The God Who Sees Me

he story is told of an elderly grandfather who was very wealthy. He was in fairly good health for his age, except that his hearing was failing him. So, he decided to purchase hearing aids. Two weeks later he returned to the audiologist so that she could make final adjustments. "How do you like the hearing aids?" she asked.

"I like them very much." He answered. "Why, I now can pick up conversations quite easily, even in the next room."

The audiologist was delighted. "Your family members must be happy to know that you can hear so much better."

The old man smiled. "Oh, I haven't told them yet. I've just been sitting around listening—and do you know what? I've changed my will twice."

God sees and hears and knows all things! In fact, according to Psalm 139, God knows what you do, He knows what you think, knows where you go, and he knows what you say. There is no place you can go, in which his all-knowing presence is not there. Here's the question: Is that reality a threat or a comfort to you?

Ah, if you are running from God, his omniscience (his "all-knowingness") is a threat, indeed, it stirs up fear—fear because despite your pious outward appearances, God knows that inwardly you are merely playing religious games—fear because God knows the twisted motives and hidden agendas behind all you do—fear because God knows every secret sin and every evil desire—fear because all is open to the eyes of him to whom we must give account (Hebrews 3:13)—fear because one

day you will stand in judgment before the great White Throne, and your whole miserable life will be judged on the basis of what is infallibly recorded in the books.

But if you are a child of God, purchased by the blood of His Son, God's omniscience is a source of great comfort and joy—comfort and joy because God knows you (and your needs) better than you do—comfort and joy because his strength will not allow you to sink in a sea of troubles.

Do you remember the story of Hagar, told in Genesis 16? It is the story of a young woman who is pregnant and on the run from some very difficult and painful circumstances. As you may recall, Abraham and Sarah were unable to have children, so Sarah gave Hagar to Abraham as a second wife. If Hagar were to become pregnant and bear a child, then according to custom, Sarah could claim and adopt the child as her own.

Well, Hagar became pregnant and began to look with contempt on Sarah—after all, she was able to bear a child, whereas Sarah could not. Sarah responded with anger and bitterness. In essence she said to herself. "I am a woman of wealth and standing whereas Hagar is only an Egyptian slave girl. Who does she think she is?"

Conditions quickly deteriorated. Sarah blamed Abraham for the whole mess (even though the entire scheme had been her idea to begin with). And Abraham, in response to his wife's anger, basically said to Sarah, "Hagar is your servant. Do whatever you think is best." Then, the Bible says, *Sarah dealt harshly with her* (16:6)—the same word later used to describe how Egyptian taskmasters treated the people of Israel.

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What is Hagar to do? The only viable solution she could see was to run from her intolerable circumstances and return to her home country of Egypt. And run she did, finally arriving at a spring of water near the Egyptian border. And while she rested at that place, feeling very much alone and overwhelmed, the angel of the Lord *found her* (16:7).

What great news! In times of distress and fear and great need, you and I (like Hagar) discover that God is never far from any one of us. More than that, we discover (or perhaps, rediscover) that he knows all about our past, our present journey, and what lies ahead of us. And based upon his perfect, all-encompassing, eternal knowledge, God acts—for his glory and for our good.

In Hagar's case, the angel of the Lord (the second person of the Trinity) gave her an amazing promise: "Not only will you give birth to a son" said the angel, "but I will multiply your son's descendants to such an extent that no one will be able to count them. Oh, and in remembrance of this event," He said, "you are to name Him Ishmael, which means *God hears*."

And what was Hagar's instructive response? She rejoiced. But the Genesis account makes it clear that she did not rejoice primarily in the great prophecies regarding her son (although she undoubtedly was both amazed and thankful). Instead Hagar rejoiced in the presence of a gracious, omniscient God.

Indeed, at the end of the passage she celebrated God's omniscience by giving this name to the Lord who had spoken to her: *the God who sees me* (16:13). "Can you believe it?" she shouts with joy. "I have actually seen *him who looks after me*". (And that, by the way, is the name she gave to the well where the encounter took place.)

Child of God, rejoice in God's omniscience. Think about it. If God is indeed all-knowing, that means, for example, that he will never discover anything new about you, nor will he ever be surprised by anything you do. God's omniscience means that He knows the absolute worst about you, but loves you eternally and fully through Jesus Christ. He has saved you by his grace. You belong to him.

Further, God's omniscience means that as a Christian you can live your life in gospel freedom. No character flaw can suddenly come to light that God doesn't already know about. No long-forgotten skeleton stored away for years in some back closet of your life can suddenly tumble out and startle God. No – not even Satan himself can make any accusation against you that will cause God to have second thoughts about you.

God perfectly knows what you and I are really like—he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust (Psalm 103:14). Why, God knows you so well that even the hairs of your head are all numbered (Matthew 10:30). So, take heart! His grace is always sufficient, His supply is always abundant, His timing is always perfect, and his faithfulness and mercies—for you—are new every morning.

The streets of our large cities have been full of marchers and demonstrators recently. Many well-meaning people have been drawn into this. The New Left which has promoted the (protests) does not have a peaceful intent.

All the "peace and safety" talk is the forerunner of sudden destruction. The world today is living in the shadow of Armageddon. The time will come when there will not be a safe place anywhere on earth. There will be no lasting peace until the Prince of Peace comes to set up His kingdom upon earth.

"Then he asked me where I went to church and I told him. He said, 'Well, I can tell you where that church is, but it's not easy to find. It's quite a distance away. Let me make you a map.' So he made an outline of the way to the church and left."

"When I awakened Sunday morning, It was raining. I thought to myself, I'll just not go to church this morning. Surely I can be forgiven of this. It's my first Sunday on campus. It's raining hard and the church is hard to find. I'll get some more sleep.

Then there was a knock on the door; and when I opened it, there stood that student. His raincoat was dripping wet and on one arm he had two umbrellas. He said, 'I thought you might have a hard time finding your church, especially in the rain. I will walk along with you and show you where it is.'

As I dressed to go, I thought What kind of fellow is this? As we were walking along in the rain under the two umbrellas, I said to myself, 'If this fellow is so concerned about my religion, I ought to know something about his.'

I asked, "Where do you go to church?"

"Oh", he said, "my church is just around the corner." I said, "Suppose we go to your church today and we'll go to my church next Sunday."

"I went to his church and I've never been back to my own.

After four years, I knew it was not law for me, but the ministry. I went to seminary and was ordained a minister."

That is a fascinating story of a most important man—the man with two umbrellas. You go back to the beginning of Christian history and you will find him or her. This type of person is in back of every concert and aback of every Christian enterprise and movement in history—that unnamed fellow with two umbrellas, the person who makes his or her Christianity so winsome, so





The world's largest species of hornet, which can wipe out a honeybee hive in a matter of hours, has been seen for the first time in the United States, according to the Washington State Department of Agriculture.

They are so lethal that just one can kill <u>40</u> European honey bees in one minute, while a small group of them can decimate an entire bee colony, decapitating them and taking the hive as their own, and using the bodies of the dead bees to feed their young.

(Ted) Cruz Urges AG Barr to Investigate Officials Who Target Religious Communities

Washington Is Burning

The Star-Spangled Banner

"Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD; and the people whom he hath chosen for his own inheritance." (Ps. 33:12)

It was September 13, 1814, and the citizens of Washington, D.C., watched in horror as their city burned. The White House, the Capital and most of the other government buildings *were ablaze*. England and the United States were engaged in the War of 1812.

As the British retreated in the ships anchored in Chesapeake Bay, near the mouth of the Potomac River, they took William Beanes as a captive. He was a prominent physician and friend of Francis Scott Key, a lawyer and plantation owner.

Key then secured permission from the government to negotiate for the release of Beanes. Although Key was successful, he and Beanes were detained overnight on the British ship *Minden*. There enemies feared they had learned of the intention to attack Fort McHenry near Baltimore.

Key and his party watched as darkness fell and obscured Fort McHenry and the fifty-foot American flag that was flying overhead. They watched until the last gleaning of the twilight.

A raging battle began. Cannon fire, rockets and flames allowed glimpses of the flag all through the night. As the day dawned, "OLD GLORY" could be seen still waving. They rejoiced that the fort had stood.

So thrilled was Key that he grabbed an envelope from his pocket and began to write what his heart was feeling. He finished the poem the next day in a Baltimore hotel room, adding several more verses. The original copy is in the Maryland Historical Society's H. Furlong Baldwin Library.

The poem, sung to an English tune known in the United States as "Adams and Liberty" and written by John Stafford Smith, became so popular in our Country that in 1931 Congress made "The Star-Spangled Banner" our National Anthem. The flag that flew over Fort McHenry is now on display in the Smithsonian National Museum of American History in Washington, D.C.

Francis Scott Key a devout Christian believed deeply in <u>Liberty and Freedom</u>. It is reported that the slaves he inherited from his wealthy father were freed by him in 1817. Before their release, he helped them with family problems, defended them, at no cost, in the courts and started Sunday School classes for them. He did everything in his power to

lighten their burdens.

He died January 11, 1843. Two statues of Key stand in our nation: one over his grave and another in Golden Gate Park, San Francisco, California. A flag, by order of the Government, flies continuously over his burial place in Frederick, Maryland.

Many soldiers in Fort McHenry gave their lifeblood on that fateful night that <u>you</u> and <u>I</u> might be *free*. Today, multiplied thousands of American men and women lie in Flanders Field and in countless other burial places where crosses mark their graves, row opon row.

They too gave their lives for our *freedom* – <u>freedom</u> to live and work and play without the fear of tyranny. What a wonderful blessing – this freedom we enjoy!

Reflection: Who is the Author of liberty, the Founder of FREEDOM? You and I can never be really free – free from the guilt of our sins – apart from the freedom that Christ alone paid for with His blood on Calvary's Cross. Oh, (Editor: to be justified) free from guilt, to know that our wrongs have been made right, to know that we are free in our NATION and in our souls before **Almighty God.**

Sword of the LORD

Editor's Term: JUSTIFICATION is to be made 'right' (ready) before GOD. This is by Grace Alone, Word Alone, Faith Alone; through/under the Blood of Jesus!

Prove All Things

"Prove (test) all things; hold fast that which is good" (I Thessalonians 5:21)

To imply that we are not to judge: teachings, movements, and doctrines is to be disobedient with the clear scriptural admonition of the Lord. He has called each one of us to be a judge (Matthew 7:1-5; 1 Corinthians 5:12, 6:2-5; Jude 1:25). DISCERNING THE TRUTH

TRUTH

In this day we must discern what the truth is. Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, no man can come to the Father but through Me" (Jhn. 14:6). Jesus was speaking about more than just who He was. He is the embodiment of truth. Therefore, every word He spoke was truth. The Bible tells us clearly that all of Scripture from Genesis to Revelation is the inspired, inerrant Word of God. "All scripture is inspired by God" (2 Tim. 3:16).

The Bible warns us of a great apostasy that will occur in the last days—2 Thessalonians 2:3. We need to guard our hearts and minds so that we do not fall for the many deceptions that Satan will bring into the world in those last days. As 2 Thessalonians 2:9 puts it, "the one whose coming is in accord with the activity of Satan, with all power and signs and false wonders." There will be many signs and wonders, people claiming supernatural events and experiences. Make sure you do not fall for these and thus become a part of the apostasy.

DISCERNING THE FALSE

The problem we have today is that many people ignore any part of God's Word that would conflict with their personal beliefs. If it doesn't agree with what they preach, then they choose to ignore it or reason it away. It is absolutely vital that Christians know what the Bible says, so they are not led away from the truth by false prophets.

There are some very important verses in I John 4 that protect us from falling for the deception of the last days. "Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out in to the world. By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God; and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God; this is the spirit of antichrist, of which you have heard that it is coming, and now it is already in the world" (I Jn. 4:1-3).

Do you believe that Jesus is truly God in human form? "They shall call His name Immanuel, which translated means, 'God with us'" (Matthew 1:23). However, these verses speak of much more that just believing that Jesus is God. The word translated *confess* in these verses is *homologos*, which literally mans "same words." The line "every spirit that does not confess

Jesus is not from God" we could fairly translate as

"everyone who <u>does not agree with the same words</u> of Jesus is not from God."

TESTING FOR THE TRUTH

How do we know if someone or something is true? It must agree with the Word of God, If it contradicts the Bible, you can be sure it is not truth. One thing Jesus made clear is that in the last days there would be "many "false prophets and people claiming to be Christ or at least claiming to do what only Christ can do. "And many false prophets will arise, and will mislead many" (Matthew 24:11). "For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am the Christ,' and mislead many" (Matthew 24:2). Claiming to be Christ can be done by saying you are Christ or by claiming to be able to do something that only Christ can do.

FALSE CLAIMS

Another phenomenon of the last days is all those who claim to have gone to heaven or hell and then returned with a message for all of us. Alex Malarkey admits he made his story up, but Colton Burpo, the last time I checked, still claims to have gone to heaven and come back. His net worth from selling his book is said to be around five million dollars. How do we know who is telling the truth? It all comes back to what the Bible says and whether these stories agree with the Word of God.

If any of these storytellers were to say I had a dream or a vision that I went to heaven and came back, I would have no problem with what they are doing. However, when someone claims to have physically gone to heaven and come back, they are in conflict with numerous Scripture verses. Jesus told us only one person ever had a heavenly body and came to earth. John 3:13—"no one has ascended into heaven, but He who descended from heaven, even the Son of Man." Jesus has told us not to accept any "adds" to His Word. We have the Word of God, and we need to stick to it when it comes to determining what is truth.

Some will also use the argument that Lazarus, Tabitha, and others died and were brought back to life. Yes, they died, but not one of them was it said that they went to heaven. They died so God could reveal that He had power over death. They died, and God brought them back to life. It does not say they went to heaven and God brought them back to earth again.

OUR FILTER

The devil is getting more and more deceitful as we near the time of Christ's return. We will see more and more of these kinds of things as we near the end. Jesus

said," For false Christs and false prophets will arise, and will sow signs and wonders, in order, if possible, to lead the elect astray" (Mark 13:22).

It is so important that we recognize that the Bible is complete and that we filter every event and teaching through that written Word of God. Is what a person says or does in agreement with the Word of God. Are they teaching the "same words" that Christ has given to us in His Word?

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied." (Matthew 5:6)

In his book 'Jesus Through Middle Eastern Eyes', Kenneth Bailey says this in regard to righteousness, "In biblical literature 'righteousness' often refers to mighty acts of God in history to save."

So, for example, Israel's exodus out of Egypt was a mighty act of God in history to save. Israel's deliverance out of captivity in Babylon was a mighty act of God in history to save. And throughout the Old Testament you see time and time again, these mighty acts of God in history to save His people from their enemies.

Again, this, Bailey says, is what righteousness often refers to. Therefore, when Jesus says, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness."

He's saying, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for God's saving action on their behalf."

However, it isn't the Pharaoh of Egypt or the mighty Babylonian empire, that we ultimately need saving from. No, we need to be saved *from* sin, death, and the power of the devil. We need deliverance *from* this body of death and the world of sin. We need to be rescued from everything that would separate us from fellowship with God. Therefore, this is what the Christian hungers and thirsts for. We long for the cry out to God to save us-with His mighty and righteous hand-*from* all these things that would separate us from Him.

But not only do we hunger and thirst to be saved *from* these things, at the same time, we hunger and thirst to be saved *for* something; that we might be holy as Christ is holy.

Here's what Martin Lloyd Jones says in this regard, "(To hunger and thirst for righteousness) means a desire to be free *from* sin, because sin separates us from God. ...It also means...a desire to be free *from* the power of sin...*from* the desire for sin...to be free *from* (our sinful) self in all its horrible manifestations, in all its forms."

However, then he goes on to say, "(In a positive sense) to hunger and thirst after righteousness is nothing but the longing *to be* positively holy (or, longing *for* holiness)...The man who (hungers and thirsts for righteousness is the one who) wants to exemplify the Beatitudes in his daily life. He is a man who wants to show the fruit of the Spirit in his every action and in the whole of his life and activity. To hunger and thirst for righteousness is to long to be like the New Testament

man, the new man in Christ Jesus. That is what it means, that the whole of my being and the whole of my life shall be like that. ... (To take a step further) it means that one's supreme desire in life is to know God and to be in fellowship with him, to walk with God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit in the light."

So, this is what we hunger and thirst for. This is what our bellies ache for and our mouths swell for. As Christians, we hunger and thirst for righteousness; to finally and fully be set free *from* sin, death, and the power of the devil (from all unrighteousness) and set free *for* a life of holiness before God; that we might be like Christ. That's what we desire; that's what we <u>continually</u> long for.

See, like it was with the second beatitude (Blessed are those who mourn), this hungering and thirsting is ongoing. Literally, Jesus says, "Blessed are those hungering and thirsting for righteousness. "Again, it's an ongoing thing. It's a daily longing; longing to be set free from this body of death; longing to be set free from this world of sin; longing to be holy as Christ is holy. Forget about power and prestige; honor and praise. The world can have all those things; we want righteousness. We long to dwell in righteousness; we long to be righteous. This is what characterizes the Christian.

And, Jesus says, "Blessed/happy are you who are characterized as such." Why? Not because hungering is so satisfying or thirsting is so delightful in and of itself. Rather, blessed/happy are you, because in your hungering and thirsting for righteousness, you are and will forever be satisfied. That is, you will find fulfillment; it's found daily and eternally in Jesus Christ.

In John 6, Jesus says, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst." In other words, in Jesus there is perfect satisfaction. For in Jesus, by His death and resurrection, there is deliverance from this world of unrighteousness, from this body of sin and death. In Jesus, by His death and resurrection, we are declared perfectly holy in Him and are being made perfectly holy like Him

So, are you hungering and thirsting today? Like a wanderer in the desert, do you long for the righteousness that only Christ can deliver and nurture in you? If so, then blessed are you, because in your hungering and thirsting, you will continually and eternally be satisfied when you turn to Christ and seek first His kingdom. You will be filled full.

This Sickness Will Not End in Death

IF the previous couple months (more months now) have affirmed one thing to me about the nature of the Church, it is our *togetherness*.

The spring of 2020 will undoubtedly go down in history as a vulnerable and difficult season of concern, grief, isolation, and loss. And, in our missing of each other and our gatherings, have we not caught a fresh scent of FELLOWSHIP, of our need and nature to somehow in some way connect, gather, pray, share joy, and support one another?

JESUS once gave a word in the face of isolation. Of the grave illness of Lazarus, he assured his disciples, "This sickness will not end in death" John 11:4.

Lazarus and his sisters, Mary and Martha were close friends of Jesus. John says, "Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus" John 11:3. In their heartache and worry, and in their trust relationship with Jesus, these sisters send word to Jesus: "Lord, the one you love is sick" John 11:3. Similar urgent, expectant prayers have undoubtedly been prayed during this pandemic, just as ardent now as then, "Lord, the one you love is sick."

Jesus explains that while He is never the cause of sin's curse in its many outcomes, yet He remains Sovereign through human pain and peril. Jesus, in every trial and circumstance, is always at work to save. Three times in this chapter (vv.4, 15, 42) we are assured that, while in the trial we are only able to count the pain, the infections, the deaths. GOD knows the count of those who – through this trial – in their seeking are found, in their doubt come to know, and in their dead heart are resurrected eternally alive.

In the temporal world, by the time Jesus leaves for Bethany, Lazarus has died. "What! Lazarus dead? I thought Jesus said ...didn't we all hear Him say, 'This sickness will not end in death'?"

When Jesus arrives at Bethany, he goes to the tomb that has housed Lazarus' dead body for four days. He is deeply moved at the grief and unbelief he sees; this too is part of the weight he will soon bear to the Cross. Jesus commands the stone across Lazarus' tomb be rolled away, and calls out with the Voice of resurrection power, "Lazarus, come forth!" And ...he does.

We must ask ourselves, of whom is this promise spoken? The answer is, "the one Jesus loves".

The one who is His own. Ones like Lazarus and Martha. Ones like Mary, who bowed herself in humility,

willing to wash his feet with her own hair – as a confession of sin, and a confession of faith – with gratitude to Him as her SAVIOR. Of such people it may be said, "This sickness will not end in death." And this *must always* be said of the one Jesus loves!

I must tell you, as much as we know, this can be said of every one who has come by repentance and faith to be the friend of Jesus, you must also realize *the opposite is true* for any person who is not by faith the friend of Jesus. No matter one's health, strength, or security. If they are not by faith one Jesus loves, the opposite is true. For the person outside of Christ it cannot be said, "This sickness will not end in death." Rather, it must be said of this person, "This apparent health, this seeming strength, this transient security, will not end in Life."

On the Cross, the promise of Jesus to those He loves is put to the test of faith.

Here the Cross, the predicament, the punishment, the prognoses of all that makes us ill by SIN is laid on our Friend. He takes it all unto Himself, and bears it, finally destroying the deadly contagion of sin and all its refuse in our lives! But here also at the Cross is the charge against all who have made themselves not friends, but enemies of Christ. For all their apparent strength, wellness, and goodness, it will not end for them in life, but in Eternal Death. For their greatest malady will be their rejection of JESUS as FRIEND, and His Innocent Blood will be upon them, forever unforgiven.

Finally, in all of us who are by faith the friend of Jesus, who have been made well – the 'cross' reminds us that we carry within us, in our hands and in our mouths, the *great antidote* our dying neighbors need. It is the very gospel of Jesus.

At this vulnerable time in our world, I say to all: friend of Jesus, seeker of Jesus, isolated and spiritually-separated from HIM – believe! Become by faith one HE loves. Trust His promises.

THE GIRDLE OF TRUTH

"Stand therefore, having your loins girded with truth" (Ephesians 6:14)

I hope no one thinks that by the girdle of truth I mean sinless perfection. If that were the girdle of truth, none of us would be girded. David was not innocent, but he was honest. Jehoshaphat was not without fault; he went to war on the side of Ahab. He should not have done that. But he was honest, and the Lord was his strength. Peter sinned, but he *repented* of his sin, and the Lord was gracious toward him. All of these were wounded in BATTLE, some very severely; but none of them was lost, because they retained the girdle of truth.

This is what I mean: Be truthful in your Christian life. Do not pretend that you are something that you are not. Each one of us is tempted to polish the exterior of his life so that the internal injury can be hidden from view. When you meet someone whom you think to be a much better Christian than you are – and in all probability he is better – you are so easily tempted to act and appear like him without actually being like him. This is a dangerous and cowardly hypocrisy. Never try to clothe yourself in the forms of another's godliness, use your own coat, even if it may seem a bit scant. In Acts 19 we are told of seven sons of a Jewish high priest who took upon themselves to use the name of Jesus in driving out evil spirits. They said, "I adjure you by the Jesus whom Paul preacheth." But the evil spirit replied, "Jesus I know, and Paul I know, but who are ye?" And the man in whom the evil spirit was leaped upon them and tore their clothes from their backs so that they had to flee from the house naked and wounded.

This was a very course form of spiritual impersonation. No, to go out and perform miracles, or whatever else it might be, under the cloak of another's Christianity, that will never do. If we ourselves do not have sense enough to see that this is wrong, we can be certain that others see it; often it is those who we think can know the least about such matters who see it most clearly. We can be certain of this too that also 'today' the people who pretend to be more than they are will be stripped naked, of then they have to flee in shame.

People of God! Gird yourselves with the girdle of truth.

Do you, child of God, feel that you do not amount to much? Does it seem that you are both insignificant and worldly? Confess it to God. Do you find that you have little desire to read GOD'S WORD and to pray? Do you find that you do not particularly care to be obedient to God? If so, you will never find a solution by trying to convince yourself and others that all is well. Tell it to God, calling

<u>each</u> sin by its <u>right name</u>; that is <u>true</u> Christian conduct. Then you will be girded about with the *girdle of truth*.

Soldiers of Christ, arise
And put your armor on;
