Hauge's Public Appearance

(Editor. Speaking in regards to Hans Nielsen Hauge)

fter the spiritual peace and rest followed work and struggle. He became very distressed over some things which are deep and inscrutable for a poor human, but through inquiry and prayers, through the help of God, he conquered the temptations, as he in his simple way believed in God's Word and there found rest.

He also experienced the struggle between the yearning of the spirit and the cravings of the flesh. He took up this struggle very seriously, and fought and prayed. "I lay a whole night," he said, "and fought and prayed to God, that I might be freed from the wicked desires and said: 'My dear Father and holy God! I cannot serve Thee or confess Thy name to men or instruct others, when I myself am beset with wicked desires!'" But he soon learned to understand that such temptations and struggles were necessary in order to keep him humble before God.

As he more and more learned to know about Adam's shameful fall within himself, the plainer he saw the strength of God is made perfect through weakness.

Amid such inner struggles Hauge started to bear witness to his fellow men. He entered upon his duties first by speaking to individuals, leading them on the road to eternal life. When he met people on the road or they came to him in his home, he talked to them and showed them how important it is to work towards our salvation. His general conduct attracted attention and caused stir among the people; some changed, and he was gladdened in seeing the fruit of his work.

In the fall he started to hold prayer meetings, and then began the common revival. But then Hauge, with his testimony became a real testing stone for others, as he himself also was tried. Some were awakened and became worried about their salvation; others scoffed at him and trumped up all kinds of stories about him; some praised him, other criticized him; and here he stood in the midst of the excitement, with danger on all sides. But the Lord helped him and kept him, on one side from despair, on the other from pride. His motto was: The good I might have done is not done by myself, but by the good God who has enlightened me with His Holy Spirit, for which I will praise and thank Him and His dear Son, Jesus Christ.

While he experienced great joy by seeing sinners converted, at the same time as he grieved over people's apostasy, he was forced forward to bear testimony. He felt sometimes quite despondent when he thought of the greatness of the task. Had he earlier said to the Lord: Send me! In these dark moments he said; Send somebody else! "Once I was in the woods with my brother and cut trees," he said. "Then my mind became very agitated at the thought of the infidel race of the time, and with all my eagerness I doubted that men in general could be brought to see the truth; for the great majority of them mocked and despised me and my talk; some were indifferent, and few were sincere. Then I called to God and wept so violently that the tears streamed from my eyes, and I admonished the Lord to take this heavy duty from me, namely, to confess His name, and rather send a bishop or another great man; the people would listen to him and respect his talk, me they did not respect."

For his own part he wished he might die. His sister Anna was sickly, and it seemed that her days were soon numbered; it was his wish then to be permitted to follow her in death, in this way to be spared from all trouble and

sorrow.

Then he heard a voice in his inner self which said: "Do you wish to die now? You have formerly served sin, will you not now, when you are saved, bring Me some fruit of My work in you? You have promised to serve Me. I have often used the lowly in this world to spread My Kingdom, for to this I have called those from the plow, shepherds, fishermen and publicans. I will give you strength and wisdom, which your enemies shall not be able to withstand Be firm in your purpose and continue in patience." Then I said: "Yes, when Thou, my God, will strengthen me, then I shall be willing."(Editor: Isaiah 6).

Another incident which was painful for Hauge, was that he was put at odds with "Sebergianerne," followers of Pastor Seeberg. These people were taken in by Herrnhutism, but carried their separate opinions to such extremes that it led to lawlessness and plain sin. This estranged Hauge from that trend of mind. Through all these tribulations he was stripped of all his own, and learned to understand that it was through the virtue of the Lord he should fight and conquer, besides which he won quite a little experience, which later on in his particular calling helped him a great deal.

ROOTED

Joash did what was right in the sight of the LORD all the days of Jehoiada the priest. 2 Chronicles 24:2

(Read 2 Chronicles 24:15-22)

Joash must have been confused and frightened when he was told about the evil deeds of his grandmother Athaliah. She had murdered his brothers to usurp the power of the throne in Judah. But baby Joash had been safely hidden away by his aunt and uncle for 6 years (2 Chron. 22:10-12). As he grew, he enjoyed the love and instruction of his care-givers. When Joash was only 7 years old, he was secretly crowned king and his grandmother was overthrown (23:12-15).

Young King Joash had a wide counselor by his side – his very own Uncle Jehoiada (chs. 22-25). Joash was one of the rare "good kings" of Judah, and while his uncle was alive he obeyed the Lord by doing right (24:2). But once his uncle was no longer there to teach and lead by example, Joash fell away and his life ended badly (24:15-25). It seems that the roots of his faith did not run very deep. He even began to worship idols. Perhaps Joash's "faith" had been more his [uncle's] than his own.

Others can teach us the principles of their faith, but each of us must come individually to a lasting and personal faith in Christ. For faith to be real, it must become our own. God will help us walk with Him and become rooted and established in the faith (Col. 2:6-7).

A Lantern Without Light

Hold fast the pattern of sound words which you have herd from me, in faith and love which are in Christ Jesus. That good thing which was committed to you, keep by the holy Spirit who dwells in us." II Timothy 1:13-14

In the years before automatic train signals were installed at railroad crossings, there were many tragic accidents. One involved a family out for a pleasure drive late at night; they were all killed.

Following the tragic deaths, the railroad company appointed a board of inquiry which called on the watchman who was assigned to that crossing. "Didn't you wave your <u>lantern?</u>" they asked. "Yes!" responded the man. Later, under continuing examination, he admitted that although he had waved his lantern, there had been no light in it. THAT LAST DAY!

(As always please read prayerfully Luke 16:19-31

There comes a 'last day' in absolutely every individual's life, <u>when time will be no more!</u> No wonder the Psalmist prayed: "So teach us to number our days, That we may gain a heart of wisdom." (90:12). If you live seventy years; you have 'invested' app. 25,568 days!

As you know, the BIBLE is relevant for all ages, all people, all times AND don't add too nor subtract from what GOD says; for HE means what HE says and says what HE means!

In this portion of God's Word which you have just prayerfully read; some folk will say such is a 'parable'; but I definitely disagree with that interpretation for seven reasons. It is as **reality**. Keep in 'mind' a 'parable' is an earthly story (illustration) with a 'heavenly meaning'.

Do you believe in a literal Hell? GOD in HIS Incarnate LOVE does! Now don't say JESUS is not Agape Love, for if you don't believe JESUS is God's Agape (Divine Love) Love manifested, it would be totally contrary to God's Holy Word, the BIBLE. It has been stated that JESUS said 7 times more about Hell in the Scriptures than Heaven; but He in this Love wants 'us' to know there is a Hell to shun and a Heaven to gain. Heaven is a literal place of Eternal/Everlasting Bliss, while Hell is a literal place of Eternal/Everlasting torment. Heaven is a place of JOY and Hell is a place of WEEPING as 'time' will be no more. Whether you believe in Hell or not doesn't change the fact that there is one no one in Hades/Hell who will ever deny the entire Bible is truthful and accurate. (Trust you also notice that JESUS Himself spoke of this reality, as it is in red letters, and in a sense He has removed the veil that separates us, who are yet on this side of eternity and has given 'us' a glimpse into ETERNITY!

NOW let me clearly state the <u>7 reasons</u> why this portion of God's Word is not a parable, <u>but literal</u>: 1). Names: 'A certain rich man' and the other person is' Lazarus', 2). See, 3). Feel, 4). Reason, 5). Remember, 6). Pray, and 7). The rich man <u>had Five brothers</u>.

Likely YOU have heard the statement: 'I have more time than money!' Actually this 'statement' may not be TRUE as likely you have an 'idea' how much 'money' you have; but how much TIME do you have? Each and every one of 'us' are only a 'heart beat' from Eternity! Some folk have one foot on a '*banana peel and the other in the grave*'.

SCRIPTURE is very clear that each one of 'us' are on one

of two roads, which do not run parallel but in *opposite* directions to an Eternal Destiny.

NOW why 'we' don't hear more about Hell from behind the 'sacred desk/pulpit and otherwise; I do not understand; except for disobedience to the Word of God (Holy Spirit) and peer-pressure!

REMEMBER EACH ONE OF 'US' are born as an individual, eat, sin, die and go to Judgment and Salvation as individuals. (By the way there will be NO hypocrites in HEAVEN)! (John 1:12-13, 3:7, 16, 18, 36, 14:6, 20:30-31). (Please think of your neighbors, friends, relatives, etc. who are outside of Christ at the present time according to John 3:18 & 36).

On that "*Last Day*," we will all be level as we find in Hebrews 9:27: "*And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment*". EVEN 'we' who alive (both physically & spiritually) who are clothed in the Righteousness of JESUS, in an instant, in the '<u>Twinkling of an Eye</u>"; as we will be instantaneously changed – according to 1 Corinthians 15:51-58! (A 'twinkling of an eye' is a very small part of a second).

Let 'us' look at this text a little deeper: The Pharisees considered 'wealth' as proof of 'their righteousness' and I don't find 'anything' in this text that would make 'us' believe the Rich Man got his 'riches' by cheating, stealing, immorality, or that he was a drunk or caused others to be immoral (Luke 16:14-15). Seemingly he was an HONEST, upright man who was industrious, just like the Capitalistic system which goes back to at least Cain and Abel. As a matter of fact, likely he was a good man, likely a Pharisee who let an unpleasant sight at the entrance of his abode – Lazarus; who survived by 'eating the crumbs from the Rich Man's Table.' (It is not a 'sin' to be 'wealthy'; and on a world scale 'we' are 'wealthy'. BUT be careful as we are admonished in Luke 21:34-36: "'But take heed to yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and cares of this life, and that Day come on you unexpectedly. For it will come as a snare on all those who dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch therefore, and pray always that you may be counted worthy to escape all these things that will come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man."" (1 Timothy 6:10).

At a 'funeral' in the average church today, the Pastor would usher this person into Heaven as he asks God to

'receive his spirit'. By the way: this teaching/preaching is heresy, FOR where was this person's 'spirit' in between death and the funeral? Oh, no doubt the eulogy would be great and IF others took part 'many' <u>nice words</u> of the departed would be spoken; but it wouldn't change the 'destiny' of that person one iota!

Martin Luther stated that 'the bottom of Hell would be covered with the skulls of unconverted preachers'!

Notice in verse twenty-two that these two individuals lived side-by-side; yet arrived at two different destinies on their last day.

BUT in verse nineteen the 'certain rich man' fared <u>sump-</u> <u>tuous</u> every DAY. Clothed in purple which implies being made out of 'wool', which was dyed 'purple'; which was costly and could be worn only by the wealthy. 'Linen' was used for under-garments was equally expensive. Life for him was one continual party; free from hardship and drudgery and living gaily. A person can 'laugh' their way into Hell, but not out!

BUT notice nothing is said about his funeral. It came sooner than he *likely* expected; probably thinking he had more time than money!

The Williams Translation states in verse 23 'constant tortures'; while the NKJV states 'torment(s), tormented four times inside of **6** verses. AND he *saw!* (It must be like watching TV where you can see but are not able to reach the destination! He *saw Abraham afar off and Lazarus in his bosom*).

For the 'rich man', it was SEEING the bliss of the 'redeemed' (blood bought individuals), but unable to reach the 'forgiven sinners' location!

Hades is a waiting location until further development for the unconverted/lost – an eternal HELL.

V. 24: What an 'eternal' plight as in the following verse he <u>cries</u> out in his 'helplessness' and pleads not for 'justice' but <u>mercy</u>. Can we not now say he is attending a 'prayer meeting' and 'praying' but it is <u>too late</u> as the open door of mercy, grace, forgiveness, etc. is <u>now forever closed</u>!

Medically I have been informed that of all natural physical deaths – dying of thirst is the most *horrible*. The rich man pleads for just 'a drop of water' to be placed on his tongue! WHY? He is 'tormented' and will not be consumed (burned up)!

OH how terrible and tragic when in God's Grace he could have been spared this abode for eternity!

Now on bended knees (symbolically), he 'recalls. (He <u>Remembers</u>) – *Revelation 20:11-15*.

He has taken the 'broad and easy' road; which is a dead-end with NO passage of relief and escape whatsoever for all eternity!

FRIEND, THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE HELL!

Matthew 18:8-9, 13:41-42, Isaiah 33:14Revelation 20:10 – *A lake/furnace of fire (brimstone – sulfur- flame almost invisible, yet greater heat & yet eternal).*

Matthew 8:12, 13:42 – A place of weeping and wailing (gnashing of teeth) and outer darkness

II Thessalonians 1:8-9 – A place of SEPARATION from GOD (also from the Glory of His Power).

Mark 3:29 – A place of eternal damnation.

Jude 13 – A place of blackness and darkness forever.

Mark 9:48 – *A place where the worm never dieth, fire is not quenched.*

Revelation 14:10, 14:11, 21:21:8 – A place of God's wrath, a place of no rest day or night.

YOU might want to read this portion of Scripture again and SEE IF it is present tense? (Luke 16:19-31).

DO YOU BELIEVE IN A LITERAL HELL AND HEAVEN? JESUS DOES, GOD DOES AND THE HOLY SPIRIT DOES!

You and I are marvelously made in the image of God which includes a 'brain'! The 'Medical world' now believes that in each one of our 'brains'; there is being recorded EVERYTHING that transpires in our lives. This would likely even include when we were in our Mother's Womb – **Revelation 20:12-13.**

Scripture is very 'clear' that we need to preach the LAW and GOSPEL in love; unto the ends of the earth; because JESUS CARES!

There is even a form of "Repentance" in this literal account. Notice verse twenty-seven as the 'rich man' was able to REASON.

Every child of God is called and responsible to share the 'word of TRUTH' as the Holy Spirit prompts you as a cleansed 'vessel'. This 'rich man' is now concerned about EVANGELISM as he is burdened/concerned about his FIVE brothers who are yet in this earthy journey.

It is CRYSTAL CLEAR that even *If* a 'miracle' took place, and GOD resurrected someone from the 'grave' to prove there is a 'literal' Hell; the unbelievers would not believe, **IF** they NOW are not listening to GOD's *Law and Gospel.*

Wether you believe this biblically based 'Editorial' or not; the Sovereign Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), believes in a 'literal Hell'; otherwise why did JESUS make Heaven poor that you and I might become rich?

The kindest, sweetest person you know – if they do not have **JESUS** (by faith) as their personal Savior, they will end up in Hell, eternally LOST with NO hope; even though <u>loved by JESUS/GOD!</u> Our Sovereign GOD is also **Righteous**, **Just, Pure and HOLY!**

His Kingdom's Work

NEVER apologize for the smallness (numerical figure) of your local Congregation, IF it is truly a Bible/Christ centered <u>Congregation</u>, for such is a <u>Great Work (Example:</u> <u>Nehemiah 4:6a)</u> for it is **HIS Work** for time and eternity!

THUS 'never' apologize for the same, as it is of great significance and important in lifting up the Name JESUS individually and also congregational ways!

The 'local' Bible practicing <u>Congregation</u> is to be like an "Oasis' in a barren land/desert, for especially both the 'lambs' and the 'sheep'. Biblically, it is to be a place of nourishing, strengthening, admonishing and encouraging – especially those of the 'household of faith.' After being "fed," each individual believer will be 'thrust out into the 'highways and by-ways' who will seek to reach the 'lost' and encourage fellow-believers.

For any organization there <u>needs</u> to be 'leadership' in word and deed!

IN these 'perilous times' we often criticize 'our leadership' of 'our' beloved Country for <u>not</u> adhering to the 'Constitution' of our great USA – and rightly so with '<u>concern</u>.'

LET'S be 'realistic' here though. Does your 'congregation' follow your local congregation's Constitution?

For example: According to chapter six of the Book of ACTS, (not resolutions; but ACTS) after <u>specific</u> prayer intercession; the people were led by the Holy Spirit, to choose/select individuals for a certain 'service' in the local congregation.

I know of a 'congregation' where the leadership (likely Deacons/Elders along with the Pastor) used to actually send out 'letters of call' for people to be Sunday School Teachers, which I believe is a great idea.

I also knew of a rural congregation, because of its size numerically, would *somewhat lightly* rotate leadership!

NOW Scripture is very clear that GOD <u>calls</u> some to be pastors, teachers, evangelists, etc. *Every* 'believer' has a 'unique/<u>very important</u>' place in the 'body of Christ'.(*1 Co-rinthians 11*).


Let's get spiritually practical in the 'service' of the King of kings and Lord of lords. For example: A Deacon/Elder is definitely in a position of Leadership which includes a protective 'shield/surrounding' for the 'Under-Shepherd'/Pastor and to make certain that he stays on 'biblical track'. He ALSO needs to encourage, support, strengthened him. Besides assisting him – he is to see to it that a 'biblical fill-in' is behind the sacred desk (pulpit) in the Pastor's absence. He is also to be along and ASSISTING in visitation, according to most Lutheran Constitutions! This means Visiting the widows, shut-ins, sick, delinquent - both of the saved and unsaved. (1 Timothy 5:17-22, Titus 1:4-9, James 1:21). IN other words, he is a Co-laborer and Supervisor of the Pastor. (This is also true of the Board Members of the Hauge Lutheran Innermission Federation/Morning Glory and other Biblical Organizations, such as Bible Schools, Seminaries, Missions, Radio/TV Ministries, etc. - the Pastor, Editor, Teacher, Evangelist, etc.). NOW this is also the 'challenge' of every born again person - to be laboring in the great Work in the VINEYARD of GOD as the Holy Spirit leads and fits you into your 'role' in the Body of Christ. This requires obedience. Remember 'whatever' God prompts YOU to do, GOD will provide!! PRAISE GOD FROM WHOM ALL BLESSINGS FLOW AND THE GIVER OF EVERY GOOD AND PERFECT GIFT - James 16-18.

However, as we look back upon our life with God, I think that we must all thank and praise Him because He has so graciously led us upon the right pathway, notwithstanding all our restlessness and impatience. Wherefore we say:

"Hitherto the Lord hath helped us!"

LOOK ... Here is your God

"O Zion, You who bring good tidings, Get up into the high mountain, O Jerusalem. You who bring good tidings, Lift up your voice with strength, Lift it up, be not afraid; Say to the cities of Judah, 'Behold your God!' Behold, the Lord GOD shall come with a strong hand. And His arm shall rule for Him; Behold, His reward is with Him, And His work before Him. He will feed His flock like a shepherd; He will gather the lambs with His arm. And carry them in His bosom, And gently lead those who are with young." Isaiah 40:9-11

...It is amazing how often people walk around in their own little world oblivious to reality and what is going on around them. This is a danger to all people and Christians are often as much of a victim of this attitude as everybody else. Our lives are so full of stuff, activities and do lists that we are unaware of our surroundings, or even the spiritual world and the Hand of God working all around us. We may not take notice of the homeless person seeking shelter, or pay attention to a question coming from our child. We fail to realize the hurting hearts of friends and family, and the list goes on, doesn't it?

We could get so set in our routines that even going to Church becomes a check on the to do list and we miss being with Jesus altogether.

Even when a person is actively seeking after God, frequently they end up not finding Him, but instead find themselves worshiping idols (false gods of their own imagination and liking). Often times when a person seeks after God, they only see the characteristics of God that they seek and like about him, but what a difference there is when God finds the person, for then the person is confronted with all of who God is. What a difference there is when we are brought before God in all of His holiness and our wickedness is made plain. When we see God's pure Love, we are forced to recognize our selfishness. What a change takes place when we are seeking the faithfulness of God and then see His Divine Justice. Or when we're eagerly searching out a God of forgiveness and are exposed to the Consuming Fire as well, it changes us. It brings about a new birth, a renewal and regeneration of our soul. It brings about the revival that is desperately needed at this hour in our country, city, and in our homes.

Revival student, preacher and teacher Richard Owen Roberts summarizes it this way, "The problem with the Church in America isn't the world. The problem with the Church is its view of God."

That is the same problem the people of God have always struggled with. From the Garden when Satan deceived Eve; Cain's heart in worship; the wicked people of Noah's day, Esau selling his birthright for a bowl of stew; the rebellious Israelites in the wilderness; King Saul and the nation of Judah: A poor view of God brought about the exile in Babylon. That was the problem Jesus had with the religious leaders of His day, the Disciples were confronted with, and what the Apostles continually wrote about in the New Testament.

Would you agree that again the Church needs to take another Look at God, to see Him as He really is, rather than just as we would like Him to be?

How Did We Get Into This Mess?

This is the second of a three-part message about current trends in Christianity. If you missed the first of these messages, contact the Editor for a copy of the December issue. In pointing out these problems, the solution is to reverse these trends back to the Biblical Standard.

The Problem: Preaching the Gospel with no Law

The church today says that the message is still the same, just presented in a different way. This isn't true. The message used to be this:

You are a sinner and have offended a holy God through your sins against God's perfect standard – His Law. You need to repent of your sins and forsake them. You must come to Jesus and accept Him as your personal Savior and follow Him as Lord of your life. This is what it means to be converted – To turn away from your sins and turn to Jesus with your whole life. If you won't do this, you will go to hell under the wrath of God forever.

Today the message is this:

God loves you and has a wonderful plan for your life. Will you let Jesus love you and come into your heart and forgive you? Will you receive Him and experience the love that God has for you? This is how you begin a personal relationship with God.

Notice in the second presentation there is no mention of sin or repentance. There is no mention of the Law or God's wrath. In the first presentation, the sinner becomes the servant of God with Jesus in control. In the second, the sinner and Jesus are on equal footing as they share a personal relationship. The second presentation is not a complete presentation of Law and Gospel and can leave people in their sins.

The emphasis in many circles by preachers today is: "We don't tell people they're sinners. They all know that and they have enough to bring them down. We need to lift people up by bringing the Good News to them." One reason they preach this way is that they feel that the Law is removed from the Christian in the Atonement. "We're not under the Law, but under Grace! Grace covers it all. We all make mistakes and sins every day, but God will forgive us. After all, we're not saved by our personal holiness, but by the sheer mercy of God in Jesus our Lord. As long as you have faith in Christ, you are free to live as you choose and will still have God's blessings upon you in this life and glory awaiting for you when you die." As a result, many preachers today talk about coming to Christ with no mention of repentance. Even some popular preachers today have little or no mention of it. It seems to have dropped from their vocabulary. "Just come to Christ just as you are and He'll clean you up."

There is No Fear of God presented – Only Love. I have repeatedly heard the statement: "There is nothing you can do to make God love you any more or any less. He loves because He is love." The impression is given that regardless of what you do – God will still love you.

Scriptures are carefully selected to avoid anything that would confront, convict or turn anyone away. Anything that would portray God as someone less than a caring, loving Heavenly Father is avoided. Even though Jesus commands the unbelievers at the end: "Depart from Me, accursed ones, into the eternal fire which has been prepared for the devil and his angels." (Matt. 25:41) Where is the Love of God here?

When this is the emphasis, people will practice all manner of sin and justify it by saying: "You're into Legalism! I am free from the dictates of the Law and I live by the Spirit and He hasn't laid anything on my heart about it." Another popular cover is to say: "Don't Judge! God is my Judge, not you. I will let God determine if something is right or wrong."

The Solution: Preaching the Whole Counsel of God

To only preach the love and acceptance of God is to ignore many Scriptures and part of the very character and nature of God. It is a half-truth. It is true that for justification, the dictates of the Law are fulfilled by Jesus. But keep in mind what Jesus Himself said, "Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish, but to fulfill. ...Whoever then annuls one of the least of these commandments, and so teaches others, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever keeps and teaches them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven." (Matt. 5:17, 19)

This means that the Law still stands for the Christian as a pattern of good works that are pleasing to God. The Spirit-led life will be one that is in agreement with the Commandments. We are not free to murder, lie, steal, commit adultery or have other gods besides the Lord. Even when God's redeemed people enter into this kind of life – It is sin before the Lord and He will effectively judge those who practice these things. *"For this you know with certainty, that no immoral or impure person or covetous man, who is an idolater, has an inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God. Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because*

of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience." (Eph. 5:5-6)

When people ignore the dictates of the Law as a guide for life, then even gentle, loving Jesus is One who will personally deal with people who practice and promote sin with no repentance. The church at Pergamum had people "...who hold the teaching of Balaam, who kept teaching Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols, and to commit acts of immorality." (Rev. 2:14) To these people Jesus said, "Repent therefore; or else I am coming to you quickly, and I will make war against them with the sword of My mouth." (Rev. 2:16)

These churches in Revelation reflect our current time frame and God's dealing with us. To have the Lord Jesus say that He will make war with people ignoring the Law and promoting sins is pretty strong language. This reflects the full nature of God and shows the proper balance that Christians need to have toward the Lord. We should both Fear and Love Him. Many of the loving things that preachers are presnting today are true, but they are ignoring the other side of the coin that presents that God is holy and just and will enact His wrath against all who practice sin.

Preaching the Whole Counsel of God means that you take the entire Scriptures as a whole – not just pick and choose certain parts that suit your fancy. It means that you look at what God will do **TO** you as well as what He will do **FOR** you.

To remove the necessity of repentance for salvation is to ignore the clear teaching of Scripture. *"For the sorrow that is according to the will of God produces a repentance without regret, leading to salvation; but the sorrow of the world produces death."* (2 Cor. 7:10) Repentance is also to be part of our daily life as a Christian. Jesus said, *"I tell you, no, but unless you repent, you shall all likewise perish?"* (Lk. 13:5) The Greek word for *repent* here means a command to do continually. Thus the Lord commands us to live in daily repentance. To ignore this is to make people perish. Jesus said so!

Indeed, such souls do not get courage to believe until they see Christ in the Word, the only one on earth who can give a sinner courage to believe in the forgiveness of sins.

"Fear not," says Jesus today to all the fearful souls who condemn themselves. It is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. He does not simply endure you; He rejoices to give you the kingdom. He who spared not His only Son, how could He do anything else but give you all things together with Him?

"Little flock," He says.

He knows that we often feel discouraged and fearful just because we are so few and so weak. The contempt and opposition of the world would deprive us of our courage. It seems as though both we and God's whole cause seem destined to be defeated by the mighty powers which are at the disposal of our opponents at all times.

Then He comforts us. He tells us that it is not dangerous to be the little flock. It is not dangerous to be in the minority. It is not dangerous to face adverse winds. It is not dangerous to encounter super-mighty opposition. It is not dangerous to be despised! For it is thus that it has pleased God to further His cause in this world.

"Fear not, little flock."

ON Being Known

I acknowledged my sin to You ... I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,' and You forgave the iniquity of my sin. Psalm 32:5

(Please read also James 5:16-20)

One of the most difficult inner conflicts we have is our desire to be known versus our fear of being known. As being created in the image of God we are made to be known – known by God and also by others. Yet due to our fallen nature, all of us have sins and weaknesses that we don't want others to know about. We use the phrase "dark side" to refer to aspects of our lives that we keep hidden. And we use slogans like "put your best foot forward" to encourage others to show their best side.

One reason we are unwilling to risk being known is that we fear rejection and ridicule. But when we discover that God knows us, loves us, and is willing to forgive even the worst thing we have done, our fear of being known by God begins to fade away. And when we find a community of believers who understands the dynamic relationship between forgiveness and confession, we feel safe confessing our sins to one another (James 5:16).

The life of faith is not about showing only our good side. It's about exposing our dark side to the light of Christ through confession to God and also to others. In this way we can receive healing and live in the freedom of forgiveness. Julie Ackerman Link

One of the complaints expressed with deep sorrow by the God of Heaven is found in Romans 1:21 in three mournful words: "...neither were thankful."

The blessed Lord upon His throne pours out His blessings of sunshine, rain, harvest of grain, fruits and flowers, friends and fellowship; then He waits for the expression of gratitude that should come from our hearts. Does He hear it? Does He receive it? Evidently, from the statement we have quoted, He does not.

"Be Ye Thankful"

In Colossians 3:15 is the definite command, "*Be ye thankful*." Strange that God would have to command us to give thanks.

Children need to be told, <u>Say thank you.</u>" We begin it as soon as they are able to understand, and usually we must

continue it for many years. We want our children to be grateful and to say thank you, but so few do. Children of God need to be reminded too to say, "<u>thank You, Lord</u>." Surely there is plenty for which to be thankful, yet God found it necessary to command us to be thankful.

Thankful for All Things

From Ephesians 5:20, we are to be thankful *"for all things."* If He withholds good things from us, we are to say thank You. If He grants our requests, we are to say thank You. Thank Him for His gifts and for His withholdings. Be thankful for everything.

Thankful in All Things

But 1 Thessalonians 5:18 says we are to be thankful "*in every thing*." In every kind of situation, be filled with thanksgiving to God.

Whether in wealth or in poverty, whether in health or in sickness, whether in sunshine or in shadow, be thankful to the God of Heaven for His precious presence, His wonderful promises and His constant care.

Psalm 106:47 says we are saved and separated in order that we may give thanks to God.

The ungodly never bow the head in gratitude to the God of their lives. It is those who are saved from going down to the pit and have been set apart as God's people who are filled with thanksgiving. Surely we will not rob Him of the thanks due His name and prove to be ungrateful and unthankful to the God who has done so much for us.

Those who know God are most grateful to Him. Be among the number and never let the Lord say about you, *"He was not thankful."*

Be Thankful in Song

David's purpose of heart is expressed in Psalm 30:12, wherin he promised and assured the people that he did never cease to be a thankful child of God. No cold blanket would ever cause his song to cease. No troubles, trials or difficulties would ever hush the song of his heart.

Be Thankful Early and Late

The psalmist in Psalm 119:62 makes a most interesting statement about the well of gratitude springing up in his soul. He said he would rise at midnight to express his thanksgiving to God. He had retired to rest, but his spirit would not sleep.

The thoughts of God's goodness, His grace and His wonderful benevolence stirred the psalmist so deeply that he could not remain on his couch. Even though the midnight hour had come, he would rise and express to God the gladness of his soul and the gratitude of his heart. No matter how dark the night nor how late the hour, his heart must pour out its thanksgiving to the wonderful God of his life.

Keep in mind and heart that "just having good intentions never gets you anywhere"!


