Beyond Suffering ...Glory!

(A radio Message by Wilbur E. Nelson)

aul (God inspired) uses his familiar expression, "I reckon," to introduce a most heartening and blessed thought in Romans 8:18: "I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed to us ward."

When Paul wrote about suffering, he could write out of experience, for certainly few, if any, have ever suffered greater – either physically or emotionally and mentally – than this brave man who gave so much and received so little so far as the things of time are concerned. He lived in perils constantly such as perils from his own countrymen, from false brethren, and from the forces of nature. He suffered a continual and persistent thorn in the flesh, which the Scripture describes as the messenger of Satan to buffet him. His bodily presence he describes as "weak" and his speech "contemptible." He faced Satanic opposition on a scale which few men have ever encountered. But he did not brood over the sufferings which came to him and he does not give us excuse for brooding over ours. He states, with sunny faith and optimism, "These sufferings are not worthy to be compared with that which awaits us."

Paul's words certainly have bearing upon our time. Men about us are unable to understand – that is, they cannot understand apart from faith – how to reconcile the pain and misery of the world with a God who is loving and mighty. Ours is an age sensitive to pain – an age which seems to feel that pain is inconsistent with the love of God. Some scholars have said that the Christian creed must be rejected because the God of nature is not the God of infinite love which the Gospel presents to us.

Well, Paul would be the last to deny pain. In fact, he presents it as an absolutely indisputable, inevitable fact. But he does not attribute pain and evil to the Maker of the world. He charges it to the sin and the depravity of man. As Professor F. F. Bruce has said, "The doctrine of the cosmic fall is implicit. In the Biblical record, from Genesis to Revelation, man is part of nature, and the whole nature, of which he forms part, was created good but has been subjected to frustration and futility by sin, and will ultimately be redeemed. The Christian will neither hold that at present 'all is for the best in the best of all possible worlds,' nor will he write the world off as belonging to the devil. The world is God's and God will yet be glorified by all His works. The grace of God has already begun to work in the lives of the justified. Its continued working is sufficiently evidenced by the indwelling of the Spirit and it is the same grace which on 'the day of Jesus Christ' will bring to completion the divine work so well begun. This is the hope of the people of God. This hope enables them to accept the trials of the present so that by patient endurance they may win their lives. It is, along with faith and love, one of the crowning graces which are the distinguishing marks of the Christian."

Paul says elsewhere, "We know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now." And this man, who knew the whole world's anguish, nevertheless declares throughout the whole epistle that God is love.

The world is a problem and a mystery, and not a very simple one. There is both justice and injustice, pain and joy, agony and love, and we have to account for all the facts. How shall they be reconciled and what shall we say – that God is working out a glory in comparison with

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which the sorrows of this present are not worthy to be compared? Or shall we say that He is what someone has called, "infinite indifference," who has created the world, wound it up and set it going and cares little about what happens to it or to man who inhabits it.

The world is full of beauty and joy but full of suffering and pain. It is the spirit in which we live and face what comes to us that counts. We may suffer in such a spirit of rebellion, such an angry feeling of helpless despair that it blights every part of our being. Or we may suffer so that even our darkest moments are times of victory, so that out of the pain and anguish come God's beautiful gifts that can turn sorrow into joy.

Paul sets over against the sufferings the glory that is to be revealed. Admittedly, we do not now know very much about this glory. As we so often quote Paul, "Now we see through a glass darkly,"

And John – "It doth not yet appear what we shall be." We do know that the glory that awaits us is the complete triumph over sin – not only over its power but from its very presence. Beyond that, the glory which awaits us is the glory of complete and perfect conformity to Christ, entering into the fullness of His strength and beauty, His freedom and eternity, claiming in the fullest sense that which is indicated by Paul's expression, "we are heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ."

This is a truth we should take with us always and of which we should never lose sight. The unfathomable blessedness of being altogether one with God, sharing His glory eternal will most certainly prove, as the old song says, that "the toils of the road will seem nothing when we get to the end of the way."

Watching For Christ's Return

"Watch therefore: for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come ... Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh." Matthew 24:42, 44.

Those who try to predict Christ's return may become skeptical about biblical prophecy. But this would be a sad mistake. Regardless of just when it will happen, Christ will return, for so He promised, and He cannot either lie or fail. He has repeatedly made it plain that no one can determine the date of His coming. Not even, He, while in His human limitations, knew that (Mark 13:32).

Again and again He urged us to watch and be ready for His return. He did not tell us to watch for the Antichrist or the revival of Rome's empire or a great apostasy or a great revival or a world government or anything else – just for Him! Note some of His commands to do this (in addition to the two in our text):

"Take ye heed, watch and pray, for ye know not when the time is" (Mark 13:33).

"Watch ye therefore: ...Lest coming suddenly, he find you sleeping" (Mark 13:35-36).

"Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh" (Matthew 25:13).

In addition to such exhortations by the Lord Himself, the apostles (*Editor*: The Holy Spirit) also sounded similar warnings:

"Unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation" (Hebrews 9:28).

"Abide in him; that, when he shall appear, we may have confidence, and not be ashamed before him at his coming" (1 John 2:28).

Space limitations preclude listing others, but again in the words of Christ: "And what I say unto you I say unto all, Watch" (Mark 13:37).

Spurgeon's Last Sermon

The closing words of Mr. Spurgeon's last sermon, on June 7, 1891, were characteristic of the man.

"What I have to say lastly is this: How greatly I desire that you who are not yet enlisted in my Lord's band would come to Him because you see what a kind and gracious Lord He is. Young men, if you could see our Captain, you would go down on your knees and beg Him to let you enter the ranks of those who follow Him.

"It is Heaven to serve Jesus. I am a recruiting sergeant, and I would fain find a few recruits at this moment. Every man must serve somebody — we have no choice as to that fact. Those who have no master are slaves to themselves. Depend upon it; you will either serve Satan or Christ, self or the Saviour.

"You will find sin, self, Satan and the world to be hard masters; but if you wear the livery of Christ, you will find Him so meek and lowly of heart that you will find rest unto your souls. He is the most magnanimous of captains. There never was His like among the choicest of princes. He is always to be found in the thickest part of the battle. When the wind blows cold, He always takes the bleak side of the hill. The heaviest end of the cross lies ever on His shoulders.

"These forty years and more have I served Him, blessed be His name! And I have had nothing but love from Him. I would be glad to continue yet another forty years in the same dear service here below if so it pleased Him. His service is life, peace, joy.

"Oh, that you would enter in it at once! God help you to enlist under the banner of Jesus even this day. Amen."

Here she broke down completely as she thought for the first time of her personal relation to the Lord Jesus in His sufferings. But, wiping away her blinding tears, she read on.

'He was wounded for my transgressions; He was bruised for my iniquities; the chastisement of my peace was upon Him; and with His stripes I am healed. I like a sheep have gone astray; I have turned to my own way; and the Lord hath laid on Him all my iniquities.'

She was silent for a moment and then exclaimed with deep emotion, "Oh, Mr. Moorehouse, is this true?"

"Dear child," he answered, "does not God say it?"

Again she was silent for a time, but at length she bowed her head to trust the Saviour. No longer through the tears of sorrow, but in joy and adoring gratitude and inexpressible love, she said, "Now I am saved, for all my iniquities have been laid upon Him." She arose from her knees with the peace of God filling her heart and soul.

"The time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine." II Tim. 4:3.

We are not peddlers of fable. God has spoken, and when men ask a reason for our hope, we ought to have a definite, clear-cut answer.

The early church did something because it believed something. We are trying to do what they did without believing what they believed. But without scriptural doctrine, we cannot do our spiritual duty.

A Better Leader

Hebrews chapters 3 & 4

This theme is introduced by an address and an admonition. In Ch. 3:1 the readers are called "holy brethren, partners of a heavenly calling". They are "holy brethren" because by faith they are brothers of Him who was "not ashamed to call them brethren." To be the brethren of Jesus Christ is to be "holy brethren." Here the word "holy" refers to position and relationship. When our sins are forgiven and we by grace are accepted by God for Christ's sake as His children, we are holy as Christ is holy in the sight of God. This holiness is complete and perfect.

Here on earth we still possess our sinful human nature and are far from perfect, but being holy brethren of the Lord Jesus Christ it is God's purpose that we shall grow in holiness here too. This we will be enabled to do in the measure that we know Christ and by faith accept what God has provided for us in Him.

In the address the readers are also called the "partakers of a heavenly calling." As the expression "holy brethren" reminded us of chapter two, so does also this expression, for it refers to our calling in Christ to be placed over all the works of God's hands.

In Christ we are "holy brethren" and we are "partakers of a heavenly calling" and as such we are admonished to "consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, even Jesus." To consider means to contemplate, to study, to keep on looking, to meditate. Such considering will cause us to know Jesus Christ and will be an entering into fellowship with Him by which He will cause His life to be lived in us.

Here Jesus is called "the Apostle" looking back to the first two chapters where He was spoken of as the great Messenger of God. "High Priest" looks forward to what he intends to make the high point of his demonstration, namely, that in Jesus Christ we have our living High Priest. Jesus is the "Apostle and High Priest" not only of our faith but of our confession, because a living faith must also confess Him.

...the author enters very naturally into the exhortation: "We are the household of God, if we hold fast our boldness and the glorying of our hope firm unto the end." That is, faith must be a constant attitude, continued in moment by moment and expressing itself in boldness and the glorying of our hope.

It requires a holy boldness to believe in the Lord Jesus Christ. It is a bold thing for one who admits that he is sinful and defiled to dare enter into the presence of the holy God. It also requires boldness to make confession of Christ in the world. But the world is bold. It does not hesi-

tate to express itself. Why should not the Christian be bold?

It will help us to be bold if we glory in our hope. How easy it is to glory in earthly things. We can glory in the possession of a house or a new car or a dress. How often have you not heard some man glorying in the car that he was driving, in its beautiful lines, in its color, in the sweet purr of its motor. The more he glories in it the more sure he is that he has the best car made. Suppose we begin to glory in our hope in Christ. How our appreciation of that hope would grow! ...

(Editor: Please now prayerfully read Hebrews 3:7-19).

The necessity of holding fast to the end suggests the warning found in the ninety-fifth Psalm. In passing we note again that the Holy Spirit is quoted as the author of this Psalm. The great danger is that in a Christian there might develop an "evil heart of unbelief, in falling away from the living God," just as such hardening of heart developed amongst the Israelites in the wilderness.

How could there possibly be such a danger for a Christian who, through faith in Christ, has been brought into a living fellowship in the household of God? There are great difficulties in this Epistle for those who hold the theory expressed in the phrase: "Once saved, always saved." The Bible teaches that there is a security for all believers, but it does not teach that a believer can not fall away and become an unbeliever. The fact is that, if words mean anything, this very passage warns of the danger and God would certainly not give such solemn warnings if the danger were not real and actual.

It is because of "the deceitfulness of sin" that the heart can be hardened. When we hear the voice of God warning us against sin and we choose to sin rather than to heed His voice, then that choice is registered in our very nature by the hardening of the heart. Sin seems to offer us some pleasure and for the moment it does give the sinner a thrill of some kind, but the permanent effect produced is a hardening of the heart. This can go on gradually to the point where even the one who has been a believer gives up his faith in Christ. We are partakers of Christ only on condition that we "hold fast the beginning of our confidence firm unto the end." As the voice of God reaches our hearts, warns us of sin, we are to flee to Christ in confession and in the confidence that He will forgive us and deliver us. Then we are partakers of Christ.

If, on the other hand, we resent God's warnings, we oppose the Holy Spirit, we refuse to yield, then we are hardening our hearts and we are turned in the direction which will finally lead us to apostasy. This progress of sin and its effect was very evident amongst the Israelites, as is pointed out in Ch. 3:16-19. First they provoked, then

they sinned, then they continued in their disobedience until they were established in unbelief and therefore were not able to enter the promised land.

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The Promise of Liberty

"While they promise them liberty, they themselves are the servants of corruption: for of whom a man is overcome, of the same is he brought in bondage." (2 Peter 2:19).

This chapter consists of a strong denunciation of false teachers. They are, among other things, sensuous, beguiling, covetous, and accursed (v. 14). They desire personal wealth (vv. 15-16), but their message is empty, and even destructive, and will be judged (v. 17), appealing to the pride and lusts of their hearers (v. 18).

In our text we see the false teachers are quick to make promises. Promises are cheap; they cost nothing. Satan first revealed himself to mankind with a promise: "Ye shall be as gods" (Genesis 3:5), and later attempted to seduce the Son of God with "all the kingdoms of the world" (Matthew 4:8). Empty promises are Satan's golden hook, and many are the foolish ones who take the bait.

In this case, the false teachers promise liberty – liberty to act without the shackles of responsibility and moral law. But they themselves are "servants of corruption," slaves of a most abhorrent mentality. And who are they to offer liberty? These are indeed "great swelling words of vanity" (2 Peter 2:18), for slaves cannot rightly offer liberty.

How is this promise kept? Bondage. Bondage to that which has overcome. The liberty that sin promises is slavery, and the greater the sinner, the greater the bondage to the sin. There is perhaps no more wretched estate than to be in bondage to abject corruption in the name of liberty. It is a bondage of the spirit; a captivity of the soul. Of all states of slavery, it is the most lasting.

On the other hand, through grace we can "stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free," with no need to be "entangled again with the yoke of bondage" (Galatians 5:1).

Eyesight/Vision

I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work."" John 4:35 & 9:4.

NOW as you look unto the 'fields' that are 'white

unto harvest', what do **you see?** Hopefully more than a mass of humanity but made up of 'individuals' as you and I.

Whatever degree of discernment you have is a gift from God and He expects you to exercise it both for your advantage and for the benefit of others. Be aware of false doctrine and cunning words from the evil one. Spiritual discernment comes by regular reading of the scripture and prayer for His wisdom and direction as you face questionable situations. You and I are to be 'fruit inspectors' according to the Word of God, by the GRACE of GOD! (Imagine going to your 'cupboard' and adding arsenic of lead to your 'oatmeal' – oh just a little of course! Hebrews 5:14-16, 1 Corinthians 2: Matthew 7:16 -20, 12:33, 15:14, 6:39 and Deuteronomy 29:29.

As David went up to the top story he looked in the wrong direction and saw; but maybe (?) he went there to have his devotions or relax: regardless of his intent – he still looked in the wrong direction!

We learn through the 'school' of hard-knocks: "I will set nothing wicked (evil) before my eyes" Psalm 101:3a. (Lot) "for that righteous man, dwelling among them, tormented his righteous soul from day to day by seeing and hearing their lawless deeds" 11 Peter 2:8.

What do you see spiritually, TODAY?

How about your neighbor; is he saved? That loved one? That friendly, morally upright person in your church/congregation? Keep in mind that 'Satan' will/would not prompt you nor I to testify to some one about their NEED of the blood atonement of the crucified and risen ONE!

WHAT do you see? Where the **Law of God** is not presented in love: SIN will inevitably move in: personally, church, community & on! Where God's Law is not preached/presented there is no need for the Great Physician: "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick." Matthew 9:12b, Mark 2:17, Luke 5:31. The General telegrammed him back with two words: "*Try Tears!*" OH that today 'we' could have individuals like <u>you</u> who truly say: Jeremiah 9:1 (Actually the whole chapter 9) & Romans 9:1-2 (by the Grace of God) and result Psalm 125:5-6. Tragically I think that many of 'our' tear ducts have *dried up!* Functioning 'tear ducks' are important both physically & <u>spiritually</u>. For example: there are way to many 'polar bears' behind the 'sacred desk', because there are so many 'ice bergs' in the 'pew'. What do you see?

The title of a Gospel Song is "He Washed My Eyes with Tears," and God says: "...and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see." Revelation 3:18b. God tells 'us' that we are able to read the 'signs' in the sky in regards to weather; but not the signs of the times: which HE definitely intends for 'us' to be 'sign read-

ers'. NOW Scripturally remember that a 'sign' is the indication of a coming 'event' and not the 'event' itself and this very 'sign' will be fulfilled at least once — but other signs numerous times: (Even in the time of Apostle Paul) "But concerning the times and the seasons, brethren, you have no need that I should write to you" 1 Thessalonians 5:1. ANYONE who does not see the 'signs of the times in our day: IS either blind or needs to remove the 'sleep' out of their EYES! Look and See: Morally, Religiously, Economically, Nature & Spiritually!

OH GOD PLEASE WAKE UP (revive) THY PEOPLE ONCE AGAIN


When the hour comes, we will seek refuge in His bosom, like a little child that seeks refuge in the arms of his father. While we feel His strong arms about us, He will carry us across.



Lesbian Divorce Case Could Have National Implications

Maryland's highest court is poised to hear arguments in a precedent-setting case involving two women who married legally in California but were denied a divorce in Maryland, which does not currently allow same-sex weddings.

The Court of Appeals of Maryland in Annapolis heard arguments on April 6 from lawyers for the lesbian couple who are seeking to end their marriage. A Maryland judge declined to grant their divorce in 2010, basing his decision on the conclusion that the women's marriage is not valid under Maryland law.

But lawyers for the women disagree, saying the state should recognize gay marriages performed elsewhere even though Maryland does not allow same-sex weddings at the present time...

The high court's ultimate decision may have limited effect since same-sex weddings, and by extension divorces, are set to start in the state in January 2013 under a law passed this year. But opponents of the new law are seeking to overturn it in a potential voter referendum.

California Woman Gets Prison Sentence for Fake Christian Concerts

A federal judge has sentenced a promoter of Christian rock concerts to more than four years in prison for a Ponzi scheme involving nearly \$1 million.

Federal prosecutors say 43-year-old Lauren Baumann of Downey, California was sentenced to four years, nine months in prison and must pay restitution to more than two dozen victims.

Baumann, who owned the promotion company Stewardship Estates, pleaded guilty to wire fraud in October for falsely promising investors that their money would be used to host Christian...concerts.

Prosecutors say she instead used the money to pay

previous investors, to rent a \$10,000-a-month mansion and to pay for private school for her children.

Obamacare to Subsidize Abortion for \$1

LifeNews.com reports that the controversial Affordable Care Act, commonly known as "Obamacare," will reportedly require people enrolled in a plan that includes elective abortion coverage to pay \$1 a month to subsidize abortions, even if they are morally against the procedure.

News about the abortion surcharge has once again fired up those concerned about protecting religious liberty. The ruling sidesteps what is known as the "Hyde Amendment," which prohibits taxpayer funding of abortion, by engaging in an accounting scheme that is described with the Act...

"...As described in the rule, the surcharge can only be disclosed to the enrollee at the time of enrollment. Furthermore, insurance plans may only advertise the total cost of the premiums without disclosing that enrollees will be charged a \$1 per month fee to pay directly subsidized abortions." ...

Under the law, the mandates will be in place by the first of January of 2014.

A HERITAGE OF FAITH AND FREEDOM

My grandfather Casper Barnhart, seven generations back, came to the shores of America from Germany in 1764. He settled on a farm near Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, where George Washington camped with his troops during the winter of 1777-1778. Based on statements in his Will, Casper was a very devout Christian.

Living near Philadelphia Casper and his son John William may have read one of the first copies of the Declaration of Independence, adopted by the Continental Congress in Independence Hall, July 4, 1776. Perhaps he and his family were among the first to hear about the new Constitution adopted by the Continental Congress in 1787 when it met at the same place. Regardless of his proximity to or his personal acquaintance with these historical events, Casper bequeathed to his posterity a tremendous heritage of faith and freedom.

History records that members of my family helped to pioneer this country from the wilderness of Western Pennsylvania and Ohio to the plains of North Dakota. Members of my family served in most of the nation's wars, while others helped to establish churches and quietly did their part in building this great land. A day rarely passes that I am not reminded of my heritage and my obligation to carry on the faithful stewardship my ancestors rendered to the United States of America.

WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO OUR NATION?

The America we knew and the America that was so sacrificially built by our ancestors is disappearing before our eyes. The present generation's legacy to their posterity may well be a national debt that can never be repaid and a society that has defiantly turned from God to decadence.

Today forty-one percent of America's children are born outside the covenant of marriage. In the black community, that number exceeds seventy percent. The God given sanctity of marriage between a man and a woman is being destroyed. Seven states have legalized same-sex marriage, while several mainline churches have sanctioned the same evil. Every year new laws are enacted and court decisions are rendered that go against the Judeo-Christian values upon which this nation was founded.

America was established on Christian beliefs and values, though this part of our history is deliberately being removed from our textbooks. The United States has been affirmed as a "Christian nation" by Presidents, Congress and the Supreme Court. Yet, such statements today are considered bigoted. One of the most difficult things for the American people to accept today is that there are actually those in high places whose purpose is to radically change our constitution form of government and replace it with a form of godless socialism. It is even harder for Christians to accept the fact that there are actually church leaders who are out to remake the church by replacing biblical truth with a man-made religion. For Christ's sake, for the sake of our children, <u>WAKE UP AND TAKE YOUR STAND BEFORE</u> <u>IT'S TOO LATE!</u> Our nation and our churches are being destroyed before our very eyes!

Every Christian in America today has the God-given responsibility to uphold the nation and our leaders in prayer. We have an obligation to speak out against the evils that are threatening this country's very existence.

Starbucks' CEO Says Backing "Gay Marriage" is Right for Them

Starbucks officials see no impact of the company's decision to endorse a same-gender "marriage" bill passed by lawmakers in Washington State.

Starbucks' annual meeting of shareholders took place March 21 in Seattle, home base of the popular coffee retailer. At the end of that meeting, shareholder Tom Strohbar, founder of the Corporate Morality Action Center, took the company to task for its pro-homosexual policies – including support for homosexual marriage.

"What concerns me is possible economic boycotts, shareholder resolutions, things that might affect the sales of our company, the earnings," he stated. "Is it prudent to risk the economic interests of all the shareholders for something that might affect the private lives of a very small percentage of our employees?"

Starbucks CEO Howard Schultz responded by saying while he did not want to be disrespectful to Strohbar, he believes the decision "is right for our company."...

Meanwhile, the National Organization for Marriage has announced a "Dump Starbucks" protest in response to the company's support of same-sex marriage.
