hough harvest festivals and Thanksgiving celebrations have been observed in America ever since the Pilgrims began tilling the soil in the new world, it was not until 1864 that President Lincoln issued a proclamation in which he "appointed and set aside" the last Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day for all of the United States of America. From that year till this there has been a successive traditional trek "over the river and through the woods to Grandmother's house" on the last Thursday of November of every year (except two years during the Roosevelt New Deal era).

It is well to have a day set aside when the harvest is completed in which we give thanks to "God, who giveth the increase." *The sin of ungratefulness is perhaps the most common, and a very serious sin indeed.* May God give us grace to "count our many blessings." May we say with David: "Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous; for praise is comely for the upright. Praise the Lord with harp; sing unto Him with the psaltry and an instrument with ten strings. Sing unto Him a new song; play skillfully with a loud voice. For the Word of the Lord is right; and all His works are done in truth. He loveth righteousness and judgment. The earth is full of the goodness of the Lord. By the Word of the Lord were the heavens made; and all the host of them by the breath of His mouth. He gathereth the waters of the sea together as an heap: He layeth up the depth in storehouses.

"Let all the earth fear the Lord: let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of Him. For He spake and it was done; He commanded and it stood fast. The Lord bringeth the counsel of the heathen to naught: He maketh the devices of the people of none effect. The counsel of the Lord standeth for-

ever, the thoughts of His heart to all generations. Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord; and the people whom He hath chosen for His own inheritance." (Ps. 33: 1-12).

Good health, a comfortable income, goodly and obedient children are contributing factors to our well-being and a happy life; but if these and like blessings are taken for granted for days, weeks months and years, we are treading on dangerous ground. Man is prone to conclude that it is his own brawn and brain that has brought him prosperity.

"For who maketh thee to differ from another? and what hast thou that thou didst not receive? now if thou didst receive it, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not received it? (I Cor. 4:7). Man is not flesh alone, neither does he "live by bread alone." Hence, a child of God sees many things besides the material for which to be thankful.

The enemies of Daniel conspired against him and induced King Darius to sign an irrevocable decree "that whosoever shall ask a petition of any god or man for thirty days save thee, O king, he shall be cast into the den of lions."

Daniel was fully aware that the decree had become the law of the land, yet, "went into his house; and his window being open in his chamber toward Jerusalem, he kneeled upon his knees three times a day, and prayed, *and gave thanks* before his God, as did aforetime." (If Daniel had lived in our time, the Communists would have called him a reactionary.)

Daniel did not have a home with a charming wife and goodly and obedient children, no flourishing business or

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fertile farm; rather, he was under severe persecution in a strange land. Yet came he before his God in prayer and thanksgiving. This-was not a once-a-year attendance at a Thanksgiving service where a person with an upside down collar reads a prayer handed down from his granddaddy; but Daniel prayed at the risk of the lions' den, "three times a day as aforetime, " irrespective of "the law of the Medes and the Persians, which altereth not."

But what could a captive in a strange land, surrounded by cruel conspirators whose thirst for innocent blood was boundless, have to be thankful for?

Above all else he must have been thankful that he was "a child of the King!" Not a child of Nebuchadnezzar or Belshazzar or Darius, but a child of the King of kings and the Lord of lords. A child of the King who created the heavens and the earth. A child of the King of whom we read: "How great are his signs! His kingdom is an everlasting kingdom and His dominion is from generation to generation" (Dan. 4:3).

We can be sure that Daniel like the apostles rejoiced that he "was counted worthy to suffer shame for his name." Where are the Daniels of our day? To have "inner convictions" is fine, but why don't some of our "milktoastish" ministers and "wooden Indian" laymen stand up so we can see how deep their convictions are?

Gift of A Second Chance

Daniel can sum up his childhood in three words: <u>a</u>ddiction, <u>a</u>buse, and <u>a</u>bandonment! An abusive, heavy pot-smoking mother and mostly absent alcoholic father are how he describes his upbringing. Growing up surrounded by drugs and alcohol, the use of substances at an early age seemed normal. He enjoyed drinking and wasn't afraid to experiment with other drugs. Lacking support, Daniel struggled in school and dropped out in the eleventh grade.

By the time he was twenty, Daniel became a daily, round-the-clock drinker. (Ed. No-doubt he began with that <u>first</u> drink). "I used to think I was a "functional alcoholic," but the <u>truth</u> is that I couldn't function without it," he shared. Even a diagnosis of type 1 diabetes didn't stop his drinking, but it would be the beginning of a real downfall for Daniel.

His addiction made it difficult to keep a job and pay rent! Daniel moved from one toxic environment to the next, and his health declined. Daniel developed a serious infection that resulted in a toe amputation! "Alcohol, the one thing that had always been there for me, was beginning to work against me," he said.

Daniel lost hope. Wanting to end his life, he overdosed on high blood pressure pills. By the Grace of GOD, Daniel survived. After receiving care at a local treatment center, he was referred to New Life Center.

TODAY Daniel is sober and feels blessed to have a *second chance at life!* GOD is at work in Daniel's life at the Mission as he receives needed care in a safe and supportive environment. He's hopeful for the future! Dan-

iel's long-term goal is to one day work with at-risk youth.

Evie's story is certainly an amazing one with a wonderful ending. However, it is so much more than that. It is truly God's story and Evie happened to be at the center of it (Ed. Nothing catches our Living Savior by accident or surprise). Our desire is that God is glorified through this situation, and we want to highlight a few notable ways we saw Him work.

<u>HE put us in the right place</u>: God knew when we planned a vacation to see the Creation museum and the Ark Encounter that we would be exactly where we needed to be to get the medical help that Evie needed. The nearest ECMO to our home for pediatric patients is Minneapolis. We are certain that with the rapid decline that Evie experienced, there would not have been time to transfer to Minneapolis to get her on ECMO before it was too late. It was not a coincidence that we were on vacation in the place where we were. '*We like to say that God used the Ark to save Evie*'.

<u>HE restarted Evie's heart</u>: The 'emotions' that we experienced while praying/begging God to bring Evie back to life are hard to describe. Everything was moving so quickly that it is sometimes hard to believe it actually happened! Yes, the Doctor expertly gave her CPR for **9** minutes, but that is not guaranteed to work! In God's Grace, he not only restarted her heart, but provided the Surgeon the skill and wisdom to be able to continue the surgery during resuscitation and allowed the Surgery to be successful!

<u>HE worked spiritually in many ways</u>; We know that there was a <u>spiritual battle</u> occurring while Evie was sick. GOD WON! There was also a spiritual battle in many of our hearts! <u>God won again</u>, providing us comfort and peace, even when Evie's physical outcome was uncertain. He brought us to a place of worship, and reliance on him, in a way that many of us had not experienced! I believe he also changed the hearts of our family and others who were touched by Evie's situation. Each of us was changed in a unique way, based on the condition of our heart and on what God specifically wanted to change in our hearts and minds. What a wonderful blessing that our God is a personal God who cares enough about us to help us grow.

Other than her summer adventure, Evie is still enjoying homeschooling as a freshman this year. She loves playing piano, working out, being involved at our church, and hanging out with baby Micah (or any baby, really). Evie's illness highlighted the fact that none of us is guaranteed another day, not even a healthy, 14 year old girl with No history of medical issues! My prayer for each of you is that seeing God work through Evie's story will either 1) bring you into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ IF you do not already know Him, or 2) draw you into a deeper walk with HIM IF you already are a follower of Christ!

Finally, I know that many of you have experienced your own difficult stories and many of them do not have the joyful ending that we experienced. We may never understand why situations have different endings on this side of Heaven, but we know that for those who love God all things work together for good Romans 8:28 & 29. God will accomplish good purposes even through difficult and painful situations and loss. We are so grateful that God chose to save Evie. For a brief time, we were faced with the reality that Evie may not return to this life. This glimpse into child loss makes our hearts ache anew for those living that out day by day.

No matter your circumstances, I hope that you know the peace that comes from the LORD! We certainly experienced HIS Love in an unexpected way this year and we look forward to see HIM work in the future!

Censorship and Suppression of Speech in America

By a "dangerous pattern," I'm referring to the pattern of censoring and/or suppressing conservative Christian speech on social media platforms. Those who have been on the front lines of the culture wars have experienced this for years!

We have watched our pages shut down, our channels removed and our posts blocked all because we affirmed what the BIBLE (says) about marriage, sexuality and LGBTQ+ related themes...

<u>No</u> exaggeration. No hype! No playing fast and loose with the *truth*! Just documented facts. The censor-ship and suppression are real ...

This attack on our freedom of speech is as real as the IRS's targeting of conservative organizations in the recent past, except it is more pervasive and widespread due to the ubiquitous nature of social media ...

Case Closed

The Federal court case against pro life activist, Mark Houck has been completed. Houck is considered a

"peaceful pillar of the community," according to his attorney, Peter Breen. Houck was accused of violating the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances (FACE) Act, which prohibits "violent, threatening, damaging, and obstructive conduct intended to injure, intimidate, or interfere with the right to seek, obtain, or provide reproductive health services.

Houck contends that in the scuffle he was defending his 12-year-old son from aggressive harassment and bullying done by an abortion escort at a Planned Parenthood clinic.

Houck faced 11 years in prison if convicted. Last September, 20 heavily armed FBI agents raided his home and arrested him in a dramatic show of force. With 5 agents pointing guns to his head, Houck ws arrested for charges that had already been thrown out of court, frightening his wife and seven young children. Houck had offered to appear voluntarily, but the Biden Department of Justice chose to use intimidation and an unnecessary show of force to arrest a peaceful and cooperative man.

As was the case in other situations the process is the punishment and is considered a "political persecution" by Houck's lawyer. Houck's lawyer also stated, "This case is being brought solely to intimidate people of faith and pro-life Americans. The verdict was announced on January 30, and Houck was acquitted on all counts."

Afterward, Houck's attorney stated, "Mark and his family are now free of the load that the Biden administration threw upon them. We took on Goliath – the full might of the United States government – and won. This is a win for Mark and the entire pro-life movement.

Most Extreme Abortion Law In The Nation

After passing the house, the abortion bill named "The Protect Reproduction Options (PRO) Act" was sent to the Minnesota Senate. After a 15-hour debate the bill was finally passed by a 1 vote majority. Opponents of the bill have said it is the "most extreme" abortion law in the Nation, on par with China and North Korea in its lack of restrictions. The Republicans attempted to add numerous amendments to the bill, but without success. All 35 amendments were rejected, including amendments to prohibit the sterilization of girls under 14 and requiring parental consent for abortions or sterilization involving minors! This bill makes any type of abortion legal up until birth, available to anyone for any reason.

NYCDA Under Fire for Downgrading 52 Percent of Felony Cases to Misdemeanors

New York Counter Democratic District Attorney Alvin Bragg... downgraded **52** percent of felony cases to misdemeanors in 2022 while New Yorkers continue to face surging crime rates, Fox News Digital reported.

According to data from the DA office website, 39 percent of felony charges were downgraded to misdemeanors in 2019. From 2013 to 2020, under District Attorney Cyrus Vance Jr., the percentage of downgraded cases never exceeded 40 percent.

Since (he took) office in January, Bragg's office has won only 51 percent of prosecuted felony charges, compared to Vance's 68 percent in 2019.

Forgiving

It was in a church in Munich that I saw him – a balding, heavyset man in a gray overcoat, with a brown felt hat clutched between his hands, People were filing out of the basement room where I had just spoken, moving along the rows of wooden chairs to the door at the rear. It was 1947, and I had come from Holland to defeated Germany with the message that God forgives.

It was the truth they needed most to hear in that bitter, bombed-out land, and I gave them my favorite mental picture. Maybe because the sea is never far from a Hollanders' mind, I liked to think that that's where forgiven sins were thrown. "When we confess our sins," I said, "God casts them into the deepest ocean, gone forever."

The solemn faces stared back at me, not quite daring to believe. There were never questions after a talk in Germany in 1947. People stood up in silence, in silence collected their wraps, in silence left the room.

And that's when I saw him, working his way forward against the others. One moment I saw the overcoat and the brown hat; the next, a blue uniform and a visored cap with its skull and crossbones. It came back with a rush: the huge room with its harsh overhead lights: the pathetic pile of dresses and shoes in the center of the floor; the shame of walking naked past this man. I could see my sister's frail form ahead of me, ribs sharp beneath the parchment skin. *Betsie how thin you were!* (Betsie and I had been arrested for concealing Jews in our home during the Nazi occupation of Holland; this man had been a guard at Ravensbruck concentration camp where we were sent.)

Now he was in front of me with his hand thrust out, "A fine message, Fraulein! How good it is to know that, as you say, all our sins are at the bottom of the sea!"

And I, who had spoken so glibly of forgiveness, fum-

bled in my pocketbook rather than take that hand. He would not remember me, of course—how could he remember one prisoner among those thousands of women?

But I remembered him, and the leather crop swinging from his belt. I was face-to-face with one of my captors and my blood seemed to freeze.

"You mentioned Ravensbruck in your talk, "he was saying, "I was a guard there." No, he did not remember me.

"But since that time," he went on, "I have become a Christian. I know that God has forgiven me for the cruel things I did there, but I would like to hear it from your lips as well, Fraulein," again the hand came out, "<u>will you</u> <u>forgive me</u>?"

I stood there - I whose sins had again and again to be forgiven - Betsie had died in that place - could he erase her slow terrible death simply for the asking?

It could not have been many seconds that he stood there - <u>hand held out</u> but to me it seemed like hours as I wrestled with the most difficult thing I had ever had to do.

<u>For I had to do it</u> I knew that! The message that God forgives has a prior condition: that we <u>forgive</u> those <u>who</u> have <u>injured</u> 'us'! JESUS says, "...**if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.**" (Matthew 6:15)

I knew it not only as a <u>commandment</u> of God, but a daily experience! Since the end of the war, I had had a home in Holland for victims of Nazi brutality. Those who were able to <u>forgive</u> their enemies were able also to return to the outside world and rebuild their lives, no matter what the physical scars. Those who nursed their '<u>bit</u><u>terness</u>' remained invalids. It was as simple and as horrible as that!

<u>Still I stood there with coldness clutching my heart,</u> BUT <u>forgiveness</u> is not an emotion– I knew that too! *Forgiveness* is an act of the will, and the will can function regardless of the temperature the heart. "*Help!*" I prayed silently. "I can lift my hand – I can do that much, but You supply the feeling."

And so woodenly, mechanically, I thrust mine into the One stretched out to me. As I did, an incredible thing took place! The current started in my shoulder, raced down my arm, sprang into our joined hands, and then this healing warmth seemed to flood my whole being, bringing tears to my eyes!

<u>"I forgive you, brother!" I cried.</u> "with all my <u>heart!"</u>

For a long moment we grasped each other's hands —- the former guard and the former prisoner. I had never known God's love so intensely, as I did then!

Seven "Oughts" For Christians!

The "Ought" of Love

"Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another." (I John 4:11)

Is this not true, that God loved us to such an extent that He sent His Son, down to this (sinful world), His only Son, down to this Earth to die for us who <u>are not</u> <u>worthy</u>? But love, His love, made Him do it. "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends." (John 15:13) We are His friends, "Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you" (John 15:14) He gives us a New Commandment, "A new Commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another." (John 13:34)

The "Ought" of Prayer

"And he spake....that men ought always to pray, and not to faint." (Luke 18:1)

<u>The prayerful life is a victorious life!</u> JESUS commanded the disciples while HE was in the 'garden' to *"Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."*

(Matthew 26:41) The <u>fainting</u> Christian is the prayerless Christian. There is a saying, <u>"The devil trembles when</u> <u>he sees the weakest saint on his knees!"</u> This shows that the devil cannot get hold of a Christian who lives in a real prayer-filled life. Great things have been wrought by Christians who have lived real prayerful lives. If one's mind and heart are not prayerful, that is when the enemy gets his chance at him, and what damage has been wrought in cases like that!

The "Ought" of Obedience

".... We ought to obey God rather than men." (Acts 5:29)

These words were spoken by the apostles when they were before the high priests! We believe the apostles had holy boldness when they uttered these words before the Counsel. These Apostles had been commanded not to speak or teach in the name of Jesus! They answered, "... Whether it be right in the sight of God to hearken unto you more than unto God, judge ye." (Acts 4:19) Samuel told Saul, when he did not obey GOD but listened to the people and did as he pleased, that "...to obey is better than sacrifice..." (I Samuel 15:22) Saul lost his kingship! Those who listen to God and obey Him will be mightily used of Him!

The "Ought" of Patience

"We than that are strong ought to bear the infirmi-

ties of the weak, and not to please ourselves." (Romans 15:1)

It may seem hard *sometimes* to bear with those who are weak! "Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself lest thou also be tempted" (Galatians 6:1) It may take these things to teach one <u>patience</u>! Paul became "...all things to all men ..." (I Corinthians 9:22) that he wins some to Christ. If a Christian becomes impatient with a weaker one and cannot bear with him in all things, he will not win him to Christ! "In your patience possess ye your souls." (Luke 21:19)

The "Ought" of Sacrifice

"Hereby, perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren." (I John 3:16)

<u>This takes Love</u> — not natural love, but spiritual love. In these days, it seems hard for some to sacrifice for others! Perhaps a few minutes of our time would be the means of cheering someone that is down and out, and perhaps even be the means of bringing him to Christ. It may mean to give up something you wanted so badly. True happiness is found in sacrificing for others! Our Lord sacrificed for 'us'. He gave His very life! HE died in such a shameful way, that we might share with Him Eternal Life!

The "Ought" of Giving

"I have shewed you all things, how that so laboring ye ought to support the weak, and to remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how He said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'" (Acts 20:35)

By these words we can fully understand why God <u>gave His</u> only Son to save a dying world, and why Jesus was willing to obey His Father. You and I cannot give in this way perhaps, but we can be willing to give the little things, such as time and money! It says, "...ought to support the weak..." This does not mean physically weak, but to bear with those who are weak spiritually. Give up your reputation and dignity and become like them. Paul said, "To the weak became I as weak, that I might gain the weak: I am made all things to all men, that I might by means save some." (I Corinthians 9:22)

The "Ought" of Forgiving

"So that contrariwise you ought rather to forgive him, and comfort him, lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch sorrow."

(II Corinthians 2:7)

Here we are told that we ought to forgive! If some-

one has wronged you; you 'ought' to forgive him; If not, your Father in Heaven <u>cannot</u> forgive you! In the sermon on the mount, we read, "But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses" (Matthew 6:15) Look at the treatment that Jesus received! He was innocent, yet when He hung on the cruel Cross, He could look to His Father and say, ".... Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do..." (Luke 23:34)

One Spark of Fire

Reading a biography of Billy Sunday, we came across this pertinent quote, <u>"One spark of fire can do</u> more to prove the power of gunpowder than a whole library on the subject."

When Paul preached to the intellectual Corinthians, he deliberately decided against any academic approach in presenting the Gospel! He told the Corinthian Christians that "...my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and power." (I Corinthians 2:4) Paul had the <u>spark of fire</u>.

Paul had the same evidence when he preached at Thessalonica. Just weeks after having been in that city, he wrote to the converts there and said, "... our gospel came not unto you in word only, but also in power, and in the Holy Ghost, and in much assurance ..." (I Thessalonians 1:5)

The spark of <u>vital</u> fire is not to be equated with <u>emo-</u> <u>tionalism!</u> Rather, it is the witness of the Holy Spirit as the reality of the message; it will convince the intellect, warm the affections, and move the will. It is not, however, to be related only to one aspect of the individual!

How much of our preaching and teaching lacks this *"spark of fire"*? HOW DESPERATELY WE NEED IT!

"He stretcheth out the north over the empty place, and hangeth the earth upon nothing"! (Job 26:7)

The GRACE of God

It is interesting and instructive to note what the New Testament teaches about the <u>Grace of GOD!</u>

Grace is the means of justification and salvation! "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and not of yourselves; it is the <u>gift</u> of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast." (Ephesians 2:8-9)

<u>The believer stands in grace, is under grace, and has</u> access to God's throne of Grace!

"Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession. For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." (Hebrews 4:14-16)

Although Israel as a nation has been set aside by God, there is a remnant among them according to the election of grace in the present dispensation. **"Even so** then at this present time also there is a remnant according to the election of grace." (Romans 11:5)

An Acronym for Grace

Vance Havner Gave This Acronym For GRACE:

G – stands for GIFT, <u>the principle of GRACE</u> – Ephesians 2:8-9

R – stands for REDEMPTION, <u>the purpose of</u> <u>GRACE</u> – Ephesians 1:7

A – stands for ACCESS <u>the privilege of GRACE</u> -Romans 5:1-2

C – stands for CHARACTER <u>the product of</u> <u>GRACE</u> – II Corinthians 5:17

E – stands for ETERNAL LIFE, <u>the prospect of</u> <u>GRACE</u> – Titus 3:7

The *principle* – we don't deserve it, but GOD gives it anyway

The <u>purpose</u> – to redeem us, buy us back from sin, save us

The <u>privilege</u> – we can now come boldly before the Throne without fear, without hesitation, seeking aid in <u>time of need</u>. That is true access!

The <u>purpose</u> – The product – it is producing a Christlike character in us; molding us into the image of His Son.

The <u>prospect</u> – there is more than what we see. There is Eternity with Christ.

Fear Not Little Flock

As we *open* our BIBLES, the word *"little"* should encourage us. If it should become to us a word associated with victory rather than defeat!

<u>A LITTLE MAID (II Kings 5)</u>

A <u>little maid</u>, far away in captive circumstances, knew about a "man of God" and the power of God was known by the king of Israel! Her simple testimony brought her leprous master to be healed and become a worshiper of God!

When we find ourselves a captive to circumstances and seemingly far from any place of usefulness, may we direct some "leprous Naaman" to a place of <u>cleansing and</u> <u>salvation.</u>

We may wonder to what place of honor and blessing this captive maiden may have been exalted as her happy and healed master returned!

A LITTLE OIL (I Kings 17)

As a refugee from Jezebel, Elijah had left the failing water of Cherith and the Raven's <u>daily supply</u>. At God's direction, he found himself a boarder with a widow and her son. Her earthly known resources were but a little oil in a cruse and a scattered handful of meal dusting the bottom of a barrel. She was about to <u>prepare</u> their <u>last</u> meal. Elijah's asking for a morsel of bread seems cruel in this desperate situation — <u>truly desperate EXCEPT FOR</u> <u>GOD!</u> We are not able to estimate the amount of oil and meal in terms of gallons and barrels but they "...did eat many days." (verse 15), and there was enough! It lasted until Elijah left Mount Carmel, until 'rain' came, and until the famine was lifted.

When things seem "like a famine" and the 'oil' and the 'meal' are low, are we tempted to <u>withhold from God</u> lest there be not enough? Remembering the widow, we must give GOD <u>first!</u> GOD has ways! How there was enough "<u>for many days</u>" we don't know — except that God did it — and herein is our assurance and grounds for (a living) faith!

A LITTLE CLOUD (I Kings 18)

<u>A prayer</u> of Elijah had driven the rain from Israel's skies, and another had brought fire to earth to consume a <u>drenched</u> altar in contest with Baal's prophets. Then this righteous man <u>bowed low</u> on Carmel's heights and <u>fervently</u> prayed for rain and breaking of the drought. SIX times the servant scanned the hot, brassy skies and reported that he saw nothing – <u>but Elijah kept praying</u>!

AFTER the <u>seventh</u> trip, and a look toward the sea, a *little* cloud the *size* of a <u>man's hand</u> was reported! After

three and one-half years, one man, a prayer and a little cloud —- but it was God's cloud —- the burning, thirsty earth was drinking in the cool, refreshing, and reviving downpour!

Elijah's God waits for His "Elijahs" *today* as James 5:16 tells us, "...effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

A LITTLE FISH (Matthew 14)

To face a stadium filled with five to ten thousand hungry people, and hope to feed them with only a single lunch might be called *impossible*! So it might have been that beside Galilee had not those few fish been placed in the hands of JESUS, and blest by Him who ages before had <u>created all things</u>!

For the Apostles alone it was beyond the realm of possibility. "...send the multitude away." (v. 15), they said. We say today, "The job is too great and the resources too small!". BUT wait! Listen!! "Bring them hither to me" (18), said JESUS, and the fainting multitude had more than enough and were strengthened!

<u>So today</u> – first into His hands, back into ours to bewail the *"littleness"* of what we have, but to dedicate it to Christ for His blessing in order that they need not go away – <u>but have enough</u>!

<u>A LITTLE CHILD (Matthew 18)</u>

HOW <u>Small</u> he must have seemed in the midst of the crowd of Apostles as Christ lifted him to His lap! He was just a "...little child..." (verse 2), but who can measure the space and place that he occupied in the ministry of the apostles, the plan of God, and the salvation of multitudes!

The reason is quite simple. Where there is no humility, God gives no grace. He fights against the proud. Therefore, if this child, in his simple faith, obedience, and submissiveness brings the lesson of humility to these upon whom the launching of God's program depends – how great is his place!

God may use some of His "little" children to teach some simple lessons needed by those "bigger" ones who may, because of our lessons taught, go forth to great things – of which we have become really a part! <u>Nothing</u> is actually "<u>little"</u> that touches God, souls, and Eternity!

<u>A LITTLE FLOCK (Luke 12)</u>

Placed alongside the non-professing world and the mere professing church, God's own are a "<u>little flock</u>" – both numerically and in natural strength! There is no merit in being "little" as a congregation (it might be a shame If our best has not been done to grow), but His <u>presence</u> in our midst is the <u>important thing</u>!

When we see what great things HE has done with

"the little" and "the few," we must conclude that when God ceases to use the things that are "<u>small</u>" and "<u>weak</u>," *HE will have ceased to be GOD!*

"For ye see your calling, brethren, how that not many wise men after the flesh, not many might, not many noble, are called: But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things that are mighty; And base things of the world, and things which are despised, hath God chosen, yea, and things which are not, to bring to nought things that are: That no flesh should glory in his presence" (I Corinthians 1:26-29)

Selected

ONE DAY!

<u>One day a Prophet</u> from Nazareth appeared, mighty in word and deed before God and all the people! He was the greatest of all the prophets and proclaimed God's message more clearly than any others! He performed the works which He had seen of the Father, and spoke the words He had heard of Him. By His works He demonstrated God's power, and by His words He revealed God's will. He opened their eyes to the deepest depths in human life and to the highest pinnacles of God's wisdom and grace. Even His enemies exclaimed, "Never so man spoke!"

How could it be otherwise when He by whom all things were created stood as a man among men to <u>declare</u> <u>God's Word?</u> HE was the Word that became <u>flesh</u> to dwell among <u>us</u>. He had the 'spirit' without measure, and taught the way of God in Truth! In a tranquility born of greatness HE sat on the mount with the people gathered about Him; with true prophetic *insight* HE looked into their souls and spoke words which expressed perfectly their poverty and need. Not only that, He brought a message of cheer from God to those who are poor in spirit and who hunger and thirst after righteousness; they are called blessed, and the kingdom of heaven belongs to them.

He opened the door to the true meaning of the Law and the Prophets. He revealed God's will for this life and the next. He cut squarely across human opinions and commandments of men to give us the kernel of God's Truth! This He did even if it made some of the *hearers* to <u>gnash</u> their teeth and lay plans against His life. He drew back the curtain between time and eternity and declared time and again that there is a life after death for those who believe (trust) <u>in Him!</u>

HE told His own clearly and forcefully that He would *rise* from the *grave* <u>on the third day</u>! HE sat with His disciples and looked over the city and the temple, these cen-

ters of God's plan for His people; from this vantage point He painted a panoramic picture of coming events to the <u>end of time!</u> These are no hazy dreams of a man in search of 'truth'; they are the simple truths of God as He gave them to the Prophet. It is the "*Thus saith the Lord!*" which shall abide when *even* heaven and earth **pass away**!

When we who live today are tempted to desert Jesus, we should be able to say with an even greater conviction than Peter, **"Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life."** Every Christian ought to frequently remind himself of the many witnesses, as well as of the testimony of the Spirit in his own heart; these all testify that He is the Word Of God! It would strengthen our faith and gladden our heart.

You and I came to Him as poor and helpless creatures! We came upon His invitation such as we were and <u>knelt</u> at the Cross of Him who <u>died for us</u>. We received what HE has promised; HE gave us new life and put a new song in our mouth (Psalm 40). For some of us many years have gone by since that day! We have lived with HIM through the years of our youth and have fought some of life's most bitter battles under HIS Banner! Many things have changed during the years; one after another of our hopes have faded into nothingness. But there is one thing that has not changed; that is the <u>Word of God</u>! One there is who has never failed us: Jesus Christ. Every Christian can testify that His is the only comfort in life worth mentioning.

In Sorrow He's my comfort, in trouble He's my stay, He tells me every care on Him to roll; He's the "Lily of the Valley," the Bright and Morning Star, He's the fairest of ten thousand to my soul.

In life's loneliness we have found our sweetest moments with Jesus and His Word. In the secret of His presence, we have received strength for our days, weeks, and years from youth to old age; we have found rest for the soul, and a friend in time of need; we have received peace in our heart and light for our path.

My own testimony is this: Every day He is becoming more precious to me. He is my life!

Now we know that the mystery of the Cross is the saving power in life, and that the mercy-seat in <u>Christ's Blood</u> is the meeting place between the sinner and God. Now we know it, not only as a fact found in a book, but as a truth established in life – a truth which is most effective when life is most difficult.

Christ is our Prophet, mighty in word and deed.

Dear Friends

"Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John...they marvelled; and they took knowledge of them, that they had been with Jesus." (Acts 4:13)

Those around the disciples knew that they had been with Jesus, for they could see the <u>boldness</u> and <u>courage</u> that was shown in their ministry! The Lord Jesus was the greatest influence in the lives of these disciples.

So, it is with us, the more time we spend with Christ, and the more we let Him influence our lives, the more like Him we become. When the inward part of our life is what it ought to be, then the outward part will be what it ought to be.

We are not to have just an outward showing and not give our heart, and life to the Lord. We are to love God and His Word with our whole heart. J. C. Ryle said, "He that would be conformed to Christ's image, and become a Christlike man, must be constantly studying Christ Himself. Our boldness and strength do not depend on our outward circumstances, our personalities, or possessions, but on Christ alone.

C. H. Spurgeon wrote, "A Christian should be a striking likeness of Jesus Christ. The best life of Christ is his living biography, written out in the words and actions of His people. If we were what we profess to be, and we should be, we should be pictures of Christ; yea, such striking likenesses of Him, that the world would not have to hold us up by the hour together, and say, "Well, it seems somewhat of a likeness;" but they would, when they once beheld us, exclaim,

"He has been with Jesus!"

Paul David Tripp wrote in Lost in the Middle:

"God isn't entering into your miniscule little kingdom to do everything he can to make it successful. Instead, he has welcomed you out of your personal kingdom allegiance into the history-spanning expansiveness of *his* kingdom, to be part of what he planned not only before your first breath, but also literally before the foundations of the world were laid in place. You were never created to live with your goals and needs as your deepest concerns. You and I were created to know, serve, love and worship him. This means desiring that his kingdom flourish and his glory to the glory of God than by what you think would make you comfortable and happy. So God will do things that rob you and me of our comfort that interrupt our plans, and that even bring pain and suffering our way. And he will do this to complete what he has begun in us and in the world. God will take away what has brought us temporary joy in order to drive us toward the greater delight of his kingdom and his righteousness. And as much as we know this to be true, we

will continue to be surprised by the turns he ordains our lives to take."

Sense vs. Sentiment, an editorial by T. C. Horton in 1921 "The King's Business:"

"This is a superficial age when there is grave danger of our losing our balance. We are drifting from our moorings. The Word of God gives us our precepts and our examples. We are taught in the Word that we should love all men. No man should be beyond the reach of the love of our hearts, and this love should be manifested in our relation to him by our lives. But true love never thwarts justice. We should love our children and be willing to suffer for them, but this demands that we should punish them when they are guilty of violation of law. Violation of law demands righteous punishment. Love is not a sentiment. It is a principle, a principle unchanging with God, always exemplified by Him in His Word. Punishment should not be inflicted in anger but in tears, though it should be inflicted after God's own pattern. God's love is a principle shown in His grace, His mercy, His longsuffering. His anger is shown in His severity. He is angry with the wicked, but it is a righteous anger, a holy anger. God hates sin and exemplified His hatred of it by pouring out His wrath on His own Son. But His love is also manifested in the sacrificial gift of His Son.

"Our country is suffering intensely today by reason of laxity both in the enforcement of law and in the punishment of lawbreakers. Justice is a joke with the law-violators. One excuse given for the failure to impose a just sentence for violation of law is that the jails and penitentiaries are overcrowded, and it is impossible to accommodate the criminals. If penalties were adequately administered, this would put fear into the hearts of men, and sentiment would give place to common sense. Sentiment breeds weak, effeminate characters. We are charged sometimes with being too severe in our editorials, in our position toward the enemies of the truth. We are told that we should be more loving toward them, that we should treat them as brethren. There is much of this that is purely sentiment and leads to a compromising spirit. We love all men. We love bandits, and with this same love we love the deniers of the truth; but we want to call men by their proper names. We do not call a man a brother, in the light of the Word of God, who denies the deity and blood sacrifice of our Lord and yet who pretends to be His disciple and draws his salary from deceived people. We bid him no God-speed any more than we would the devil, for we know that he is the devil's instrument and the worst kind of a deceiver, for he wears the royal robe as the ambassador of Christ while serving Satan.

"Trifling with truth, smoothing down sin, condoning false preaching, calling a Bible-bandit a brother, pussy-footing with perjured professors, is purely silly sentimentalism. It evidences a lack of Bible sense. Worldly and ungodly men respect the man who reproves and rebukes their sinful ways because they have a conscience concerning their wrongs. And these false teachers have more respect for those of us who love the Lord and His Word and who make no compromise with them but condemn their unholy position. We propose to expose error, not to excuse it. We will continue to love these destructive critics with a godly love but will not fail to let the light shine in on their dark and dangerous teaching. We will pray for them as enemies of the truth but will not participate in their pernicious teaching. We prefer to be sensible rather than sentimental, to be loyal rather than traitors. We can shed real tears over their sinful doings, but we will also seek to tear away the mask behind which they hide and let the light of God's Word illumine the devilish sophistry of their teaching. Those of us who love the Lord and His unimpeachable Word ought to be willing to make no compromise with sentimentalism of any kind."


Mirror of the Heart


