The Mixture Mess!

(The Devil Loves It; God Hates It!)

he Devil loves mixture; confounding the things of God and the things of the world is his delight. With this, he confuses and deludes many, including believers

God hates mixture! Though many men, even some professing Christians, seem to think that God will tolerate just about anything as long as there seems to be some good in it, yet nothing could be further from the truth.

Both the Old and New Testaments are full of illustrations and warnings about this very thing. In Ezekiel 22:26 we read, "They have put no difference between the holy and profane, neither have they shewed difference between the unclean and the clean." For this, God promised judgment.

How sad to see this spirit of mingling the things of God with the things of the world among God's people in our day. I believe that spiritual discernment is at an all-time low and compromise is at an all-time high!

An incident in the life of Spurgeon shows much wisdom. P. T. Barnum of circus fame invited the great preacher to come to the United States. Barnum would set up a special tent in his traveling circus in which Spurgeon would speak and do so without restrictions.

Any help he needed would be provided, and all expenses would be paid by Barnum. Spurgeon would preach as long as he liked and would be paid \$1,000 per message (quite a sum in those days). (Ed. Today too!)

No doubt some Christians of that day and many more in our day would say, "What a splendid opportunity this would be to preach the Gospel, have souls saved, and at the same time reap a great sum for the Lord's work." This sort of thing would no doubt be accepted by many evangelicals and, yes, fundamentalists. But Spurgeon did not see it that way, and he did not come to America under the auspices of the worldly Mr. Barnum.

Spurgeon sent this very simple reply to Barnum's invitation: "Dear Mr. Barnum, you will find your answer in Acts 13:10. Very sincerely yours, Charles Haddon Spurgeon."

If Mr. Barnum turned to that passage of Scripture, which I am sure he did, this is what he read: "O full of all subtilty and all mischief, thou child of the devil, thou enemy of all righteousness, wilt thou not cease to pervert the right ways of the Lord?"

I don't think many fundamental ...preachers would respond quite like that today! Many professed Bible believers, beginning with preachers (I am speaking of many fundamental ...), act as though II Corinthians 6:14-17 and similar passages had been rescinded.

Those verses begin by saying, "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness?" We are not to have any joint endeavor with the unrighteous (the unsaved, the ungodly) or even with disobedient brethren.

We should realize our capabilities and not be content with mediocrity; but few realize their possibilities, and fewer seem to care.

Great men and women are not made overnight, but through the year they have been making the most of their opportunities and possibilities. They have burned the midnight oil and have been toiling upward in the night. Then at last the world discovers them and their talents and gives them the well-earned applause and credit that are due them.

Nature teaches us it takes time for things to come to ma-

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turity. Seed that is sown in the earth takes time to germinate and bring forth fruit. So it is in the lives of men.

It took John Milton forty years to produce <u>Paradise</u> <u>Lost.</u> William Bryant rewrote his "Thanatopsis" more than a hundred times; and even then he was not satisfied with it, for he felt that he could yet do better.

It took John Bunyan twelve years behind the locked doors of Bedford jail to write <u>Pilgrim's Progress</u>, but who can estimate the influence of this book upon the world?

Let us have a worthy goal in life; and whatever we do, let us do it all to the glory and honor of God and the uplifting of humanity. Let us strive with all our might, for we pass this way but once.

The rest of those verses basically say the same thing in different words. In Ephesians 5:11 it says, 'Have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them." I read many years ago this good advice: "Never do evil that good may come." You have probably heard of Jesuit Casuistry, which says the end justifies the means. In other words, if it will help the (Roman Catholic) Church, it is all right to do it! But that is not what God says! He says, "Touch not the unclean thing" (II Cor. 6:17). The Bible has abundant evidence that God hates mixture! It is confusion!

I believe in it because it reveals a religion adapted to all classes and races, and it is intellectual suicide, knowing it, not to believe it.

Jesus and the Flood

"For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the ark. And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be."

Matthew 24:38-39

The Lord Jesus Christ not only believed in the special, recent creation of all things by God (note Mark 10:6-8), but also in the worldwide Flood of Noah's day, including the special preservation of life on the Ark. The Flood in which He believed was obviously not a "local flood," for He compared it to the world-wide future impact of His Second Coming.

Neither was it a "tranquil flood," nor a "selective flood," for Jesus said, "The flood came, and destroyed them all" (Luke 17:27). It is clear that He was referring to – and that He believed – the Genesis record of the great Flood! There it says that the whole earth was "filled with violence" (Genesis 6:13), having first been filled with people, and that the resulting world-cleansing deluge was so cataclysmic that "every living substance was destroyed which was upon the face of the ground, both man, and cattle, and the creeping things, and the fowl of the heaven; and they were destroyed from the earth" (Genesis 7:23). Indeed, "the flood came, and took (literally 'lifted') them all away."

This is what Jesus said, and what He believed, and therefore, those who are truly His disciples must also believe this. The destructive effects of the Flood can still be seen today not only in the biblical record, but also in the abundant evidences of cataclysmic destruction in the rocks and fossil graveyards all over the world. To refuse this evidence, as do so many modern intellectuals, can only be because they "willingly are ignorant," as Peter said in referring to this testimony (2 Peter 3:5).

LOVE

"Let us consider one another to provoke unto love and good works" Hebrews 10:24.

By this statement in Ch. 10 the author (God inspired, in-breathed, so definitely God's Will) indicated his intention to show that our fellowship with God in Christ Jesus would not only be revealed in a life of faith (Ch. 11); and steadfastness of hope (Ch. 12); but also in a life of love. This he now sets forth in many practical aspects in Ch. 13).

The Better Life of Love.

- 1. Love of the brethren, vv. 1-6,
- 2. Love of teachers, vv. 7-17,
- 3. Closing words, vv. 18-25.

1. Love of the brethren. Ch. 13:1-6.

13. 1. Let love of the brethren continue. 2. Forget not to show love unto strangers; for thereby some have entertained angels unawares. 3. Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; them that are ill-treated, as being yourselves also in the body. 4. Let marriage be had in honor among all, and let the bed be undefiled: for fornicators and adulterers God will judge. 5. Be ye free from the love of money; content with such things as ye have: for himself hath said, "I will in no wise fail thee, neither will I in any wise forsake thee." 6. So that with good courage we say, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not fear: What shall man do unto me?'

"Let love of the brethren continue."

The language suggests that Christ Jesus is the source of that love and we are to permit it to continue in its onward course of blessing through us. This love of the brethren reminds us of the new commandment that our Lord Jesus Christ gave that those who are saved in Christ shall love one another. Before Christ died and gave the grace for this new commandment men knew about love of God and also love of man, the latter to be expressed deeds of kindness and mercy, but that men should love one another because they have become members in the body of Christ, was something that had not been known on earth before. We know, too, that the early Christians were noted amongst the heathen for the love that they showed one another.

There can be no doubt that this is an admonition which Christians need to heed in our own day. There is a great stream of love issuing from Jesus Christ, but too often it is not permitted to flow out through the members of His body in love one for another. Love would solve all the problems of our relationship with each other as

fellow Christians. When the heart is filled with love of Christ towards fellow-believers, then every vice and evil desire is crowded out. In this connection it would be profitable to again read 1 Cor. 13.

a. Strangers.

In the early days of Christianity, because of the many persecutions, many Christians became wanderers over the face of the earth and were therefore in need of hospitality, which was also enjoined by the apostles. It is interesting to note how the author (GOD, who most certainly states for you to use the discernment He has given you and test the spirits) suggests that the entertainment of strangers might bring about an intriguing and blessed experience, "For thereby some have entertained angels unawares."

The reference here to Abraham is, of course, evident. However, the author of Hebrews believes that there are angels now too, and as he has already said, "they are sent forth to do service for the sake of them that shall inherit salvation" Hebrews 1:14. Even though God might not cause an angel to appear in human form as a stranger to be entertained, there can be no doubt but that the angels ministered to many Christians who were driven hither and thither in the persecutions, and receiving one of these pilgrims would also be receiving the angel that had been sent of God to minister to him. And there still are children of God in the world who are strangers and who are certainly in need of the kindly hospitality of Christians who are better situated.

b. Prisoners.

Many Christians were in prison or in bonds because of their faith in Christ and, as Christians, the readers should feel so really a part of the same body that they would "remember them...as bound with them; them that are ill-treated, as being yourselves in the body." Those of us who are Christians and live under the great blessing of a land in which we are not persecuted for our faith, are surely tempted to forget the brethren who suffer as in Russia and China today. It would indeed be well to remember that we are also in the body and that we may be called upon to experience such sufferings, too, for most assuredly these are days that are evil.

Tithes and Offerings

(Editor: Seemingly, EVEN the title of this article will turn some folk off, even among professing Christians! Why? Because they don't believe GOD is a good bookkeeper nor financial advisor!

Furthermore they say indirectly to the Third Person of our Triune God, the Holy Spirit – your indwelling of the Blood purchased temple, "You can have access to every room of the temple except the financial room – which I will take care of myself!")

"Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me who herewith, saith the LORD of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it." Malachi 3:10

Today there is much talk of financial security. The biblical formula in today's verse, given to Israel but applied to all, begins with a scathing indictment. "Will a man rob God?" Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings" (v. 8). What a terrible thing, to rob God. The result of their thievery, in God's eyes: "Ye are cursed with a curse" (v. 9) such that their financial state was much worse than it would have been had they been obedient. This teaching and promise has not been rescinded (Luke 6:38; 1 Corinthians 16:2; etc).

God's charge to us as given in [this] verse is in three steps. First, we are told to obey; i.e., "bring ye." This cannot be considered an option. Secondly, God pro-

poses a test. "<u>Prove me.</u>" He says, give and see if He lives up to His promises. Thirdly, trust His promise to meet our needs.


Note that His promise is also threefold. It abundantly covers present needs, for He promises to "pour you out a blessing" immeasurable in quality or quantity. Likewise, it covers the threat of future loss. "And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field" (v. 11). Most precious is His promise to reward obedience and trust with a special relationship. "All nations shall call you blessed: for ye shall be a delightsome land" (v. 12).

Thus, we see that with less than 100 percent of our income at our disposal, we will have greater financial security than if we had kept it all to ourselves, thereby robbing God. — John D. Morris, Ph.D.



Let us also consider the phrase, <u>"for good works."</u>

This new creation of God in Christ is to be transferred to us; we receive it by faith, and it is to be built up in us. The foundation was laid in us when we were born of God. As time goes on, and God's power is made perfect in weakness, God works in us so that we live not after the flesh but after the Spirit. All that a Christian does as the love of Christ constrains him is the work of Christ/Holy Spirit in us; indeed, it is Christ in us.

A Christian/bond-servant becomes a servant of Christ, a channel through which God's power flows, a candlestick which carries God's light of salvation, and an agent for the works before prepared that we should walk in them. Canadian Government Says Priest Has to Support Abortion to Qualify for Federal Program

An Ottawa Catholic priest had hoped to employ three students this summer to work in the churchyard and office.

But (he) will not be able to this year unless he complies with government's demand that he support abortion for any reason up to birth.

Many churches and other groups provide students with summer jobs through the Canadian Summer jobs program. However, the new 2018 grant application requires groups to say that they respect "re-productive rights," including abortion on demand, as one of their core values. Groups cannot submit the on online application unless they do, National Report reports.

A Personal Testimony – Written Almost Sixty Years Ago!

To (now-known) Pastor Willmore Gundersen Dear Willmore, Oct. 30, 1959

I have thought of sending you a letter so I will do it now. Hope you can understand my hand writing. To write about the summer, winter, weather, people or cattle could be interesting. But there are things I have more interest in than that. I want to write and ask about where you are spiritually!

You are young and I am old, but isn't it interesting how things in common work together for us? Please listen to what I have to say and don't reject what I am saying. I believe it can be of good help for you all through life. Life can be divided into two segments. You can live according to the flesh, your old nature. Or, you can live according to the Spirit, the new nature; that we receive when we accept Jesus.

My father and mother were Christians. From them I was taught and learned about Jesus as a child. I was taught as a child to pray. I went to Sunday school and I went to grade school. In school we had Christianity as one of our subjects. Then I had Confirmation and was taught many things. And I had to learn a lot about Christianity.

I did not remain in childlike faith or in what I was taught. After Confirmation I wanted to live the way I felt like living. My mother's and father's warnings went by the way side. I did not heed them. I wanted to be free and live according to my own desires. I did this until I was Twenty and a half years of age. Then a great conversion took place in my life. I was called by God during those years, but I did not want to heed His call. I just wanted to live my own life and have fun. I was carefree and careless. I followed the way of the world. Contentment and peace never lasted very long.

I went out to sea and sailed on ships at the age of 15. It wasn't long before I got malaria fever and (berry berry?). I was sent back to Europe. I was very sick. One of the men on board the ship said to me, "You'll never get home to see your mom again. We are going to have to fix up the goat quarters, and make it into a church before we throw your dead body overboard." However, I believed that the God of my mother had power over me though I was so sick and weak. This happened in 1896. The following year, 1897, was a good year at sea. I was healthy. We had good weather and no storms. I felt great with no sickness. The year of 1898 our ship sprang a leak and sank in the North Sea. I lost everything and drifted in the water. We were rescued by an

English fishing boat. During this experience the Lord was calling me. I prayed to the Lord and promised I would be a good young man, but I didn't keep my words of promise. I did my own thing and lived it up, and then I got sick once again. They had to get me to a hospital where I was for three months. I was very near death Once again I prayed to the Lord. I told Him I would change. Again, I did not keep my promise.

In 1899 I sailed, for a short time, on a boat where the captain prayed to Satan. The boat was in sad shape. Things were not good on board. "I'm going to hell on our next voyage," the captain said. That's the way it went with them also. The boat, men, even the mice onboard, were destroyed and went down into the sea.

Then in 1920, which was the last boat I worked on, was called "Spira." This boat sailed from Sisor, Norway between Christmas and New Year. I was on board that boat four and a half months. I left the boat when we landed the 17th of May in Lillesand, Norway. While on board that boat, the Lord really called me in a powerful way. In the middle of the night we were sailing in the North Sea. There was a voice that called out my name "Joakim!" I said "hello", but nobody answered back. I laid down once again and this voice called out once again "Joakim!" I did not hear my name mentioned after that. That same night I had a dream. There was going to be a war between Jesus and the Devil. The place where this was going to take place was a big open field next to a mountain. The Devil with all his followers were ready to fight. I was on the Devil's side. I was not standing far from him. But then Jesus came, with just a few people following Him. We stood opposite from one another. Jesus called out to me and said, "Joakim, whose side do you want to be on and fight?" I turned around and looked and saw millions of people on our side. I didn't know what to answer Him. But then it was as if I could hear my mother whisper in my ear, "remember this is Jesus who is speaking to you." Hearing this, I called out with a loud voice, "I want to be with you!" As I was running over to Jesus I woke up. Right there and then I asked Jesus to save me. I also prayed that I could become sick (to get off the ship) and I did get sick. During that time of sickness I was saved. The Word of God opened my heart to the Lord as I read the Bible. I was like the lost son that had left his father, and now was returning home. I experienced the great, great love of my Heavenly Father.

A pastor told it to me this way: Just as the father loved his wayward son, who returned home, penny less and in miserable shape, that's the way God loves you. "Oh my, is that true?" I said, "Has the Lord really loved me like that? Then I want to love Him in return." From

that moment on, I have had assurance of salvation and that assurance has been with me until today.

Yes, He is with you every day until your life is over. That's what Jesus says! It's very rewarding to be true to Him, so that no one can takes our crown from us. Don't wander off to the right or left. Walk on the straight path. Jesus is the way! Remain in Him and He will remain in you. In that way you will be building your life on a sure foundation. Yes, on a sure foundation, because Jesus is that foundation. These are important things I want you to be aware of Willmore. I am telling you the truth; I'm not lying. This has been my life experience these last 58 years. Nobody is like God. Nobody is as good as God. If you want to see Him and hear Him, follow Him. Then the puzzle of this life will be revealed.

Jesus Christ has all the answers. He solves all of life's problems and puzzles. Take to heart that which you have heard. This is your grandfather's personal life experience. I have told of my conversion to Christ. I greet you with 2 Timothy 2:2-15. (Editor: Please now read 2 Timothy 2:2-15, which is part of his personal testimony written to Willmore: now known as Pastor Willmore Gundersen).

I lovingly greet you. Greet your parents, sister, Leif, and Johannes, Your grandfather, Joakim.

GRACE UPON GRACE

HAUGE'S IMPRISONMENT AND LAST DAY – 1804 – 1814

(Continued from the March issue of the Morning Glory)

Finally Dec. 4, 1813, the prosecuting attorney summed up his accusations: "1. Hauge had traveled about the country and held devotional meetings and had encouraged others to do the same. 2. He had tried to find a new sect and a new community within the state. 3. He had used sharp and accusing words against the clergy. 4. As a dangerous person he had used religion as a mask to cheat people; therefore he was not only a dangerous fanatic, but a defrauder of the people."

The prosecuting attorney demanded that Hauge should be given "slavery" for life. The court found him guilty on the first three points and sentenced him to "slavery" for two years plus the cost of the trial. Hauge appealed to the Supreme Court. Norway's great year, 1814, had now dawned and should have had some influence on the minds of the Judges. On Dec. 23, 1814, the Supreme Court ratified the sentence of the lower court, but made the sentence much milder. They ordered \$1,000 to be paid, and Hauge to be set free. His friends paid the fine at once and Hauge was a free man.

During Hauge's long imprisonment the following well known incidents might be referred to:

His old friend, Erik Saue, walked across the country from Voss to Oslo for an interview. It was denied. As he stood in deep sadness outside the prison, Hauge saw him through the little grated window. He held up the light and trimmed it. Erik understood the meaning. "trim your light and let it shine before men". God so strengthened his heart that he felt well repaid for his long trip. The story of this light trimming in the prison window has been used over and over in sermons and testimonies now for 130 (Ed. Plus) years and has become a sort of household word among God's people.

Hauge did the same thing for two of his spiritual children... who had walked some 40 miles to talk with him. They went home again weeping as if their hearts would break in the crowded rooming house where they stayed overnight on their sad homeward journey, they were allowed to sleep on the floor. "They read, sang and prayed and went to sleep in sorrow and fatigue."

By 1806, the enemies threw some rationalistic and atheistic literature into Hauge's cell. "I did not believe what I read, but the devil found opportunity to tempt me," Hauge said.

Hauge had been slowly dying from being cooped up in a little cold cell winter and summer. Finally the humane judge, J. L. Bull, from 1807 on allowed him to go to Toyen near Oslo and work a little in Bull's garden. This really saved his life, for he was by this time almost dead from the number of illnesses that afflicted him.

From 1808 and on, during the wars with Napoleon, the English fleet blockaded the coast of Norway so effectively that nothing could be shipped in. Bull signed a bond of \$300 for Hauge, so he could go out and make salt for the people. Then he was good enough to help when the country was in deep need. In 1809 he went around the coast for over a half year and started salt industries here and there. Although he had performed this great service for his country, he was returned to prison...

His home was becoming a blessed headquarter for God's people. The blessed Christian fellowship meetings that Hauge had missed so many years were now revived. Hauge experienced a wonderful renewal of his spiritual life. "I wept and prayed and my soul was renewed," he said.

After Hauge won his liberty completely at the close of 1814 his friends helped him to buy the Bredtvedt farm just out of Oslo, which became a blessed headquarters for God's people. He married Andrea Nyhus in 1815, but she died a year later after giving birth to a son. In 1817 he married Engeborg Olsdaughter, who outlived him...

He (Hauge) wrote a great deal including a little church history. Before his imprisonment he had written 19 books. After he was set free he published 14 (33 in all). Some of them ran through many editions. The almost incredible number of 250,000 copies of his writings were distributed. During his imprisonment all who possessed his books were required to bring them to the authorities, as they were looked upon as spreaders of poison. Those who refused were heavily fined.

Hauge set up his "Last Will and Testament" to his friends March 7, 1821... Hauge's wife, Ingeborg, tells about his illness and death as follows: "He was very sick for about two weeks before he died. The last Friday he lived (March 27, 1824) he felt very happy and said: 'We have so much to thank God for.' Sunday he was very sick. In the evening he was trying so hard to say something. I said, 'Oh, how I wish I could understand you!' But then he spoke out plainly so all could her: 'Follow Jesus!' ('Folg Jesus'). Then he exclaimed as his face beamed with joy 'O Thou everlasting, loving God!'... He will soon take you home now,' I said. To which he answered, 'Yes.' Then he asked us to pray with him. Next morning at 4 A. M. he left us."...

"Until his last breath he held fast to the (living) faith, hope and love he had spread among others by word, deed, writings, and Christian life. He lived in the

Lord; he died in the Lord; by the grace of Jesus does he receive eternal salvation."

"Is It Well With Thee?"

"Is it well with thee? Is it well with thy husband? Is it well with the child? And she answered, It is well."

(2 Kings 4:26)

More than fifty miles north of Jerusalem, near Tabor and a few miles from Jezreel, once stood the ancient village of Shunem. It was beautifully situated. It is said that "in that older time every house had its little park about it" and that "every park had its fountain, the waters of which climbed the ladders of light."

But it is not of the beautiful situation of Shunem that I am to speak.

We know something about one of the families of the city. We know the number of the house-hold — the father, the mother and the little boy who was as truly a gift of God and a miracle as was Isaac. We know something about the home-life of the little company.

We say in these days, if we know what company a man keeps, we may study the man through his company. And if you will tell me the names of your chosen friends written upon your guestbook in your home, I can tell you very accurately the story of your home-life. I can tell you very truly, no matter whether or not I have been in your home.

One of the very best things I know about the home in Shunem is this: it was the place where Elisha used to tarry. Over and over again he passed through Shunem, and the Shunammite woman provided for him.

It is said in the account that she was a great woman (vs. 8). John McNeille has said that he *thinks* that means she must have been a great discerner of character. She knew by the way the man walked that he was God's man.

She said to her husband, "We will invite him into our home." Since the home was small, they built for him the prophet's chamber (vs. 10). They gave him a special invitation to tarry with them; and when Elisha was weary, he rested there. When he was hungry, he found refreshment in the home of Shunem.

We know something more about the household. One day in the midst of the harvesting season, the little boy of the family turned his face away from his mother and sought his father and the reapers in the field (vs. 18).

The hot sun of the East beat down upon him so that as he came into the presence of his father he threw his hands to his head, saying, "My head, my head." His father turned to a servant and said, "Carry him to his mother" (vs. 19).

The lad carried him to his mother and placed him upon her knees. He lay upon her knees until about noon,

and then he died (vs. 20). You can only imagine the sorrow of that Shunammite woman unless you have passed through like affliction.

She was an exceedingly wise mother. She did not shut herself up with the body of her dead boy and refuse to be comforted, nor sit alone with her grief and let her heart break. She turned away from the home at Shunem and said, "Elisha is across the plains in the mountains of Carmel" (v. 22).

Elisha saw her coming. He turned to his old servant, Gehazi, and said, "Yonder is that Shunammite; Run now, I pray thee, to meet her" (vss. 25, 26). And Gehazi, obedient to his master's command, started down the mountainside.

When he came near enough for the woman to hear his voice, he cried out to her after the manner of the East, "is it well with thee? Is it well with thy husband? Is it well with the child?" And she in turn replied "It is well" (vs. 26).

I suppose he thought she would stop and tell him the nature of her errand to his master, but she pushed on past him and up into the presence of Elisha where I suppose she sobbed out the account of the death of her boy.

By this time Gehazi appeared and Elisha said to him, "Take my staff in thine hand... and lay my staff upon the face of the child" (vs. 29). Just as he started to obey Elisha told him not to salute anyone on the way.

I never realized what this expression meant until in the Holy Land I noticed the length of time required to complete the Eastern salutation. I am quite sure that what Elisha meant to say was that there was no time for even the ordinary courtesies of life.

The boy was dead. The mother was heartbroken, and the father was waiting in grief and despair, thinking that Gehazi might be the means of raising the child.

I have an idea that Elisha thought the Shunammite woman would follow Gehazi when he started down the mountainside at his master's command, but she did not do so.

I see her at the feet of the master saying to him, "Did I desire a son of my lord? Did I not say, Do not deceive me?... As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee" (vss. 28, 30).

And so Elisha took her by the hand and started down the mountainside. He came into the home in Shunem, shut himself in with the boy, put his hands to the boy's hands, put his mouth to the boy's mouth, put his eyes to the boy's eyes, and prayed as only a servant of God could pray.

Suddenly there was a touch of color in the boy's cheeks. He sneezed seven times. His eyes opened. Elisha took him by the hand and bid Gehazi call his

mother. I think I see her rushing up and down the streets of Shumem, saying, My boy was dead and is alive again!" And there was joy in the old home in Shunem.

Oh, to Pray With Importunity!

Why do you suppose this was placed in the Old Testament? It is true that it is one of the miracles of Elisha. But why is it told? It would seem to me that among other reasons it is there for this purpose: that we might understand what it is to pray with importunity.

"Do you believe," said a young woman to me in the city of Boston, "that if my mother and I should pray all night that my brother would be saved?"

I said to her, "If I were you, I would pray all night if I were led to do it."

To my certain knowledge that brother had not been within four miles of the meeting place. Before ten o'clock they were on their knees. At twelve o'clock they were praying. At three o'clock they were still crying out unto God when the mother rose from her knees to say, "I believe God will hear us" and closed her eyes in sleep.

I saw that young man the next evening stand in the great church and say that he had spent a sleepless night. I heard him say that he occupied a most important position in the city of Boston. He said "This morning, as the day was breaking, I gave myself to Jesus."

I think the account of the Shunammite is in the Old Testament that we might thus learn how to pray.

One evening my telephone rang. When I went to answer the call, I heard a voice that seemed to me to be almost choked with emotion, saying, "Will you pray for me?"

I said, "Certainly I will pray for you, but will you not meet me this evening at the close of the service?

I went to the service that night, and at the close of the meeting there came up to me this man who had telephoned me. He said he occupied a responsible position as a bookkeeper in the city.

He said, "My father is a pastor, my mother is a sincere Christian. I have been feeling the power of their praying. I have felt a great sense of need in my soul, and when I heard this evening the song that says, "O Mother, when I think of thee, 'tis but a step to Calvary.' I bowed my head and took Christ."

It seems to me that this may be in the Old Testament that we may be led to the kind of praying that went up to God on behalf of the pastor's son. I am sure it is there to teach us how to pray.

"As the LORD liveth, and as thy soul liveth, I will not leave thee." We have had days of prayer. I wonder how many of us have had nights of prayer. We have prayed minutes for our children. How many of us have prayed

by the day for our children?

And yet the story of prayer from the very first prayer that was offered until the last one that was sobbed out this evening is this story, that when we pray in faith God does hear and He will answer.

IS IT WELL WITH YOU?

I think the text takes in everyone in its teaching. "Is it well with thee?" That is personal salvation. "Is it well with thy husband?" That is interest in the salvation of others. "Is it well with the child?" That is interest in your own household.


I ask the first question: "Is it well with thee?" I will answer it for everyone in need. The man who is rich in worldly goods, the man who is highly honored in society, the man who has risen to some place of distinction knows that in his heart there is an ache that money cannot stop and position cannot help.

The man whose outward life may seem to be all right knows that in his heart there is again and again the cry for God. "Is it well with thee?" I should like to answer the question for you if you will allow me. It is not well for two or three reasons.
