Trouble of every kind will fill the mind and stay all day and return in the morning by the time we open our eyes.

Anxieties weighing a thousand pounds each come and leave their burden.

The old nature, refusing to submit to God, demands the best chair in the house even though it is the most un-wholesome visitor.

Worries and friends and families, our home, our work, our enemies, fear about what was, what is and what is to be, all these things will harass and occupy our mind – if we let them.

Today thousands are living in fear and depression because they allowed tormenting thoughts to rule their minds.

But there is hope. God has a way of deliverance from these thoughts through His Son Jesus Christ. I discovered God's freedom one morning as I lay in bed. I awoke from a troubled night's sleep and the thoughts of the past, present and future were there to torment me. They had made an early start. They would soon come trooping in. I felt helpless. What could I do?

Then the LORD showed me from His Word how He had delivered His people Israel from their captivity in Egypt. On that awesome night of judgment upon the Egyptians God commanded each Jewish family to sacrifice a lamb and place its blood over and around the door of the home. By performing that sacrifice, the family was protected. (Exodus 12:21-24).

How are you and I protected? *The **blood of Jesus Christ**, shed for our sins is our safety.* The Lord showed me that in my helplessness I was to commit my mind unto Him and to believe that He would protect me just as He protected the children of Israel.

This was a new thought to me. When tormenting thoughts overwhelm me now I say, “Jesus Christ is my Savior. His blood is over the door.” And, miraculously, as I trusted God's power to turn back those thoughts, I found peace. Again and again the thoughts would come, but I simply pointed to the blood of Christ over the door of my mind.

The Spotless Lamb of God has shed His precious blood to cleanse and free you not only from sin and sickness, but from the torment and distractions of the mind.

The Cost Of Freedom

During his lifetime, Paul Harvey was the world's finest news commentator. He once told a story about a group of scientists who had decided that they were going to teach a chimpanzee how to write. For fourteen years they labored indefatigably to that end. Finally the great day arrived when the chimp seemed to be actually forming letters into words – into an intelligible message. The scientists rushed into the laboratory and watched breathlessly. At last the day had come. The world's most pampered, best cared for, best fed, best housed, best trained chimpanzee in the history of mankind and the whole world, was about to write the first message written by an animal. The excited scientists pressed forward to read the history making sentence. It said, "LET ME OUT OF HERE!"

Well, countless millions of people who have lived in totalitarian cages for human beings in Nazi Germany and the Soviet Union, and off of the various communist countries around the world, including Cuba, our next-door neighbor, have, at great risk to life and limb, said, "Let me out of here!" And many have died in the attempt to gain liberty – freedom. It is something that is easily taken for granted. It is like the air we breathe. It is not until it is gone that we even think about it.

John Adams, our second president, made a declaration to future years and said: "Posterity: You will never know how much it has cost my generation to procure your freedom. I hope you will make good use of it."

What has happened to that burning flame of liberty that so moved the Founders of this country? I am afraid the flame is burning very weakly in America today. Abraham Lincoln said, "Our fathers brought forth upon this continent a new nation conceived in ...what? ...in **liberty!**" Our Declaration of Independence says that next to life itself, the most important right we have is "liberty." And if you look at the Bible, you will find what many scholars agree to be the major theme of the entire Old and New Testaments. It is "liberty, freedom." Did you ever think about that?

Jesus said: "***Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed***" John 8:36. Jesus was talking about the heart and source of freedom, and also bondage, which is sin. He said that if we commit sin, we are the bond slaves of sin. And so it is that sin inevitably enslaves people. Whether it be alcohol or tobacco, whether it be cocaine or crack, whether it be sex or whatever, sin is always addictive, and it brings people into slavery. And Christ came ultimately to deliver us from the bondage, from the thrall of sin. Shackles are broken at CALVARY. There on the Cross taking our sin and guilt upon Himself,

Christ broke the chains of sin and set the prisoners free.

We are very quickly throwing our religious liberty overboard and you should also remember that when religious liberty goes, other liberties follow. We take religious liberty so much for granted, and yet very few nations in the world really enjoy it. Until the Constitution of the United States was signed, religious liberty had never existed in any nation on earth.

My friends, it begins in the heart when Christ sets us free from sin. Shackles are broken at Calvary and only there, and when that freedom comes, it will give us a great desire for the civil and political liberty freedoms that men need as well. Would that the flame of freedom and liberty, which burned so brightly in the hearts of our Founders, could be fanned into a flame again in America. This "Bread Chapter" reveals Christ's thanksgiving for bread to eat (6:11, 23) and also His prayer-retreat escape when the throngs would have made Him a King before His time (6:15; Rev. 11:15; 19:23).

What interests us most in the chapter is the prayer, "*Lord, evermore give us this bread*" (vs. 34). As the woman at the well understood the words of Jesus about water in a physical sense (4:15), so here the people thought only of the satisfaction of a physical need. They did not realize that man cannot live by bread alone.

Jesus spoke of the bread of God coming in the same way as the manna fell from Heaven giving life to the Israelites; and the people wanted an unfailing supply of bread. The prior day they ate the bread He blessed; but they were hungry again today and so prayed, "Lord, evermore give us this bread." Jesus went on to describe how He Himself is the Bread giving life, that He is the ONE sustaining the spiritual life in strength and refreshing it in weariness. And as we eat and drink of Him hunger and thirst are removed (6:51-56; Matthew 5:6). Well might we pray, "LORD, GIVE US EVERMORE OF THYSELF."

Did you ever hear of a coach who encouraged his men to drink before a game?


Have you ever heard of children who complained because their daddy or mother never came home drunk?

Did you ever hear of a drunkard who boasted, "I can take a drink or let it alone" who did leave it alone?



\$1.5 Million Settlement for Muslim Workers Fired in Prayer Dispute

A big U.S. meat packer has agreed to pay \$1.5 million to 138 Somali-American Muslim workers who were fired from their jobs at a Colorado plant after they were refused prayer breaks, a federal anti-discrimination agency said...

Cargill meat Solutions, a division of Minnesota-based agribusiness company Cargill Corp., also agreed to train managers and hourly workers in accommodating Muslim employees’ prayer breakers at its Fort Morgan beef processing plant, the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission said.

Right from Wrong

“Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who exchange darkness for light, and light for darkness; who exchange bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!” Isaiah 5:20

Many times, we find that our modern society has things exactly backwards. They do what Isaiah decried – they call evil good and they call good evil.

Let me indulge in a bit of sarcasm to illustrate this phenomenon. We have a problem today in sexual matters. The problem is that we have so many of you who are “homophobes.” Ah, that is the Problem. No doubt homophobes have caused the plague of AIDS. Our problem is not perversion. Our problem is not homosexuality. Our problem is you, the homophobes.

“*Are you he that troubles Israel?*” asked the wicked King Ahab of the righteous Elijah. But Elijah will have none of this, and armed with the power of God, he answered, “*I have not troubled Israel, but you and your father’s house, in that you have forsaken the commandments of the Lord*” (1 Kings 18:18).

We have people who won’t take responsibility for their sins, but, instead, redefine illicit behavior so that they’re no longer sinning. For example, there was a politician who was pulled over for a DUI. He said that it wasn’t his fault: “I was overserved.” Despite the attempts of Hollywood or a sinful world to redefine good and evil, **God’s Word stands firm.** As President Lincoln once said when he received a copy of the Bible. “But for it, we could not know right from wrong.”

QUESTION TO PONDER: Can you think of an example of someone calling evil good and good evil?

The Hireling

“But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep. The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep.” John 10:12-13

OUR LORD USED contrast for dynamic effect. It was one of the secrets of His remarkable, arresting teaching. He used contrast to display in bold, bright strokes the great truths we human beings have such difficulty in comprehending.

He told about the rich man and the poor beggar Lazarus who lay at his doorstep. He recounted the incident of the haughty, proud Pharisee prying while the contrite publican struck his breast begging for mercy. He contrasted the prodigal with His very “proper” elder brother. And now, in this parable, Christ brings before us the behavior of a hireling as it is contrasted with the Good Shepherd in caring for sheep.

Our Lord previously pointed out how the people of God’s pasture could, under His control, enjoy an abundant, rich life with Him.

He made clear how God’s life, poured out in rich measure on my behalf, enables me to enjoy abundant living in every area: physical, mental, moral, emotional, and spiritual. He told how life in Him contributes to a wholesomeness and holiness of unique quality, that it is entirely possible for a man or woman to be so intimately associated with God as to reflect His character to a skeptical society.

Yet, in bold contrast to all of the foregoing, Jesus made it clear that not all sheep were under a good shepherd. Some suffered because of the bad behavior of hireling shepherds.

During the time of our Lord’s sojourn in Palestine, servants were of two sorts. They were either bond or free. They were either slaves owned outright for their master or free people who worked temporarily for meager wages. In fact, because of slavery, the worth and dignity of a human being was much less esteemed than it was in a free society. After all, if people could be bought and sold at random in a slave-market they were really not of much more value than cattle or furniture.

It will be recalled that when Judas bartered with the high priests for the betrayal of his Master, the price of thirty pieces of silver was agreed upon. This was the going price of a slave in the slave market.

If a slave served his owner well and the two became attached to each other, the master often offered to set

him free. The slave could then choose either to go free or become a bond slave or bond servant. Of his own free will he could choose to remain, for the rest of his life, as a servant who, because of his love for the master, choose to remain in his family.

To confirm this the owner would take his slave to the doorpost of his home. Placing the slave’s ear against it, he would pierce the lobe with an awl, pinning it momentarily to this post. This drew blood. This indicated that a bond was sealed for life and that this slave had in fact become a love servant for the remainder of his days. He would never leave that family. He would be over faithful to his owner. He was a part of that household. Their life was his. His life was theirs.

There was none of this devotion about a hireling. A hireling had no permanence. He was a casual laborer who came and went at will in a rather haphazard way. He would be here today and gone tomorrow. He was essentially a transient worker. He took no special interest in his job. As soon as a few shekels jingled in the deep folds of his loin cloth he was gone. He would seldom settle down or take any responsibility seriously. His average wage in Jesus’ day was a penny a day. The less work he could do to earn this the better it suited him. Like a dandelion seed drifting on the wind, he floated about the country looking for the softest spot to land. And if the place did not please him, he would soon take off for another.

Sometimes, but not often, one of these drifters would be employed to tend sheep in the owner’s absence. It was seldom a satisfactory arrangement. For that reason our Lord used the hireling to represent those who were entrusted with the sheep but had no real love or concern for them. The secret to successful livestock husbandry is an essential love for the animals under one’s care. And this the hireling lacked. He had no stake in the flock. They were not his. He could care less what became of them. They were but the means whereby he could make his “fast buck,” and then get out...

God has, all through history, entrusted the care of His sheep to so-called under-shepherds. And not all of them have proven to be as loyal as...

Inevitably in the nature of human affairs there appear those who pretend to be genuine but are not. The ancient prophets of Israel cried out again and again against those who posed as shepherds to God’s people but who instead only plundered them for their own selfish ends.

For example: some are called by GOD to be Pastors, Evangelists, Missionaries, etc. Then, notice for example the leading of the Holy Spirit in Acts 6, or Phillip and the meeting of the Egyptian Eunuch in the wilderness or desert.

OH, how 'our' "hearts" should 'ache', as there are many 'hirelings' who have never even been 'born-again'! In addition, there are also those who 'never' were "called by GOD" to fill such a position as 'Under-shepherds', etc. For Example:

"And the word of the LORD came to me, saying, 'Son of man, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel, prophesy and say to them, 'Thus says the Lord GOD to the shepherd: Woe to the shepherds of Israel who feed themselves! Should not the shepherds feed the flocks?'"

Then please read on found in Ezekiel 34:1-6.

NOW please turn to Matthew 9:36: "But when He saw the multitudes, He was moved with compassion for them, because they were weary and scattered, like sheep having no shepherd." Thus the 'ministry' of the Hauge Lutheran Innermission Federation/Morning Glory becomes even greater in the challenge, responsibility and privilege (by God's Grace and empowerment) to seek to be a means of being a "Trumpet-bearer" in nurturing and admonishing both the saved and the lost sinners! Co-Workers With God

The practical aspect of this truth is the question of how we may best be co-workers with God.

We know that not all Christians progress equally far in the service of God. Some can, with fewer gifts and less natural talents, accomplish more than others who have greater gifts.

To answer this question satisfactorily I shall have to refer to well-known characters in Scripture, Martha and Mary.

Martha was a faithful servant of Christ; it may appear to us that it was only she who served Him in that home. However, in all her toil and serving she had lost her joy and liberty, and had become a legalistic slave. She is ruffled and dissatisfied in her spirit. As the hostess she turns to her worthy guest with these words; *“Lord, dost thou not care that my sister did leave me to serve alone? Bid her therefore that she help me.”* We can only conclude that hers was not a joyous service.

There is quite another note in the words of Paul, *‘For though I was free from all men, I brought myself under bondage to all, that I might gain the more’* (I Corinthians 9:19). Mary places herself at the feet of Jesus and listens to what He has to say. She desires to receive as much as possible during the short period He is in the house. In this quiet peacefulness she is moved to the point of taking the cruse of costly ointment and offering its precious contents on the Savior. Jesus approved of her act.

She is not busy. She does not complain of too much work or of the laziness of others. It is not with her as with Martha that Jesus seems to care but little about her; quite the contrary is true. In her quiet moments of rest Jesus becomes so precious to her that she holds nothing too dear for Him.

THE GOSPEL CANNOT BE IMPRISONED

Mojtaba Hosseini, a leader of the house church movement in Iran, was arrested and sentenced to 3 years for his Christian activities. Feeling hopeless and desperate, he sought the Lord in prayer. Soon he realized that he was surrounded by people who were even more desperate and very lost. He felt prompted to share God’s Word with his fellow prisoners. Some allowed him to pray for them; some accepted his message and were born again. He has since been released and is out of the country now. Hosseini said, “I can serve God anywhere, inside or outside of prison. It doesn’t matter what situation I’m in. I can work in God’s kingdom wherever He places me. And at that time God placed me among the prisoners.” – godreports.com

Martha served Jesus without joy and satisfaction, and Mary gladly offered the costly ointment to Jesus. Martha is gently reprov'd for her ceaseless toil. Mary is commended for having chosen the better part; her deed will live through coming generations and move Christians to follow her example.

I should like to illustrate this truth with a picture from modern life. I know a home in which both father and mother are Christians. From the beginning of their lives together they realized that obedient and God-fearing children are the most precious possession that parents can have. They exerted themselves to rear their children in the fear of God; they were ably assisted by Christian teachers. But as the children grew up they left God.

The parents were at the point of despair. They had tried so hard, but they failed. In this extremity, they resolved to bring their troubles to God. In doing so they themselves learned to fear God better. The joy of salvation again filled their heart. Then this wonderful thing happened that all their children, one after the other, gave their lives to the Lord.

What the parents were unable to do for God made them to live in a closer fellowship with God. They found the way to the Savior, and the Savior found the way to the children. Thus they became co-workers with God. To begin with they followed Martha’s example, but later they learned to do as Mary.

No one must understand me to say that we are to remain indolently at the feet of Jesus and shirk duties and responsibilities. Mary did not do that. But we need to be on our guard, not least in these days of so much Christian activity, lest we lose ourselves in the work without losing ourselves in God. If this should happen, the words of Jesus will apply to us, *“Thou art anxious and troubled about many things.”*

We shall also find that if the Lord is to prosper our work He must first make us fit servants. If this part is omitted our work will also be fruitless even if it appears successful. That which makes us useful servants of God is that God is first permitted to prepare us. He makes us His co-workers.

A missionary was filled with sorrow and discouragement as he looked back over his work. He saw no fruit, and was ready to give up. As he pondered upon this one sleepless night he seemed to hear, *“Take care that the union between thee and Me is in order; I shall take care of the fruits.”* From that moment the missionary became a joyful co-worker with God. He learned that one who would bear fruit for God must first and always *live with God.*

On, that this might be said of every (Ed. biblical) church! Let us love people and let us be friendly.

Robert Burns, the Scottish poet, once attended a church which was so cold in every way that he vowed he would never go back again. *Probably* if that church had been as friendly as it should have been, the great author would have come to know the Lord Jesus.

SATAN, The Great Deceiver

“For the accuser of our brethren, who accused them before our God day and night, has been cast down, And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death. Therefore rejoice, O heavens and you who dwell in them! Woe to the inhabitants of the earth and the sea! For the devil has come down to you, having great wrath, because he knows that he has a short time.”

Revelation 12:10b – 12.

Fringe benefits, raise in salaries, pensions, and benefits of working overtime are things commonly mentioned in our materialistic world. Yet very seldom do you hear that Satan, the great deceiver, is a very poor paymaster. When he is mentioned it is usually in profanity, and the word/place called Hell is used very loosely! Satan is our chief arch enemy as he is known as the great ‘deceiver’.

But we need to be aware of the tactics and snares of Satan, who is our enemy; ***“lest Satan should take advantage of us; for we are not ignorant of his devices”*** II Corinthians 2:11.

This warfare is not to be taken lightly and is not a scrimmage or one to be tampered with, for it is a battle unto eternal life or eternal perdition. Satan is out to steal from, kill and destroy a child of God!

To consider this subject lightly only proves that people are carna (worldly minded) or have no spiritual life at all. The LORD did not say it was difficult to serve two masters. Jesus said it was IMPOSSIBLE. You cannot have the smile of God and the smile of the world (Satan) upon you at the same time. Trying to do so is in total contradiction with the Inspired Word of God. You are either gathering for Jesus Christ or scattering. Evil and good are not bed-partners!

The beginning is not the end, as far as a Christian is concerned, for as long as a person is in this world, such will be in a spiritual warfare with self, the world and Satan. Satan even comes before the presence of God among God’s people. *“Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the Lord, and Satan came also among them”* Job 1:6.

Accusations, discouragement, harassments are among the most common ‘tools’ that the Deceiver uses on the children of God. As Satan knows his time is short; so we consistently need to plead the BLOOD of Jesus over us and His Word, the Bible. (Rev. 2:10)

This is the **Climax** for the child of God in the 'journey' of his personal walk with JESUS for HE promises this as 'we' follow JESUS; as He is the Author and Finisher of a "Living Faith". Satan whispers to you that your 'faith' is not strong enough; which may be true, BUT how much 'faith' does it take to cross a street or bridge? WE are not to look at 'our' faith in itself; but exercise the 'faith' we have. Greater is He (The Holy Spirit) than he who is of this world!

CLIMAX: (*emphasis mine*), "**And they overcame him by the blood of the LAMB, and by the word of their testimony and they did not love their lives to the death.** (Most certainly the walk and the talk are to be in harmony with each other)

If you know of anyone (personally) who believes that the above article is a theory; I would like to suggest that tell you them to just have a little talk with Adam and Eve (*NO not really*) and discuss why they listened to Satan while in a 'sinless' world and let Satan tempt them by applying to their EGO = PRIDE (I also believe P R I D E is the 'backbone' of SIN). "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee" Psalm 119:11.

The best defense against sin is the Word of God. When Jesus was tempted by Satan in the wilderness, He used the sword of the Word to drive the tempter away.

The psalmist shows us the best way to victory – we must every day have the word of God hid in our heart. In that way we may escape sin.
