His Grace, Our Witness

hile grace and truth came by Jesus Christ, the witness of grace has been committed to man. "There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all men through him might believe. He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light." (John 1:6-8)

The <u>fact</u> that the witness was a man and that his name was John can hardly be without importance. It has been given to man to bear <u>witness</u> of the LIGHT! The name <u>John</u> means "God is gracious."

It is most fitting that the name of the witness should so harmonize with his 'message'. Is it not equally fitting that the one to whom was entrusted the writing of the Gospel which records the bringing of grace and truth should also be named John?

This man who bore witness was "sent from God," a most essential condition for one who is to bear witness to grace. Such a one will be fully qualified to <u>bear witness of GRACE</u>. He came to <u>bear witness</u> of the LIGHT. It is of the Light and the Light alone! No other issues are involved.

It is in no sense a witness of anything that is good in man or the accomplishments of man. It does not expose the deeds of darkness. The Light itself will do that. It is not of the guilt of the world. That is the testimony of <u>(God's)</u> Law (Romans 3:19)

So also, he who would bear to the world witness of the Light must center his whole message in Him by whom came grace and truth. It must tell of what HE is and what He has

done. There is no room here for a moral reform or social betterment program!

He came to bear witness of the Light that all men through him might believe. Here is the first mention in John's Gospel of the word "believe" (Ed. the word 'believe' means to come to faith in action; not just head knowledge) This word includes within itself all that man must do in order to become partakers of grace and truth (Ed. As you know, repentance first).

It is used in its various forms about a <u>hundred times</u> in this Gospel.

JESUS SAID that it was God's work to cause men to believe on Him whom God had sent (John 6:29) and the purpose of the writing of the GOSPEL was that men might believe and believing, might have life (John 20:31).

IF, anything more than believing were necessary to receive eternal life, then it most assuredly would have been mentioned in that Book which is especially written to show the way to Eternal Life!

"He (John the Baptist) was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light" (1:18). He was but a witness of the Light. HOW IMPORTANT THAT IS! Under GRACE man is not the light of the world. ONLY the WORD that was with God and was GOD is the Light of the world.

<u>Grace</u> is God's infinite provision in love and that includes regeneration or the gift of Eternal Life, which is infinitely more than mere restoration of the life that was lost by Adam's sin.

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"He who is justified stands in grace and has access to that grace by faith" (Romans 5:2) ALL that the believer is, is by GRACE (I Corinthians 15:10) and GOD'S GRACE is sufficient to meet ALL needs (II Corinthians 12:9).

Gifts for "the perfecting of the saint, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we all come...unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ," are said to be grace given "according to the measure of the gift of Christ." (Ephesians 4:7-13)

Then there is "the grace that is to be brought ...at the revelation of Jesus Christ." (I Peter 1:13) This is the culminating provision of the God of all grace, who hath called us unto his eternal glory by Christ Jesus.

<u>In</u> all this is grace not only to redeem and justify the sinner, but to take him through the vicissitudes of his earthly life and finally conform him to the image of the Son of God.

That is grace upon grace! This is the grace and truth that came by Jesus Christ. It is all of the fullness of Christ and in no way comes from the effort of man.

In bringing this message of grace upon grace, John realized that he was nothing in himself. He was but "the voice of one crying in the wilderness" (vs. 23). He was but an instrument used by ANOTHER! That is the true condition of man witnessing to the Grace. (Romans 6:13)

Jesus has Scars

On July 9, 2020, a six-year-old boy and his four-year-old sister were at a friend's house. After growing bored inside, the three children decided to play in the backyard. Upon entering the yard, the friend pointed to one dog and said, "That's the nice dog." He then pointed to a second dog, a German Shepherd, and said, "That's the mean one."

Immediately, the mean one trotted over to the little girl! Her older brother could tell the dog intended to harm her, so he stepped between them. The dog tried to go around him, but the boy refused to let it pass. He knew the danger. He later said, 'one of us had to die, I thought it should be me.'

HE WAS SIX!

When the dog was blocked a second time from reaching the little girl, it bit the boy on his face! It grabbed hold of him, tearing him open below the eye to the corner of the mouth. Later, it would take <u>ninety</u> stitches to put his face back together! When the dog finally let go, the boy did not cry for help. Instead, he stood up, put himself between the dog and his sister

again, and took her to a place in the yard where he thought she would be safe.

My heart sank as the nightly news broadcast photos of the young boy's face! It was as IF all the world's brokenness was held in that one image! At that moment, my son's voice cut through the room, reminding me of the Gospel! HE said, "That's what Jesus did for us." I asked him, "How so?" and he replied, "The devil wants to destroy us, but Jesus steps in front of him." (Isaiah 53:4-5)

Surely He took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered Him punished by GOD, Stricken by Him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on Him, and by His wounds we are healed.

We are all helpless little four-year-olds, and the enemy of our souls is in the yard. The Apostle Peter tells us, "The devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour"! (1 Peter 5:8). We appear defenseless to such a foe. Our sin has left us exposed! In our frailty, he whispers that we are abandoned. In our strength, he tells us that we are gods! When we are kind, he tells us that we are righteous!

What a clever foe! He crosses the yard, hell-bent to harm us! The power of his jaws is unmatched, but JESUS steps in. The Apostle Paul writes, "None of the rulers of this age understand it, for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory" 1 Corinthians 2:8. The rulers of this age were bent on evil, but what they intended for evil, God meant for good! As Jesus gave up His Spirit, the chains of Hell were broken forever.

Do you have scars? I am sure that you do! Some are visible, and others remain hidden, so deep you dare not speak of them. <u>Hear this:</u> your scars will soon disappear. A day is coming when the only scars you will see will be those that belong to our Lord.

When your enemy attacks you with your sin, remind him of the One who scars mark the wound by which we have been healed, the One whose scars hold all the brokenness of the world. That will silence Him, until the day he is silenced forever by our Savior!



The Passover was always meant to serve as a picture of the Son of God's <u>sacrifice</u>. The <u>lambs</u> who died that



Tik Tok and Other "Prohibited Technologies" Banned on All Texas State Devices

Still, John Newton discovered that God in Christ's deep and abiding love does not give up on anyone. In his opening stanza, he lifts up the story of the prodigal restored to sonship (Luke 15:11-32) and the blind man who received his sight (John 9). Both aptly describe his being blessed in the mercies of Christ saving grace!

'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears relieved; 'Tis grace has brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home.

John Newton had been through a lot of trials over the years, so for his sermon on New Year's Day 1773, he selected the text from David's phrase, "brought me thus far" for his hymn, adding only the word <u>safe</u> – for he knew the dangers and dire straits of the Sea, BUT he also trusted the God who would see him home. That is why the original title of "Amazing Grace" published in print was I Chronicles 17:16-17, Faith's Review and Expectation."

The Lord has promised good to me, His Word my hope secures; He will my shield and portion be As long as life endures.

Newton inscribed two verses from Scripture over his fireplace to remind him of God's providential and freeing grace. The first of these is Isaiah 43:4. It speaks of God's election of his chosen people. Newton believed, in spite of all his many sins, that he was chosen by the Grace in Christ. The second text over his fireplace was Deuteronomy 15:15, which is about setting slaves free. Later in his life, he would work for the abolitionist movement. Newton published against slavery in his, Thoughts upon the African Slave Trade (1788); and through his friendship with the politician William Wilberforce, he addressed the House of Commons on the Slave Trade Act,

which abolished the slave trade in May 1807, seven months before he died. The Slavery Abolition Act was passed on <u>July 22, 1833</u>, one week before Wilberforce died. The <u>2006</u> major motion picture <u>Amazing Grace</u> chronicled the interlacing lives of Newton and Wilberforce and the parts <u>these two men</u> played in ending slavery in the British Empire.

Yes, when this flesh and heart fail, And mortal life shall cease, I shall possess, within the veil, A life of joy and peace.

This fifth stanza of <u>(rarely, if ever, sung today)</u> speaks of the time of our death as time of hope. Hope takes on the symbol of an anchor, a solid mooring that a ship would need, <u>especially on rough waters!</u> Newton the <u>sea captain</u> would certainly have had plenty of experience with the <u>importance</u> of an <u>anchor</u>. His own hope is anchored, or grounded, in Jesus, the priest who has taken his place at the Throne of GOD in the Holy of Holies "within the veil" Hebrews 6:19.

The earth shall soon dissolve like snow, The sun forbear to shine; But God, who called me here below, Will be forever mine.

The first two lines of this stanza referring to dissolving earth and a sun refusing to shine are from John Newton's reading of the end times in 2 Peter 3:10: "But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be destroyed with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed." BUT near the end of his own life was, by the Grace of God in Christ, shielded, cared for and guarded as a precious child of God.

When we've been there
Ten thousand years,
Bright shining as the sun,
We've no less days to sing God's praise
Then when we'd first begun.

This final stanza was not part of Newton's original hymn. The lyrics are actually from "Jerusalem My Happy Home" (1790), reproduced in Harriet Beecher Stowe's own representation of the hymn in her novel *Uncle Tom's Cabin* (1852). By 1910, it became affixed to the hymn "AMAZING GRACE" as a fitting doxology to God's ever abundant grace.

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The Plagues of Passover

The plagues represent God's assault upon false gods of Egypt; His declaration that He is the superior ruler of the universe.

The God of Power

One of the major components of the Passover story is the 10 plagues with which GOD afflicted Egypt. Sometimes the account of the plagues get glossed over as mere high drama, but the account is crucial to 21st century Christians' understanding of just who God is.

Yes, the Passover is a glorious display of God's mercy and redemption: as He redeemed Israel from Egypt, so Christ (<u>symbolized by the slain Passover lamb</u>) redeems all who believe in Him from the bondage and eternal consequences of sin.

But in the <u>plagues</u>, another attribute of GOD was revealed: His power. In the 10 plagues, God's might and sovereignty over ALL Creation was on full display. And as it was so long ago in Egypt, so it will be again at the end of the age when <u>our all-powerful</u> God will pour out His fierce anger upon a wicked, unrepentant Earth during that time the Bible calls the Day of the Lord.

Quick Background

The background, of course, is Israel's <u>400 years</u> of Egyptian bondage, and how God chose to terminate it. For the God of Israel, it was not enough to simply emancipate His people, but to show both them and the Egyptians – particularly Pharaoh – exactly who He was: the Sovereign Creator of the Universe who is God over all – including Egypt.

By way of identifying Himself this way, He instituted a series of plagues to bring home His point. These plagues were: blood, frogs, gnats, flies, livestock, boils, hail, locusts, darkness, and the death of all the firstborn.

The Word "Plagues"

The Hebrew word for "plagues' used here is <u>nega</u>, which can be translated "disease," "affliction," and "wound." But there is another sense of <u>nega</u> which means "to strike" or "afflict." In modern English, the word "plague" carries with it the sense of communicable disease and epidemics. This is not necessarily the sense here.

Rather, when we read of the 10 plagues, we should think more in term of "judgments." These are not so much the <u>10 plagues of God</u>," but the *ten judgments of God*."

The Target

Furthermore, these were not just some haphazard

concoctions of afflictions being hurled at the Egyptians. The God of Israel had a very specific purpose, including an assault upon the false gods of Egypt. GOD would not only display to the Egyptians He was the superior ruler of the universe, but that their false deities were worthless, powerless, and pointless.

The God of Israel had a very specific purpose, including an assault upon the false gods of Egypt. These were, in essence, an attack on the entire Egyptian worldview.

Everything which helped the Egyptians make sense of the world came crumbling down around them. Also, these attacks on Egyptian deities would be much more obvious and specific to Egyptians living at that time than at any other time of history.

Let's take a brief look at the 10 plagues and the deities the plagues targeted.

Blood (Exodus 7:14-25)

More than one deity was targeted here: Hapi, the god of the Nile, and Khnum, the god of the water and life. As blood filled the Nile, many Egyptians were no doubt wondering why Hapi and Khnum were not rectifying the situation.

*Frogs (*Exodus 8:1-15)

As frogs consumed the land, the god Heqet was in view. Heqet was the wife of the above-mentioned Khnum, and was usually depicted as a frog. Heqet was the goddess of childbirth, but she was ineffective in stopping the spread of all those reeking amphibians!

Gnats (Exodus 8:16-19)

God told Moses to "Say unto Aaron, Stretch out thy rod, and smite the dust of the land, that it may become lice throughout all the land of Egypt" (v.16). The gnats were *probably* mosquitoes, and an attack on Geb, the god of the land, specifically the dirt.

Flies (Exodus 8:20-32)

The Hebrew_word for flies literally translates into "swarms." This was an attack on Khepri, the Egyptian god of creation, the movement of the Sun, and of rebirth. Khepri had the head of a fly.

Livestock (Exodus 9:1-7)

The plague of livestock was an assault on the credibility of Apis, the male god of fertility, often represented as a bull. This plague also could have targeted Nut, a sky

goddess depicted as a cow.

Boils (Exodus 9:8-12

This was an attack on Qudshu, goddess of sex, indicating that the boils likely afflicted the genital area.

Hail (Exodus 9:13-35)

This was an attack on Seth, god of wind and storms.

Locusts (Exodus 10:1-20)

This plague was an attack on Serapis, the god of protection on the land; Isis, the goddess of life associated with flax and making clothes; or Min, the god of fertility and vegetation, whose job it was to protect the crops. Most likely, the attack was on all three false deities.

Darkness (Exodus 10:21-29)

This was an attack on major deities associated with the Sun and Sky: Re, Ra, Amon Re; Atum, and Horus.

<u>Death of the Firstborn</u> (Exodus Chapter 11)

This terrible plague was an attack on Pharaoh himself, who was regarded as not just a human king, but a god, as well. That his firstborn son died proved he was no match for the God of Israel.

Lessons of the Plagues

The 10 plagues, or judgments, of Egypt prove GOD is the Creator of all things and that all of His Creation is at His disposal to do with as HE pleases. May we stand in awe of the God who created us, and acknowledge His power, glory, and goodness!

In 1986 when I was 6 years old, I went to live in South Africa. During that time my parents came to know the Lord as their Savior in the Rhema Church. I was eager to learn more and so I began to read the Bible for myself and always prayed before reading saying "God if this is really your Word, show it to me, make me understand it." One night while I was reading Psalm 91 it seemed as if God was talking to me through His word, and it said in verses 9, 10, 14-16 "if you say, "The Lord is my refuge," and you make the Most High your dwelling, no harm will overtake you, no disaster will come near your tent. "Because he loves me," says the Lord, "I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name. He will call on me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him. With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation."

Suddenly I became aware that the Lord loved me and He wanted me to entrust my life to Him. I was so afraid of dying and in the Psalm, I saw that the Lord wanted to satisfy me with LONG LIFE!!! Was I able to believe that He was capable to do this, that He was able to rescue me, protect me, answer me, be with me, deliver me, save me, and keep my life until I got old? Eventually I fell asleep and I had a dream, and in that dream I was in a classroom in a very high building where the walls were all glass. I was seated like the rest of the people there and suddenly there was a massive roar of thunder. We all knew that the building was going to collapse and we were all going to die. I was so scared, I thought about God, and I cried out "Lord have mercy on me." As I said this I felt something grabbing me and picking me up and taking me to a safe place on solid ground. When I woke up I knew that it had something to do with what I had read in God's Word, about putting all my trust in the Lord Jesus.

That morning I decided to give my life to the Lord Jesus and received Him as my Saviour. I repented from my sins and I put all my trust in Him.

Days passed and I soon realized that the panic attacks were gone and I was completely healed from the depression that I was also suffering. Soon I started going to church, got baptized, got married to Tania, and I had a hunger for the Word of God. I started reading more and more and listening to as many sermons as I could. Now my purpose in life is to serve and follow Jesus and it is such a blessing to be involved along with my wife and family in the ministry in Santo Andre Church with Pastor Aroldol, Emmannuelle and Jeffrey.

Humility

Changed and Charged

"For I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation..." (Romans 1:16)

Belfast's urban redevelopment undoubtedly provided many new houses to replace the streets of two-up-two-down small terrace houses. However, the once familiar name of "... Street" were transformed into "...Gardens', ...Close" or "...Court". In this regeneration programme not only did street names change, but also communities lost their local "corner shop," and many small mission halls became extinct.

Among those halls that closed was Banbury Street Mission Hall. It had a remarkable beginning. In the early 1920s, a group of fellows gathered on Sunday afternoons to play cards and gamble their money on a plot of spare ground on Banbury Street. One day in 1923 a brave and zealous Christian dared to invite these young men to attend an evangelistic Mission at a church on the Newtownards Road. The evangelist was William Patterson Nicholson from Bangor, but the name meant nothing to the lads. However, they agreed to go.

During that mission over 1,000 people professed faith in Christ. On that Sunday afternoon five young men were converted: ... These were the lads who had gambled their money at Banbury Street every Sunday.

After their conversion, Jimmy White involved his chums in serving the Lord and between them they acquired the spare ground on Banbury Street where they formerly had wasted time and money. Instead, they invested their meagre funds in purchasing and erecting a wooden hall for evangelistic meetings in this area. This was a forerunner of the more permanent brick building that was constructed some years later.

Out of remarkable beginnings, the Banbury Street Mission Hall was a Gospel Beacon in that part of East Belfast until urban development transformed the community.

Questions & Answers

By Dr. Bill Rice Answers: *Are J.W.s' a Cult?* Dear Dr. Bill:

I have a question: Are the Jehovah's Witnesses an occult religion? IF they are considered to be so, <u>why</u>? I would most deeply appreciate all the information that you can send me.

I believe you intended asking If Jehovah's Witnesses are a cult rather than an "occult" religion. By occult is generally meant mysticism, magic, perhaps <u>astrology</u>; and we usually think of it as originating in the East.

<u>Cult</u>, on the other hand, means a system of religious worship that is not based on biblical truth. It <u>may</u> use Scriptures – usually taken out of context and perverted – to "<u>prove</u>" its beliefs. Often a cult is originated by a strong personality who is almost worshiped by his followers. *Jehovah's Witnesses* are <u>definitely a cult</u>. They are not to be trusted.

Charles Taze Russell — For many years Jehovah's Witnesses' beliefs were known as Russellism, named for the founder, Charles Taze Russell. Russell was a promoter who could have made P.T. Barnum jealous! Barnum is credited with the saying that a sucker is born every minute. Russell acted on this belief before anyone ever heard of the famous Barnum and Bailey Circus! Once Russell sold wheat for \$60 a bushel to many of his followers. (None but the "faithful" could buy this wheat.) The reason for the

high price was his promise that his wheat would grow five times as much as average wheat.

It's too bad he wasn't more "faithful" himself. His wife sued him for divorce and in court he admitted his guilt. But in spite of his crooked business practices and his wicked life, thousands of his followers today believe him to be the greatest Christian who ever lived!

Of course, the name of his cult has changed a number of times. From Russellism it was changed to *Millennial Dawn*. Later the name was changed to *Watchtower and Tract Society*. Yet later the name was changed to the *International Bible Students Association*.

When Russell died in 1916, Judge Joseph Franklin Rutherford became the head of this cult and he changed the name to *Jehovah's Witnesses*. The judge died in 1942 and the name of the cult has not been changed since.

Aggressive — The followers of this wicked cult work with admirable energy and zeal. When I was a little boy people would come to ranches in West Texas and try to sell pamphlets by Judge Rutherford.

If a rancher could not buy the pamphlet, the J.W. would swap it for a dozen eggs or a jar of jelly. If all else failed, he would let him borrow the pamphlet until he came that way again! But these "witnesses" simply would not take no for an answer if they could help it.

It is tragic that Christians do not help get out the Gospel of Christ with the same zeal with which these false witnesses spread their heresy. "Heresy" it is. They are wrong on virtually every Bible doctrine. As a matter of fact, they put more trust in the writings of their leaders than they do in the Holy Scriptures...

False Doctrines — Jehovah's Witnesses use Scriptures in such a way that the late Dr. H. A. Ironside said of them, "This is indeed a sect of perdition; and its teaching is rightly labeled 'damnable heresy.' From such turn away.'"...

The Trinity – Russell said, "This view suited well the Dark Ages, which it helped to produce." He also said this; "theory is as unscriptural as it is unreasonable" – this in spite of the fact that the Bible plainly teaches the Trinity. In Genesis 1:26 the Bible says, "And God said, Let, us make man in our image, after our likeness." Notice the plural pronouns. ... In the Great Commission we are commanded to baptize people in the name of the "Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost (Spirit) Matthew 28:19. First Corinthians 12:4 through 6 mentions the Spirit, Lord and God. Jehovah's Witnesses are certainly wrong about the TRINITY! ...

The Deity of Christ — Jehovah's Witnesses believe that Jesus was "chief of the angels and next to the Father." They believe that "God the Father created Jesus and God has two sons — Jesus and Satan."

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

Mirror of the Heart


