Transformed by the Word

The proprietor of a successful business, Nandak, gave all the credit to his gods. There used to be little hope in Nandak's life: his father had died when he was in the 10th grade, leaving Nandak's mother alone to provide for her two sons.

andak dropped out of school and took upon himself the burden of providing for his mother and younger brother.

He got married and started a business selling furniture. This venture brought in enough money to meet all of the family's needs. Attributing the success to their gods and goddesses, Nandak and his family worshiped them faithfully.

However, Nandak began spiraling down into a dark pit. He started spending time drinking with his friends. As this destructive habit grew worse, both Nandak's wife and his mother pleaded with him to stop, but their words fell on deaf ears.

It was during this time that Probhat, a Gospel for Asia-supported pastor, began taking a team of believers to share the Good News among unreached villages in the area. When Pastor Prabhat stopped at Nandak's house, the young man wasn't home. So Prabhat left a New Testament with Nandak's wife and mother. When Nanadak came home that evening, he noticed the Bible on the table. Not knowing what the book was about, however, he didn't read it.

Sleepless Nights Cause Him to Read the Bible

A few days later, Nandak came down with a sickness that left him bedridden for days. Demons tormented him

at night, robbing him completely of sleep. He went to a doctor and offered special sacrifices to the gods, but he didn't get any better. Stuck in bed, Nandak picked up the New Testament left by Pastor Prabhat and began to read. The stories in the book of Matthew amazed him. Reading about the many healings of Jesus, Nandak was impressed by Jesus' power, and he wanted Jesus to heal him too.

When news came that the pastor was back in his village, Nandak sent for him.

Pastor Prabhat was overjoyed to know that Nandak had been reading the Bible. He came and prayed for Nandak and challenged him to keep reading every day.

A Changed Life

This was not a problem for Nandak; he was learning so much. When he stopped worshiping the gods and goddesses of his traditional faith, the other villagers became upset. His mother and brother moved out, which saddened him. But Nandak noticed that the more he read the Bible, the better he felt. As Jesus began transforming his heart, he stopped drinking.

Within a month, people could see the positive changes in Nandak's life. His wife decided to follow Jesus too. The couple invited Pastor Prabhat to their home to pray for them, and they also began hosting a weekly prayer meeting.

As the whole village heard about the prayer meetings and the power of Jesus to transform lives, people's hearts began softening. Two more families decided to come to pray, and they have since embraced the love of Jesus — along with Nandak's mother and brother.

"I remember always trying to improve myself to earn love and respect from everyone around me," Nandak says,

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"I started drinking alcohol, I thought I was so cool. But in reality, I was mentally, emotionally, physically and spiritually unhealthy. I thought I was just partying and having fun, but I was really destroying myself. I want to thank the Lord for the grace and mercy He showed in my life by sending His Word to my home through His servant."

Christ and the Four Thieves

"The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." John 10:10

There were four thieves closely involved in the events surrounding the crucifixion of the Lord Jesus Christ. The first of these was one of His own disciples. "(Judas) was a thief, and had the bag, and bare what was put therein" John 12:6. It was Judas, of course, who betrayed Christ, facilitating His arrest and conviction.

The second was not only a thief, but also revolutionary and a murderer. "Barabbas ...who had committed murder in the insurrection ...was a robber" (Mark 15:7, John 18:40). This convicted criminal, appointed to death, was released and Jesus condemned in his stead. Thus, Barabbas benefitted temporarily from Christ, receiving an unexpected and undeserved liberty because Christ was willing to go to the cross.

"Then were there two thieves crucified with him." Matthew 27:38. Their names are not given in the Bible, but their attitudes toward Christ, and therefore their ultimate destinies, were diametrically different. One of them berated Christ, saying, "If thou be Christ, save thyself and us" Luke 23:39.

The fourth thief, on the other hand, believed Christ, and therefore heard His saving words: "Today shalt thou be with me in paradise" Luke 23:43.

All were thieves deserving punishment. One was a betrayer, ending his life in suicide; one was a beneficiary, though only for a time; one was a berater, destined for hell; but one was a believer, receiving salvation and eternal life. Jesus, who received the penalty for thievery, can save even the thief, for He came "that they might have life, and might have it more abundantly." Henry M. Morris, Ph.D.

God's Personal Love Letter

Please prayerfully read 1 Thessalonians 5:1 - 12 (ALWAYS ask the Holy Spirit to open the Scriptures to YOU)

In a rightful sense 'all of Scripture' is a 'love letter' (God's Grace) to <u>you</u>; but at times it is so <u>very personal</u>. HE tells things just actually as they are, because HE loves you that much!

Naturally there is no question of whom God has in mind as HE took holy men of old, by the Holy Spirit, and inspired them to write for our benefit. The entire BIBLE! With that in definite 'focus', there is no question of whom our text is especially for today. Did you notice the word 'you' eleven times, and the words 'us' and ' we' nine times, and the word Brethren three times? (Those of the household of faith).

Then please note when the very significant word 'but' appears in Holy Scripture and especially so when it says 'but God', for then a miracle is just around the corner.

Almost always on a new day of GRACE, one of the first things I do is check the 'weather map' to see what the weather forecaster predicts for the day and on. "He answered and said to them, 'When it is evening you say, it will be fair weather, for the sky is red; and in the morning, it will be foul weather today, for the sky is red and threatening! Hypocrites! You know how to discern the face of the sky, but you cannot discern the signs of the times" Matthew 16:2-3, 16:6, 11-12, 24:4-5, 24:24, 3:8, 7:16-20, etc.

As you notice God never wants His children to become complacent nor indifferent in verse one, but definitely want us to be spiritual 'sign readers': just like 'spiritual fruit inspectors', especially so in the latter days!

Now a sign is not the 'event' in itself, but an indication of what is going to day place (like a highway sign of an up coming curve or speed limit). Now in Scripture, a sign can be fulfilled at absolute minimum at least once. Everything will happen just as God said it would.

It is very interesting as Jesus speaks of His coming (rapture) as a 'thief in the night'. For me there is a difference between a 'robber' and a 'thief'; for a robber comes bold and brazen (openly) and a 'thief' makes his appearance unexpectedly and knows what he is coming for! Is is special as Jesus (the Bridegroom) is coming for His blood bought bride in the twinkling of an eye. A 'twinkling' of an eye is a very minute portion of a second.

This is mentioned in verses two and four.

From creation and on, every thing reproduces after its kind. IF <u>you</u> sow 'wild oats', <u>you</u> will reap the harvest of the same. When SIN is sown, it will reap a harvest that will keep you longer, take you farther, cost you more, and, as a result, you will end up where you do not want to go.

Sheep reproduce lambs and spiritually you and I are <u>either</u> walking in the light or darkness and 'we' reproduce after 'our' kind. For in verse five you are <u>either</u> walking in the light of day or the darkness of night.

Night is generally a time of sleep, and, while a person sleeps, such a person does not know what is going on nor taking place. You can not tell me exactly when you went to sleep nor what took place while you were sleeping; on your own. Basically a person is comfortable when they sleep. TRAGICALLY this happens spiritually. (For example: remember the ten virgins in Matthew 25)

Night (darkness) time is a cover up for: "'And this is the condemnation, that the light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed.'" John 3:19-20, - John 2:11, Ephesians 5:11: contrast John 8:12, 12:35, 1 John 1:5, Luke 1:79, Romans 13:12.

"And now, little children, abide in Him, that when He appears, we may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming." Whenever JESUS spoke of His coming again; He shares it not for speculating, BUT for admonishing us for 'godly living'. In other words, we should make choices daily for godly living that conforms to our future dwelling place. "Knowing this first: that scoffers will come in the last days, walking according to their own lusts. II Peter 3:3. Therefore, God intends this wonderful realization: Either through the valley of the shadow of death OR the blessed, purifying hope as an encouragement and comfort to us! For in verse nine we are not appointed to wrath. (Editor: This is one reason I am of the conviction and hope with the Pre-tributionists; BUT regardless, I definitely adhere/propose/suggest/prepare to 'prepare for the worst and look for the better! Most of the time when you are in the midst of someone sleeping, it becomes more conducive to sleep yourself. That's one reason HE tells us to be watching, and to make certain that we have Christ's righteous robe applied to our own personal desperate Need (II Corinthians 5:17-21/armor - Eph. 6:10-21). A watch man who is sleeping on the job; is of a greater hindrance, as IF there were no watchmen at all. *1 Cor. 14:8*. God speaks of those who do not warn others as dumb dogs that can not bark OR blind leaders of the blind!

Have <u>you noticed</u> in the average Christian's worship service <u>today</u> that the songs are good, the order of service fine, the message good, etc. BUT doesn't there *seem* to be something <u>lacking</u>? Therefore it falls into the 'category' of *II Timothy 3:5*. Could it be that many people want and receive a 'warm, fuzzy, cozy, emotion' experience, but there os a lack the **unction** of the <u>Holy Spirit</u>? The Bible tells us **not to** 'quench, grieve' the Third Person of our Triune God; who symbolically came in the form of a dove; which is gentle, sensitive and easy to frighten? May I suggest that possibly the same is being experienced today because there is too much concern of having a good 'attendance' than 'obedience' to the Word of God?

OR that there is way too much: I, you, me, we in the presentation of the Living Word in music and sermon? The Bible says: "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up" John 3:14, 12:32, Prayer John 12:13, Life 1 Corinthians 6:20. In other words: Could it be that there is way too much attention/attraction is focused on I, you, me, we (congregation, videos, free-movement, gathering, etc), AS God is a 'jealous God'!

It has Never been, nor will it ever be 'easy' to be a true

spiritual watchman (and the 'battle' is *intensifying*); but the Lord (Jesus) asks us to be found unto Him! (One reason there are so few prophets in the Christian Church today; is because it is a non-profit organization)

BUT do notice how a 'spiritual watchman' (Leader/Pastor) is described according to Jesus: "And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you" Verse 12. Galatians 6:1-10 & Hebrews 13:12-21.

As **always**, it is our responsibility <u>now</u> to take 'God's Personal Love Letter' and put it into 'practice'. You see as an example: A Homemaker's recipe book is on the shelf and does absolutely no good for human nourishment, unless you put it into realistic practice; it does the physical body NO good!

Thus as we *practice* the recipe in our individual lives, it will it be a blessing unto others as well as for ourselves. The book of ACTS is not a 'book' of *resolutions*, but a 'book' of *ACTS!* (of the Holy Spirit through His servants).

You see it is <u>you and I</u> who are to not only forget those things behind, but also to press on to the high calling in Christ Jesus until we reach our eternal Home. This applies to others also. (This is <u>one</u> of the purposes of the *Morning Glory/HLIF*).

<u>THUS</u> according to the text today: we admonish, forewarn, nurture, edify, comfort one another in the light of God's 'Personal Love Letter.' *HEBREWS* 10:24-25.

"O LORD, I have heard Your speech and was afraid; O LORD, revive Your work in the midst of the years! In the midst of the years make it known; In wrath remember mercy." Hab. 3:2





Should We Be Surprised?

"But evil men and imposters will proceed from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived." (2 Tim. 3:13)

On December 14, 2012, our nation suffered yet another mass shooting, this time in an elementary school in Connecticut. What made this shooting so bad was that 20 small children were gunned down mercilessly. People have tried to make some sense out of this terrible tragedy, and are asking, "How could someone do such a thing? What can we do to see that this doesn't happen again?" In truth, they should be saying, "Should We Be Surprised?"

Our schools have removed any reference to God and His Word and standard from their teachings. Copies of the Ten Commandments used to be displayed in public schools. Now they are removed, and clubs freely propagate literature that promote safe sex and homosexuality. If people are going to defy God on the Sixth Commandment, "You Shall Not Commit Adultery," are we surprised when people defy Him on the Fifth, "You Shall Not Kill?"

The commonly accepted teaching in many schools and universities today is the Big Bang Theory and evolution. This means that man is an animal because he evolved from the animals. When people are taught this, are we surprised when they behave like an animal? The rule of survival in the animal world is that only the strong survive and the animal world is ruled by killing and oppression of the strong over the weak. This is precisely what is happening in our society today.

People are taught today that there is no God and that, when you die, you die and that's the end. They are taught that there is no final accounting before God of your life, or the possibility of an eternal punishment. Are we surprised when they live as though there is no tomorrow and take matters into their own hands, regardless of what that means or how it affects the person themselves or other people around them? God still promises us this: "By mercy and truth iniquity is purged: and by the fear of the Lord men depart from evil." (Prov. 16:6) When there is no Fear of the Lord presented in society and almost all of the churches, are we surprised when men do not depart from evil?

When society turns away from God and His Word, they leave themselves wide open for every satanic attack. When people proudly declared, "We will have no God rule over us!", they never figured out that they would have one who would be more than happy to rule over them. When people freely take the lives of others, are we surprised when Jesus has told us, "You are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father you will do. He was a mur-

derer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks of his own, for he is a liar and the father of it." (John 8:44) The only thing that will keep a nation free from this satanic control is the blessings of God and His mighty protection and restraint. When this is openly rejected, don't be surprised when there is senseless killing.

Many young people today play personal video games where killing is a central part of the game. There are war games where you kill people ruthlessly. Regardless of the laws that you pass, it will not stop this killing from happening. The guns used in the Connecticut shooting were legally purchased guns. The problem is not with the guns themselves, it is the people who deploy them for that which they were never intended. The problem is not with legislation, the problem is the evil that is growing in the hearts of mankind. God tells us that, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?" (Jer. 17:9) Are we surprised when unconverted mankind does the most heinous acts?

What you see happening in society today is an end result of what they believe about God and His Word. When you reject God and His goodness and Love, which are found alone in the Person and Work of Jesus Christ, then why are you surprised when people behave so evil? As the Scripture at the top of the page says, they will continue to go from bad to worse. What you see happening today will only continue to greater and greater acts of evil.

What is the answer? There is only one answer, and it isn't complicated. Our nation and society must return to God and the standard of His Word. Our churches must return to preaching and teaching the whole counsel of God and living the life of the Christian that Scripture dictates. Did you know that 44 United Nations affiliated monitors were sent here to observe our presidential elections in November? The Democratic Party then replaced Lyon with Vance, whose wife was one of the first attorneys appointed by Barack Obama after taking office...

Now that Moore has regained his seat as Chief Justice of Alabama Supreme Court, he said that while he won't

display a monument this time, he will defend his right to acknowledge God.

"The true issue is whether we can acknowledge the sovereignty of Almighty God over the affairs of our state and our law," he said.

ELCA Joins In Petitioning Congress To Stop US Funding Of Israel

The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) recently announced that it has joined with the National Council of Churches and other liberal mainline denominations in asking members of Congress to conduct an investigation into human rights and weapon violations by the State of Israel. Furthermore, they have asked the government to cut funding to Israel or base the funding on strict compliance regarding these matters.

The other denominations involved in sending this letter, which several prominent Jewish leaders have labeled as "a betrayal of the Jewish State," include the Presbyterian Church (USA), the United Methodist Church and the United Church of Christ.

Not a word in their letter expressed concern about the billions of dollars the US is giving annually to the Muslim Brotherhood, the terrorist organization that now controls and governs Egypt, or about the vast sums given to the terrorist organization Hamas in Gaza.

Leaders from several Jewish organizations cancelled a planned ecumenical gathering with these liberal churches, scheduled for this past October, after learning about their efforts to stop US aid to Israel. In a statement, the Jewish leaders said, "It is outrageous that mere days after the Iranian president repeated his call for Israel's elimination, these American Protestant leaders would launch a biased attack against the Jewish state by calling on Congress to investigate Israel's use of foreign aid. In its clear bias against Israel, it is striking that their letter fails to also call for an investigation of Palestinian use of U. S. foreign aid, thus once again placing the blame entirely on Israel."

The Underground Church In North Korea Is Praying For The Church In America

A very revealing and humbling report was recently given by the Reverend Eric Foley, an expert on underground Christianity in North Korea — The underground church in North Korea is praying for the church in America. When asked why, a member of North Korea's underground church told him: "Because you American Christians put so much confidence in your wealth and freedom that you don't fully know what it's like to be able to trust only in God."

Foley said, "We need to repent of the idea that, because we have more worldly goods and worldly freedom than the North Korean Christians, we are somehow in a more advantageous position to do ministry than they are. It turns out that our modern western way of making disciples and being a church is the historical oddity. The North Korean situation of empty-handed discipleship in the face of intense persecution is the norm. We can learn a lot from them."

Another example of life within the church in North Korea is seen from a testimony given at the Lausanne Conference in 2010, by Sung Kyung Ju, who fled to China from North Korea with her family when she was six years old. While in China, her family was exposed to Christianity, where her father was converted to Christ. He was sent back to North Korea and imprisoned for three years. After his imprisonment, he returned to his family in China, but later went back to North Korea voluntarily to witness the gospel. He was never heard from again. Sung Kyung Ju, who became a Christian after seeing Jesus in a dream, said her family believes her father was executed.

Sung Kyung Ju said, "I want to bring the love of God to North Korea."

Gipsy Smith's Conversion

Cornelius Smith, father of the great evangelist "Gipsy" Rodney Smith, became greatly impressed with his need of salvation.

On one of his journeys, he camped at Shepherd's Bush, and attending a service in a mission hall, he heard the people sing Cowper's stirring hymn:

There is a fountain filled with blood Drawn from Immanuel's veins; And sinners, plunged beneath that flood, Lose all their guilty stains.

And the chorus of another hymn:

I do believe, I now believe That Jesus died for me. That on the cross He shed His blood From sin to set me free.

Soon the father claimed Christ by faith and left the meeting exclaiming, "I am converted!"

Reaching home, he told his motherless children what had happened, placed his arms around the five of them, kissed them and fell on his knees and began to pray.

That first prayer was never forgotten. Many years afterward, Gipsy Smith said, "I still feel its sacred influence on my heart and soul."

The next morning, the converted man was pleading with others, and thirteen gypsies professed to find Christ that day.

When Gipsy Smith was a little older, he attended a service in a chapel in Cambridge. A prayer meeting followed the sermon. When an invitation was given, the gypsy lad went forward. By a coincidence, the congregation sang the chorus which was sung when his father was converted:

I do believe, I now believe That Jesus died for me. That on the cross He shed His blood From sin to set me free.

There and then he trusted in Christ, and from that time he rejoiced in Him as his Saviour. Selected.

The Test of Expedience

"All things are lawful unto me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any." 1 Corinthians 6:12.

Christians are saved by the grace of God, not by works of righteousness. Therefore, in a sense, they are free to do whatever they please. "All things are lawful unto me." The Christian, however, is under a higher law, the law of love and of seeking to please and honor his Savior and Lord.

Therefore, when a question arises as to whether a certain act is right or wrong, the decision should be based on how the act impacts the cause of Christ. Does it help or hinder in the winning of the lost or in edifying the believer? Does it honor the Lord and His Word or bring reproach against His truth? For example, Paul concluded he could not afford to "be brought under the power of any practice (e.g., drinking, smoking, gambling) that might limit the power of God over his actions and decisions.

In a similar passage, Paul says, "All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but all things edify not" 1 Corinthians 10:23. Thus, nothing is expedient for the Christian that does not edify (that is, "build up") spiritually either himself or someone else.

In a similar vein, he said elsewhere that "there is nothing unclean of itself: but to him that esteemeth any thing to be unclean, to him it is unclean ... Let not then your good be evil spoken of.... Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another" Romans 14:14, 16, 19).

This test of expediency, therefore, if applied sincerely by the believer in terms of advancing or hindering the purposes of God in Christ, can be of great help in decision making regarding doubtful issues.

Christian Mission

To say that *John the Baptist* was important might be an understatement. Jesus himself said, "*Among those born of women there has not risen anyone greater than John the Baptist*" (Matthew 11:11). John had purpose. He was chosen by God to prepare the world for the Messiah, the Christ, and John was faithful to his call. In a world full of darkness, he was light. In a world rotting with sin, he was salt. John's entire life, from the way he dressed to the words he spoke, pointed to Jesus, and John's witness changed the world.

Luke 3:1 - 6

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar — when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene — during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the desert. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet: "A voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth. And all mankind will see God's salvation'"

Just as John was called to prepare Israel for the arrival of the Christ, we have been called to prepare the world for the Christ's return. As Christians we know that we are not saved by our actions. We know that we are saved solely by the work of Jesus Christ, but that does not mean that our actions don't matter. In fact the Bible tells us the opposite is true. The Bible tells us, as Christians, that we are to be the salt of the earth (Matthew 5:13), (*Ed.* Look closely at verses 13 & 14, please 'we are'?), to prepare and purify the earth by living out our faith in preparation for the day when Jesus Christ comes again. We are people with purpose, people who point others to Jesus Christ, and in so doing, change the world.

The life of John the Baptist looked different than the lives of the Pharisees, because John believed in the promise of God. John spoke by faith. He lived by faith. His life was a sermon. He was salt!

If we are to be salt, our lives will look different than the lives of those who don't know Jesus. Our lives will point others to Christ.

Sometime ago, I was in Subway with my father. A family came in — grandparents, children, and grandchil-

dren, taking the place over, pushing tables, moving chairs. You know the type.

After they were seated, the grandfather looked down the row of tables, told his family to fold their hands, and right there in Subway, they began to pray. They gave thanks to God, not only for their food but for each and every blessing in their lives. As they prayed, I looked around the restaurant. People were watching! The actions of that family, although not directed toward the world, reminded the world that there is something bigger. That family was salt!

It's a small thing, but small things that point others to Jesus Christ change the world. Jesus said, "Where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them" (Matthew 18:20).

Inviting a neighbor to church — a small thing! Calling your son or daughter who has walked away from the faith, and encouraging them to return — a small thing. But small things that point to Jesus change the world.

John the Baptist lost his life for Christ. If we are going to live as salt in this world, we too will feel the wrath of the world. We will hear the world cry out "Hypocrite!", and we will be guilty, because following Christ, living for Jesus, is hard. We can't live like Jesus; he is perfect, we are sinners. That's why we need him, and that's why those who don't know him need to hear about him.

We will hear the world accuse us of being intolerant, and we will again be guilty, because when we see people living in sin, we know the importance of pointing them toward repentance and salvation.


The world might cry out, "Guilty!", but the voice of Jesus is the only one that counts. He is the judge, and he tells us, those who turn from the world, those who call on his name, we are children of God, washed white as snow, pure and innocent — and those are exactly the words you will hear when he returns in glory.

The Fourth Picture

A picture of the inner condition of a person who has been reconciled to God by Christ's merits, and knows nothing else than Jesus Christ, the Crucified.

In the fourth picture can be seen in the heart of the sanctified sinner only Jesus, the Crucified, and the sign of His suffering. The Holy Spirit, to whom he has surrendered, now rules his life. In no better way can He kindle love in the believer's heart than by constantly holding up before his vision the dying Redeemer on the cross in all His agony, and impressing upon his mind how much it cost Jesus to redeem him. The chief endeavor of the Spirit will now be to declare to him Christ's suffering and death so that he will say with the Apostle Paul: "I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ, and him crucified." "God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world" (I Cor. 2:2, Gal 6:14).

By the guidance of the Holy Spirit the believer finds such comfort and strength from the Redeemer's suffering and death that it fills his whole life. "If God is for me," he says, "who can then be against me?" "He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all how shall he not also with him freely give us all things" (Rom. 8:32). The suffering and death of Jesus is the surety of God's fa-

therly love. In Christ, God reconciled the sinner to Himself, and does not impute his transgressions to him (II Cor. 5:19). Christ, the Crucified, is the basis for the trust in God. If God, the Father of eternal love, gave His Son for us in such suffering, what can He then deny us?

Since Christ in this manner became man's possession and dwells in his heart, he finds in Him the richest source of comfort, and strength to do that which is good. Because of his living faith in Christ, all the pleasures of the world, all the lust of the flesh, all the earthly glory, all perishable things, have become loathsome to him. It appears to him that Christ is calling: "If you want to belong to me and be my disciple, then take up thy cross, deny thyself, and follow me" (Matt. 10:38). His highest desire will then be to become like Christ, the Crucified. He exercises himself in the fear of God and strives to attain "holiness without which no man shall see the Lord" (II Cor. 7:1). He prays "always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit" (Eph. 6:18). He does not neglect "to do good and to communicate, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased" (Heb. 13:16).

The believer rejoices when he is found worthy to suffer for Christ's sake, who suffered persecution, shame, dishonor, and humiliation. He knows that if we suffer with Him we shall also be glorified with Him. For His sake who loved him and gave Himself for him, he wins victory over all things. He looks to the reward that will be given to all those who endure to the end. He that overcometh will inherit all things (Rev. 2:17, 26). Thus it re-echoes in his ears, as he is reminded of the words of Paul: "This one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:13).

O Jesus Christ, Thou boundless love! Thou hast reconciled me to God. From now on Thou alone shall be seen in my heart. My heart shall be dedicated to the fellowship of Thy suffering and death, and my whole life sanctified.
