What Kind of Church?

A preacher whom I greatly respect, Charles Spurgeon, once wrote: "The devil has seldom done a cleverer thing than hinting to the church that part of their mission is to provide entertainment for the people, with a view to winning them" (*The Biblical Evangelist*, Vol. 35, Number 1, Jan-Feb, 2004).

His words, written well over a century ago, could well apply to segments of church life today. In fact, Dave Hunt, writing in *The Berean Call*, February 2004, sounds very much like Spurgeon: "Some of the largest presumably evangelical churches have designed their Sunday morning services based upon what the ungodly want. Missing are the fear of a holy God's wrath against sin, trembling repentance, and grateful faith in Christ, the eternal God who became man through the virgin birth to suffer the full penalty of God's judgment in our place. Seeker-friendly churches must not 'offend' with the Truth, but pamper with the flattering 'gospel' of self-esteem, self-love, and positive thinking—a 'gospel' that cannot save. As Paul foretold, *'they will not endure sound doctrine...* '(2 Tim 4:3)."

Today mega-churches continue to grow. And, some of these churches are flourishing because of what they have eliminated. "Gone are traditional religious dogma, rituals, and symbols, replaced by uplifting songs and sermons... The messages are encouraging and easy to swallow, and no one is called a sinner. It's 'Jesus meets the power of positive thinking' (*The Christian Science Monitor*, Dec 30, 2003).

The question is: "Are we in the church called to edify people or entertain them?" That is, do we try to reach people by feeding them the whole counsel of the Word of God, or, do we seek to amuse them into the Kingdom? It is a sad commentary on the state of the evangelical church today

when many would rather hear an upbeat song than an uplifting sermon. As a result, the church is superficial, anemic, and careless about souls. Don't misunderstand. I am not talking about worship styles or different types of music. I am talking about a consumer mentality that caters to the wants rather than to the needs of people. Commenting on this, John MacArthur writes: "The church service is too long, you say? We'll shorten it (one pastor guarantees his sermon will never last more than seven minutes!). Too formal? Wear your sweatsuit. Too boring? Wait until you hear our band!...And if the message is too confrontational, or too judgmental, or too exclusive, scary, unbelievable, hard to understand, or too much anything else for your taste, churches everywhere are eager to adjust that message to make you more comfortable...It's Christianity for consumers: Christianity Lite, the redirection, watering down, and misinterpretation of the biblical gospel in an attempt to make it more palatable and popular" (Hard To Believe, pp. 1-2).

We would do well to remember Paul's emphasis as recorded in I Thessalonians 2:4 "...but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, so we speak, not as pleasing men, but God who examines our hearts."

Some years ago a friend of mine humorously commented on the chicken soup he had eaten someplace. He called it "Shadow of Chicken Soup." He said that they must have had a chicken that they held over the hot water and the chicken's shadow on the water was what gave the soup its insipid flavor. In other words, there was very little chicken in the soup.

What kind of "church" soup do you want? Even better, what kind do you need?

Faith And Assurance

Dr. C.F.W. Walther, in his book Law and Gospel writes, "There are people who regard themselves as good Christians although they are spiritually dead. They have never felt a real anguish on account of their sins; they have never been filled with terror on account of them, have never been appalled by the thought of the hell which they have deserved, have never been on their knees before God, bewailing with bitter tears their awful, damnable condition under sin. Much less have they wept sweet tears of joy and glorified God for His mercy. They read and hear the Word of God without being specially impressed by it. They go to church and receive absolution without feeling refreshed; they attend Holy Communion without any inward sensation and remain as cold as ice. Occasionally, when they become inwardly agitated because of their indifference in matters concerning their salvation and because of their lack of appreciation of God's Word, they try to quiet their heart with the reflection that the Lutheran Church teaches that the lack of spiritual feeling is of no moment. They reason that this lack cannot harm them and that they can be good Christians notwithstanding, because they consider themselves believers."

"However, they labor under a grievous self-delusion. People in that condition have nothing but the dead faith of the intellect, a specious faith, or, to express it still more drastically, a lip faith. They may say with their mouths 'I believe,' but their heart is not conscious of it No, indeed; a person who cannot say, in accordance with Psalm 34:8, that he has **tasted** and seen that the Lord is good must not regard himself as being in a state of true faith. Moreover, the apostle Paul says, Rom. 8:16: "The Spirit himself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are children of God.' Can the Holy Spirit bear this witness in us without our *feeling* it?

If God were to call me hence tonight, I would not be sure whether I should die saved.' God grant that not one of you will retire in that frame of mind; for he would lie down to rest with the wrath of God abiding on him."

A Promise Is a Promise

Numbers 14:1-12

In today's text, we find the children of Israel distraught over the "evil report" delivered by ten of the twelve men commissioned to spy out the land of Canaan – the land promised by God to the Israelites. After returning from their journey, these men acknowledged the goodness of the land (13:26-27), yet they determined that they were unable to claim the land due to the strength of the inhabitants therein (13:31-33). Their refusal to press forward stemmed from a heart of unbelief – unbelief in the promises of God. Yes, God had promised to give them the land that flowed with "milk and honey," but their lack of faith in the Lord's promises revealed the hardness of their hearts and their anger against all who desired to live by faith (vv. 2-4, 10).

God's Word is full of promises to people of every age, and because God is the author of the Bible. He is the author of the promises therein. Men often break promises, but God cannot break any promises He has made. Concerning the promises of God, the Bible declares that God cannot lie (23:19, Titus 1:2), that God's record of keeping His promises is perfect (Josh. 23:14), that God is able to do whatever He has said (Rom.4:21) and that God is completely faithful to His word (2 Cor. 1:20; Heb.11:11). Yes, we can be certain that what God has said will come to pass in His time. Our responsibility is simply to live out lives day by day believing (exercising faith) in the promises of God concerning what He has done for us, who we are in Him and what He will do yet future. The consequences of faithless living are devastating it hinders our fellowship with God now and will bring loss of reward yet future. MDC

The PRECIOUS BLOOD of CHRIST

1 Peter 1:13 – 25

God freely offers forgiveness of sin and eternal life to all who believe. Why? Because Jesus Christ, as a Lamb without spot or blemish, shed His precious blood to pay the penalty for our sin (vv. 18-19). The precious blood of Christ is an integral part of the very basis of our salvation, as is the glorious fact of the resurrection (vv. 20-21). The precious blood of Christ provides the believer's present justification as well as deliverance from the wrath to come (Rom. 5:9). The Bible reminds believers that if we walk in the light as He is in the light, we will enjoy not only our Lord's fellowship but also continual cleansing through His blood from daily defilement (1 Jn. 1:7). We ought to strive diligently to be "obedient children," sober-minded and "holy in all manner of conversation" (vv. 13-16). If we honestly consider the blood of Christ to be precious and if we truly are thankful for the precious faith He has provided, then we will separate from worldly corruption (v. 14). We have been bought with a price (1 Cor. 6:19-20)! We should live in accordance with that fact.

Now a word of warning: Anyone who claims that the word *death*, as in verse 19, can be substituted with the word *blood*, thereby supposedly "clarifying" the meaning of a particular Scripture, is terribly mistaken. It is "the blood that maketh an atonement for the soul"(Lev. 17:11). The Lord unequivocally declares, "Without shedding of blood is no remission" (Heb. 9:22). Christ's shed blood is necessary in order to cleanse us from sin! Those who change the word *blood* to *death* in the Scriptures are tampering with an incredibly vital truth. Jesus Christ's shed blood is precious indeed! MHR

REMEMBER, GOD DOESN'T OWE A THING!

"I do not make void the grace of God: for if righteousness is through the law, then Christ died for naught." (Gal. 2:21)

The road from Golgatha to Sinai is not always long, and many Christians have walked it and thought that they did right. It appears so right and wise to do that, because our nature so much prefers to help itself rather than to live on grace. In all times it has become evident that the great danger that threatens the people of God is this: to glide away from grace and into the works of the law. To carry an empty container and just have something given to you from day to day, from year to year, from generation to generation – that might easily be mistaken for sinning on grace. In such times there is among Christians fertile soil for bondage under the law, and for the teaching of sinless ness.

Neither has Satan any objection to telling us how a Christian should live and what he should be, if thereby he can separate us from grace. For there is no way that more certainly leads to eternal death than the Pharisaic way of works. Wherefore Jesus also has said that we must above all things beware of the leaven of the Pharisees.

To be saved by grace alone, and then in addition to that to be permitted to live and die, saved by grace alone: that is the road leading home to heaven again that God has built for sinners. On that road we can be completely saved in sorrow and in joy, in light and in darkness, when our soul feels lifted toward God, and when our heart condemns us.

"And he hath said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for My power is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my weaknesses, that the power of Christ may rest upon me: (II Cor. 12:9).

Is Hell Really Eternal Torment?

In recent years, the question of the reality of hell and its eternal torment in fire has been brought into question and denial by a growing number of evangelicals today. Popular Christian Apologist Lee Strobel, in question and answer format, says this:

"Q: How could a loving God torture people forever? A: For one thing, hell isn't a torture chamber. Hell, is, first of all, about relationships—broken relationships. ...In the Bible, hell is separation or banishment from the most beautiful being in the world—God. ...It's not torture. The punishment of hell is separation from God and the shame, anguish, and regret that go along with it. The pain may be both mental and physical, but it will be the pain and sorrow of final, unending banishment from God and the good life for which we were created.

Q: Will people burn in flames in hell? A: I believe that the imagery of flames the Bible uses to describe hell is a figure of speech. Trying to take the flames of hell literally results in nonsense.

Q: Doesn't the phrase "gnashing of teeth" used to describe hell mean that people are in pain and torture?

A: "Gnashing of teeth" is an expression of rage at realizing you've just made a huge mistake. When you hear about people grinding their teeth or gritting their teeth today, it means they're angry or frustrated, not that they are being tortured." (The Case for Faith, (Student Edition) pp. 63-65)

Probe Ministries, which is on Christian radio and the Internet says this: "Torment comes from the mental and physical anguish of knowing we used our freedom for evil and chose wrongly. The anguish results from the sorrow and shame of the judgment of being forever away from God and all that is meaningful and joyful. ...The flames of hell are generated by the individual who has rejected God. It is not a place where people are forced against their will to undergo agonizing pain. ...such is the anguish of hell. The pain comes from the regret of all that was lost. A person experiences separation from God, the ultimate good. ...God does not send anybody to hell; people choose to go there." (<u>Hell: The Horrible Choice</u> by Patrick Zukeran, probe.org)

One ministry summed it up like this: "Do you honestly believe that Jesus would apply that kind of sadistic torture upon your lost children, parents, spouses, friends and neighbors? Jesus is not cruel and unjust." (HE HAD Faith Ministries, Rogers, MN.)

Thus, these people and many with them believe that hell is not eternal torment in flames. Ultimately they believe that the very character of God does not allow this. Since God loves everybody, He would not punish people in torment forever. It is beyond His character!

Let's let the Scripture speak for itself regardless of what personal reason would want to tell us

In Matthew 25, the final judgment is laid before us. Jesus sits upon His throne judging all mankind (vv.31-32). All nations are brought before Him and He separates the believers from the unbelievers (v. 32). What a separation that will be! To the unbelievers, Jesus declares this: "Depart from Me, accursed ones, into the eternal fire which has been prepared for the devil and his angels." (v. 41). From this we learn 1) God does send people to hell. Jesus is commanding the unbelieving people into hell. It is based upon whether these people came to personal repentance of sin and faith in Jesus in their lives. These people did not, so Jesus orders them to their destiny. Jesus emphasizes this yet even more when He says, "But I will warn you whom to fear; fear the One who after He has killed has authority to cast into hell; yes, I tell you, fear Him!" (Lk. 12:5) Jesus describes God as One who both KILLS people and CASTS them into Hell!

We also learn that 2) hell is a place of torment in fire. This place where Jesus is commanding these people to go is called "eternal fire." (Matt. 25:41) We need only look to other Scriptures to see if this fire is figurative or literal. In Luke 16, a certain rich man went to hell. In hell he yearned for just a drop of cold water to cool of his tongue, "for I am in agony in this flame." (Lk. 16:24) It was not just the pain of a broken relationship, but agony and torment of being on fire. We see this also in Revelation 14 where eternity is described this way: "He will also drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is mixed in full strength in the cup of His anger; and he will be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb. And the smoke of their torment goes up forever and ever; and they have no rest day and night ... "(Rev. 14:10-11) The fire and torment of hell is all too real.

We also learn that **3) This torment is eternal.** After Jesus has separated the believing from the unbelieving and cast the unbelieving into hell, then the Scripture records this: *"And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."* (Matt. 25:46) The torment, burning and agony of hell never end. It is described as eternal torment. To say that it is not eternal is to say that heaven is not eternal either, because they are described with the exact same words in the exact same verse. People are not burned up or annihilated as some teach, but rather, they are tormented forever. We can look at the Scriptures already referenced above, as the rich man in hell from Luke 16 did not

burn up and the unbelieving from Revelation 14 are described as "having no rest day or night" and "the smoke of their torment ascends up forever and ever." (Rev. 14:11)

If my mind cannot fathom such a thing and my perception of God does not allow for Him to do such a thing, then I must submit my limited understanding to the straightforward claims of the Word of God. I may not understand it and I may not like it, but that does not change the reality of it. Rather, I need to submit to the Scriptures' authority and heed their warning.

Dear reader, will you be duped by the new preachers who deny God's wrath? The clear teaching of the Bible is that mankind has sinned and is under God's wrath. This wrath will ultimately be poured out upon all outside of Christ. It will be burning in fire and torment, weeping and gnashing of teeth, gnawing your tongue for pain. It will be a lake of fire where people burn and suffer God's wrath for eternity. It will be separation from God and all the goodness that He is into the the presence of the devil and his angels (demons). It will last for eternity and there will be no relief from its agony, there will be no hope for the future and there will be no second chance for you to be saved from this horrible state. You have but one chance in this life time, and then the door will be shut. To deny this is to call Jesus a liar! This is not popular today and is rejected by many, but it is still the truth of the Bible.

God has provided a way for you to escape this horrible place called hell. He has given Jesus on the cross to die for all your sins. Jesus bore the fierce wrath and fury of God that you deserved. He died for every sin of every person of all time. In Christ you can be forgiven all your sins, be declared righteous in God's sight, made God's child, and enter in the glory of heaven. 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After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst (John 19:28).

The *soul* of Jesus was athirst. He yearned for love and understanding. He thirsted for human souls. His two outstretched arms were as an invitation to the whole world to come to Him.

This, however, is not what Jesus has in mind when He exclaims: "I thirst!" He refers to *physical* thirst. It is now about 3:00 o'clock. Jesus was crucified at 9:00 o'clock. For six long hours the had been suspended on the cross. The greatest physical suffering connected with crucifixion was *thirst*. As time went on, the thirst became like a fire burning in every part of the victim's body. It was the result of loss of blood. Crucifixion brought on a high fever. For six hours Jesus had been bleeding, and so He cries in pain: "I thirst!"

During the first three hours on the cross Jesus was so occupied with the welfare of those who stood about the *cross* His executioners, the robbers, His mother, and John – that He forgot His own pain. During the next three hours, when darkness covered the earth, His anguish of soul was so great that His physical suffering faded into the background. However, when the light again appears, the thirst makes itself felt like a consuming fire; and then He cries: "thirst!"

Thanks be to Thee, my Savior, for what Thou has suffered. It was all for *me*.

The Academy Award-winning director behind "Titanic" is attempting to challenge fundamental tenets of Christianity by suggesting that Jesus may have been a father whose body was buried far from the Jerusalem tomb where believers say he rose from the dead.

In a documentary set to air Sunday [March 4], filmmaker James Cameron and his team contend that they've produced new evidence that Jesus married Mary Magdalene and fathered a son named Judah. Biblical experts and archaeologists who are familiar with the central evidence instantly discounted the claim, which the Discovery Channel has touted as possibly "the greatest archaeological find in history," as an ill-informed, recycled publicity grab.

The chances that the findings in "The Lost Tomb of Jesus" are real "are more than remote," said Israel Museum curator David Mevorah. "They are closer to fantasy."

If proved true, the findings would undercut Christian beliefs that Jesus never had children and that he rose from the dead. The documentary also contradicts long-held beliefs by Roman Catholic and Orthodox Christians that Jesus had lain in a tomb around which Christians built the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in the Old City of Jerusalem.

"It doesn't get bigger than this," Cameron said Monday. "We've done our homework ...now it's time for the debate to begin." The Discovery Channel documentary and an accompanying book center on a 2,000-year-old limestone tomb that was discovered more than 25 years ago in Jerusalem between the Old City and Bethlehem.

When the tomb was uncovered in 1980, specialists were called in. The man who led the effort was Amos Kloner, an archaeologist from Bar Ilan University, who documented the findings. The tomb contained 10 limestone burial boxes and scattered bones. Among the inscriptions on the caskets: Jesus, son of Joseph; Mary; Judah, son of Jesus.

Five of the burial boxes, known as ossuaries, had names that could be linked to the Bible, including versions of Joseph and Matthew. Then and now, Kloner took no note of the names, saying they were common at the time.

But Discovery hired a statistician who concluded that the chances that this was the tomb of Jesus and his family were 600 to 1.

Mevorah called that "a good trick." While the collection of names might seem compelling, he said the names were

popular at the time and that another ossuary with the inscription "Jesus, son of Joseph" is on display in Florida as part of a traveling exhibition of Christian artifacts.

The documentary used DNA testing on samples from the ossuary for Jesus and for Mary to show that the two sets of bones weren't related, evidence the TV researchers said indicated that the two probably were married

The documentary suggests that the ossuary labeled Judah, son of Jesus, may have carried the bones of their son, though the researchers make no mention of doing DNA testing on that box.

After watching a review copy of the documentary, Kloner said it was little more than a publicity stunt. The documentary and book aren't the first to focus on the tomb. A BBC crew in 1996 concluded the tomb was that of Jesus and his family. Scientists and religious leaders also challenged that report.

Leading the latest team was Simcha Jacobovici, who was at the center of a similar stir four years ago when he produced another piece for the cable company. That documentary focused on an ossuary that was thought to be the oldest archaeological find to bolster the Bible. It bore the inscription: James son of Joseph, brother of Jesus. Within months, however, Israel's Antiquities Authority deemed the ossuary a fake.

(N)one of the pro-homosexual comments was found on the first page, the location most parents who actually do inspect a site would be most likely to check. ...They were found embedded in the site as a reader follows various links. WorldNetDaily.com

Forty Thousand Abortions in Israel

New reports indicate that there are about 40,000 abortions that take place every year in Israel. According to official records, the government approves and pays for about half of the abortions, which are carried out in public hospitals

Steven Mosher, the president of the Population Research Institute, says abortions have caused population problems for Israel.

"With birthrates well below replacement, Israel's economy has survived over the past decade and a half largely because of the steady influx of Jews from Russia and the other former Soviet republics," Mosher said.

Christians in the world's most populous Muslim nation didn't let the threat of violence keep them from church, Agape Press reports. Israeli High Court Orders "Gay Marriage" Recognition

In a landmark 6 - 1 decision, Israel's Supreme Court November 21 ordered the government to begin recognizing "gay marriages: from other countries, such as Canada. Although the decision doesn't give homosexual couples the ability to "marry" within Israel's borders, it nonetheless puts Israel at odds with countries such as Great Britain and the United States, neither of which recognizes foreign "gay marriages."

The ruling by the High Court of Justice – the name for Israel's highest court – gives homosexual couples the same legal benefits as traditional couples, including tax breaks and the ability to adopt, the *Jerusalem Post* reported. The decision forces the government to register the "marriages" like it does any other marriage.

"We don't have a Jewish state here. We have Sodom and Gomorrah here," lawmaker Moshe Gafni told Israel's Army Radio, according to the Associated Press. "I assume that every sane person in the state of Israel, possibly the entire Jewish world, is shocked, because the significance is the destruction of the family unit in the state of Israel."

Legal Group Tells IRS to Back Off Efforts Intimidating Churches

Agape Press reports that a religious liberties group says it has had enough of the Internal Revenue Service's bullying pastors and wants those pastors and churches to know that the U.S. Constitution trumps IRS regulations about what can and can't be said from the pulpit. The Washington, D.C. based Becket Fund for Religious Liberty says the First Amendment takes precedence over regulations established by the IRS concerning political speech from the pulpit of a house of worship. Anthony Picarello, vice president and general counsel for the Becket Fund, says the first mistake most churches make when they are confronted with an IRS investigation is keeping quiet about it. He recommends they go public. "Make sure that the world knows about what's going on," he suggests. "I think that' one of the best approaches that a church can take when it's confronted with this sort of investigation."

There is a <u>new</u> way of spelling HEAVEN – **HOME.** By the GRACE OF GOD, will **you be there? ARE YOU SURE?** <u>*Heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people!*</u>

Revive Us Again

In his book <u>A New Springtime</u>, Robert Lee, president of the AFLC, said that there were six principles that summarize the Spirit of awakening sparked by Hans Neilsen Hauge. They are as follows:

1. The demand for true conversion, with emphasis on the working of God's Law in bringing the sinner to repentance. Over the last 150 years the Holy Spirit has slowly been stripped of the only tool at its disposal to bring the knowledge of sin. Paul said in Romans 3:20: "By the Law comes the knowledge of sin." He says in Romans 3:19; "Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God." And in Romans 5:20: "Moreover the law entered that the offense might abound."

If I'm out driving around and and pretty soon I'm cruising with the flow of traffic. I look down at my speedometer and I see it's at 70 mph. Well the speed limit is 55 mph, but everyone else is doing it, and it does feel good. Besides, it's only 15 miles over and everyone would stare at me and make obscene gestures at me if I was doing the speed limit when everyone else wasn't.

Then all of a sudden I see a cop car with its lights flashing and its siren blasting entering the freeway. I look at my speedometer and see that it's at 70 mph and I think, "Oh no, 15 miles over." I know that for every mile per hour over it adds up to more money. It no longer matters that everyone is doing it. I know if I'm standing in front of a judge, and I give him that excuse he will throw the book at me, so I hit my brakes and slow down to 55 and hope that he's after someone else, instead of me. The Law entered and the offense abounded. I saw my actions for what they were, lawlessness.

That's the way the world is, everyone is on the freeway of life, and everybody is speeding along, doing their own thing. They think, no big deal, everyone is doing it. They think the law has forgotten to patrol that section of the road.

More than ever, today we need a revival of the preaching of the law so that people will see their sin and cry out, "What must I do to be saved?" Only then will they be prepared to receive the good news of the Gospel.

2. Living faith, a vital and personal commitment to Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord, manifested in holy living. Hans Hauge faced the same dilemma that John Wesley faced in England. With the state church everyone was baptized and everyone's names were written on the churches rolls, so everyone presumed they were also written in the "Lamb's Book of Life". But John Wesley and Hans Hauge preached that no one could claim they were a Christian unless they were born of God and had the witness of the spirit within them.

James says faith without works is dead. If you call yourself a Christian and your life is the same as your unbelieving neighbor, you had better examine yourself to see if you are in the faith. If your faith doesn't affect the way you live and think, James calls it dead. You could be in danger of Christ saying to you on that day, "Depart from me I never knew you." Living faith is a life changing faith, it's being changed from one degree of glory to another.

3. An ethical emphasis on sanctification.

From Nelson's Bible Dictionary we read: SANCTIFICATION: "The process of God's grace by which the believer is separated from sin and becomes dedicated to God's righteousness. Accomplished by the Word of God and the Holy Spirit, sanctification results in holiness, or purification from the guilt and power of sin."

As Christians we are set aside, we are separated from the world, we are God's own people. Eph 5:7-8: "Therefore do not be partakers with them. Walk in Light, for you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light."

4. An emphasis on personal Salvation.

Norway in Hauge's day had a state church. You were born into it. You were baptized and everyone was a Christian. Lutheranism in many churches has reverted back to that. It's sacramentalism. You're baptized, when your older you're Confirmed, then you take Communion and attend church; as long as you perform the rituals, then you're OK. That's religion, but that is not Christianity, which is a personal salvation. God doesn't have any grandchildren. He only has children. And how do you become a child? You have to be born! How do you become a child of God? You have to be born of God. John 1:12-13 "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God." That comes when you see your sins for what they are, rebellion against God, and you see "Christ crucified" as the only remedy for your sins.

5. Vigilance, or the continual need for Christians to watch and pray lest they fall and to examine themselves spiritually on a regular basis.

This is so important. "Prone to wander Lord I feel it. Prone to leave the God I love," the hymn writer says. We're like Adam and Eve, like Samson, David, Judas, and like Peter, it's easy to loose our first love, it's easy to become lukewarm. **Heb 3:13: "But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is still called "Today," lest any one of you be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin."** In Hebrews 2:1 we read **"Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, lest we drift away."** What have we heard, what have we read, what have we meditated on? We need to stay in His word; we need to hear the preaching of the Word, lest we drift away.

We need to: (2 Cor 13:5) "Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you? - unless indeed you fail the test." It's easy to be deceived, to think we are saved and to not be. Scripture tells us that this is a big category; Jesus said many will come on that day, and Jesus will tell them, "Go, I never knew you". We often time ask people "Do you know the Lord?" Maybe the correct way to ask this question is: "Does the Lord know you?" Paul says examine yourself. This is a pass, fail test as Paul says, If Christ is in you, you pass, if not you fail. How sad that day will be for so many people when they find out just being religious wasn't enough.

<u>6. Evangelism, a burning compulsion to spread the</u> <u>Good News by means of simple and direct personal out-</u> <u>reach.</u>

Jesus Christ came to seek and to save that which is lost. If we are His, that will be our desire too.

George Whitefield, the famous English Evangelist, said, "O Lord give me souls, or take my soul."

Henry Martyn, missionary, kneeling on India's coral strands, cried out, "Here let me burn out for God."

Charles Spurgeon said, "If sinners be damned, at least let them leap to Hell over our bodies. If they will perish let them perish with our arms about their knees. Let no one go there unwarned and unprayed for."

John Hunt, a missionary to the Fiji Islands, a prayer upon his dying bed said, "Lord, save Fiji, save Fiji, save these people, O Lord, have mercy on Fiji, save Fiji." (Today that prayer is being answered, there is a revival going on in Fiji).

These were the principles of the Haugean revival that stirred Norway and many of our great, great grandparents in Norway years ago. They would stir us too if we took them to heart and practiced them in our daily lives and preached them from our pulpits.

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Is Seeing Believing?

"Unless I shall see in His hands the imprint of the nails, and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe." (John 20:25)

These words above came from the lips of one of Jesus' very disciples – Thomas. Consequently, he has come to be known as "doubting Thomas." This demand for proof has also been the cry of many people down through the ages – Unless I can see with my own eyes and have absolute proof of Jesus – I will not believe. Today's rational, scientific mind is more prone to this than was the thinking of years past. We must be able to mathematically and scientifically examine and prove this matter of Jesus before we will believe such a thing.

Is that really true, though? Would really seeing the real Jesus really die on the cross for the sins of all mankind really convince people? Well, simply look to those who did actually stand and watch the event unfold. There were the two thieves on each side of Jesus. "And when they came to the place of The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and the other on the left." (Lk. 23:33) One of them turned in a death-bed conversion to Jesus and the other blasphemed Him to his death. Hanging right beside Jesus did not convince one man as to His reality.

Then there was the multitude of people. "And the people stood by, looking on." (Lk. 23:35) It was Passover when Jesus was crucified, so most of the people in Israel were coming and going in and out of Jerusalem. Since Jesus was crucified on the outside of the city, he would have been seen my many people. What effect did it have on them? "And all the multitudes who came together for this spectacle, when they had observed what had happened, began to return, beating their breasts." (Lk. 23:48) They were saddened and grieved by what they saw, yet, there is no mention in the Scriptures of anyone seeing this happen and turning to Christ for salvation.

Then there were the rulers. "And even the rulers were sneering at Him, saying, 'He saved others; let Him save Himself if this is the Christ of god, His Chosen one'." (Lk. 23:35) Seeing Jesus die had no effect whatsoever on them. They hated Him in His life and ministry, and seeing Him on the cross was a glad sight for them. They, who should have known the Scriptures and recognized the fulfillment of them in this very moment, stood by in sheer mocking and torment. They would go on after His death to have Pilate secure a guard around the tomb. Seeing Jesus die brought none of them to salvation.

Then there were the soldiers. "And the soldiers also mocked Him, coming up to Him, offering Him sour wine, and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save Yourself'!" (Lk. 23:36-37) These men had followed Jesus along from Pilate's hall and had been the ones to inflict flogging upon Him. They had mocked Him with a robe, crowned Him with thorns and beat Him with their fists. Did seeing Jesus die have any effect on them? "Now when the centurion saw what had happened, he began praising God, saying, 'Certainly this man was innocent'." (Lk. 23:47) In Matthew, we are told further of this man, "Now the centurion, and those who were with him keeping guard over Jesus, when they saw the earthquake and the things that were happening, became very frightened and said, 'Truly this was the Son of God'!" (Matt. 27:54) Were these people converted through this? It is hard to say whether this statement about Jesus' deity was one of panic at the moment or was a true cry of faith.

So of all the people who did actually see Jesus die, one came to faith, and perhaps some of the guards, but the vast majority did not. Seeing did not convince them that Jesus was dying for the sins of the world. This should not surprise us, because faith is belief without proof. *"Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, and the evidence of things not seen."* (Heb. 11:1) Faith takes the work of the Holy Spirit through the Word of God in the heart of man. It is NOT based upon seeing.

In fact, if people will not believe the testimony of the Scriptures, they will not believe, regardless of what they might see. In Luke 16, the rich man was in hell and cried out for Abraham to send Lazarus to the rich man's house to warn his five brothers that they not also come to the place of torment. Abraham's reply was, *"They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them."* (Lk. 16:29) But the rich man cried all the more, *"No Father Abraham, but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent!"* (v. 30) The rich man thought that seeing was believing, especially to see something as miraculous as someone coming back from the dead. But Abraham responded back, *"If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone rises from the dead."* (v. 31)

If people will not believe the testimony of the Scriptures, they will not believe, regardless of what they might see or experience. This is how powerful the Spirit of God is as He works through the Word of God. Preachers in years past went out with just the Word and Spirit of God because they understood this precious truth. How about today?

BUT what goes into the mind (eyes) MUST come out sooner or later! *"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God"* (Romans 12:2).

INTERESTING, FRANK, *REALISTIC!* A word to the "wise" should be sufficient! What are our priorities? It is the LOVE/GRACE of GOD that should 'constrain' (empower) US! God loveth a cheerful GIVER! It's not so much how much you give, but with what attitude you give that REALLY counts for ETERNITY! Let the LORD lead! JESUS is Watching!
