he future, we don't know what it holds, but it is not totally unknown. There is one and only one book that gives us a glimpse of what the future looks like. And that book is the Bible. Revelation 20 gives us one of those glimpses into the future.

Rev 20:12 says, "And I saw the dead, small and great, standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is the Book of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books." What do you suppose has been written in those books about you? Even as a Christian, would you want to be judged on that great day by what has been written? I wouldn't. But we're not just talking about the last year, it's everything, everything you've ever done, every time you've broken a commandment it's been written down, it's written in the books and waiting for judgment day.

So we have the books, plural, and we have the book, singular. There is only one of those, the second book, it's much smaller, there is not a lot written in this book, no deeds, no works, no sins, only one thing written in this book, names. Many names we would recognize; Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, David, Elijah, John the Baptist, Matthew, Paul, along with a mighty host of believers whom we've never heard of, but they are there in the book, row after row, page after page of names

The judgment of books. We will either be judged by what is written in the books, or we will be judged by what is written in the Book of Life. I know which one I want to be judged by, how about you? And it is the Lamb's book

of life, Revelation 21:27 identifies whose book it is. It's not Buddha's book, it's not Muhammad's book, it's not Maroni's book, it's not even the Pope's, or anyone else's book. It's the Lamb's book; He's the one who decides which names get written in. It's his heaven and He gets to decide.

Not everyone likes that idea. They think they should get to decide who makes it. Take for instance the great theologian Sophia Loren. She said,

"I'm not a practicing Christian, but I pray, that aught to count for something. I read the Bible, it's the most beautiful book ever written. I should go to heaven, otherwise it's not nice. It's not nice if God doesn't let everyone get into heaven, and I don't want to listen to anyone who tells me otherwise. When the Bible says that, it's not nice, I don't want to listen. I have not done anything wrong." Wow! That's quite a life she's lived! Perfection, but by whose standards? By her standards, or by God's standards?

It's not nice that God would send anyone to hell. That's not the way I want it to be. As long as you pray a little, as long as you give the "Good Book" a thumbs up, as long as you do nice things, you should get in, shouldn't you? I've got to admit, that's attractive. There is even something inside of me that wishes that were so. But it's not my Heaven, it's not my invitation. It's God's heaven, so He gets to decide.

What does Jesus say, how do you get in? Does He say, be nice, just try to be nicer. Does He say work real hard to be as good as you can? No actually he says Be

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Perfect, and it's not perfect as Sophia Loren is perfect, it's perfect as you Heavenly Father is perfect, there is quite a difference between the two.

How is our name written in the book of life? John 3:15, and 16 both say; "that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. And to believe has little to do with head knowledge, but has to do with heart knowledge and literally means to come along side of. Whosoever comes along side of and walks with Christ in fellowship should not perish but have eternal life. Again in John 17:3 Jesus says; "And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent." (NKJV) As I've already said, it's not what you know, it's who you know. This is the only way to have your name written in the Lamb's book of life.

Rev 20:15 says, "And anyone not found written in the Book of Life was cast into the lake of fire." At the end of Chapter 20 we have fire, we have it again in Chapter 21 verse 8; "But for the fearful and unbelieving and corrupt and murderers and sexually immoral and sorcerers and idolaters and all liars, their part will be in the lake that burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death." Everyone who has not been perfect according to God's standards, their part will be in the lake of fire. Uncomfortable things to think about I know. I understand the attraction of Sophia

Loren's theology, but I've searched the scriptures, and I have not found "nice" to be included as one of God's attributes.

But there is safety, there is a way of escape, and that is God's Son. We have a picture of fire in Chapter twenty and again in Chapter twenty one, but there is a place of safety between the fires for everyone whose name is written in the lamb's book of life.

Rev 21:3 says, "Behold, the tabernacle of God is with men, and He will dwell with them, and they shall be His people. God Himself will be with them and be their God." (NKJV)

The day is coming when there will be a new Heaven and a new earth, a New Jerusalem, and in Rev 21:5, "Behold, I make all things new." All things new, including these bodies we reside in! New! Untouched by sin. No death, no sorrow, no crying, no pain, but best of all it says, God Himself will dwell with us.

The future, what does it hold for us? Probably more of the same. Tears, death, sorrow, crying, and pain, for that is the way of this old Earth cursed by sin. But for those whose names are written in the Lamb's book of life, we have the promise of a new earth where righteousness dwells. A new earth where God Himself will dwell with us. We will no longer have to hide behind the covering of the blood of the lamb, we will see face to face. And standing face to face with God, he will take a handkerchief and wipe away every tear from our eyes. You've shed some tears this last year haven't you? I know you have. We all have, and I'm sure we will shed some tears this next year. But that's part of the former things that will pass away. Rev 21:4 says, "And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying. There shall be no more pain." (NKJV)

That's the glorious future of the redeemed, those whose names have been written in the Lamb's book of life. When the books are opened, and the book of life is opened, where will you be found? Our text starts with fire and ends with fire, but between the fires there is safety, and that safety and rest come through faith in Christ alone for our salvation. In Heb 4:1 we read, "Therefore, since a promise remains of entering His rest, let us fear lest any of you seem to have come short of it." (NKJV)

The One and Only Just and Righteous GOD!

"God is a just judge, And God is angry with the wicked (<u>UNGODLY SINNER/one</u> without God is included here!) every day. If he does not turn back, He will sharpen His sword..." (Psalm 7:11-12a)

IF you or I were an upright and righteous person and realized a person is destined for eternal penalty, who by no means can never set himself free from the just punishment he rightly deserved, what would you do?? We are talking about this prisoner; whom you dearly love, in spite of what this prisoner is bound for; what would you do? That is, EVEN the very best that you have and could sacrifice, even if it would actually make you poor, would you do all that in order to set this prisoner free? Well, that is exactly what GOD did on our behalf! We could be 'set-free' through His Beloved Son, Jesus **Christ.** And JESUS was willing to make Heaven poor that we might become rich – through His Finished work on CALVARY. He was the LAMB OF GOD without a spot or blemish, yet HE opened not His mouth – Isaiah 53:7, "He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He opened not His mouth; He was led as a lamb to the slaughter. And as a sheep before its shearers is silent, So He opened not his mouth,"

In other words, how can GOD forgive when HE already has forgiven & forgotten the sins of the sinner?

The verses above are directed towards and in preparation of partaking of the Lord's Supper. Sixty-two Percent of Americans Oppose Allowing Boys Who Identify as Female to Compete in Girls' Sports

Supreme Court Sides with Christian Student in College Free-Speech Class

Conservatives just secured a massive victory at the U. S. Supreme Court regarding free speech.

The Supreme Court ruled in an 8-1 decision that a Georgia college's speech code policy violated the First Amendment and that a student who was harmed by the policy can seek damages.

Justice Clarence Thomas issued the opinion of the Court, writing that nominal damages claims are enough to establish standing to sue for a constitutional violation. Chief Justice John Roberts was the only dissenter in the ruling favoring a couple of Christian students who challenged the University for restricting when, where and how they could speak about their faith and disseminate materials on campus.

Uzuegbunam et al. v. Preczewski et al. Chike Uzuegbunam, a student at Georgia Gwinnett College, was stopped by campus police for handing out religious materials on campus, a reported violation of the school's "Freedom of Expression Policy," which limited distributions and other expressions of free speech zones only with permission from the administration.

Biden Overturns Trump Rule Protecting Doctors from Being Forced to Kill Babies in Abortions

In June 2020, President Donald Trump issued a pro-life rule ...to block the effects of a dangerous Obamacare provision that could be used to compel doctors to participate in abortions.

On May 10, 2021 Joe Biden reversed it.

During the Trump administration, the Department of Health and Human Services finalized a rule that ...protected doctors, nurses and medical professionals from being compelled to assist abortions...

Before the November presidential election, Biden indicated he would eliminate conscience protection for pro-life healthcare providers, forcing them to adhere to pro-abortion ideology even if it conflicts with their medical judgment.

Supreme Court Schedules Review of Mississippi Abortion Ban

Pro-life advocates gladly welcomed the U.S. Supreme Court's announcement ...(May 12, (2021)) it would rule on the constitutionality of Mississippi's ban on abortions of unborn children whose gestational age is more than 15 weeks.

The case, *Dobbs v. Jackson Woman's Health Organization*, offers the High Court the opportunity next term to rein in a legal regime inaugurated in 1973 that has made the United States one of the permissive countries in the world regarding abortion rights. Mississippi's 2018 Gestational Age Act is one of many state laws enacted in recent years that establish prohibitions on Abortion at certain stages of pregnancy and offer challenges to *Roe v. Wade* that legalized the procedure nationwide.

The Supreme Court's next term begins in October and it is expected to issue an opinion in the case before it adjourns in the summer of 2022.

What About Hell? - Part III

"The Son of Man will send forth His angels, and they will gather out of His kingdom all stumbling blocks, and those who commit lawlessness, and will cast them into the furnace of fire; in that place there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth." (Matthew 13:41-42)

This is the third in a series of messages on the denials of Hell by the modern church, some of their reasons behind them and a biblical response to each one.

False Ideas Present Today:

Hell is not a place, but the suffering we endure in this life

This belief is presented because of John 16:33, which says, "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world." It is true that we have definite severe things in this world that are typically described as being "hellish," but that does not mean that there is no place of suffering in the afterlife. In the Scripture at the top of the page (Matt. 13:41-42), Jesus described hell as a literal place, "In THAT place." Jesus also called it a "Furnace of Fire." In Luke 16:23-24, the rich man in hell described the location where he was as "a Place Of Torment" and that he was in "Agony in this Flame" His ungodly soul went immediately upon death to punishment in the flames of hell with no stop at purgatory and no soul sleep between death and hell. Will we believe the Words of Jesus or not?

Hell defies the Love of God

The statement is made that God is Love and the precious love and compassion of God would never allow this kind of endless suffering and torment upon someone. But in the very verse that many know by heart, the difference is seen. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16) It doesn't say that God's Love says everyone, but the ones who believe should not perish. God's Love goes out to the whole world and seeks to save everyone, but only those who respond to God's Love in Jesus are saved and do not perish.

To say that God's Love could not allow for hell to exist is to not understand the attributes of God. It is not God's Love which does this, but God's Holiness. When people breach the holiness of God as sinful men, then Judgment is what they get. Even the consecrated high priest would perish at the Ark of the Covenant if he came at the wrong time or without the blood atonement. "And the LORD said to Moses, 'Tell your brother Aaron that he shall not enter

at any time into the holy place inside the veil, before the mercy seat which is on the ark, lest he die; for I will appear in the cloud over the mercy seat." (Lev. 16:2) This has nothing to do with the Love of God, but everything to do with the Holiness of God.

The meaning of the word "Holy" is "Separate." Unless the sinfulness of man is dealt with, they can't be in a holy God's presence. When Adam and Eve sinned against God in the Garden of Eden, God "drove" them out of the garden. This is more than just a polite request to leave, but a definite action of God to drive them out. It is virtually identical to what happens to people who are lost on Judgment Day. "And if anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the lake of fire." (Revelation 20:15) The angels of God will throw or cast these lost sinners into that lake of fire. It's almost a picture of grabbing a dog by the scruff of the neck and throwing it. This is not the Love of God, but the Wrath of God which does this.

If your personal sentiments can't believe that God Almighty would ever do such a thing, then you need to set aside your personal feelings, which change like the weather, and look instead to the Word of God, which never changes. "Forever, O LORD, Thy word is settled in heaven." (Psalm 119:89)

It is not reasonable (or fair) that God would punish people for an eternity for a life-time of sins

Human reason cannot understand the infinite ways of God. "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, Neither are your ways My ways," declares the LORD. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, So are My ways higher than your ways, And My thoughts than your thoughts." (Isaiah 55:8-9) The Bible is filled with things that are totally beyond the reason of man – like the Creation of the Universe out of nothing (Gen. 1) and a Virgin bearing a Son (Matt. 1).

If God's standard were for you to do your best, then it may seem fair that God would grade on a scale and give less duration of hell to those who were better in this life. But God states that the standard is not your best, but the absolute perfection of God Himself. "Therefore you are to be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Matt. 5:48) Everyone who does not achieve the righteousness of God is condemned regardless of how close or far away they come to that. God is perfectly just in condemning anyone for the sins they have committed, regardless of the number. It is not a question of how many sins a person has done, but the fact that they have no covering for their sins, because this comes only through Jesus. "I said therefore to you, that you shall die in your sins; for unless you believe that I am He, you shall die in your sins." (John 8:24)

In the Presence of the Lord

When a patient goes to his physician to be examined, he does not sit down and talk continuously. If a doctor had a patient who only sat down and talked all the time and left his office as soon as he was through talking, the physician would no doubt have a reason to believe that his patient was unbalanced. But the Great Physician has daily visits by just such patients, who leave Him as soon as they are through talking. Meanwhile He observes how sick these patients are. And He tries to persuade them to lie down quietly in order that He may examine them and ultimately heal them of their ailment.

Quiet hours, such as these, in the presence of the Lord, when the secret thoughts and counsels of the heart are laid bare in the light of God's truth have a twofold effect. In the first place, they humble us deeply. When we begin to see the uncleanness which clings to us in word, thought, and deed—even in our prayers and good deeds—than our hunger and thirst after righteousness become real indeed. The Gospel also begins to acquire a new and fresh appeal to our souls. We take refuge quietly and gratefully once again beneath the cross. And joy in the Lord gives us strength to take up the battle anew. A willing spirit again pervades us—the workmanship of God.

In the next place, these quiet hours in the presence of the Lord have a peculiarly healing effect. There is no more effective antidote for our sinful habits than to bring them into the light of God's presence. There are physical ailments which respond most readily to light treatments. The affected parts are exposed to light regularly for longer or shorter periods of time until the bacteria responsible for the illness have been destroyed. We do not have a more effective means of combating our sinful desires and sinful habits, which often tempt us and cause us to fall, than to expose them regularly to the light of the Lord's presence. Our sins never become so repulsive to us as when we see them in the light of the Crucified One.

Do you have a particularly weak point, one in which you fail day after day, perhaps many times a day? Then take care that you expose it to the light of God's presence. Tell Him immediately how seriously you have erred. Mention your sin by name. Tell Him about the dishonest way in which you are dealing with this sin how easily you are tempted to show favoritism toward it, make it appear in a better light than it is and look upon

it as harmless or innocent. Then you will experience how effective these light treatments are.

In the second place, permit me to indicate what a privilege and a joy it is to live in the presence of the LORD with all one's plans and purposes. Most people do not dare to take counsel with GOD. They have the unregenerate man's distrust of God, and think that it involves too great a risk to permit God to have His way. So, they take the helm into their own hands, and sooner or later run their skiff aground. What good fortune it is to have learned to trust God in such a way that we allow Him to be at the helm. It imparts to our lives, in the first place, inner poise and balance, even when we in making some of the momentous decisions of our lives, lay all our plans before the Lord and pray that we may be assured of what His will is in each particular instance.

There is, in the next place, an inner, peaceful joy connected with bringing one's plan and purposes into the presence of the Lord. The friendship of God, which we experience, gives life a depth and a wealth of riches that is more stable and permanent than even some of the other joys which can be experienced in fellowship with God.

And, finally, such a life, lived in the presence of the Lord with our deliberations and our purposes, will keep us from many a wrong road which we would have to take if we had the reins in our own hands.

It soon becomes apparent whether or not a Christian takes counsel with the Lord each day! It is wonderful to meet those simple-hearted believers who feel so dependent upon the Lord that He is the first One whose counsel they seek.

In the third place, I would mention the joy and privilege of living ones whole commonplace daily life in the presence of the Lord, to live through all one's joys and sorrows, great and small, one's encouragements and disappointments, one's seasons of work as well as rest, in fellowship with the Lord. To most of us, daily life consists of little, unnoticed acts and events, which, because they are commonplace and consistently repeated, quickly tire us and become monotonous. If we can see that the Lord is with us in the greater as well as in the lesser experience of life, then these become ever new to us. In the light of God's presence, the little events of our daily lives will take on an entirely new significance. Even the simplest and most retiring life will become rich and interesting when our inner eyes have been opened to see the Lord and recognize Him as He meets us in love in the prosperity or the adversity of each passing day. ...I do not know whether it is possible to glorify the LORD more than by living one's home life in the presence of the Lord. At least, there is no place where we

have so many opportunities to glorify GOD...

Our homes, more than anything else among our beloved people, are facing complete disintegration these days. It is therefore doubly important that the homes of the Christians become good homes, in order that sound and strong young people may be sent forth.

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The Colorblind God

As my wife and I entered the old Spanish fort on the island of Vieques, I immediately noticed the statue of a white woman with flowing blond hair and bright blue eyes. She was holding a child of similar complexion. The Roman Catholic symbolism made it obvious that this was Christian art. I assumed it to be the virgin Mary and the child Jesus, but I had never seen them depicted so Scandinavian. "Who's the woman?" I asked the Puerto Rican man behind the counter, as I pointed toward the statue. "It is Saint Barbara, the protector of the fort," he replied. Now knowing I had the identity of the woman wrong, I wondered if I had the identity of the child wrong as well. "Who's the kid?" I asked. The man looked at me as if I had spoken blasphemy. It is God!" he said, "The Lord! Jesus!"

Embarrassed, I sought to justify my error. "It's just that Jesus probably did not look like that," I said. "He was Jewish. He would have looked more like you than me. His skin would have been darker. His hair and eyes probably brown." "How do you know this?" asked the man. "I'm a Lutheran pastor," I replied. "What is a Lutheran?" he asked. I responded; "We are followers of Jesus. We believe the Bible teaches that we are saved by faith alone, through grace alone, in Christ alone." "...and by being good." He added, as if I had left something out.

Three unmistakable evidences of being born again:

- 1) Keeping His Word I John 2:5
- 2) Loving the brethren I John 3:14
- 3) The Spirit bears witness with our spirit Romans 8:16

"NO!" I replied. "We try to be good, because God is good, but it doesn't save us." "Only Jesus does that."

Over the next twenty minutes, my wife toured the Spanish fort, while the man and I took an express trip through the book of Romans. As we stood next to each other, shoulder to shoulder, both looking up Bible verses on our phones, the man couldn't get enough of the idea that Jesus did everything necessary to bring him Eternal Life, and I began to notice the identifying marks of a life lived hard. His visible skin displayed a few deep scars. His arms were covered in amateur tattoos, and the wrinkles on his face aged him well beyond his years. I wanted to know his story, but didn't ask. Something told me our limited time was better spent in the Word of God.

"We know that whatever the Law says, it says to those who are under the Law, so that every mouth may be silenced the whole world held accountable to GOD. Therefore no one will be declared righteous in GOD'S sight by the works of the Law, rather, through the Law we become conscious of our sin. But now apart from the Law the righteousness of GOD has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness is given through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference between Jew and Gentile, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of GOD, and all are justified freely by His grace through the redemption that came by JESUS CHRIST." (Romans 3:19-25a) GOD presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of His BLOOD — to be received by faith.

As I sensed my time with the man coming to a close, I asked him, "Do you believe what you have read today?" He replied, "I need to see it in Spanish. I have a Spanish Bible at home. I will look up the verses you gave me." "Please do," I said, "But the important thing is not the color of His skin, it is the fact that He took on skin — that HE became human like us — so HE could die as a sacrifice for us."

A few seconds later, a group of new tourists entered the fort, and I bid the man farewell. I left that place amazed by God's relentless pursuit of the broken.

Are you broken? Does your soul bear the marks of a life lived hard? Perhaps today you need to be reminded that God pursues you as well! There is no scar too deep, no sin so ugly, that it <u>cannot be covered by the</u> **Blood of Christ.**

Call to Jesus. HE does not discriminate. Those who call on the Name of the LORD, He heals, and those who believe He saves.

The Firstborn of Every Creature

"Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature." (Colossians 1:15)

A widespread cultic heresy based on this verse claims that Jesus Christ was not eternal, but merely the first being created — perhaps an angel — before becoming a man. Note, however, that the verse does not say He was the "first created of every creature," but the "first born of every creature." In fact, the very next verse says that <u>BY HIM WERE ALL THINGS CREATED</u>" (verse 16). He was never created, for He, Himself, is the Creator. "All things were made by Him; and without Him was not anything made that was made" (John 1:3).

He is "born" of God, not "made," the only begotten Son (John 3:16). "No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, He hath declared Him" (John 1:18). The eternal Father is omnipresent, and therefore invisible, inaudible, inaccessible to the physical senses. The eternally existing Son is the "image" of the invisible Father, the One who declares, reveals, embodies His essence. Although He is always "in the bosom of the Father," yet He is eternally also "the brightness of His glory, and the express image of His person" (Hebrews 1:3). He is the eternal, living Word, which was "in the beginning with God: (John 1:2), and which "was God" (John 1:1).

Thus, the phrase, "<u>firstborn of every creature</u>" in our text, can be translated literally as "<u>begotten before all creation</u>." The eternal-inner-relationship of the Persons of the Godhead is <u>beyond</u> human comprehension in its fullness, and the terms; "Son" and "begotten" are the best human language can do to describe it. Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh, is the only begotten, eternally generated, Son of the Father, forever shining forth as the image of the otherwise invisible God.

Think of it! A king who was a choice young man! A king who stood head and shoulders above any other man in Israel! A king who was kingly in appearance! A king who had a great friend in Samuel the prophet!

A king who wore the garments of royalty! A king who had a crown, a scepter, a throne! A king who had an army at his command! Doing what! Chasing a flea. A ludicrously grotesque comedy, all tragedy!

A king prostituting great authority to ignore ends, wasting great energies in cheap trivialities, despising great opportunities with sinful scorn! A king dishonoring himself with cheap littleness-an eagle coming down to titmouse dimensions, "contracting his firmament to the

compass of a tent."

A king shooting a cannon at sparrows, charging anthills with drawn swords, fishing for minnows with an anchor hook, lassoing tabby cats with cart ropes, seeking to capture a flea!

Saul is a type of any and all who use their mental endowments, their physical energies, their educational advantages, their spiritual privileges, their all, in seeking those things that matter little—following the paths that lead eventually and inevitably to the land of nobody-ism.

In the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus made it clear that everyone with whom we come in contact with is our neighbor. Jesus used the example of someone from Samaria being the neighbor to a beaten and dying Jew. Normally, Jews and Samaritans had nothing to do with each other because the Jews, as God's chosen people, considered the Samaritans outcasts with a corrupted form of Worship. By using this example, Jesus made it clear that "our neighbors" includes even people with whom we may disagree on some of the basic things in life.

How do we engage neighbors who we have already decided would never be interested in the Gospel? You know, those who are so different from us that we sometimes think they must have been raised in a different world then we were. Certainly, they would be the first ones to reject any overtures by us. Does that let us off the hook?

We all know the story of the crucifixion. Jesus was nailed to a cross between two criminals who, along with the crowd, mocked JESUS. Yes, even these two who were also despised by the crowd made fun of our LORD. But something dramatic happened during the hours that Jesus and the criminals hung on the *cross*. One of them became convinced that Jesus was the Son of God and received the gift of Eternal Life, just moments before he left this earth. The other criminal, who heard and experienced the same things as the one who believed, left this life for Eternal punishment. (Editor: Both 'eternities' are of the same length of time). How can two people who saw and heard the same "truths" at the same time from the same person (Jesus) respond so differently? We don't know. BUT the implication is that only GOD knows who will receive His gift of salvation. Only HE can save! That is not our job. Our job is to give the "Truth" (Ed. privilege/responsibility – Romans 1:14-17) to everyone we can.

People tend to distrust and disbelieve those they do not know. So, the likelihood is small of our 'neighbors' with whom we have had little or no contact listening to us. Are there things we can do to improve the inclination of such neighbors to hear the Message from us? Here are a few:

- 1. Pray that God would change our heart toward anyone that we assume would not be receptive to hearing the Gospel. After all, it is God's Word that creates faith and receptivity to the Good News.
- **2.** Pray for them, and for anyone we meet, that God would prepare their hearts to receive His Good News. Sometimes we speak and act as though prayer is the last

resort when it is actually the most powerful thing we can do.

3. Be kind and helpful to our neighbor, treating them with respect. Do not condemn them for their ideas or try to persuade them that your way of thinking is the only one that makes sense. Instead, lovingly give them God's Truth, which can meet them where they are and penetrate all their defenses. Remember, God's Word alone can bring life to the dead. Our words can never do that unless we are speaking the Words of LIFE.

May God give us his grace to share His Love and Good News with those around us. And let us share that Message with those around the world through the ministries of the CLB (Ed. & Morning Glory, etc.). May GOD bless you as you labor and give to His Glory.
