here is a poem I have always found thought provoking and that's C.T. Studd's poem, "Only One Life." Charles Studd was an Englishman born in 1860. He was converted at a D.L. Moody crusade in England and he went to China as a missionary, later he went to India and then to the Congo where he died in 1931 at the age of 70. He was quoted as saying, "Some want to live within the sound of church or chapel bell; I want to run a rescue shop within a yard of hell."

A few stanzas of his poem reads:

"Two little lines I heard one day, Traveling along life's busy way; Bringing conviction to my heart, And from my mind would not depart; Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last.

Only one life, yes only one, Soon will its fleeting hours be done; Then, in 'that day' my Lord to meet, And stand before His Judgement seat; Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last.

Only one life, 'twill soon be past,
Only what's done for Christ will last.
And when I am dying, how happy I'll be,
If the lamp of my life has been burned out for Thee."

I think sometimes Christians have the opposite view of life, especially by the time we advance in years a bit. We get weary of the battle, the battle against sin, the battle against pride, the battle against the godless culture we live in, the battle against our physical bodies as they age and we can't do the things we used to be able to do. We are tired and we just want to go home.

The Apostle Paul shared that desire. He said, Phil. 1:21, "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain. But if I live on in the flesh, this will mean fruit from my labor; yet what I shall choose I cannot tell. For I am hard-pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better. Nevertheless to remain in the flesh is more needful for you." (NKJV)

It's not a sin to desire to depart and be with Jesus. That was Paul's desire. But Paul also knew that since God had preserved his life to this point there was work he still needed to do. Some people in the past have so looked forward to the return of Christ that they have sold all their belongings and moved to the mountains to wait for Jesus to return. Don't do that. There is work to do.

Time is a gift from God, in comparison to eternity it is the blink of an eye. It is like the grass that grows just for a season and is burned up, or as James describes it, life is a vapor. In 100 years, if the world lasts that long everyone here will be mostly forgotten, but yet for these few short years on Earth we have the privilege and honor of doing the Lord's bidding.

Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire."

Only what is done for Christ. This gets to our motives. Is what we're doing for Christ, or is it for pride, is it for show so others will think better of us? Only what is done for Christ will last. There is only one way to make sure we are doing what we are doing for Christ, and that is to stay Gospel focused. So much of today's preaching is feel good self esteem psychology, when really the opposite is what we need. We already have too high a view of ourselves, we need to see ourselves as we really are, wretched sinners, so that we stay at the foot of the cross and see Jesus as our only hope. Then we will truly esteem Jesus and his sacrifice, and our focus will be on Christ and pleasing Him, and not ourselves.

If that is true for you then we will be able to join in with Charles Studd and say: "Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last. And when I am dying, how happy I'll be, If the lamp of my life has been burned out for Thee."

He moves along through the book reading its precious promises, hearing its high challenges, looking at its deep messages of peace and power and victory. But he never makes this his own! He appreciates but does not appropriate. He respects his Bible, argues for it, counts it dear, but its rich treasures never become living realities in his own experience. "They which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by One, Jesus Christ." (Rom. 5:17) Another looks at that gem and lives like a pauper when God meant him to be a prince.

"All things are yours." (I Cor. 3:21) There are many who behold that free pass to all God's unlimited stock, yet live spiritually almost bankrupt. Window – Shoppers!

The storehouse of God's Word was never meant for mere scrutiny, not even primarily for study, but for sustenance. It is not simply a collection of fine proverbs and noble teachings for men to admire and quote as they might Shakespeare. It is rations for the soul, resources of and for the spirit, treasure for the inner man. Its goods exhibited upon every page are ours, and we have no business merely moving respectfully amongst them and coming away none the richer.

The window-shopper upon the streets (Malls) often has a very good reason for not buying; he has not the wherewithal. But no believer can say that of God's riches, for the treasure of His Word is without money and without price. Whosoever will may drink freely! Some window-shop because they never fully realized that the things of the Spirit can be made actual, living realities here and now amidst this humdrum, daily round of common duties. Others loaf along, indifferent to their inward poverty, faring scantily when the banquets of God are at their disposals. And some substitute wishful longing for the practical realization of the Christ-life.

The LORD is rich unto all who call upon Him! Let us be done with this *idle window-shopping*. Let us go into the deep stores of His Word, rummage among its treasures new and old, and come forth from each excursion laden with the bounty in the Book.

Sheep's Clothing

Be aware that the kingdom of self is a costume kingdom. It does a perversely brilliant job of masquerading as the kingdom of God.

Spiritual fakery is one of the chief tools of the enemy. It is one of the key ingredients of spiritual blindness. This is why we read the warning in Matthew 7:15: "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves." The kingdom of self is very skilled at wearing the clothing of the kingdom of God. So:

- * A focus on material things can masquerade as good stewardship of your possessions.
- * Loving personal control can masquerade as using God-given leadership gifts.
- * Anger can masquerade as having a heart for what is right.
- * Self-righteous legalism can masquerade as loving God's law.
- Building your own ministry empire can masquerade as a commitment to the expansion of God's kingdom.
- * Fear of man can masquerade as a sensitive heart toward the needs of others.
- * Selfish attention-seeking can masquerade as being candid about your needs.
- * Judgement and criticism can masquerade as a commitment to honesty.
- * Theological pride can masquerade as a commitment to God's truth.
- * A craving to be known and respected can masquerade as a commitment to ministry.
- * Bondage to the opinions of others can masquerade as a commitment to community.
- * Lust can masquerade as a celebration of the beauty of God's creation.
- * Gossip can masquerade as a prayerful concern for others.

It really is true – the kingdom of self is a costume kingdom. This is because one of the enemy's most useful tools is the ability of wrong to imitate right. Couple this with our natural propensity to spiritual blindness and you end up with personal spiritual confusion. It is scary to think of the number of times we think we are

serving God when we're actually serving ourselves, or the number of times we think we are worshiping God when we're actually giving worship and service to some aspect of the creation.

The masquerading nature of sin plays to the fickleness of our idolatrous hearts. So what is often present is not what we think it is, and the masquerading idol has no power at all to deliver to our hungry hearts what Jesus alone can give us. Only God can give us insight into our hearts and free us from our bondage to the little costume kingdom of one.

This may be even safer than the soft answer which turneth away wrath. Study this silence, too, not only in personal provocation and injury, but in reference to the failings and infirmities of others. Put to confusion all evil-speaking, backbiting, and censoriousness by a becoming, dignified, holy silence. Speak evil of no man. Curb the tongue, seal the lips, be silent touching a brother's or a sister's failings. God is silent of yours; learn you of Him to be silent of your fellow-servants. Go to thy brother and tell him his fault between him and you alone, but let no consideration induce you to unveil that fault to another. (Matt. xviii. 15)

How much of the feuds and heart-burnings, suspicions and wranglings, which mar the happiness of families, and which disturb the peace and impede the prosperity of churches, would be prevented were this sacred, holy silence more strictly observed. Spend a whole night in prayer before you open your lips to utter a sentence or to breathe a word tending to sully the fame, to injure the character, or to wound the happiness of a child of God. Think how dear, how precious, that believer is to Christ, and that in wounding the disciple you wound the Lord. "Set a watch, O Lord, before my mouth; keep the door of my lips."

Life in the Blood

"For the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it is the blood that maketh an atonement for the souls." (Leviticus 17:11)

This great verse contains a wealth of scientific and spiritual truth. It was not realized until the discovery of the circulation of the blood by the creationist scientist William Harvey, in about 1620, that biological "life" really is maintained by the blood, which both brings nourishment to all parts of the body and also carries away its wastes.

In spiritual truth it is even more significant. The blood, when shed on the altar, would serve as an "atonement" (literally, "covering") for the soul of the guilty sinner making an offering. In fact, the "life" of the flesh is actually its "soul," for "life" and "soul" both translate the same Hebrew word (*nephesh*) in this text. When the blood was offered, it was thus an offering of life itself, in substitution for the life of the sinner who deserved to die.

Human sacrifices, of course, were prohibited. No man could die for another man, for his blood would inevitably be contaminated by his own sin. Therefore, the blood of a "clean animal" was required. Animals do not possess the "image of God" (Genesis 1:27), including the ability to reason about right and wrong, and therefore cannot sin. Even such clean blood could only serve as a temporary covering, and it could not really "take away" SIN! For a permanent solution to the sin problem, nothing less was required than that of the sinless "Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). "Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by His own blood He entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us" (Hebrews 9:12). Since His life was in His blood, HE has "made peace through the blood of His cross" (Colossians 1:20).

Foolish Virgins

And they mean it in all sincerity, without a doubt.

How can they be so certain in the matter? Jesus speaks to them, too; He includes them also in His admonition.

Yes, He does. But many of them live in false peace. Admonition is ineffective. They are always positive of themselves.

Others, again, acknowledge, willingly enough, that they do not live as they ought and that their relationship with God is not as it should be. Nevertheless they do not think that they will be lost. They intend to be saved, and they do Plan to repent. There is no doubt in their minds about that. But they cannot do it now.

Likely it is this type of thinking which gives them the necessary boldness to postpone their conversion.

Yes, we can understand full well that it will come as an unexpected surprise when they open their eyes in perdition. O God, help the unconverted to heed Thy warning today!

Believable...Yet Unbelievable

High Court Justices Express Skepticism over Texas Abortion Law

A majority of Supreme Court justices Monday [Nov. 1] appeared willing to allow a challenge by abortion providers to a unique Texas law that bans most abortions after six weeks of pregnancy and allows enforcement by private citizens.

The court's three liberal justices have already said they believe the law is unconstitutional and that it should be halted until federal courts can look at it more closely. The court in a 5-4 vote turned down that option before the law went into effect Sept. 1.

But at Monday's three-hour hearing, justices Brett Kavanaugh and Amy Coney Barrett- part of that five-justice majority - repeatedly and pointedly questioned Texas' arguments and seemed more swayed by challengers' claims that the law improperly blocked the judicial review necessary when constitutional rights are at stake.

"There's a loophole that's been exploited here, or used here," Kavanaugh said to Texas Solicitor General Stone, and suggested it might be better to close it rather than allow Texas to employ it.

Barrett seemed concerned that the Texas law was written to avoid federal judicial review but that it also would be hard for challengers to get relief in state court, where Texas said the law's constitutionality should be challenged.

... GOP-led states and conservative activists have asked the court to use next month's case from Mississippi banning abortions after 15 weeks of pregnancy to overturn 1973's Roe v. Wade and 1992's Planned Parenthood v. Casey. They prohibit bans on pre-viability abortions, usually meaning before 22 to 24 weeks. Those arguments are set for Dec.1.

Knees on the Ground

For many years, I focused on abortion solely as a political issue. I grew frustrated by the lack of progress toward a culture of life despite all my time and efforts. This became especially poignant when, in September 2014, a Whole Woman's Health abortion center was announced to open in my hometown of Las Cruces, New Mexico-the "City of the Crosses."

Abortion suddenly became no longer just a political issue to debate on social media or at the ballot box, but a local crisis harming women and children just 50 feet behind our local family pizzeria. With New Mexico being infamous as the "late-term abortion capital" of the nation, we knew we couldn't turn to our state government for help. Instead, we looked for guidance from 40 Days for Life leaders in our sister city of El Paso, Texas.

The pro-life movement in El Paso had been running long and strong for many years. In 2007, Gaby Avila moved into a duplex directly behind El Paso's notorious "Hill Top" abortion center. For nearly a decade, she lived humbly and in secret as a full-time pro-life missionary, helping women and saving babies from the traumatic violence of abortion on a daily basis.

At the climax of this faith in action was her co-leadership for a 40 Days for Life campaign. God, in His Goodness, has used 40 Days for Life campaigns to save thousands of children, close dozens of abortion facilities, and even help dozens of abortion workers to quit!

All this fruit was not being accomplished through laws and politics, but in spite of these temporal hurdles, I discovered a world of Christians not just petitioning Caesar to help our neighbor for us, but humbly getting their knees on the ground to petition our King and turning from our wicked ways so that God could heal our land.

Talk about an "A-ha" moment. In December 2016, just 27 months after opening and five 40 Days for Life campaigns later, the same Whole Woman's Health facility – which had bragged about their "freedom" from abortion restrictions in New Mexico during the pro-abortion Obama Administration – closed it doors for the last time, citing financial trouble due to "suddenly not getting enough patients."

While Whole Woman's Health had put its faith in secular legislators, we put our faith in Christ and His precepts. The abortion facility counted on Caesar but did not count on the Church – united across denominational, partisan, and even state lines – showing up to help the very women whom Whole Woman's Health intended to exploit for profit.

The Holy Spirit fanned the spark into a wildfire, uniting thousands in peaceful vigil across the larger Borderland region. In July 2018, we witnessed God close a second abortion facility, Reproductive Services, after 45 years in El Paso. Encouraged by this momentum, people gave even more sacrificially of their time, talent, and treasure, forming unbroken chains of literal knees-on-the-ground prayer and full-time year-round outreach.

After months of hopeful signs, in April of 2020, El Paso's notorious Hill Top center became our third local abortion facility to shut its doors for the last time – after 36 years in operation. With three local facilities closed in just over three years and just two left to go, our new goal is to see God go five for five!

Does it not bid us sanctify ourselves unto HIM by whom we have been redeemed? Does it not call us to newness of life, and incite us to entire consecration to the LORD? O that the power of the BLOOD might be known, and felt in us this night!

The Gilded Age

"Beware lest you forget the LORD your God by not keeping His commandments and His ordinances and His statutes which I am commanding you today; lest, when you have eaten and are satisfied, and have built good houses and lived in them, and when your herds and your flocks multiply, and your silver and gold multiply, and all that you have multiplies, then your heart becomes proud, and you forget the LORD your God who brought you out from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery." (Deuteronomy 8:11-14)

American satirist Mark Twain coined it "The Gilded Age." It began in the latter part of the 19th century. By the turn of the new century [1900], it had blossomed into a social gospel: A Philosophy for Living. Man, through his mastery of technology, was on the verge of creating heaven on earth. In short, he was about to best nature, perhaps, even out do God. *

The world was changing very, very rapidly. It [the Industrial Revolution] was making people live longer, it was bringing more happiness to people, and people tended to believe that and looked upon technology as a salvation or a panacea for everything. *

It was a period of great optimism. That optimism showed itself in migration to the new world. Thousands and thousands of people were viewing America as the place where dreams were realized. *

In an age where rigid class boundaries shaped and defined their differences, Titanic's passengers shared one quality in common: A complete trust in the future, utter faith in a world that they believed was always getting better. *

The epitome of this great optimism was building the largest ship in the world, called the *Titanic*.

Shipbuilder magazine raved over state-of-the-art safety features and pronounced them "as far as it is possible to do so, these two wonderful vessels [Olympic and Titanic] are designed to be unsinkable." She was the largest ship in the world. She was designed to be the epitome of style, luxury and safety. The ship upon construction in 1912 was among humankind's crowning technological achievements. *

One of the passengers on the *Titanic* said,

"To declare a ship to be unsinkable was to fly in the face of God." *

Just 4 days into her maiden voyage [April 14, 1912],

Titanic would collide with an iceberg and plunge to the seabed, taking with her over 1,500 souls. From the world's wealthiest industrialists to the humblest of immigrants. *

The loss of the *Titanic* marked the beginning of the end of the age of innocence and of arrogance. It was the swift and sudden death of a dearly held dream. *

This is especially significant when on May 7, 1915, just a year later, the ocean liner *Lusitania* was torpedoed by a German submarine and sank with all 1,198 people on board perishing. In fact, *Titanic's* sister ship *Britannic* hit a German naval mine and sank on November, 21, 1916, killing 30 people. World War I put the final nail in the coffin of man's dream of great optimism in how good man can make life on earth. The Gilded Age was gone.

"The rugged North Atlantic is a harsh and jealous sovereign, demanding of man's respect, vengeful against his arrogance." *

"It seems to me that the disaster about to occur was the event that not only made the world rub its eyes and awake, but woke it with a start. To my mind, the world of today awoke April 15, 1912." – Jack Thayer, Titanic Survivor *

This fits what the Lord told Israel before they entered the Promised Land in the Scripture at the top of the page from Deuteronomy 8. When life is going really well and prospering, there is a tendency to look to how great everything mankind is making things and forget about God.

Lest we think that this is only a history lesson, our lives currently mirror those of the Gilded Age. Technology is going insane with cars that can steer themselves for sale right now. People are going into outer space as sheer entertainment. Everyone has an outlook that everything is getting better in life and mankind will always come up with a solution to keep things getting better and better, even extending life, with a glimpse toward immortality.

Yet, it has been said that history repeats itself. What happened to this Gilded Age has also happened to our age. On November 10, 1975, the Great Lakes Freighter SS Edmund Fitzgerald sank and lost all 29 people on board. It has been commemorated by the most immortalized ballad of our era, "The Wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald" by Gordon Lightfoot. Even with all our great technology, man still can't conquer the forces of nature; even though Jesus can when He stilled the wind and the waves. (See Mark 4:39)

On January 28, 1986, the Space Shuttle Challenger

exploded shortly after take off with the crew of 7 all perishing. Even after we have gone to the moon and back several times, mankind still doesn't have mastery over space, even though God still controls the entire universe and all that it contains. "The heavens are telling of the glory of God; And their expanse is declaring the work of His hands." (Psalm 19:1)

On September 11, 2001, 18 terrorists brought the mightiest nation in the world to its knees. 2,996 people perished and our military didn't fire a shot. This was the first time in history that the United States has been attacked on her native shore; and if it has happened once, it can certainly happen again. It should be obvious by the recent debacle of trying to get people out of Afghanistan just how far our country has fallen.

What God did to rebuke the pride and arrogance of mankind to end the Gilded Age, He has also done to our age. But will we learn the lesson and humble ourselves before the Almighty and turn from our wickedness?

I see no indication of that happening.

Ever since the rise of modern science, and especially since the resurgence of ancient paganism in the guise of modern evolutionary "science," there has developed a sort of social compulsion to follow after whatever <u>seems to be new.</u> There are new philosophies and new religions and "modernized" versions of traditional doctrines — always some new idea. But the Eternal GOD does not change with the times. With Him, there "is no variableness, neither shadow of turning" (James 1:17). No one questions the value of true advances in science and technology. In fact, this is implicit in the primeval dominion mandate to "subdue" the earth (Genesis 1:28). Remove not the ancient land marks, which thy fathers have set" (Proverbs 22:28). When the true Gospel comes, however, it is genuine "Good News" to all who are not merely curious to hear "this new doctrine" (Acts 17:19), but who will appropriate it for themselves by faith. This new doctrine, in fact, is not new at all, but is that "hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began" (Titus 1:2).

Confusion

Numbers 10:1-20 (KJV): "And the Lord spake unto Moses, saying, Make thee two trumpets of silver; of a whole piece shalt though make them: that thou mayest use them for the calling of the assembly, and for the journeying of the camps. And when they shall blow with them, all the assembly shall assemble themselves to thee at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation. And if they blow but with one trumpet, then the princes which are heads of the thousands of Israel, shall gather themselves unto thee. When ye blow an alarm, then the camps that lie on the east parts shall go forward. When ye blow an alarm the second time, then the camps that lie on the south side shall take their journey: they shall blow an alarm for their journeys. But when the congregation is to be gathered together, ye shall blow, but you shall not sound an alarm. And the sons of Aaron, the priests, shall blow with the trumpets; and they shall be to you for an ordinance forever throughout your generations. And if ye go to war in your land against the enemy that oppresseth you, then you shall blow an alarm with the trumpets; and ye shall be remembered before the Lord your God, and ye shall be saved from your enemies. Also, in the day of your gladness, and in your solemn days, and in the beginnings of your months, ye shall blow with the trumpets over your burnt offerings, and over the sacrifices of your peace offerings; that they may be to you for a memorial before your God: I am the Lord your God."

In this day of mixed messages, not only from the world and the secular society we live in, but also from the many religions of the world, confusion can reign. Non-Biblical doctrines can even come from pulpits of many churches that identify themselves as Christian. This can make it very confusing both for young and old alike. For the young because, at least a good percentage of them, the ability to discern or use common sense has not yet fully developed. "Remember not the sins of my youth" (Ps 25:7a). That's why parents need to train up their children in the way they should go (Proverbs 22:6a) so they can resist the temptations and false teachings they will be exposed to in the world. This can be especially problematic if they have been brought up in a broken home, a home with no parent around to spend time with them, or where they receive little or no spiritual guidance from their parents or anyone else.

For adults, those things previously mentioned can carry over into adulthood. Also, confusion can come when teachings they have received in the past conflict with other teachings they are exposed to later. They can hover between two or three opinions for years and may even become exasperated and throw in the towel and quit trying to find the truth. Many have left the church because of what they view as hypocrisy. Just trying to please the flesh can turn adults away from sound teaching. We fight against not only principalities and powers of the air, but against our own flesh as well.

The Israelites, and I'm sure almost every society, used trumpets for the purposes as indicated in Numbers 10:1-20. The Israelites, who were traveling from Egypt to the promised land, used trumpets as signals, warnings, a call for gatherings and so forth. Even armies much more recent, such as in the Civil War, and the cavalry when the west was being settled, used trumpets, or bugles, to send out various messages critical to a battle or just to organize the troops. The message that the trumpet sounded had to be clear, precise and correct to avoid confusion in the ranks. We as Christians and as a church need a clear trumpet sound as well to guide us on our narrow Christian path. I Cor 14:8 says: "For if the trumpet gives an uncertain sound, who shall prepare himself to battle"? Imagine the confusion if a clear trumpet sound was not given when the Israelite tribes were to move out in a specified order on God's command, or during a battle?

It's hard enough to live the Christian life without having confusing messages. However, even with a clear message some will choose the wide path. But that does not excuse the church from proclaiming clear truth. There are struggles in our daily walk when the message is clear. But when we get conflicting messages, it makes it even more difficult. For example, some church bodies deny the inerrancy of scripture, and some say there are many roads to God. Some are even joining non-Christian religious groups and forming a sort of hybrid church. All of these examples can cause confusion for people when they see their church espousing one thing when scripture is saying another thing. Everything is upside down it seems. It's like the coast guard officer who was trying to radio a boat he could barely see in the fog to see if he was in trouble. He said "come in boat #9, boat #9 can you hear me"? Then he thought for a moment and remembered, "we don't have a boat #9". He then called again and said "Boat #6, are you in trouble"? It was only then he realized that Boat #6 was actually upside down.

Sometimes it's not just a blatant error with respect to the Scriptures that can be confusing. There are times when some pet doctrines are pounded on hard and loud. That's fine for clear biblical doctrines. However, when there is a doctrine that we just can't be dogmatic about, it can even become a point of separation when one group claims to have the final word on it, and mocks those who don't go along with them. Maybe it's a preacher who claims that "no other preachers have seen this except me". These "claims" can dominate the preaching in those particular churches, leaving many other clear doctrines or scriptures being neglected.

What then shall we do as a Christian body? Of course, we do not espouse a One-World church. However, there are some things that can be done to unify the people with respect to doctrine. This would help take some of the confusion out of the equation. Lutherans have documents that can function in that regard. The Augsburg Confession (usually the unaltered confession) is one example. There are Luther's small and large Catechisms. Also, there are the creeds of the church such as the Nicene Creed, the Apostles Creed and the Athanasian Creed. These can guide someone who is confused about what the scriptures teach. However, there is nothing that compares to the scriptures themselves. Therefore, the Scriptures must rule supreme as the divine authority. They must be considered infallible and any attempt to water the scriptures down must be stopped in its tracks. Any attempt to compromise on the scriptures during the Reformation was met with a scathing rebuke from Martin Luther. Compromise with respect to the Bible is not an option. Otherwise, confusion certainly would reign, leading to eternal consequences for many. I for one am glad that God included II Tim. 3:16-17 in the Scriptures to take out all doubt about the origin and infallibility of the scriptures where He says "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness. That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." I sure don't see anything confusing about that. Alleluia.

Self-esteem

Come to Jesus
