Witnesses for Christ

"For thou shalt be a witness unto all men of what thou has seen and heard." (Acts 22:15)

s you read this entire chapter you are convinced that Paul had certainly been privileged to see and hear great things concerning the Lord Jesus Christ. On the day referred to in this passage, he made a discovery. It was more than a mental illumination. It went way beyond a strong impression upon his consciousness. It was nothing short of a revelation which produced a complete transformation of his life. Explain it psychologically or any way you will, it was the apostle's testimony throughout a long lifetime that this experience was not an effect produced by the working of his own mind but by the glorified Christ making Himself known. In other words this was not something worked up from within but it was something revealed to him from without.

This revelation consisted of a vivid demonstration of the power and the glory of God with whom he had to deal. It brought to Paul the conviction for the first time in his life that with all his religious sincerity, he was sincerely wrong and deserving of eternal damnation. It showed him conclusively that his only hope of pardon was through the Divine Christ whom he had until now declared to be an impostor. Finally, it brought to the stubborn and proud Paul the experience of seeking the help of a humble Christian for spiritual enlightenment and direction. Read the whole fascinating and instructive story yourself in the first twenty verses of the ninth chapter of Acts.

This, then, is what Paul has seen and heard. The revelation brought with it such an inner conviction of its truth-

fulness and reality that stonings, beatings, slander, banishment from home and city, arguments of bribes could never move him and he finally sealed his faith with his life's blood. To such a man came the commandment of our text. Note its content.

1. PERSONAL

"Thou shalt be." It is the man who has personally experienced the power of the truths he is to speak that the Lord commissions to be a witness. It is firsthand knowledge of the truths of the Gospel that is required. Is this asking too much? Would a court of justice accept anything less? Would they be content to have you take the stand and witness of what some sharp lawyer had instructed you to say? Certainly not.

What leads you then to suppose that God will use the testimony of a man just because professors in a college or a seminary have taught him a system of theology which we call Christianity? Hear me college and theological students who contemplate entering the ministry: You may have the hands of the presbytery laid upon you, you may be ordained as a clergyman of the church but you'll never be commissioned by the Lord Jesus as a witness for him until you have personally experienced the truths you are expected to preach.

2. CHRIST-CENTERED

"Thou shalt be His witness." I understand this to mean that we are to bear our testimony about Chirst. Though we have been entrusted with blessed experiences with Christ, our witness is to be about Him, not ourselves.

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We are to "show forth the virtues of Him who called us from darkness into His marvelous light." Our experiences do have a part in our testimony as evidence of the practical application of the truths which we proclaim and as encouragement to others like ourselves to "taste and see that the Lord is good."

To be His witness also means that we are to witness for his glory, not our own. Nowhere is pride, vanity, self-glorification and self-seeking as offensive as in a Christian witness. May the Holy Spirit root it out of the hearts of each of us.

3. IMPARTIAL

"My witness unto all men."

Christ's witnesses are to bring their message of the Gospel of Christ unto all whom they can in any wise reach. We are to proclaim it to those who are glad to hear our message and to those who curse us for it. We are to bring it to our countrymen and to every other race, color and nationality. To the rich in their mansions and to the poor in their hovels. To those in the sunset years of life and to youth in life's golden morning.

We are to use every possible means at our disposal to get out the message. We who preach, may we bear witness about Christ from the pulpit. You who sing, proclaim it in song. To others, let it be by street meetings, distributing tracts, visiting the sick and shut-ins, writing letters. May all of us who truly know Christ the Savior be found bearing witness for him until he comes to call us home. This is His call and command to every true Christian.





COLUMBINE – Father of murdered daughter speaks

On Thursday, Darrell Scott, the father of Rachel Scott, a victim of the Columbine High School shootings in Littleton, Colorado, was invited to address the House Judiciary Committee's subcommittee. What he said to our national leaders during this special session of Congress was painfully truthful.

They were not prepared for what he was to say, nor was it received well.

It needs to be heard by every parent, every teacher, every politician, every sociologist, every psychologist, and every so-called expert!

These courageous words spoken by Darrell Scott are powerful, penetrating and deeply personal. There is no doubt that God sent this man as a voice in the wilderness. The following is a portion of the transcript:

"Since the dawn of creation there has been both good and evil in the hearts of men and women. We all contain the seeds of kindness or the seeds of violence. The death of my wonderful daughter, Rachel Joy Scott, and the deaths of that heroic teacher, and the other eleven children who died must not be in vain. Their blood cries out for answers.

"The first recorded act of violence was when Cain slew his brother Abel out in the field. The villain was not the club he used. Neither was it the NCA, the National Club Association. The true killer was Cain, and the reason for the murder could only be found in Cain's heart.

"In the days that followed the Columbine tragedy, I was amazed at how quickly fingers began to be pointed at groups such as the NRA. I am not a member of the NRA. I am not a hunter. I do not even own a gun. I am not here to represent or defend the NRA – because I don't believe that they are responsible for my daughter's death. Therefore I do not believe that they need to be defended. If I believed they had anything to do with Rachel's murder I would be their strongest opponent.

"I am here today to declare that Columbine was not just a tragedy - it was a spiritual event that should be forcing us to look at where the real blame lies! Much of the blame lies here in this room. Much of the blame lies behind the pointing fingers of the accusers themselves. I wrote a poem just four nights ago that expresses my feelings best. This was written way before I knew I would be speaking here today.

Your laws ignore our deepest needs, Your words are empty air. You've stripped away our heritage,
You've outlawed simple prayer.
Now gunshots fill our classrooms,
And precious children die.
You seek for answers everywhere,
And ask the question "Why?"
You regulate restrictive laws,
Through legislative creed.
And yet you fail to understand,
That God is what we need!

"Men and women are three-part beings. We all consist of body, mind and spirit. When we refuse to acknowledge a third part of our make-up, we create a void that allows evil, prejudice, and hatred to rush in and wreak havoc. Spiritual presences were present within our educational systems for must of our nation's history. Many of our major colleges began as theological seminaries. This is a historical fact. What has happened to us as a nation? We have refused to honor God, and in so doing, we open the doors to hatred and violence. And when something as terrible as Columbine's tragedy occurs - politicians immediately look for a scapegoat such as the NRA. They immediately seek to pass more restrictive laws that contribute to erode away our personal and private liberties. We do not need more restrictive laws. Eric and Dylan would not have been stopped by metal detectors. No amount of gun laws can stop someone who spends months planning this type of massacre. The real villain lies within our own hearts.

"As my son Craig lay under that table in the school library and saw his two friends murdered before his very eyes, he did not hesitate to pray in school. I deny any law or politician to deny him that right! I challenge every young person in America, and around the world, to realize that on April 20, 1999, at Columbine High School prayer was brought back to our schools. Do not let the many prayers offered by those students be in vain.

"Dare to move into the new millennium with a sacred disregard for legislation that violates your God-given right to communicate with Him. To those of you who would point your finger at the NRA – I give to you a sincere challenge. Dare to examine your own heart before casting the first stone!

"My daughter's death will not be in vain! The young people of this country will not allow that to happen!"

Do what the media did not — let the nation hear this man's speech....God Bless

Canada family leader: U.S. stimulus socialistic

Brian Rushfeldt, executive director of the Canada Family Action Coalition, says U.S. President Barack Obama's stimulus package is socialism that will lead the nation into poverty. The Universe

The following is excerpted from 'The Complex Cosmos' by the late Henry Morris, Institute for Christian Research.

"He hath made the earth by His power, He hath established the world by His wisdom, and hath stretched out the heavens by His direction (Jeremiah 10:12). God's 'power' refers to the tremendous energy or force required to organize the complex systems and phisco-chemical processes which govern the earth. Episcopal Divinity School Dean Gives Sermon Saying Abortion Is a "Blessing"

The new dean of the Episcopal Divinity School has given a sermon describing abortions as a "blessing" for the women who have them. The Rev. Katherine Hancock Ragsdale also thinks that the people who run abortion businesses are "heroes" and even "saints." Ragsdale, speaking in Birmingham, Alabama, said that "when a woman becomes pregnant within a loving, supportive, respectful relationship; has every option open to her; decides she does not wish to bear a child; and has access to a safe, affordable abortion, there is not a tragedy in sight – only blessing."

She goes on to say, "When a woman wants a child but can't afford one because she hasn't the education necessary for a sustainable job, or access to healthcare or day care or adequate food, it is the abysmal priorities of our nation, the lack of social supports, the absence of justice that are the tragedies; the abortion is a blessing." In her speech, she tells the audience, "These are the two things I

Poll: More Americans now call themselves 'pro-life'

The Gallup Poll reported that 51 percent of Americans now call themselves "pro-life" rather than "pro-choice" on the issue of abortion, the first time a majority gave that answer in the 15 years that Gallup has asked the question. The findings, obtained in an annual survey on values and beliefs conducted May 7-10, marked a significant shift from a year ago. A year ago, 50 percent said they supported a woman's right to choose abortion and 44 percent opposed it -in the new poll, 42 percent said they were "pro-choice." The findings echoed a recent survey by the Pew Research Center, which reported a sharp decline since last August in those saying abortion should be legal in all or most cases – from 54 to 46 percent.

PUERTO RICO A rocket carrying the largest space telescope ever has launched into space on a mission that European scientists hope will help unravel the mystery of the universe's creation. The Herschel will study the formation of stars and galaxies, while the Planck will gather data on radiation from the Big Bang, the cosmological explosion that many believe formed the universe.

Fossil Linking Man to Apes?

A discovery of a 47 million-year-old fossil primate that is said to be a human ancestor was announced and unveiled Tuesday [May 19] at a press conference in New York City.

Known as "Ida," the nearly complete transitional fossil is 20 times older than most fossils that provide evidence for human evolution.

It shows characteristics from the very primitive non-human evolutionary line (prosimians, such as lemurs), but is more related to the human evolutionary line (anthropoids, such as monkeys, apes and humans), said Norwegian paleontologist Jørn Hurum of the University of Oslo Natural History Museum. However, she is not really an anthropoid either, he said.

The fossil, called Darwinius Masillae and said to be a female, provides the most complete understanding of the paleobiology of any primate so far discovered from the Eocene Epoch, Hurum said. An analysis of the fossil mammal is detailed Tuesday in the journal PLoS ONE.

"This is the first link to all humans ... truly a fossil that links world heritage," Hurum said.

Here is some context for the age of the new primate fossil: Anatomically modern humans (Homo sapiens) first emerged about 200,000 years ago, but early humans such as Australopithecus afarensis and Australopithecus anamensis reach back 3 million to 4 million years ago or even earlier. Humans are thought to have split off from a group that includes chimpanzees and gorillas about 6 million years ago. And a group that includes all the great apes (including us) and Old World monkeys (called simians or anthropoids) diverged from New World monkeys in the Eocene, just after the time of Ida. So our primate roots reach back to this time.

Obama calls for 'fair-minded' abortion debate

The President is greeted by cheers, protests at University of Notre Dame

President Barack Obama strode head-on Sunday [May 17] into the stormy abortion debate and told graduates at America's leading Roman Catholic university that both sides must stop demonizing one another.

Obama acknowledged that "no matter how much we want to fudge it ... the fact is that at some level, the views of the two camps are irreconcilable." But he still implored

the University of Notre Dame's graduating class and all in the U.S. to stop "reducing those with differing views to caricature. Open hearts. Open minds. Fair-minded words. It's a way of life that always has been the Notre Dame tradition."

One of the noisiest controversies of his young presidency flared after Obama, who supports abortion rights but says the procedure should be rare, was invited to speak at the school and receive an honorary degree. "I do not suggest that the debate surrounding abortion can or should go away," the President said.

The Rev. John Jenkins, Notre Dame's president, introduced Obama and praised the President for not being "someone who stops talking to those who disagree with him." Jenkins said too little attention has been paid to Obama's decision to speak at an institution that opposes his abortion policy.

At least 27 arrests ahead of speech

Ahead of Obama's speech, at least 27 people were arrested on trespassing charges from protests outside the university, police said. They included Norma McCorvey, the plaintiff identified as "Roe" in the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision that legalized abortion. She now opposes abortion and joined more than 300 anti-abortion demonstrators at the school's front gate.

More than half held signs, some declaring "Shame on Notre Dame" and "Stop Abortion Now" to express their anger over Notre Dame's invitation to Obama, saying the university had lost touch with its Catholic roots.

On campus, Obama entered the arena to thunderous applause and a standing ovation from many in the crowd of 12,000. But as the President began his commencement address, at least three protesters interrupted it. One yelled, "Stop killing our children."

The graduates responded by chanting "Yes we can", the slogan that became synonymous with Obama's presidential campaign. Obama seemed unfazed, saying Americans must be able to deal with things that make them "uncomfortable."

The President ceded no ground on abortion. But he said those on each side of the debate "can still agree that this is a heart-wrenching decision for any woman to make, with both moral and spiritual dimensions.

"So let's work together to reduce the number of women seeking abortions by reducing unintended pregnancies, and making adoption more available, and providing care and support for women who do carry their child to term."

'Sensible Conscience Clause'

He said he favored "a sensible conscience clause" that

would give anti-abortion health care providers the right to refuse to perform the procedure.

Before taking on the abortion issue, Obama told graduates they were part of a "generation that must find a path back to prosperity and decide how we respond to a global economy that left millions behind even before this crisis hit an economy where greed and short-term thinking were too often rewarded at the expense of fairness, and diligence, and an honest day's work."

Obama supports abortion rights but says the procedure should be rare. The Catholic Church and many other Christian denominations hold that abortion and the use of embryos for stem cell research amount to the destruction of human life and are morally wrong and should be banned by law.

The contrary argument holds that women have the right to terminate a pregnancy and that unused embryos created outside the womb for couples who cannot otherwise conceive should be available for stem cell research. Such research holds the promise of finding treatments for debilitating ailments.

Within weeks of taking office in January, Obama eased an executive order by President George W. Bush that limited research to a small number of stem-cell strains.

It is better to repair the hole in the hedge than to run around with snake-bite kits... Let us pay more attention to the fences and not be guilty of glorying in sensational conversions. When this realization comes to us and we repent of our sin, then we are prepared for the rest, pardon and peace offered by our Saviour. Let us remember the awful truth of sin. 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TWO TRUMPETS OF SILVER

(Numbers 10:1-10)

The Old Testament presents God as a God of order. Likewise the New Testament tells believers, "Let all things be done decently and in order" (1 Cor. 14:40). Therefore, it is important, in these days of disorder and indecency in the church, that God's children heed His Word in every detail. In our text, God commanded Moses to make two trumpets of silver "for the calling of the assembly, and for the journeying of the camps" (vv. 1-2). Why did He require "two trumpets" and why made "of silver of a whole piece"? God spoke to Israel through the two trumpets, even as He speaks

ot believers today through the Old and New Testaments, each with its particular purpose, but both necessary (vv. 3-9). Silver speaks of the purity of God's Word. The fact that these trumpets were made "of a whole piece" symbolically reminds us that both Old and New Testaments are the Word of God, not the words of men (2 Pet. 1:19-21). The proper use of these trumpets brought blessing to the people of God by providing them with divine guidance and protection in a dangerous wilderness filled with enemies.

When we consider the wilderness experiences of the children of Israel and the use of the two silver trumpets, we note several major purposes that can be compressed into four words: walking, worshipping, warning and warring. God wanted His people to walk in His ways, to worship according to His will, to be warned concerning danger and to battle in His strength. The Lord knew that His chosen people would need to hear the warning trumpet often, just as we do today in these deceptive last days. Tomorrow we will note some practical applications of these important, God-given truths.

Walking, Worshipping, Warring, Warning

When God speaks, everyone should listen, especially His own. What God says is always right; His way is always best. The use of the two silver trumpets in our text allowed His people to know for certain when He wanted them to move or when they were to stop and rest. The Lord wanted them to assemble for worship and instruction – not according to their terms but in accordance with His will. The Israelites certainly needed to be warned of danger, and when waging battle against the enemy, they required God's direction and support. One trumpet or both were to be blown at the right time and in the right manner – no exceptions. If the trumpets failed to be sounded or obeyed, the Israelites would suffer at the hands of their enemies.

Today, God speaks through His completed, infallible Word. As believers, we know that not all of the Bible is directed specifically to us, but every word of it is given for our learning (Rom. 15:40). Many times in the Old Testament Scriptures God used the word trumpet when, through His prophets, He warned about sin and backsliding and pleaded for his people to walk and worship in His ways (Isa. 58:1; Ezek. 33:1-7). When we read God's Word today and notice how the Israelites treated and responded to His grace and mercy, we condemn their actions as shocking and inexcusable – and rightfully so. But why do so many even in our day rebuff God's pleas to walk and worship according to the Scriptures? Why do so many refuse to warn the disobedient? Why do so many spiritual pacifists exist who will not earnestly contend for the faith? Remember, all believers one day will give an answer to God (1Cor. 3:10-15). MHR

What can wash away Sin?

For it is the blood that maketh an atonement for the soul. (Leviticus 17:11)

Sincere people today are trusting in many different things to forgive their sins. The Hindu, Buddhist and Moslem all have various ways to atone for their sins. Within the realm of Christianity some hope to have their sins forgiven by doing good works, getting baptized, observing the sacraments, going to church or keeping the commandments. God's plan for forgiveness from the very beginning, is very clear according to the Bible verse above. After Adam and Eve sinned and lost their innocence in the Garden of Eden, they tried to cover their nakedness with fig leaves. God gave them an object lesson right away and used animal hides or leather (Gen. 3:21) to cover them. Obviously some animals (most likely sheep) had to die, and the first blood was shed for sin. Immediately God gave them a promise of a coming Messiah one day (Gen. 3:15). Adam and Eve's two sons, Cain and Abel, were soon offering up sacrifices to God. Abel offered up a lamb as a blood sacrifice, which was acceptable to God. Cain offered God a bloodless sacrifice of fruit and vegetables and it was rejected. God had set a precedent as told in Hebrews 9:22, "without shedding of blood is no remission" (forgiveness of sin). Years later Abraham is found offering up sheep as a blood sacrifice (Gen. 22:13). By the time we get to Moses, God establishes the Passover involving the following instructions: A special lamb was to be sacrificed. It would be a male lamb without spot or blemish. It would be a year old, which is prime of life for a lamb. Its blood would be shed as a sacrifice, and the innocent would die for the guilty! That lamb would be a picture of someone who was yet to come. The Passover and the shed blood of lambs would continue for many years. After numerous centuries, Jesus Christ appeared on the scene, and John the Baptist proclaimed, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the son of the world" (John 1:29).

Jesus Christ would be like that Passover lamb as a male, without sin, dying in the prime of life (age 33) as the innocent dying for the guilty. For many years, the blood of sacrificial lambs had been shed by the thousands. Jesus

The LORD knows the manifold dangers of man's covetous nature, always seeking Things, Things, Things, early and late. For our own spiritual good we need to be in fellowship with people who "Watch and Pray", and less with those who "buy and pay."

would shed the final blood on the cross. Before He died, He spoke those last words, "It is finished" (John 19:30). By this he meant there's now no more need for animal sacrifices. The moment Jesus died, the thick veil back in the Jewish temple supernaturally tore in half and God made it clear there were to be no more animal sacrifices. The Jews continued to sacrifice lambs until Titus the Roman general permanently destroyed the temple. God had spoken. So what can cleanse us from our sins? Please carefully read the following Bible verses as they spell out the answer.

1 John 1:7 "The blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin"

Ephesians 1:7 "In whom (Jesus) we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins"

Romans 5:9 "Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him."

1 Peter 1:18-19 "Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot"

Revelation 1:5 "Unto him (Jesus) that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood"

Apparently baptism or doing good deed has nothing to do with getting us to heaven. (Editor: After a child reaches the age of accountability - when a child is old enough to know what SIN is; that same child is old enough to consciously accept JESUS as his very own SAVIOR). That leaves us with one final question: How can we apply the shed blood of Christ to our own sins? The answer is by being born again (John 3:3, 7). This requires two things which are both connected to the shed blood of Christ. First of all we must be willing to repent of our sins. The Bible says, "Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out" (Acts 3:19). Secondly we must put 100% of our faith in the blood sacrifice of Jesus on the cross to save us from hell and our sins. (Editor: A living faith is a gift from God – Ephesians 2:8-9, John 6:29, etc.). The Bible says "God hath set forth (Jesus) to be a propitiation (satisfactory payment) through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins" (Rom 3:25).

From the very beginning its center was not in itself or in me, but outside itself and me. I never supposed that it was merely a case of my father's or mother's will being pitted against my will, still less of their power being pitted against my weakness. I knew they had a right to ask of me what they did – I knew that they desired it because it was already right. I understood that my parents were under the same constraint that they were so conscientiously transmitting to me; and I knew that the ultimate source of their authority, this constraint, was God."

Would that every parent who reads these words could hear such words spoken of them by their own children. We lead best by living before our children lives that reflect the spirit and love of Christ. Wilbur E. Nelson

Thank you for your generous giving and may the Lord add His blessing.



We have now re-printed the daily devotional,




Finished copies will be available in June. These books will be available on a free-will offering basis, with a
