. The wounded pride of a rebellious son felt the tension and bitterness ease when those hands stroked his unruly hair. A little girl's bruised knees seemed to smart less under the ministry of those hands, and the tears dried quickly.

Her hands were not permissive. They could chasten and turn the willful child back into the paths of obedience and respect for authority. Thank God, she had not read the current crop of books on child psychology, but she knew and lived by the Good Book and sanctified Christian principles. As a result, the children were secure after being chastened, and their sleep was sweet.

A Christian mother's hands lifted in prayer have stood guard over family and fireside, over church and nation. They are strong hands, for they touch the very throne of God. They have turned to flight the armies of aliens. They have delivered sons and daughters from the jaws of death and from the poser of the Destroyer. They have gently guided straying feet back to the narrow way—the way of life, of peace, of righteousness and of honor.

The Spirit – A Guide To Christ

However, let us not forget that there is another kingdom in the world, the kingdom of Satan. This is also a spiritual kingdom with great powers. It is not a kingdom that is satisfied merely by holding what it has. It has this in common with the Kingdom of God, that it is a Kingdom of conquest. It always aims to reconquer that which it has lost. With all the hosts of evil Satan searches out every Christian on earth, and seeks to draw him into his own kingdom again. God's Word admonishes us therefore to be on the watch so that we may not become victims of Satan's treachery.

We must not forget that Satan is not particular about the means and methods that he uses when he wants to deceive God's people. If he cannot gain his point by an outright temptation to sin, he will don the wings of an angel and show himself as though he were the Spirit of God and a servant of Christ.

The Word of God therefore exhorts us to try the spirits to see if they are of God. Why should the Bible remind us of this if Satan does not have the power to show himself as the Spirit of God? The magicians of Egypt could imitate the miracles of Moses by their secret arts.

According to the Word of God we are bound to believe that not every spirit that purports to be the Spirit of God actually is so. Many Christians do not seem to understand this, and therefore they are drawn into by-paths. It has been a mystery to us how honest and sincere Christians could be led astray by a spirit that is shown to be something else than the Holy Spirit. The answer undoubtedly is this: That Satan has betrayed them to think that he is the Spirit of God

Many Christians do not dare to criticize anything which purports to be spiritual and lays claim to being of God. Especially is this so if this manifestation seems to be more than ordinarily spiritual; Christians are afraid of quenching the Spirit, or at least wounding Him, by any adverse criticism. But to try the spirits to see if they are of God is precisely what the Word of God asks us to do. Those who then blindly and uncritically open their arms and hearts for every wind and spirit that claims to be from God expose themselves to the danger of being deceived.

Much could be gained for the Kingdom of God, and much would be lost for the kingdom of Satan, if Christian people would not forget this.

My purpose with that which is written here is to try to discover some of the ways in which the Holy Spirit works in bringing a person to Christ. I shall also try to point out how He helps God's children through all the dangers in this life and brings them safely to their heavenly home. May the Holy Sprit direct my thoughts so that what is here written may be of help to many who strive to gain the imperishable

crown...

It is sin which has made the separation between God and us. It was sin that made Christ to become the Lamb of God in order to die for us sinners. If we are to know ourselves as we really are, we must learn to know our sin; if we are to have any particular use for Christ as our Savior, we must be inwardly convinced that we need Him.

It is therefore the work of the Holy Spirit to convict us of sin.

The first experience of an unconverted person with the Holy Spirit is that of being disturbed in his life apart from God. In the heart of every one who has been instructed in the Word of God the Spirit is at work; He is trying to disturb all those who are sleeping in sin. The Spirit is at work with men while they are about their daily tasks; He calls upon them in Church and in gospel hall; He is active at sea and on land; He pleads with men in sick-rooms, theaters and dance halls. Every once in a while mans mind and conscience is brought face to face with God, the day of reckoning is brought into view, and the heart feels itself condemned, tired and sore.

Thus the Spirit of God seeks to convict man of sin.

A person is not permitted to walk in his sin as peacefully as it sometimes appears to us that he does. Under the hardest countenance and coarsest blasphemy may be found a soul that is crying and longing for peace. That people sometimes throw themselves into sin and shameful vices is not always caused by a desire to destroy themselves; they are just trying to stifle the cry that the Holy Sprit has called forth in their hearts. We can therefore often see that those whom we thought to be farthest away from God are the first ones to become Christians. Where the day has been given to merriment, laughter and jesting, night may offer no sleep; in its stead bitter tears are wrung from a head that is sore and a soul that is longing for God.

This is the work of the Holy Spirit in the heart of an unconverted person.

Who can number the times that the Spirit of God has been knocking at the door of our hearts?

For all who have been called and drawn to God, but who have resisted the Holy Spirit, it will be terrible to be a human being in the day of judgment. ...

But how can you be saved? That is the great question which the Holy Spirit is trying to answer; unless this question is solved by the Holy Spirit, it will never be solved. While you are occupied with yourself, how you are and how you ought to be, and while you are praying bootlessly for a new life and another mind, the Holy spirit is seeking to show you in the Word that it is such people Jesus wants to save.

You do not realize that you can never become rightly

prepared – you who are dead in trespasses and sins. Therefore the Holy Spirit coaxes you and draws you to Him who justifies the ungodly and brings salvation to the sinner.

That is how it happened to me and many others – may it also happen to you. We saw that Jesus alone is sufficient. We saw that we had need of nothing else for salvation. We had to be saved just as we were. The light of salvation came into the soul. Where there formerly was fear, night, and death there came to be peace, day, and life.

Under the Cross of Jesus the day of grace began to dawn. The Spirit introduced Jesus to our heart, and life's most vexing problem was solved. This is the work of the Holy Spirit. He has led the sinner to Christ, and the sinner is saved. God's Spirit witnesses with our spirit that we are the children of God.

Hamas Leader's Son Becomes A Christian

Masab Yousuf, son of notorious Hamas leader Hassan Yousuf, recently moved to America where he converted to Christianity. In an exclusive interview with an Israeli newspaper, *Haaretz* Masab praised Israel and condemned Hamas. He said he hoped his terrorist father will open his eyes to Jesus.

"I know that I'm endangering my life and am even liable to lose my father, but I hope that he'll understand this and that God will give him and my family patience and willingness to open their eyes to Jesus and to Christianity. Maybe one day I'll be able to return to Palestine and to Ramallah with Jesus, in the Kingdom of God," Masab said. Masab said he previously aided his father, but now has affection for

Israel and laments Hamas.

"You Jews should be aware: you will never, but never have peace with Hamas. Islam, as the ideology that guides them, will not allow them to achieve a peace agreement with the Jews. They believe tradition says that the Prophet Muhammed fought against the Jews, and therefore they must continue to fight them to the death."

Masab's father is considered the most popular figure in the West Bank. He is serving a sentence in Israel for planning or involvement in multiple terror attacks. In a statement to a Palestinian news agency, Masab's brother, Suhaib, strongly denied that Masab converted to Christianity. But *Haaretz* stood by its story. The newspaper said it sent a correspondent to the U.S., who met with Masab for a detailed, in-person interview.

Priest: No communion for Obama supporters

Priest says it's because the Democratic president-elect supports abortion

A South Carolina Roman Catholic priest has told his parishioners that they should refrain from receiving Holy Communion if they voted for Barack Obama because the Democratic president-elect supports abortion, and supporting him "constitutes material cooperation with intrinsic evil."

The Rev. Jay Scott Newman said in a letter distributed Sunday to parishioners at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Greenville that they are putting their souls at risk if they take Holy Communion before doing penance for their vote.

"Our nation has chosen for its chief executive the most radical pro-abortion politician ever to serve in the United States Senate or to run for president," Newman wrote, referring to Obama by his full name, including his middle name of Hussein.

"Voting for a pro-abortion politician when a plausible pro-life alternative exits constitutes material cooperation with intrinsic evil, and those Catholics who do so place themselves outside of the full communion of Christ's Church and under the judgment of divine law. Persons in this condition should not receive Holy Communion until and unless they are reconciled to God in the Sacrament of Penance, lest they eat and drink their own condemnation."

Risking their immortal soul

During the 2008 presidential campaign, many bishops spoke out on abortion more boldly than four years earlier, telling Catholic politicians and voters that the issue should be the most important consideration in setting policy and de-

ciding which candidate to back. A few church leaders said parishioners risked their immortal soul by voting for candidates who support abortion rights.

But bishops differ on whether Catholic lawmakers — and voters — should refrain from receiving Communion if they diverge from church teaching on abortion. Each bishop sets policy in his own diocese. In their annual fall meeting, the nation's Catholic bishops vowed Tuesday to forcefully confront the Obama administration over its support for abortion rights.

According to national exit polls, 54 percent of Catholics chose Obama, who is Protestant. In South Carolina, which McCain carried, voters in Greenville County — traditionally seen as among the state's most conservative areas — went 61 percent for the Republican, and 37 percent for Obama.

"It was not an attempt to make a partisan point," Newman said in a telephone interview Thursday. "In fact, in this election, for the sake of argument, if the Republican candidate had been pro-abortion, and the Democratic candidate had been pro-life, everything that I wrote would have been exactly the same."

LIVING IN SPIRITUAL POVERTY

Through the years of my ministry, I have considered it a privilege to share God's Word with those at home, in the hospital, the jail cell, the care facility, and elsewhere. Most individuals appreciate the Bible passages and prayer; a few have been noticeably uncomfortable.

I recall a lady that stared at the New Testament I placed on the armrest of the chair I sat in when I went to visit her in her home. She seemed to watch it like a hawk. Another widow lady I visited often was called Emmy, which is Finnish for "grandma." She would take out her well-worn Finnish Bible, and I would find the place for her to read as I read in my English version. She would be busy underlining in pencil, and since we could not understand each other's language, we communicated with head nods and hand gestures. Upon leaving she always said "God's peace" in Finnish and "see you" in English. She had a happy heart. The morning of the day she entered eternity, she said in her hospital bed, "The Heavenly Father is coming tonight."

The Bible to many is a friend; it is God's inspired Word, able to save their soul because of the shed blood of Jesus Christ. To others, it is simply a piece of literature or just another book on the shelf with little meaning. And to some, it is an object of mockery.

I once heard the story of an elderly woman in Scotland who was living in abject poverty. Many years earlier, her son had come to America and had not returned to his native land. One day a friend visited the mother and inquired, "Does your son ever help you with expenses?" Reluctantly she admitted, "No, but he writes me nice long letters and sends me interesting pictures." The visitor wanted to speak harshly of the man, but he held back and asked, "May I see the pictures?" The aged mother brought them out of a drawer, and to the friends' amazement, they were valuable bank notes. Through the years she had been needlessly living in poverty because she did not understand their value.

"Open thou mine eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of Thy law" (Psalm 119:18). Many people today are doing well materially yet living in spiritual poverty, and it is needless.

What are you doing with God's Word in light of eternity? Search the Scriptures, and you will find the riches of eternal life in Christ (John 5:39).

I'm sure it has happened to you as you have traveled across this country. You drove in your car, and when evening came you wanted a Motel room. You wanted to take a shower and get a good night's sleep. You drove up to a place and there the sign read: "No Vacancy." So you moved on to look for another place.

This summer my uncle told me he had gone from place to place, until three in the morning, and had not been able to find a room. So they had to sleep in the car until morning dawned.

There was no room for them in the Inn's even after the birth of Jesus. When the shepherds visited them they were still in the stable.

There was no room for Jesus in the heart of the people of Israel either. Scripture says: "he came to his own but they received him not." John 1:11. All through his ministry we notice the same thing. He traveled for three years proclaiming the gospel, the good news of Salvation. Yet we notice there was no room for Him. They argued, mistreated, laughed at and scorned this man (God-man) of sorrows.

The Bible speaks of Jesus becoming poor, not owning that which he could even lean His head on. We sing with the song writer: "He became poor to ransom my soul." He left the splendor of heaven as well. Scripture says: "Although He existed in the form of God, (He) did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bondservant, and being made in the likeness of man. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." Phil. 2:6-8. All this he did for us!

Willingly Jesus walked the dusty streets of Capernaum, Nazareth and Jerusalem, as well as many other places. He knew that many would have no room for Him nor His Word, because the heart of man is wicked and deceitful. Still He preached the Word, and He preached with authority. "Never did a man speak the way this man speaks." John 7:46. Being convinced who he was, they still had no room for Him. "Nevertheless many, even of the rulers, believed in Him; but because of the Pharisees they were not confessing him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue; for they loved the

approval of men rather than the approval of God." They had no room for Jesus; so they crucified Him.

Proving to be the one he claimed to be, Jesus rose from the dead. Today he is sitting at the right hand of God the Father. He is now asking you, through His Word and through His ambassadors: "Do you have room for Jesus?" Confess your sin to Him, and allow Him to come into your heart. Oh, what a difference it would make in your life, if you would make room for Jesus! He would make all things new for you. The Lord bless you to accept Him, today!





MUSIC

In considering the role of the organist in the worship services of the Lutheran Church, a few comments on the position of Martin Luther concerning music in general may help to clarify the attitude which the Lutheran organist should strive to maintain within himself and within the congregation he serves. Martin Luther considered music one of God's greatest gifts. He is quoted as saying: "Music is a beautiful and lovely gift of God ..." And again, "One of the most beautiful and most precious gifts of God is music ...

He continues by saying "Music drives away the spirit of sadness, as may be seen from the life of King Saul ..." Luther acknowledged the power of music when he wrote, "Next to the Word of God, the noble art of music is the greatest treasure in this world. It controls our thoughts, minds, hearts, and spirits. This precious gift has been given to man alone that he might thereby remind himself of the fact that God has created man for the express purpose of extolling and praising God." We find statements to this same effect repeated several times referring to the use of music by man to praise God. In the preface to a collection of part songs based on the sufferings and death of Christ, Luther wrote: "A greater praise we cannot imagine...

Even the Holy Spirit honors music as a tool of His work, since He testifies in the Holy Scriptures that through the medium of music His gifts have been put into the hands of the Prophets (e.g. Elisha), again, through music the devil has been driven away ..."

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Prayer in Light of Christ's Glorious Return

In today's Scripture, Christ links the importance of prayer to the events that will increasingly unfold as "the last days" and "perilous times" (2 Tim. 3:1) approach (v.1 cf. Lk. 17:22-37). He impresses upon His hearers the appropriateness of prayer at all times — "men ought always to pray" (v. 1). This parallels God's Word through Paul to the Thessalonian believers — "Pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17); that is, do not allow prayerless gaps to develop in your life. Make it a habit to pray; build a frame of mind that is ready always to cry out to God. Failure to meet this challenge will lead to the alternative of fainting and, thus, of caving in under pressure and stress. Faith expresses itself to God in prayer, and prayer nourishes our faith and courage.

Jesus then spoke a parable about an uncompassionate, self-seeking judge who refused to hear and respond to the

cries of a widow in need of his help (vv. 2-5). Yet, because she persisted in bringing her case before him to the point of exasperation, he finally gave legal satisfaction in avenging the injustice against her. Jesus contrasts the unjust judge with our heavenly Father. If that judge will finally act because of persistence in requesting, how much more will the Father respond to your prayers (vv. 6-8)!

In our present age, "evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse" (2 Tim. 3:13), and the Father, "not willing that any should perish," forebears long, allowing the unsaved to come to repentance if they will (2 Pet. 3:9,15). But when God does avenge, it will transpire suddenly (v. 8; II Thess. 5:3). Conditions between Christ's first and second comings are not conducive to prayer, but we must pray on (Rev. 22:20). JED

Why Study the Old Testament?

"For ever, O Lord, Thy Word is settled in heaven." (Ps. 119:89)

There is an attitude among many in Christendom that the Old Testament is a history book of the Jewish nation, and prophecies that point to our day and beyond, yet not a portion of the Scripture that we should study. The general feeling is that the Old Testament was under the Law and the New Testament is under Grace. Some feel that the Old Testament was for another time (Dispensation) and is not for our day. It is true that some dealings of God with man were different in the Old Testament, yet God has a rich source of spiritual life to be found in the pages of the Old Testament!

Do you realize that "approximately ten percent of the New Testament is direct quotations, paraphrases, or allusions to the Old Testament? Of the thirty-nine books of the Old Testament, only nine are not expressly referred to in the New Testament." ¹

The Old Testament lays the groundwork for what we read in the New Testament. Without understanding what was first laid in the Old Testament, you can't fully understand what it is referring to in the New. Every aspect of Jesus' life was prophesied in the Old Testament, including His incarnation that we celebrate at Christmas. "Behold a virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and you shall call His name Emmanuel, which is translated God with us." (Matt. 1:23, a fulfillment of Isaiah 9:6) Repeatedly in Matthew, it says, "...that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets." (See Matt. 3:23 for example) The Old Testament prophets laid out the birth, life, death and resurrection of Jesus in advance.

Jesus' very mission to die for the sins of the world was already laid out in the Old Testament sacrificial system. An innocent victim, free from defect, must die to atone for sin. It also must die with the shedding of blood. (See Exodus 12 and Leviticus 16). In fact, Jesus used the Old Testament example of Jonah being swallowed by a whale as the basis for His resurrection. "For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." (Matt. 12:40) Jesus believed in the literal account of Jonah, which modern man scoffs at. Yet, how can they deny the literal account of Jonah and yet believe in the literal resurrection of Jesus, when Jesus used the Old Testament account as the basis for His resurrection? They can't! Jesus had absolute faith in the Old Testament as He quoted 3 times from the Book of Deuteronomy when tempted by the devil. (See Matt. 4:1-11)

The Old Testament people are the example of faith to us

in the New Testament. In Hebrews 11 there is an entire list of people of faith, all of them Old Testament people. We can go back and study how these people walked and served God in their daily lives as an example to us today. In fact, the New Testament says "*The just shall live by faith*." (Rom. 1:17, which itself is a quotation from the Old Testament, Hab. 2:4). The very heart of the Reformation that Luther discovered was born out of the Old Testament!

The lives of the Old Testament saints demonstrate this to us in both victory and failure. Even though they lived under the Old Testament order, their lives had to be lived by faith before the Lord, just as ours do. You can read of Moses' victory over Pharaoh in Exodus, and his frustrations of leading the people in the wilderness after that. Through all of this, you can see how God dealt with him in his daily life. You can read of Gideons' victory and Samson's failure in Judges, Saul's demise in I Samuel, David's intrigue in II Samuel, Solomon's great life and horrid fall in I Kings and many more. Through all of this, you see exactly what it means for the godly to live by faith.

The Old Testament serves as a warning for us to avoid the mistakes that God's people made in the Old Testament. 1 Cor. 10 list several incidents in the life of Israel where they sinned and brought God's judgment upon themselves. Verse 7 refers to gross acts of idolatry and sensuality from Exodus 32, verse 8 refers to immorality and sensual worship from Numbers 25, verse 9 refers to the time when Israel put the Lord to the test from Numbers 21 and verse 10 refers to grumbling and unbelief from Numbers 16. The conclusion is stated in v. 11, "Now all these things happened to them as an example, and they are written for OUR admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come." These mistakes of Israel in the Old Testament are written for us New Testament saints to avoid. If we don't take time to study them, how can we avoid them? With these many references to sensuality and sensual worship, perhaps we could study the Old Testament and see through the new contemporary worship for what it really is. It has already happened and it has already failed as Exodus 32 and Numbers 25 so painfully remind us. There is nothing new under the sun, as Solomon reminds us.

Dear reader, will you read and study the Old Testament from a New Testament perspective?

Have you never heard of dead faith?

Pray God to open your eyes that you may realize your true condition and not give yourself peace or rest until you are in the right relationship with God and can say with old Simeon: "Now lettest thou thy servant depart, Lord, according to thy word, in peace; for mine eyes have seen thy salvation!"

"Woe to those who are at ease in Zion ... those who recline on beds of ivory and sprawl on their couches, and eat lambs from the flock and calves from the midst of the stall, who improvise to the sound of the harp, and like David have composed songs for themselves, who drink wine from sacrificial bowls while they anoint themselves with the finest of oils, yet they have never grieved over the ruin of Joseph." (Amos 6:1, 4-6)

Is this not precisely what has happened to the people and the Church in America? As we have undergone un precedented prosperity in recent decades, have we not forgotten the Lord? Have we not gone after bigger is better as far as churches, ministries, books and all the related things that are now a "must have if we are going to really conduct effective ministries." Have we not forgotten that the simple, basic need to hear the Law in all its sternness and the Gospel in all its sweetness is all that will really satisfy the soul? Have we forgotten that the more we own, the more we have to take care of? All of this chokes out that simple child-like faith in the Lord at His Word.

Perhaps the Lord has brought this economic recession upon us to try and bring us back to Himself. If you have forgotten God, return to Him today!
