Listen to Jesus

James 1:19-22

Do we hear our Savior when He speaks? James tells us that if we are to live a life that is pleasing to God and worthy of reward, then we must be "swift to hear (and) slow to speak" (v. 19). From a physiological perspective, the definition of hearing is "the perception of sound." To perceive something is to willfully become aware of its presence. If we are to truly listen to what Jesus is saying, we must be quiet and still, we must perceive His voice, and we must hear what He has to say to us through His written Word. We are living in a world wherein everyone wants to speak and no one wants to listen. Everyone seems to be clamoring for our attention: advertisers, politicians, commentators, sales persons. People everywhere think they have all the answers to life's problems and want everyone else to listen to their opinions. Even many preachers fall into this category. They often are more concerned about getting their own personal agendas across to others than preaching what the Bible has to say.

Perhaps we, too, are often so caught up with wanting to be heard that we do not stop to listen to what our Savior has to tell us through our quiet study of His Word. Christ told the apostles that the Holy Spirit would give them words to write that would honor and glorify Him, and those are the very words that Jesus would have us to hear as well. Christ Himself told of the importance of listening to His voice (Jn. 10:27 18:33-38). Just as God spoke to Elijah in a "still, small voice" (1 Kgs. 19:12), He likewise speaks to us when we attentively study His Word, pray and wait for His leading in our lives. Let us strive to silence ourselves each day and perceive His voice alone. MDC

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The Christian's Lifestyle: Our Gifts

"But unto every one of us is given grace according to the measure of the gifts of Christ" (Ephesians 4:7).

The grace that is given (Greek, *charis*) is a distribution by the Holy Spirit of gifts (same Greek word) to every believer (1 Corinthians 12:4-11). Seventeen different gifts are listed in three New Testament passages (Romans 12:3-8; 1 Corinthians 12:4-10; Ephesians 4:11), all of them intended by the Holy Spirit to minister to the church and to enhance her unity (Romans 12:3; 1 Corinthians 12:12; Ephesians 4:12).

Three reasons are cited for these gifts (Ephesians 4:12): The perfecting of the saints, a process that describes making something useful or suitable that is not yet adequate. James and John mended their nets (Matthew 4:21). Paul prayed that he might supply that which was lacking (1 Thessalonians 3:10). The gifts of the Holy Spirit mend that which is lacking in the saints. The work of the ministry is a joint effort of service (11 Corinthians 6:3) that recognizes the public visibility of that service (II Corinthians 4:1-2) and steadfastly displays those gifts so that the ministry be not blamed (II Corinthians 6:3). The edifying of the body of Christ focuses the use of the gifts on the enrichment and betterment of the local assembly of believers (1 Corinthians 14:5, 12, 26).

The goal is to bring all (the saints) to a state of doctrinal unity (the faith) so that our maturity can be compared to the fullness of Christ (Ephesians 4:13), eliminating susceptibility to every wind of doctrine, growing up unto him in all things, and building the body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, according to the effectual working in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love (Ephesians 4:14-16). HMM

Rebellion Against the Lord

Jeremiah 28:12-17

Rebelling against the Lord is a terrible sin. To teach rebellion against the Lord is even more reprehensible. The false prophet Hananiah was guilty of both aforementioned sins, and God condemned him for causing people to trust in a lie (vv.15-16). Hananiah held a respected place in the hearts of God's people, and his message was well received. He claimed that he was sent by the Lord and that he had received his message from the Lord, but he lied. He deceived himself, and he certainly deceived others. He told the people, the priests and the rulers what they wanted to hear, not what God wanted them to hear. As a result of this compromise, the so-called prophet of God was popular among the people. But he caused the Israelites to trust a lie; he taught rebellion against God: he needed to be exposed and opposed by a faithful minister of the Lord.

Once again Jeremiah was placed in a difficult position. He had to face and openly rebuke the false prophet Hananiah. It was not easy to be a minority voice against the majority in that day, nor is it easy today. As increasing compromise stills the voices of many pastors and people who formerly cried out against false teachers and apostate churches, the task of faithful watchmen becomes even more difficult but also more important. The question in Psalm 94:16 – "Who will rise up for me against the evildoers? or who will stand up for me against the workers of iniquity?" – needs to be answered by every believer today: "By God's grace, I will." The theological wolves of our day wear such innocent looking sheep skins. Spiritual discernment is needed as never before to separate truth from error. If we hold to error, we are, in reality, rebelling against the Lord. MHR

Africa Mission Update

"Many of our Bible schools, theological colleges, and other training centers have graduated record numbers of men and women this year. Most will now fan out into Africa as pastors, missionaries, and Christian workers. Each graduate is special. Some have overcome unbelievable obstacles in order to achieve this milestone. I wish I had time to interview each one and tell you how God provided for them. Of course that would be impossible, but I do want to tell you about Francis Ayul. Francis hails from Southern Sudan, one of the eight tribes inhabiting the oil rich region known as the Upper Nile District. Determined to exploit this area for its enormous wealth, the corrupt government has supported a campaign to either annihilate or dislocate these tribes from the area. This action has, of course, caused a world-wide uproar from peaceful nations, but to very little avail. The family of Francis Ayul was one of the targets.

According to AIM missionary Gregg Okesson, a professor at Scott Theological College, 'Francis is the only (person) of 13 siblings still alive.' In an attempt to repel this onslaught from Sudan's north, Francis enlisted in the Sudan People's Liberation Army. During the 13 years he fought he earned prestige for his fighting prowess. However, during one hot afternoon, in a vicious battle, he was shot twice in the stomach. For three days he lay among the dead, sometimes wondering if he was still alive. He had to constantly chase away hyenas and vultures as they devoured the flesh of his dead comrades. Finally on day three, rather than enduring this slow death, he held an AK47 to his head, planning to take his own life. But while he hesitated, he remembered the name of Jesus from a childhood sermon. Looking heavenward he prayed, 'Jesus, save me.' And even as the words were coming from his mouth he heard his comrades coming to see if any casualties were still alive. While recuperating he promised Jesus, out of gratitude, that he would serve Him the rest of his life. Today, Francis Avul is still a soldier. No, not with the SPLA, but a soldier of the cross. His weapon of choice is no longer an AK47, but God's Word.

How to Get Assurance

Editor's Note: This is the fourth and final chapter from Rev. Maynard Force's booklet entitled, "Assurance." The first chapter was printed in the September, 2007 issue of the *Morning Glory*, the second chapter was printed in the November, 2007 issue, and the third in the December, 2007 issue. If you would like a copy of either issues, please write to the editor.

The Word of God is full of examples of people who received assurance. We cannot find one case in the entire New Testament of a Christian who did not have assurance. Is it not then strange and peculiar that in our day there are many people who do not have assurance? All the New Testament Christians had a positive testimony of what Jesus had done for them. The blind man, for example, said, "One thing I **know** that, whereas I was blind, now I see" (John 9:25). What a positive assurance! The personal meeting with Jesus was such a glorious experience that nothing in all of life compared to it.

Jesus stated plainly, "I know mine own, and mine own **know me** even as the Father knoweth me, and I know the Father" (John 10:14, 15). Here in no uncertain words Jesus relates the true relationship between Himself and His own. He even compares our relationship to Him as that of the relationship that He had with the Father. If this is the pattern set before us by Jesus, surely we should not be satisfied with anything less.

Jesus Christ has not changed, for He "is the same yesterday and today, yea and for ever" (Heb. 13:8). It is the purpose of the Word to acquaint us today with this living Saviour, "whom to know is life eternal." Let us then seek from the Word to know Him. There is only one way. Remember the words of Christ when He said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). It is interesting to note here that Jesus is not only the way, but also the life. We want to know the way that leads us to the life. But this is the way of the cross, and it is not popular. Many ridicule those who take it. The one requirement to all who come to the cross is that they be sin-burdened. Self-righteous people are in no condition to be saved. They waste their time at the cross. They only find much there to criticize and ridicule. Their head is overstuffed with their own ideas about salvation until there is no room for God's great plan of salvation. Such self-righteous sinners can never receive Holy Spirit-wrought assurance; they must pass on and take to themselves false assurance. The sacred place at the cross is only for the lost. For Jesus "came to seek and to save that

which was lost" (Luke 19:10). It is those who have nothing but sin who come here. The law has utterly undone them; they realize what the Word means when it says "that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may be brought under the judgment of God" (Rom. 3:19). They have nothing good to say for themselves. They cry in despair like the publican of old, "God, be thou merciful to me a sinner." These are the Father's gifts to Jesus, for He himself once said, "All that which the Father giveth me shall come unto me." Such, in their lowly position beneath the cross, confess their sins. There they find the cleansing power of Jesus' blood, for "if we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). I praise my God for the day He took me out of the class of the self-righteous who needed no salvation and revealed to me my lost condition. What a revelation! I thought I was too good to be lost. I was a faithful attendant at church; I was a teacher in the Sunday school; I took Communion; I did not drink and carouse like many whom I knew. Surely I must be a Christian. But one day I saw clearly that in spite of all my religion and morality, I was lost. After three months of struggling to better myself, I found my way to the cross. I found that "the way" led to "the truth." I experienced the verse, "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). I found out also that it led to "the life." Now I praise God that He knocked the false foundation from under me, so that I sank in despair. That is what led me to the cross.

It is at the cross that the Holy Spirit can reveal Jesus to us. We never see Jesus until we fall prostrate before the cross. Then the Holy Spirit, who is the Comforter, gently lifts our head and whispers, "Look." Jesus never appears more beautiful than to a prostrate sinner. A look at Him melts the hardest sinner. We begin to realize the price that He paid for our salvation. "Him who knew no sin he made to be sin on our behalf; that we might become the righteousness of God in him" (II Cor. 5:21). What a wonderful Saviour! All of this He did because He loved us. It is because of Jesus' dying on the cross that we can be sure. Jesus himself cried out before dying, "It is finished." Nothing else need be done. He tasted death for every man. "He died for all" (II Cor. 5:15). The price of redemption was paid so that no one need go lost because of his sins. All who come to Jesus Christ, the Saviour of "the whole world" (1 John 2:2), can be saved. Our assurance is based solely on what Jesus has done for us.

It is at the cross that "the Spirit himself beareth witness

with our spirit, that we are children of God" (Rom. 8:16). Only as we look to Jesus does the Holy Spirit bear this witness; no other One is good enough. It is while looking to Jesus in the Word that we are given faith to believe. Bible verses we have read many times previous now unfold to us like flowers. How living and real they become. A heavenly relaxation comes over us! "The old things are passed away; behold, they are become new" (II Cor. 5:17). Assurance is now our possession. Whereas we once "hoped" or "thought" we were saved, we now **know** that we are saved. A miracle has taken place. The horror of being lost has left us. We are "heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ" (Rom. 8:17). "The spirit of bondage" has been broken, for we have received "the spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father" (Rom. 8:15). What a blessed day, that day at the cross, when "the Spirit himself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are children of God." God then puts a new song into our hearts.

"Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine! O what a foretaste of glory divine! Heir of salvation, purchase of God, Born of His Spirit, washed in His blood."

Hymn History

This is the account of the writing of the hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus"

This beloved poem, written to comfort one person, has brought consolation and help to millions of people the world over. The author, Joseph Scriven, discovered early in life how much he needed the friendship of Christ. Born in 1820 in Dublin, Ireland, he was graduated from that city's Trinity College and looked forward to a happy life with the Irish lass of his choice. But then tragedy struck. On the eve of his wedding, his fiancee was accidentally drowned. Lonely and unable to continue his training as a military cadet because of poor health, he left the Emerald Isle and came to Port Hope, Ontario, Canada when he was twenty-five years old. He became the local "Good Samaritan"helping the poor and underprivileged. He often shared his food with the needy and even gave them his clothes. He would work only for those too poor to pay him for his services. All these good deeds, however, might have been forgotten by Christendom had not Joseph Scriven written twenty-four lines to comfort his mother during a time of serious illness. It had been ten years since he had kissed her goodbye and he was now unable to go back to be with her. So he produced this poem and sent it with the prayer that it would remind her of her never-failing Friend, Christ Jesus.

Scriven's copy of these immortal lines lay dormant in his bedroom until a neighbor found them and asked, "Who wrote these beautiful words?" He modestly replied, "The Lord and I did it between us." Sometime later these words appeared in a periodical and were eventually seen by a German-American lawyer and composer, Charles Converse, whose simple but plaintive tune gave the wings of melody to Scriven's three verses. Thus an Irish-Canadian and a German-American were used by God to bless untold millions through this favorite sacred song. Scriven lived and died a socially lonely man. (His second fiancee died after a brief illness.) From the spiritual perspective, however, he was never alone because he knew, in a personal way, the Friend "that sticketh closer than a brother." (Proverbs 18:24)

So, in various ways, evil becomes fascinating, flattering, mesmeric. It is full of diplomacy, legerdemain, hypnotism. It betrays "with studied, sly, ensnaring art."

State court to decide on legal limits of spanking

When Shawn Fraser's discipline failed to rein in his 12-year-old son, he turned to his religion, taking a wooden paddle to Gerard's upper thighs and posting Bible verses on the refrigerator, Fraser's lawyer told the state Supreme Court on Wednesday.

But after 36 blows, delivered in 12- blow increments, the 195-pound boy called authorities. Now the state Supreme Court will determine when discipline of a child crosses the line into physical abuse that requires a social worker's intervention.

For an hour Wednesday, the court heard arguments from the lawyers for Hennepin County, the boy's guardian ad litem and the parents. Jill Waite, the attorney for Shawn Fraser, said the issue is, "How do we draw the line? How do we make it possible for parents to know what is OK and what is forbidden?" The case dates to 2005. After Gerard called authorities, Hennepin County determined he was in need of protective intervention. The District Court agreed that he and his brother, Caleb, needed help.

But the family appealed, and in July the state Court of Appeals reversed the District Court, determining the parents were not physically abusive.

The Court of Appeals determined that for the county's intervention to be justified, physical abuse requires the use of unreasonable force or cruel discipline that is excessive under the circumstances. The county appealed. [Now the State Supreme Court is deciding when spanking is considered physical abuse]...

Briefly referencing the federal debate about torture, Anderson said he had a hard time concluding that physical injuries must be present for punishment to cross a line.

School Board Refuses to Settle ACLU Lawsuit, Stands by First Amendment Right to Open Meetings With Prayer

The Indian River School Board has rejected a proposal to settle a lawsuit over school-sponsored prayer that was filed by the ACLU against individual members of the Indian River School District Board of Education. In rejecting the proposed settlement, school board members have opted to abide by their current prayer policy, which allows for prayer before board meetings....

The Rutherford Institute was approached for help in August 2004, after the Wilmington, Delaware branch of the ACLU demanded that the Indian River School District discontinue offering prayers at graduation ceremonies and school events, as well as at their board meetings. Despite ACLU pressure to cease, board members continued to open their business meetings with a brief prayer. The board also adopted a policy on prayer which states that in order to "bring solemnity to school board proceedings, it is the policy of the board to open its meetings with a prayer, sectarian or non-sectarian, or a moment of silence, all in accord with the freedom of conscience of the individual adult board member." The policy requires that the prayers be voluntary and that no school employee, student in attendance or member of the community in attendance be required to participate in any such prayer or moment of silence ... In August 2005, U.S. District Court Judge Joseph Farnan dismissed the lawsuit against individual members, declaring that opening a session of the legislature or other deliberative public body with a prayer is not a violation of the Establishment Clause and that absolute immunity extends to legislators at all levels of government, including school board members in Delaware....

"This policy is legal and non-discriminatory," said Thomas Neuberger, a Rutherford Institute affiliate attorney. "It recognizes the freedom of speech of all citizen legislators to open their meetings with religious speech in accord with their particular religious tradition and freedom of conscience."

Man Set to Be Euthanized Regains Consciousness

A Gulf War veteran who was set to die in an Arizona hospital was found to have regained complete consciousness ...

A decision to pull Jesse Ramirez, 36, from his feeding tubes ...had been reversed after a lawsuit filed by the rest of his family. The move has paid off now that the man is responding and is set to move to a rehabilitation center

...Ramirez was part of a serious car accident where he suffered multiple injuries and was put into a comatose state. He was placed onto feeding tubes where he received nour-ishment and water.

Ten days later, the man's wife, Rebecca, 33, asked doctors to pull him from the tubes after they explained that the accident would probably leave the man blind or in vegetative state.

For five days, the hospital withheld sustenance from the injured man, but restored the tubes after the Alliance Defense Fund (ADF) – an Arizona-based Christian law firm – filed a lawsuit on behalf of the rest of the Ramirez family. Ramirez has regained many skills now, including hugging and kissing, nodding his head, responding to voice commands, and knowing his and his family's identity.

"The decision to withhold food and water was hasty and wrong under Arizona law," explained Byron Babione, a senior legal counsel for ADF.

According to a report from Rebecca Ramirez, who was also in the Toyota SUV when it crashed, the accident was a result of a heated argument in the car between the husband and wife.

Hindu Offers Prayer In Senate

A Hindu cleric, Rajan Zed, gave the opening prayer at the July 12, 2007 session of the United States Senate. It marked the first time a Hindu was asked to give the opening prayer in the Senate chamber.

Zed, a Hindu chaplain from Reno, Nevada, was invited by Senate Majority Leader, Harry Reid. Zed offered the following prayer:

"We meditate on the transcendental glory of the deity supreme, who is inside the "heart of the Earth, inside the life of the sky and inside the soul of heaven. May he stimulate and illuminate our minds...."

Vine and Branches

What About Israel?

QUESTION: Have you read former President Carter's new book, *Palestine: Peace, Not Apartheid?* Rabbi Marvin Hier of Simon Wiesenthal Center has said that Carter's book is "blatantly one-sided and unbecoming of a former President." I was wondering what your thoughts are.

Response: Yes, I've read that brazenly anti-1srae1 book. Israel is blamed for everything, the Arabs are White-washed. Ararat is called "a strong leader ...well-educated ...(who) turned much of his attention to raising funds for the care and support of the refugees and inspiring worldwide contributions to their cause." No mention is made that Arafat and his PLO murdered thousands, or that he siphoned off billions for his Swiss bank accounts, lied continually, and never kept one promise that he made to Israel. Carter writes as an unabashed promoter of PLO and Muslim lies, which he passes off as the informed truth, for example: that Arabs, PLO, or "Palestinians" have never threatened Israel, have always wanted peace and have done all they could to effect it, and that the land of Israel belongs to them as descendants of the original inhabitants—none of this true!

Carter dares to say that the Israeli kibbutz dwellers in 1948, who had few and inferior weapons, were "better armed" than the regular armies of the six Arab nations (600,000 against 60,000) who attacked Israel with tanks and planes, of which Israel had none. He says it was "the continuing state of war between Israel and its neighbors [that] caused many Jews to flee Syria, Iraq, and other Arab countries to Israel." No, it was 1,300 years of perpetual persecution and murder of thousands that caused Jews to flee to Israel when it became a nation and offered the first refuge they'd ever had.

Carter's claim that in 1993 Arafat and his PLO "recognized the right of Israel to exist in peace and security...renounced the use of terrorism [and] those articles of the PLO covenant that deny Israel's right to exist" is not true. He blames "Israeli repression" of Palestinian rights for the terrorist attacks against Israel, exonerating the Arabs. He accuses Israel of imposing "apartheid" upon the "Palestinians" and says, "Peace will come...when the Israeli government is willing to comply with international law... by accepting its legal borders."

Carter is scandalously dishonest. In fact, Israel *accepted* the borders set by the UN in 1948. "Palestinians" could have been living in peace for the last 60 years, had they done likewise. Instead, the Arabs refused to accept the existence of an Israel of *any* size, attacked to annihilate her, and have sought to destroy her ever since. Any land Israel ever took was in self-defense against an enemy that will not recognize

her existence (no Arab map in the world shows Israel). Why should Israel retreat to the indefensible borders dictated by the UN in 1948 (as Carter advocates), which the Arabs refused to accept?

Never in history has an attack upon any country *other than Israel* been for the purpose of annihilation, which has been sworn repeatedly by the Arab world. Muslims must destroy Israel–or renounce their religion, Allah, Muhammad, and the Qur'an. Never was any nation *except Israel* blamed for failing to make peace with an enemy whose openly stated and irreversible goal was its total destruction. Never was a nation so pressured by the world to surrender territory taken in self-defense as has been Israel. Carter's book justifies the Muslim desire to destroy Israel in order to make "peace."

QUESTION: John Hagee says we should not witness to the Jewish people; God will take care of them. Is this biblical?

Response: Speaking at the last Pre-trib Seminar in Dallas, Hagee said he had never taught this. In fact, he has taught it a number of times. The Houston Chronicle (4/30/88, sec. 6, p. 1) quoted Hagee, "I'm not trying to convert the Jewish people to the Christian faith ... trying to convert Jews is a waste of time." It only takes a few Bible verses to expose this serious heresy condemned by Paul in Galatians 1. The first Christians were all Jews. Peter preached the gospel on the day of Pentecost to Jews. The early Christians and apostles thought the gospel was only for Jews and preached "the word...unto the Jews only" (Acts 11:19). God had to give Peter a vision to get him to preach to Gentiles (Acts 10:9-16). In every town Paul entered, he first went into the synagogue, where he preached to the Jews, and only when they rejected the gospel did he turn to the Gentiles (Acts 9:20; , 13:5, 14-46; 14:1; 17:2,etc.). Why did he always offer salvation to the Jews first? Because, as we are clearly told, "the gospel of Christ is the power of God unto salvation...to the Jew first..." (Rom 1:16).

QUESTION: Why should Christians care about the Middle East in general, and specifically about Israel?

Response: As stated ...this is the key issue upon which the future of earth and heaven – indeed, the entire universe – depends. God has tied His name and integrity to Israel. He is called the God of Israel 203 times and the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob 12 times. Depending upon what happens in the Middle East, God will either be vindicated or discredited. His name and integrity will either be upheld in perfect purity and power, or He will be disgraced as a liar who cannot make good upon His promises to His people Israel. That's how important the regathering and ultimate blessing of Israel is!

Making no Apologies for the old time Christianity!

If the Muslims, UN, EU, et al., succeed in destroying Israel, the integrity of everything God has said throughout His Word would be placed in question. If "forever" and "everlasting" don't really mean forever in relation to Israel ("all the land ...to thee will I give it, and to thy seed for ever" –Gen. 13:15; "I will give unto thee and to thy seed after thee ...All the land of Canaan (not 'Palestine' - there was no such place) for an everlasting possession" 17:8; "the covenant which he made with Abraham ...Isaac. ...Jacob ...Israel for an everlasting covenant, saying, Unto thee will I give the land of Canaan "1 Chr. 16:16-18, etc.), then how can we be sure that the promise of "everlasting life" (John 3:16, etc) means forever?

If Satan were stronger than God and able to make God a liar by preventing His promises to Israel from being fulfilled, then how could we ever be secure, even in heaven itself, from Satan's schemes and power?

Such is the importance of Israel and what happens in the Middle East. There is a real battle going on between God and Satan for the eternal destiny of planet Earth and of all mankind. Wake up, pray for God to tear down the Islamic curtain (more vicious and impenetrable than the Iron Curtain ever was) so that Muslims can hear and receive the gospel without fear of being killed for their faith. "I Know..." "I Know Your ... Tribulation, And Poverty" REVELATION 2:9

SEVEN TIMES IN HIS LETTERS to the churches of Asia, the Lord Jesus says, "I know" and usually those words are used in a favorable sense. "I know your works ...your labor ...your patience ...your tribulation ...your poverty ...and charity ...and faith." In those words "I know" there is tremendous comfort and sympathy and encouragement for God's people.

Lehman Strauss points out that when Jesus said "I

know," He did not use the word *ginoske*, which frequently means to know in the sense of realizing through progress in knowledge. He used the word *oida*, which suggests fullness of knowledge" to know perfectly; not merely from observation, but from experience.

Though suffering saints are unknown and hated by the world" they are known to the Lord and loved by Him. Christ knows the persecution and poverty of His own; He knows how the world looks upon them. Many a tired, tried and troubled saint has been strengthened and encouraged by those two monosyllables, "I know." Those two words uttered by our Savior touch our troubles with the smile of God, and make this world's suffering "not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18).

They are words of sympathy. Our Great High Priest knows what we are going through because He has been through it Himself. He is the Man of Sorrows and is acquainted with grief. He has suffered being tempted.

They are words of sharing. As the Head of the body, He shares the trials and persecutions of the members. "In every pang that rends the heart, the Man of Sorrows has a part." He not only knows intellectually what we are going through; He knows it as a matter of present experience. He feels it.

They are words of promised help. As our Paraclete, He comes alongside to bear our burdens and wipe away our falling tears. He is there to bind up our wounds and to drive back our foes.

Finally; they are words of assured rewards. He knows everything we do and suffer because of our identification with Him. He keeps a careful record of every act of love, obedience and patience. One day soon He will richly repay.

If you are passing through a valley of sorrow or suffering just now, hear the Savior saying to you, "I know." You are not alone. He is with you in the valley; will bring you safely through, and will lead you safely to your destination.
