Those Days She Was Very Close to God

Anjali remembers the day her husband's regional ministry leader interrupted the prayer meeting she was in to break the news her husband, Ugyen, was in prison.

was very shocked... The first thing I remember doing is talking to God," Anjali says. "It was hurtful to learn my husband was arrested for telling people Jesus loves them."

Weeks before, Gospel for Asia missionary Ugyen Tashi left on a month-long trip to tell people in the mountainous villages of their country about Christ. Anjali and their 18-month-old daughter stayed behind in her mother's house. The month of separation had been a strain, but now she didn't even know when she would see her husband again.

But both Ugyen and Anjali had known these risks when they decided to serve the Lord.

I had heard from older people who served the Lord (there) that sharing the Good News could be risking one's freedom and sometimes even life," Anjali says.

Throughout her husband's court hearings, reinvestigations, appeals and delays, Anjali waited. Weeks passed –still, no answer. Finally, four months after he was arrested, Ugyen was sentenced. Anjali would have to wait three full years to be reunited with her husband.

Rejecting Discouragement

The sentence was a disheartening one that could have crushed Anajali's spirits and caused her life to fall to pieces. However, it was in these hardships that she found abundant grace. She was able to accept what the Lord had allowed to come into her life and trust He had a purpose for it.

"My husband was suffering in the prison, but I always reminded myself that he had gone to the prison for a noble cause, and he was suffering for the Lord. I never regretted or wept over my husband's imprisonment," Anjali remembers. "Those days I was very close to God."

When discouragement tried to creep its way into her heart and mind, Anjali made a deliberate effort to rejoice instead.

"We have to learn to thank the Lord for what He has done in our lives, and then we have to move ahead for the Lord," she says. "If we cry over our losses and hurts, we will not move ahead, and we will not see God's doings and miracles. We should rejoice in the times of persecution and trials. We have to have the joy of the Lord within us even during the trials and difficulties."

Devoting Herself to Ministry

While she prayed and waited for her husband's release, Anjali devoted herself to serving the Lord. She was never idle. The Lord gave her opportunities to minister to the women around her, and from that, she drew strength.

"When I talked to women who shared their problems and difficulties, I forgot mine, and I would pray for them and minister to them," she says.

One woman in particular whom Anjali spent time with was Rupali, the wife of pastor Ashu Suthar.

Pastor Ashu was attacked and crushed by a wild elephant in 2011. The ordeal left him in critical condition with a broken neck. After a year and a half of suffering, he went to be with the Lord in April, 2013.

Morning Glory

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"Hearing all about Pastor Ashu through his wife made me forget my problems," Anjali shares.

In addition, Anjali often spoke at women's gatherings, exhorting her listeners to trust the Lord and be thankful for everything. And because her own life was a living example of this, many women were challenged and encouraged by her trustworthy words. She would tell them "I have given (all my struggles) to the Lord, and He is going to handle everything for me. The Lord is going to meet all our needs."

Encouraging Her Husband

Finally, after three years of imprisonment, Anjali's husband was released, and the family was reunited.

Ugyen and Anjali, along with their now 4-year-old daughter, Nitya, continue to bring the love of Christ to those around them—and the threat of imprisonment continues. But Ugyen and Anjali rejoice in the call the Lord has given them, no matter the cost.

"It is a responsibility and duty of a wife to encourage her husband to fulfill his call from the Lord," Anjali shares. "We have to pray for him and encourage him to serve the Lord faith-There fully. are lots of hindrances and difficulties when we step forward to serve the Lord, but we have to overcome them. We have to move forward for the Lord. Although we get worried thinking about the risks involved in serving the Lord, we have to encourage them and pray for them."

And though the future is uncertain, Anjali's focus is as clear as it ever was. "This life is a short one, and we have to redeem the time and bring Christ to people. We have to serve the Lord till we die."

Why Does a Bird Sing?

Recently, while hiking along White Rock Creek north of Dallas, Texas, I paused to enjoy the delightful, clear, slurred song of a cardinal, one of my favorite birds. What a combination of character, color and musical ability! Unlike most species, cardinals sing throughout the year.

The question occurred to me: Why was he singing? Why does any bird sing?

Is it to please the ears of men? Most bird songs aren't even heard by human ears. Too often we simply aren't "tuned in."

Is it the male's attempt to attract a mate? Certainly not in the fall. Or do birds sing, as some poets insist, because they must express their sheer joy at being alive?

Omithologists (those who study birds) claim that a bird's chief motive of singing is to notify all others of his species, that this is his territory and that they are to keep out!

I believe that Psalm 148 gives us the real reason: "praise the LORD from the earth,... Beasts, and all cattle; creeping things, and flying fowl" (vss. 7, 10). A bird sings in praise to the Lord, his Creator. Even William Wordsworth, in his poem "To a Skylark," wrote

"Happy, happy liver, With a soul as strong as a Mountain River, Pouring out praise to the Almighty Giver.

According to Psalm 148, God is to be praised by all creation. The psalm begins and ends with the admonition, *Praise ye the LORD!*"

If the birds upon the treetops sing their song, "Why shouldn't I, why shouldn't you, praise Him too?"

The Lost Art/Virtue of Blushing!

"And I said: 'O my God, I am too ashamed and humiliated to lift up my face to You, my God' for our iniquities have risen higher than our heads, and our guilt has grown up to the heavens."" (Ezra 9:6)

This is part of <u>Ezra's</u> prayer as he leads the people who *'trembled at the words of the God of Israel'* assembled before him. This 'prayer' is at <u>the evening sacrifice</u>.

The sacrifice, and especially the <u>evening *sacrifice*</u>, was a type of the great propitiation.

The 'leaders' have informed Ezra that the people of Israel, the priests and the Levites have mingled/mixed with the heathen/unbelievers surrounding them and some have even inter-married! (They have not separated themselves from the '*world'*). YES, even the 'leaders' and 'rulers' have *been 'stumbling blocks*/bait for the children of Israel.

In preparation of leading the 'assembly' in prayer; although he himself is <u>not 'personally'</u> guilty, he tore his garment and his robe and plucked out some of the his hair and beard (he had been fasting), and 'I fell on my knees' and prayed. His prayer is a penitent confession of SIN, not his own, but the sin of his people. (Like Daniel 9).

The tearing of the garments was a sign of deep affliction (Lev. 10:6, Josh. 7:6); but plucking out a portion of the hair and beard was an expression of violent wrath or moral indignation (Isa. 50:6, Neh. 13:25). Ezra realized that because of the 'holiness of God', that such sin(s) could lead to the captivity/judgment of God! As you see a man's attitude toward God's Word is one of the ultimate criteria of his spirituality. (Please read the entire chapter of Ezra 9).

To tell YOU that 'immorality' is rampant in 'our' beloved' country and beyond is not NEWS! Anyone with a good sense of right and wrong can easily distinguish that; BUT 'we' are told to tell the TRUTH <u>in love</u> and lie not to one another. (Thus by the Grace of God 'we' of the MG/HLIF, seek to be 'faithful' unto 'our' Creator and Redeemer). (As an example: I sent out a 'Hauge Letter' recently (app. 140) with the following statement 'A few folks have requested us to include all of their 'Christmas card' names on the Morning Glory (this is a great idea and motivation): but I can not necessarily verify the same))!

Hopefully you are aware of the realization that a spiritually alert and alive person deals with SIN like the waste products of your own human body and also it greatly 'disturbs' one when SIN has invaded the church and/or community! NOW I most certainly do not 'fully' understand LOT who vexed his 'own' soul and yet could sit at the 'gate' and also bargain his virgin daughters' II Peter 2:4-11. It is crystal clear what happened to Mrs. Lot, as she turned into a pillar of salt and for eternity ???

Seemingly one of the 'greatest' sins TODAY is to name SIN by <u>it's name!</u> BUT keep in mind/conscience that sin will take you further than you want to go, keep you longer than you want to stay and cost you more than you want to PAY; for what YOU sow YOU will also <u>reap</u>.

Please notice the introductory ministry of John the Baptizer and JESUS and for <u>all ministers</u>. See John 1, <u>Matthew 4:17, 3:7-8</u> and Luke 24:47 & Acts 17:30-31.

Almost without fail, *Immorality* doesn't just take place 'over-night'. *Likely* it 'roots' can be traced 'way-back' to pre-school years when immodesty began with clothing and apparel and watching Mom and Dad and TV/Computers. You see, long ago, TV has become the in home 'baby-sitter' and I don't need to tell you <u>that immodesty</u> (<u>Immorality</u>) is not 'foreign' thereof. You know 'sin' seems so 'harmless' at first, just like how 'cute' baby foxes are, but a baby <u>fox/</u> grows. <u>Psalm 101:3</u>.

Almost all 'fashion' has become the all-important clothing 'apparel' which is definitely of the 'world'. Basically the 'worldly fashion' is scant or viewing of the human body and leaving just enough for the 'observer's imagination to 'wonder/imagine'. (This is true for BOTH male and females: men pull up your 'pants' and carry on)! JESUS says: "But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart" Matthew 5:28. This 'sin' has also invaded some 'Christian churches' with scant (and see through) clothing, music and body movements! NOW, how can a 'conscientious Christian' purposely cause 'the thought life' of another to sin and fuel 'evil thoughts' in another is very hard for me to 'grasp'. 1 Corinthians 8:9-13, II Sam. 12:13-14, Matthew 18:7, Romans 14:13 and 1 Thess. 5:22. Martin Luther said in regards to 'evil thoughts' that you cannot keep a bird from flying over your head, but you can keep it from nesting in your hair'. So the conclusion in regards to this 'phase' in life is: What is more important to you: Fashion OR to cause 'someone' to SIN? "Nor did they know how to blush... Thus says the LORD; 'Stand in the ways and see, And ask for the old paths, where the good way is, And walk in it; Then you will find rest for your souls. But they said, 'We will not walk in it.' Also, I set watchmen over you, saying, 'Listen to the sound of the trumpet!' But they said, 'We will not listen" Jeremiah 6:15, 16. A person most certainly can dress neat and attractive without being seductive!

Likely what will happen next is attending/participating in what is consider the *innocent Christian Dance!* NOW, the 'challenge' is <u>yours</u>. How can, for example, a male observe/participate in an atmosphere where there are 'body-movements' of the opposite sex without a 'sinful' thought? For example think of Samson, Lot, Demas, etc. By the way IF you still have question IF a 'Christian' should be on the dance floor; please prayerfully read Phil. 2:5-13. I personally cannot imagine JESUS on the 'dance floor' and touching the opposite sex.

Likely moderate drinking of alcohol follows the dance and easily leads to <u>immorality.</u>

Probably the climax of 'immorality' is 'same-sex marriages'; which is <u>permissible</u> (legally) in sixteen of the fifty states of our beloved USA. OH how we need to identify with EZRA, JEREMIAH, etc. and acknowledge openly before 'our' Holy God our SIN and plead for His continued **mercy and grace** upon our 'country'. II Chron. 7:14. (Notice: Four conditions & three Promises)!

When 'we' experience 'seasons of refreshing' from the Lord (Revival), both the saved and unsaved will become

Mortified

"For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die; but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live." Romans 8:13

To mortify something means to put it to death. Paul taught in our text and in other passages that the "deeds of the body," or its fleshly actions and appetites, all that pertains "to the old man," should be mortified, or put to death.

This mortification is first of all judicial – Christ having been put to death in our stead. "Our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin" Romans 6:6.

But the mortification must not stop there, with only a positional death. It must also be an actual mortification in practice, for "they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit" Galatians 5:24-25. "For as ye have yielded your members servants to uncleanness and to iniquity unto iniquity; even so now yield your members servants to righteousness unto holiness" Romans 6:19.

Elsewhere, Paul identifies specific deeds and attitudes that must be mortified. "Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence (or evil desires), and covetousness" (Colossians 3:5). The first four listed will be recognized as various "forms of sensual sins, indicating how detrimental this category of sin is to spiritual life. The fifth is covetousness, or inordinate love of money and material things. These five comprise deadly sins to men and women of any historical age – particularly our own. If they are not put to death, they bring death, "for which things' sake the wrath of God cometh" (v. 6).

The choice is clear! It will be either death to the flesh, or death to the spirit.

Total abstinence

"Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul." 1 Peter 2:11

The command to <u>abstain</u> occurs only a few times in the New Testament, but there are three occurrences which are especially relevant for Christians today. One of these is 1 Thessalonians 4:3:

"For this is the will of God, even your sanctification, that ye should abstain from fornication." The Greek word here actually applies to any type of sexual relationship outside of marriage, and the command is not merely for temperance or for "love" in one's non-marital sexual relationships, but for total abstinence. This exhortation is perhaps needed more today than at any time since the days of pagan Rome, even for Christians and, unfortunately, Christian leaders. But that is not all. In the words of our text, we are also urgently exhorted to "abstain from fleshly lusts," since these carnal desires are in mortal combat with our very souls. One must avoid situations which might initiate or encourage fornication or its kindred activities.

But even that is not sufficient for the serious Christian man or woman. "Now we exhort you, brethren ... Abstain from all appearance of evil" 1 Thessalonians 5:14, 22. The word here means anything that in its outward form might appear to be evil, regardless of whether it is really wrong in itself or not. The Lord desires that we "adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things' (Titus 2:10) and that we "give none offense" 1 Corinthians 10:32.

A believer cannot afford to be careless in this warfare against his soul. "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour" 1 Peter 5:8. "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God" 1 Corinthians 10:31.



A HIGH MAN WHO CAME DOWN

(One of Three Questions in John 3), radio sermon by Pastor R. Norheim

THE THIRD QUESTION

People who seek council should be prepared to receive rebuke as well as advice. Ministers of the Gospel should not be limited to pleasant preaching, comforting consolations and palatable plaudits. Putting the mildest form of construction of Jesus' question to Nicodemus one cannot escape the fact that He intended to rebuke this ruler of Israel. There might even have been a tint of ridicule in His words. Jesus knew his important position; so He was not interviewing him for a "case study; nor was He filling out a questionnaire. Nicodemus knew that. So he must have felt a certain sharp sting in this question:

"Art thou a ruler in Israel, and knowest not these things?"

For a moment or two he may have wondered if Jesus were treating him as a child. So far, Nicodemus had been asking all the questions; now the teacher asks the question.

This is God's usual pattern: the sting of the needle precedes the doctor's injection. The Law always prepares the way for the Gospel. Man must know pain before he can know pardon. The Lord wasn't a graduate with the back-slapper's class. "He taught as one having authority, and not as the scribes and Pharisees." Matt. 7:29. No wonder some modern psychologists are confused - and their patients are even more so. The customer must always be pampered and pleased; no cross-grain irritation allowed; he may not return! Jesus knew this better than anyone else, and still He didn't pamper Nicodemus. The Lord gives comfort where comfort is due; but He never puts the cart before the horse. There's a method to His seeming madness. In the words of Hosea, in chapter 6, verse 1, we agree: "He hath torn, and He will heal us; He hath smitten, and He will bind us up."

It is quite obvious that the rulers in Israel did not know these things pertaining to the new birth. Theologians, today, too, have highly differing interpretations of what Jesus meant when He said, "<u>Ye must be born again.</u>" Modernists can use the same terminology true Bible believers use, but they mean something else, often just the opposite. "Conversion" becomes man's ability to make the right choice, instead of God's power in turning a man from sin to salvation. "Inspiration" simply means the Bible inspires me, instead of the fundamental fact that the Bible is God-inspired. It is God's Word whether it inspires or condemns me. So beware of words; some men are clever in the use of them. Whichever way the wind blows – they blow! But a truly born again person knows the meaning of Jesus statement in verse 5, "*The wind bloweth where it listeth, and thou hearest the sound thereof, but cans't not tell whence it cometh, and whither it goeth: so is every one that is born of the Spirit.*"

He that is born of the Spirit is a miracle-moving man, "Old things are passed away; behold all things are become new" II Cor. 5:17. The first movement was toward Sinai, where the demands of a thrice-holy God made man tremble with realization that he was totally lost and could never become righteous by law observances. The second movement was to Calvary, where the demands of God were met by man's Substitute, the Lord Jesus Christ, where the blood of Christ was shed to atone for man's sin, where man and God were reconciled, where God can be both righteous and just in granting forgiveness to sinners who identify themselves as such. The third movement is the "going in and out" of John 10:10; or, in the language of Romans 8:14, "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."

"Under Divine Control", is the three-worded motto of every person created by God the Father, redeemed by Jesus Christ and enlightened by the Holy Spirit. This does not make man a robot, without exercise of the will; but it does explain the fact that his spiritual life is a miracle: his movements are God-directed, and therefor God-accepted. *"That which is born of the flesh is flesh."* It may be dignified, religious flesh, but it's nothing more than flesh. Man's best efforts can never satisfy the just demands of God; therefore he must be born again.

Isn't it tragic that these truths are unknown to so many religious leaders? Why are there multitudes of preachers who preach everything and anything but the new birth? Evidently they can't express what they haven't experienced. A blind man can't explain the blue sky, the colors of the flowers nor the beauty of nature. He has never seen these things. "If the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch." Matt. 5:14. Therefore I must ask you, today, you who are leaders in your church - you pastors, Sunday School superintendents, teachers, elders, trustees and other leaders of church organizations, "Are you born of the Spirit?" If you will not be converted, the best thing you could do would be to resign from your position of leadership! It is not a small thing to mislead those who have placed their confidence in you, and look up to you as their spiritual leader. Jesus spake some terrifying words in Matt. 18:6,7 when He said, "But whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea. Woe unto the world

because of offences! For it must needs be that offences come; but woe to that man by whom the offence come."

Yes, it is tragic to not know these things; tragic for you as well as for those you are supposed to help. But it is not only tragic: **it is an open transgression!** What right do you have to fill a place someone after God's heart should fill? "The Lord knoweth them that are his. And let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity." 2 Tim. 2:17. "Thou therefore that teachest another, teachest thou not thyself? Thou that preaches a man should not steal, doest thou steal? Thou that sayest a man should not commit adultery, dost thou commit adultery? Thou that abhorrest idols, dost thou commit sacrilege? Thou that makest thy boast of the law, through breaking of the law dishonourest thou God? For the name of God is blasphemed among the Gentiles through you." Romans 2:21-24.

The higher you've climbed, the farther it is to the bottom; the more you've been elevated, the greater the humiliation to be abased. I was a preacher's son; but I had to come down at the altar of my home church, to request prayer for salvation. The Pharisee in the temple (Luke 18) was high and lifted up; he refused to come down. But the Publican "would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote <u>his breast, saying, "God be merciful to</u> <u>me a sinner.</u>" But "this man went justified down to his house rather than the other; for everyone that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted."

Years ago, while serving as the Youth Pastor in our Brooklyn, N. Y. church, I heard a convert say in the Jerry McAuly Cremorne Mission: "The only way up is down." He added, "The only way up into the arms of Jesus is down at the foot of the cross." I've never forgotten this. It has been my repeated experience. It is my present abiding place: the place Jesus commended Mary for taking, and recommended for Martha. (Luke 10). If you are still up in a sycamore tree with Zacchaeus, do like he did: make haste and come down! If you think you are climbing Jacob's ladder (Genesis 28), remember it wasn't Jacob that ascended that ladder, but angels of God. God came down to us; but none of us can climb up to Him. Poor Jacob had to come down too. We see him lowest at Peniel, when he wrestled with God, and limped the rest of his life as one whom God had humbled. "Come down! Come down!" is God's call to every creature. You are no exception. Come now, let Jesus come into your heart. Then, and then only will you be "seated in heavenly places in Christ Jesus." (Ephesians 1).

"I come quickly: hold fast that which thou hast, that no one take thy crown." Rev. 3:11

THIS is the cry to us from Him who knows that we are quite inclined to compose ourselves in this world, and to grow fast on the edge of our grave. At times it also seems to us that He is not coming quickly, but it is nevertheless.

It is not only because a thousand years are to God but as yesterday when it is past, but also because life in this world runs away from us so fast. If we pause a moment in our haste, and think back over the time that we have lived, we realize that time has passed quickly. Everything is like a brief dream, as smoke in clear air, and like the path that a ship makes in the sea. After all, it is only the breath that we now draw that is ours: God owns the next. It is only over the cross that the crown beckons to us, and only they who hold fast to Jesus can win the victor's wreath. There we shall be more than conquerors through Him that loved us. But to remember that life here is short is a great help to us in holding fast. When the thought of a long lie finds lodgement in the heart, it is easy to let go of the cross and to lose the crown.

O Son of God, we wait for Thee, We long for Thine appearing, We know Thou sittest on the throne, And we Thy name are bearing. Who trusts in Thee may joyful be, And see Thee, Lord, descending To bring us bliss unending.

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The Ministry

The Church – 1 Corinthians 3 & 4

By (Dr.) O. Gornitzka

(Continued from last issue of the Morning Glory)

There are four terms used to designate the ministry in these chapters. a). Ministers or servants (3:5); b). God's fellow-workers (3:9); c). Stewards (4:1); d). Fathers (4:15).

a. "What then is Apollos?

And what is Paul? **Ministers through whom ye believed;** and each as the Lord gave to him." The Corinthians had made man the central figure in their faith. They were followers of one or the other of the servants of God. Now they are reminded that these men are but ministers, servants. They are **not in the field to gather about themselves but in cooperation to gather unto Christ.** And this service they perform *as God gives to each.* They can take and give nothing. It must be given from above and the gifts may differ. They are to supplement, not supplant, one another. One planteth, another watereth. These gifts bring results, however, <u>only as God gives the increase.</u> Therefore to Him be all the glory.

b. "We are God's fellow-workers"

This term designates their relation to the temple. *Ye are God's building*." God is the great master building. The temple is His own creation. It is the fruit of His planning from everlasting and His redemptive work in Christ. It is made possible through the indwelling presence and power of the Holy Spirit. But He has chosen men to be His channels through whom He is working, men born again and made responsive to the guidance and leadership of the Holy Spirit. These are laboring on the temple walls, finding, fashioning and fitting stones into the structure.

What a glory! God working hand in hand with men! And what a wonder of His grace! Men made fit to receive His instruction and power to carry them out! Indeed there is nothing impossible with God.

But having received such honor and glory the workers must watch lest on the foundation they build with wrong material (3:12-15). If so, although they be saved they will lose their reward. In the fire of judgment their deeds will burn up. This is being done if as fellow-workers with God we follow man-made plans and policies for the purpose of pleasing man, satisfying vain-glory, rather than to follow the guidance of the Spirit of God to glorify His name.

c. Let a man so account of us, ... as stewards of the mysteries of God." As co-workers together with God the ministers are stewards, responsible to God for their ministry. As workers on the temple the men are responsible, not to the temple, but to Him who has employed them. As such it is required of them that they be found faithful. They are in His employ whose eyes are as flaming fire and who can always say, *"know thy works." In his man-ward relation the minister has ample opportunity to sleep on the job and be unfaithful. But if he is conscious of his high calling he will always be kept awake by his tremendous responsibility toward God.*

Because of this unique position held by the ministry the members **are warned against premature judgment** upon his life and work. God will judge and from Him nothing can be kept secret. This warning is given because there always will be carnal-minded Christians of the judging type who take special pleasure in faultfinding. There are those who seem to have an honest doubt that a minister can be a true Christian. Let such members take heed from the Word of God. This has nothing to do with constructive, loving criticism which will always be pleasing to God and welcomed by His servants.

d. Fathers

"In Christ Jesus I begat you through the gospel." This honor title can be assumed by those who through much struggle in prayer and spiritual agony have been used by God to bring souls into the kingdom. To them are born spiritual children. Such joy had come to Paul. He reminds his children of this as they seemed to be too quickly grown up in their estimation while as yet they were in such need of his fatherly advice and guidance.

The Attitude of the Christian to the Ministry – Ch. 4:6-21.

This may be summed up in the words <u>"puffed up."</u> Or, in others words, "SPIRITUAL PRIDE." This is one of the pitfalls into which many a young Christian has fallen. The danger is especially great where, as among the Corinthians, there is an abundance of spiritual gifts without the proper balance of true self-knowledge.

They were filled, had become rich, had come to reign without God's servants (4:8). They were spiritually independent. Yes, to the extent of going beyond that which was written (4:6). They were no more in need of any guidance. Theirs was a boasting Christianity, rich in words. They are therefore reminded that when Paul comes he will look not for words, but power. *Is the grace of God revealed in a life of victory over self and sin, or is sin and self shielded behind a flood of empty words? "For the kingdom of God is not in word but in power."*

Ephesians 2:9.

Psalm 46:10

Is there any note in all the music of the world as mighty as the grand pause? Is there any word in the Psalms more eloquent than the word "Selah," meaning pause? Is there anything more trilling and awe-inspiring than the calm before the crashing of the storm, or the strange quiet that seems to fall upon nature before some supernatural phenomenon or disastrous upheaval? And is there anything that can touch our hearts like the <u>power of stillness</u>?

For the hearts that will cease focusing on themselves, there is "the peace of God, which transcends all understanding" (Phil 4:7); "quietness and trust' (Isa. 30:15), which is the source of all strength; a "great peace" that will never "make them stumble" (Ps. 119:165); and a deep rest, which the world can never give nor take away. Deep within the center of the soul is a chamber of peace where God lives and where, if we will enter it and quiet all the other sounds, we can hear His "gentle whisper" (1 Kings 19:12).

Even in the fastest wheel that is turning, if you look at the center, where the axle is found, there is no movement at all. And even in the busiest life, there is a place where we may dwell alone with God in eternal stillness.

There is only one way to know God: "Be still, and know." *"The LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth be silent before him"* (Hab. 2:30). Selected.

What Began at Philippi

"Paul and Timotheus, the servants of Jesus Christ, to all the saints in Christ Jesus which are at Philippi ... Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ." Philippians 1:1-2

The church at Philippi was birthed on one of Paul's missionary journeys. He was summoned there in a vision by an unidentified man in Macedonia (now Greece) pleading for him to come and help them (Acts 16:9-10). Paul soon traveled to Thessalonica, Berea, and Athens, where he encountered much hardship and persecution. But the work he had begun in Philippi continued, eventually spreading throughout the continent. The intensely personal letter he later wrote to the Philippian church contains some of the most important doctrinal truths concerning Christ and our victorious life in Christ in all of Scripture.

God's sovereign plan included Europe. He saw to it that the governmental roadblocks and personal opposition were ultimately unsuccessful. Today many individual Christians trace their ancestry back to Europe. Great evangelistic movements and worldwide missionary efforts over the centuries have European roots. The God-ensured preservation of the Scriptures primarily occurred there as well. Many of the important Bible study tools and preaching helps come through the Western church. Many seminaries and Bible colleges, as well as hospitals and humanitarian efforts, stem from the Western tradition.

Today, great numbers are thankfully turning to Christ around the world, but much of the Church's work began in Philippi as a faithful witness fearlessly and sacrificially preached the Good News of Jesus Christ.

"I have a dream," proclaimed Martin Luther King, Jr., in his most famous speech as the leader of the civil rights movement.

As a servant of God, I too have a dream! It is to see the Body of Christ changed and revolutionized in such a way that we no longer go to church to be entertained and get what we want. Rather, we meet the Living God and understand the purpose He has for our lives and pursue it.

So what is God's purpose for us?

Is it that we pursue great accomplishments, have huge congregations, build fancy facilities and enjoy great entertainment (although these things in themselves are not wrong)? No, I believe God is looking for a Bride.

In his book ..., Paul Bilheimer describes how God created everything, seen and unseen, in order to find a Bride for His Son.

God is looking for a people who will seek what He seeks in order to please Him and who will prepare for the day when they will meet the Lord Jesus Christ face to face.

The world around us and much of modern day Christianity tell us we can do both, please ourselves and God at the same time.

They encourage us to live a life of compromise – instead of following Christ's example, who surrendered to the Father's will, chose the cross for Himself and asks us to do the same.

When we read in the Gospels what Jesus says regarding discipleship, we realize it is impossible to live for our own wishes and ambitions and at the same time follow in

As you go to the 'house of the LORD' to Worship HIM , please 'remember' to dress in proper attire within your means; as you bow before the LORD of lords, and King of kings in 'Spirit and in Truth'. Christ's footsteps.

Jesus says, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me" (Luke 9:23).

Christ's call to us, His Bride, is to be exclusively committed to Him and seek to please and obey Him.

The Apostle Paul wrote, "he died for all, that those who live should live no longer for themselves, but for Him who died for them and rose again" (2 Corinthians 5:15).

So what is God asking from us, the Bride of Christ?

He is asking for an all-out, absolute surrender, not just of our personal life but of everything with it. It means denying *self*. That's far different than denying ourselves *things*, like food or new clothing, as part of a spiritual exercise.

If we seek to please Christ, we can no longer measure ourselves by what we see in others, nor can we *copy what they practice*.

Instead, we must look to Jesus and find out what He values and desires for His Bride. God's Word reveals to us that He wants us to have a character like His and reflect His humility, obedience, love, compassion, holiness and kindness.

"For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son" (Romans 8:9).

In order for this transformation to take place, we must not only cooperate with the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives, but we also must be willing to walk the small and narrow road Jesus talked about. Others around us will be free to live their own dreams and pursue their own goals, but we can no longer join them, for we have found something far more precious to live for. We want to spend every minute of our life on earth getting ready to meet Jesus, our heavenly Bridegroom. And we will be ready if we seek to please only God and walk away from the ever-present temptation of our culture that tells us it is OK to compromise.

Jesus is worth all of our love and dying to self. Believe me, in eternity we will never be sorry that we followed Him with a whole heart.

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WHEN AMERICA CRIED FOR BIBLES

Even the U. S. Congress cleared a printing of Bibles, and American statesmen helped spread them throughout the land.

The American Revolution was in full swing. The Bible, though more than one hundred fifty years of early settlement in America, remained the base of her people's religious devotion, her education, her colonial government. These Bibles had been shipped in from England.

Now, suddenly the American Revolution cut off this supply, and the stock dwindled.

Here was America in its greatest crisis yet – and without Bibles! Patrick Allison, Chaplain of Congress, placed before that body in 1777 a petition praying for immediate relief. It was assigned to be a special committee which weighed the matter with great care, and reported: "...that the use of the Bible is so universal and its importance so great that your committee refer the above to the consideration of Congress, and if Congress shall not think it expedient to order the importation of types and paper, the Committee recommend that Congress will order the Committee of Congress to import 20,000 Bibles from Holland, Scotland, or elsewhere, into the different parts of the States of the Union.

"Whereupon it was resolved accordingly to direct said committee to import 20,000 copies of the Bible."

During the session in the fall of 1780 the need arose once more.

Robert Aitken, who had set up in Philadelphia as a bookseller and publisher of *The Pennsylvania Magazine*, saw the need and set about quietly to do something about it.

In early 1781 he petitioned Congress and received from them a green light to print the Bibles needed. The Book came off the press late next year, and Congress approved it.

So originated the "Bible of the Revolution," now one of the world's rarest books – the first American printing.

Open the door for the Lord's friends, and be hospitable! He who asked us to do this, is rich enough for all. He never forgets what He has promised.

What Could be Worth More Than GOLD?
