here are some of us, in these days, who find it difficult not to be anxious as to the result of the many attacks, which are being made upon God's holy Word. Such attacks are not a new thing in human experience, and it may be true that they are not more vigorous now than of old. But it is recognized that there is a subtlety about them at this present time, which has seldom before been known. This is chiefly seen in this, that, formerly they came mostly from without the church, and, now, frequently they come from within the church. Moreover, of late, there is this deceit about them, which makes them peculiarly dangerous in their process and effect; they are so mixed up with truth that it becomes often difficult to recognize them as error.

Hence, not a few of us behold, and tremble, asking ourselves and others the question: "What is to be the end of all these things, and what is to become of this Word which God has given and we have received and revered?" As so often happens in similar cases, the Lord of light and love has anticipated our question and has spoken the word, which casts out fear. As our text declares, the Word will not be harmed but will stand. Sad and terrible things will happen as the result of all this Satanic onslaught, but the effect will not be that God's truth will suffer.

Some years ago, the great iron steamer upon which the writer was traveling hurled itself with all its force against an island of rocks off the China coast. The contact was terrific. But when we examined, the next morning, the harm,

which had been done, we found that the steamer was the thing damaged, not the rock. Afterwards, the steamer was abandoned as worthless, being self-destroyed; and it no longer exists. But the great rock still stands where God placed it, without a mark upon it. So shall we find it upon that glorious morning when Christ shall come to vindicate His truth. His holy Word will be found even as it was from the beginning, unmoved and immovable, unmarked and unmarred. Let those of us who have fearful and fainting hearts, therefore, be of good cheer. It is our business to witness to the truth. As we do so, God will preserve and vindicate His truth.

Psalm 107:1-43

Please take the time to read this entire psalm and meditate upon the goodness of our God. Today, the United States of America observes a Day of Thanksgiving. Our Canadian neighbors observed a similar day in October. It is a great blessing to live in countries where such a day is still recognized each year even though, for most people, Thanksgiving Day is just another holiday with little time, if any, given to thanking God for His many blessings. As Christians, however, we have so much for which to be thankful. Our text places great emphasis on the goodness and lovingkindness of our God. "O give thanks unto the LORD, for He is good" (v. 1.) And again, "Oh that men would praise the LORD for His goodness, and for His wonderful works to the children of men!" (vv. 8, 15, 31). The final verse of this blessed psalm of thanksgiving says, "Whoso is wise, and will observe these things, even they shall understand the lovingkindness of the LORD" (v. 43).

It is sad that on this national Day of Thanksgiving, so few in our nation will pause to consider God's goodness and say, "Thanks." We have so much for which to thank the Lord-our freedoms of worship, speech and the press and also the many material blessings God has showered upon us. But Christians have much more to be thankful for in addition to these material blessings-our salvation, forgiveness of sins, eternal life and God's many great and precious promises. Every day should be a day of thankfulness for the believer. But on this Thanksgiving Day, let us "sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, and declare His works with rejoicing" (v. 22). MHR

The Christian Life from Corinthians

Read I Corinthians 5-9

How to live a Christian life acceptable to God in an immoral world is a constantly reoccurring problem for many Christians. The Apostle Paul exposed a distinct difference between the Christian and pagan life-style as he wrote to the Corinthian church about their attitude toward condoning sin among their members. The problems with which Paul dealt are much the same as problems in the church today. It was reported to Paul that immorality existed in the life of the church. Although it was apparently common knowledge, no one was saying or doing anything about it. One member was committing fornication or adultery with his father's wife (I Corinthians 5:11), which would mean that he had an ongoing sexual relationship with his stepmother. Whether his father was no longer living is not indicated, but Paul is saying that they must immediately excommunicate the offending brother: In the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ, when you are gathered together, and My Spirit, with the power of our Lord Jesus Christ, To deliver such a one unto Satan for the destruction of the flesh, that the spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus (5:4-5).

The need to be more sensitive as to how our lives affect our witness in the world is important. But, the consequence of how our lives affect our church and Christian friends is critical. Still more serious is how our lives affect our relationship with God: I have written to you not to keep company with anyone named a brother who is a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a reviler, or a drunkard, or an extortioner, not even to eat with such a person...Therefore put away from yourselves that wicked person (5:11-13).

As the members of the church do nothing, it encourages the sinner to rationalize his sin and consequently do nothing about it. Whatever evil we allow to exist unchallenged in our church life will grow like weeds within the congregation. Consequently, the effort to leave things as they are in the interest of peace represents not only a cowardly position, but a stand against what the Bible clearly makes evident.

Other problems also existed in the Corinthian church. Some saw no relationship between their personal faith in Christ and their differences with other members of the church and they were suing each other in secular courts to settle their disputes. Paul continued: *Dare any of you, having a matter against another, go to Law before the un-*

just, and not before the saints?...I speak to your shame...Why do you not rather take wrong? Why not rather suffer yourselves to be defrauded? (6:1, 5, 7).

Because of the seriousness of sin, the Apostle Paul again said: Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the Kingdom of God. And such were some of you: but you are washed, but you are sanctified, but you are justified in the Name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God. (6:9-11)

All who repented of sin and turned to Christ were forgiven, but Paul also makes it just as clear that those who continue to practice these sins will not inherit the Kingdom of God.

While the Bible views sex as a gift of God, which can only bring happiness and fulfillment within the marriage relationship, there are many in our secular society that treat sex as no more than a physical appetite to be satisfied. Paul then wrote of the need to *give yourselves* (unhindered) *to fasting and prayer* (7:5). There are times when a spiritual need from God should supersede all other considerations. Prayer and fasting will bring results that are not attainable any other way.

The importance of the listening aspect of prayer is too often overlooked. In prayer, the ear, not the tongue, should be of first concern. The tongue is trained through the ear. What the ear allows into the mind, the tongues gives out. So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God. (Romans 10:17)

Anxiety or Worry FREE!

"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:6, please read verses 4-9)

Yea, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" (Psa. 119:103). Job, in the midst of his pain and suffering, said, "I have esteemed the words of His mouth more than my necessary food" (Job 23:12). 
Dry - Eyed Teaching


PASTOR, IF YOU ARE ONLY SHARING, you are not caring for your people. If you are simply talking, you are not tearing down the strongholds of the enemy. We need preaching in this late hour. Dry-eyed teaching will not produce life in men. Henry Blackaby comments that during times of revival "powerful, scriptural preaching is exhibited:" Powerful preaching is a hallmark of true revival. Revival preachers demonstrate their commitment to the authority and sufficiency of the Scriptures, with bold, urgent, and uncompromising preaching, as they set before God's people the way of life and death. Powerful, Spirit-filled sermons concerning sin, Christ and the cross penetrate the hearts of the saved and lost alike with the realities of eternity. Concerning a sermon Whitefield preached in Scotland (1742), one present reported, 'During the time of divine worship, solemn, profound reverence overspread every countenance. Many cry out in the bitterness of their soul. Some ... From the stoutest men, to the most tender child, shake and tremble and a few fall down as dead ... when the ... Preacher speaks of redeeming Love, and talks of the precious Savior ... All seem to breathe after Him ..."

Hear the confession of Mr. Robe, a minister used in the 1742 revival in Kilsyth, Scotland. Hear what was the doctrine that was so zealously propagated, and which God's Holy Spirit honored so much in his day: "I feared to daub or deal slightly with my people, but told great and small that they were by nature the children of the Devil, while they were in the state of unbelief; and that if they continued so to the end, I told them, in our Lord's plain terms, they would be damned. I resolved that I would cry aloud, and not spare, and preach with the seriousness and fervor of one that knew that my hearers must either be prevailed with or be damned; and so that they might discern I was in good sadness with them, and really meant as I spoke. Aware that the greater part of every public audience is secure, unconcerned, and fearless, I preached the terrors of the law in the strongest terms I could, that is to say, in express Scripture terms. Yet I ever delighted to follow up such statement with a declaration of the gospel of the grace of God. After the law had done its office, I have seen the congregation in tears of joy when the law of grace from Mount Zion was proclaimed." Preacher, are you dealing slightly with your people? Are you proclaiming the utmost "terrors of the law" to your people and their true condition by nature?

Civil Union Law Impacts Religious Retreat Centers

Those who believe "gay marriage" would have no impact on religious freedoms may want to take a look at New Jersey, where the state is investigating a United Methodist retreat center that prohibited a lesbian couple from using one of its facilities for a civil union ceremony.

The question is whether the nonprofit Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association - an ocean-front retreat-type ministry owned and operated by members of the United Methodist Church - violated the state's antidiscrimination law. Once rebuffed, the two women, Harriet Bernstein and Luisa Paster, filed a complaint with the state's civil rights office......

Lee Moore, a spokesman for New Jersey Attorney General Anne Milgram, said the lawsuit was "premature" since findings from the investigation have yet to be released, the New York Times reported.

But Brian Raum, an attorney with the Alliance Defense Fund, said the state should have "refused to entertain a complaint against a religious organization" and told the couple who filed it that "the law against discrimination doesn't apply under these circumstances."

"Whenever the state investigates, they inherently affect your right to operate as you normally would," Raum told Baptist Press. "They put you under compulsion to provide records. There's a stigma attached to an investigation. Anytime you investigate, people assume you've done something wrong."

If the ministry was to provide its facility to a lesbian couple, it would be a patent endorsement of the civil unions law, Raum said.

Homosexual activists long have argued that if "gay marriage" is legalized nationwide, ministers would not be forced to conduct the ceremonies. Raum, though, says there are many other ways such a law could impact religious freedoms. New Jersey, he says, is one example

Tangipahoa School Board Votes Unanimously to Adopt ADF Model Prayer Policy

The Tangipahoa Parish School Board voted unanimously to adopt a model prayer policy drafted by attorneys with the Alliance Defense Fund (ADF). The new policy sets forth constitutional guidelines for board members to reinstitute the long-standing tradition of opening meetings with an invocation.

"The practice of opening public meetings with prayer is and always has been lawful," said ADF Senior Legal Counsel Mike Johnson. "The Constitution does not ban citizens or elected officials from invoking divine guidance and blessings upon their public work. It's a practice that is part of our nation's religious heritage, and the Constitu-

tion does not prevent public officials today from doing the same thing America's founders did."

The Tangipahoa Parish School Board has been a frequent legal target of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU). ACLU has filed five lawsuits in 13 years against the Tangipahoa Parish School Board on matters related to religion in some form.

On July 26, a full panel of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit issued a landmark decision in favor of the Tangipahoa Parish School Board, whose rights were successfully defended by ADF attorneys. The ruling severely undercut the ACLU and it "offended observer" claims in Establishment Clause cases.

"Public officials throughout our country need to be encouraged and reminded that they can and should resist the increasingly radical demands of secularist groups. Just because the ACLU claims it is 'offended' by hearing a public prayer does not mean the prayer has to be silenced," said Johnson.

Evangelical Christians Now Thanking Allah

"This year, a group of "Emergent Christians" led by one of the United States' most influential pastors, Brian McLaren, have announced they will actually be 'observing' the Muslim holy month, along with a Muslim 'partner," writes Joel..."Ramadan is the month that Muslims thank Allah, their god, for revealing the Quran to Muhammad, their prophet. On McLaren's personal blog, he recently announced his intentions: 'We, as Christians, humbly seek to join Muslims in this observance of Ramadan as a God-honoring expression of peace, fellowship, and neighborliness."

Richardson questions whether such an "observance" is actually tantamount to an endorsement of Islam.

He points out: "Every year, during the ninth month on the Islamic calendar, the Muslim world celebrates a month long fast known as Ramadan. The timing of the fast of Sha'aban is specifically intended to commemorate the month in which the Quran was 'sent down' or 'revealed' to Muhammad. During Ramadan, Muslims will abstain from smoking or drinking, from sex or sexual thoughts and eating during the day light hours. Muslims also believe that good deeds done during Ramadan will be doubly credited before Allah."

Richardson adds that McLaren is not fasting for the salvation of his Muslim friends.

"Instead he is seeking through the practice of this Is-

lamic ritual to promote the common good, together with people of other faith traditions,'..."

Booze Wages Devastating War on Russia

Alcohol abuse has fueled an unprecedented spike in mortality among Russians in the post-Soviet era

MOSCOW A study by an international team of public health researchers documents the devastating impact of alcohol abuse on Russia, showing that drinking caused more than half of the deaths among Russians aged 15 to 54 in the era following the Soviet collapse.

The 52 percent figure compares to estimates that less than 4 percent of deaths worldwide are caused by alcohol abuse, according to the study by Russian, British and French researchers published in today's edition of the British medical journal, the Lancet.

David Zaridze, head of the Russian Cancer Research Center and lead author of the study, estimated that the increase in alcohol consumption since 1987, the year when then-Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev's restrictions on alcohol sales collapsed, cost the lives of 3 million Russians who would otherwise be alive today. "This loss is similar to that of a war," Zarldze said.

The study is part of a long-running debate among scientists as to the causes of an unprecedented spike in mortality among Russians in the post-Soviet era. Some researchers have blamed the crumbling of the Soviet health care system, increased smoking, changes in diet or a loss of jobs that raised stress levels for the mysterious rise in deaths.

Many others pin the blame squarely on increased drinking, which the report says roughly doubled in Russia between 1987 and 1994 —the equivalent of about 1.3 gallons of pure alcohol annually to about 2.8 gallons.

"If you look at the dynamics of death and the dynamics of alcohol consumption in Russia, it is obvious that all these sharp increases and decreases of the mortality level are caused by increases and decreases in alcohol consumption," Zaridze said.

He argued that the social and economic shocks of the late 1980s and 1990s drove people to drink. "Alcohol consumption is always connected with poverty," he said. "It's been associated with social crisis. If we take our mortality statistics, it will be obvious that it's parallel to our social crisis, to our social instability."

Russia and some of its Eastern European neighbors still have the world's highest levels of alcohol consumption, according to another study also published in the Lancet today. Russians currently consume almost twice the global average, the equivalent of 1.64 gallons of pure ethanol alcohol per year, the global report found.

WHEN AM I TRULY CONVERTED?

When is a soul truly converted? Answer: When an awakened soul has received a clear and full light of his totally lost and undone condition, and also a clear light of the full and free grace of God. In other words, the moment when he receives the full deliverance from the bondage to the law, and at the same time the full assurance of his state of grace. There are those who will not believe a person is really converted until these blessings have been experienced. Until that moment a person is merely awakened.

However, there may not be full agreement as to words, just so the real truth is fully acknowledged.

The question is often asked: Does the awakened and penitent soul go lost if he should die before he is set free from the bondage to the law and has received the assurance of salvation? That is rather a confusing question. God would not let anyone go lost if it was just a question of time. But an important matter is wrapped up in this confusion, which is this: Is the awakened and penitent soul on the *outside* or on the *inside* of the fellowship with Jesus until the soul has received the full assurance of salvation?

From Scripture proofs we must hold that a penitent and awakened soul is on the *inside* though he has not received the full assurance of salvation. Note how Jesus treated His disciples. They had not come far in clarity about either sin or grace before Pentecost. That Jesus was to die for their sins they did not grasp. But Jesus spoke to them as converted believers: "Ye are clean because of the word which I have spoken unto you" (John 13:10; 15:3). He says plainly that their names are written in heaven (Luke 10:20).

So Jesus, now as then, does not go by our shortcomings in our grasp of the truth, just so there is an honest will in surrendering to the will of God without any compromise. Therefore the Scripture shows that from the moment the soul has turned wholeheartedly to Christ and accepted Him, he is looked upon as truly converted. For he has acknowledged and confessed his sins as far as he has received light, and Jesus is his only salvation, even though he has he has not received full light concerning his

sinful and lost state, nor concerning God's free grace in Christ.

Leafing Through The Pages Of History

On April 3, 1771, Hans Nielson Hauge was born in Norway. In 1796 he had a wonderful experience; while singing a song, his being was lifted close to God. Hauge could not explain what had transpired in his soul, but he felt so sad because he had not served his God better. Everything in the world he counted loss. He received such a love for God and his fellow men. He had such a desire to read God's Word and to witness to his fellow men who were living in sin and shame. Hauge made much use of the opportunities he had to witness. As a result, many were converted; but many also began to persecute him, including pastors and parishioners. This led to his imprisonment. Those who were converted to God through Hauge's ministry also bore witness of their Saviour until many in Norway became Christians. Many of these Christians came to America and were faithful in bearing witness through lip and life.

The northern Iowa Innermission Society was organized in May, 1898, and great blessings throughout the district followed. Many Innermission meetings were held in churches and homes, the speakers being mostly lay preachers who had been born again. The pastors in our neighborhood worked in harmony with the society for the salvation of souls. God alone knows how many were saved.

When I was confirmed I meant to be true to God, but can a baptized person fall away from God? Yes, when he forgets the grace that he once received, resists the Holy Spirit, and neglects the Word of God and prayer. This happened to me and I was bound by the devil. At first when I became troubled about my sins, the devil whispered, "You need not worry. You have so many good relatives. God is merciful to thousands of generations." But that did not satisfy very long. Then he said, "You can't be saved the way you are. You must become better." But in my own sight I became worse until the devil told me there was no more hope for me. What an awful condition!

In 1915 I moved near the Palestine Church near Dolliver, Iowa, to work for my brother-in-law, Carl, who had been converted in 1906 in his parents' home. Many other young people were converted at the same meeting.

One evening in April, while Carl and my sister were having their devotions, my sister asked me if I would like to become a Christian. I answered that there was no hope for me, for I had sinned against God's Spirit. My sister and Carl read many of God's promises and encouraged me to pray. I did this, confessing my sins and lost condition. To my surprise, God forgave my sins and I became a new creature in Christ. After that I had no desire for the old life or the old friends. But I was accepted among the Christians as a new born child. They fed me with the sincere milk of the Word, that I as a newborn might grow. I also needed help to walk in the new way. The older Christians had patience and wisdom to lead the younger ones, as there were a number who were added to the flock from time to time.

The Innermission Society continued faithful to labor for souls' salvation. According to Rev. B. K. Barstad, one of the great problems for the Union in 1917 was the laymen's work; but because of compromise on the part of some, it came into being. But some time between 1917 and 1928 the church district decided to control the lay work, which proved to be the death stab. From then on less and less invitations came from the congregations, and finally no more came from the ALC. What then has taken its place? A form of godliness, disregarding some of God's Word (II Cor. 6:14-28), and also the works of the flesh (Gal. 5:19-21) which are manifest and whose participants shall not inherit the kingdom of God. Men cannot disregard God's Word and get away with it, for all things are known to His all-seeing eyes.

We have been led by our leaders into the ecumenical movement and into the WCC. It reminds me of the story told of hundreds of Roman residents who complained that the milk they were served smelled bad and tasted worse. Police launched an investigation and discovered that some of the trucks used for milk delivery had also been used for hauling kerosene. The church leaders are mixing much together that we may have unity.

Martin Luther said, "Cursed be that love for unity for whose sake the Word of God must be put at stake." It is better to be divided by truth than to be united by error." "To go against conscience is neither right nor safe; therefore I cannot and I will not recant; so help me God."

Luther stood on the premise that the just shall live by faith. He had by faith in Jesus experienced peace with God through the forgiveness of his sins and stood firm against all ungodliness.

"Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any man will

come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me." (Matt. 16:24)

The footsteps of Jesus led to the cross and suffering. A crown of thorns was place on His head; He was slapped, mocked, spit upon. The creature hanged the Creator on the cross. He was rejected by men and forsaken by God for a while until He cried, "It is finished." Then He bowed His head and gave up the Ghost. "Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit: and having said thus, he gave up the ghost." (Luke 23:46b)

Redemption was complete for all. Everyone born of women will have to choose which way he will go – follow the man-made church or Jesus Christ, the only Savior provided by God for man's salvation. I believe that everyone who wants to be saved had better send in his reservation now or he may be lost forever.

One day, in her forty-fifth year, Charlotte felt unusually depressed and alone. The members of her family had gone to a pleasant church function. She remained bedridden in her room, as she had been since the age of thirty-two. Before this serious illness came, Charlotte had lived a carefree life, gaining popularity as a portrait artist and writer of humorous verse.

Now all of this past, she felt so useless, so out of the mainstream of life.

Then came nagging doubts about her Christian life. Although she had been a devoted Christian for years, she found herself wondering about her spiritual relationship with Christ. Could she be sure that all was well between her soul and the Savior?

By an act of the will, Charlotte began listing Scriptural reasons for believing that she was truly a child of God. She listed the power of Christ's shed blood; His promise to accept all who would come to Him in faith and repentance; His ability to pardon, to cleanse, and to relieve. They flowed from her pen in poetic rhyme and meter:

"Just as I am without one plea But that Thy blood was shed for me, And that Thou bidd'st me come to Thee, O Lamb of God, I come, I come."

age of eighty-two. Before her death she received more than one thousand letters from people who thanked her for having written, "Just As I Am." In this way, God proved to her that He can take the one who feels "useless" and make that person truly "useful" to His kingdom!
