Surrounded By God

n the 139th Psalm are several verses which are of great encouragement to the one who may ask, "<u>What</u> <u>is before me? What does the future hold?</u>" The Psalmist here says, "O Lord, Thou hast searched me and known me. Thou knowest my down sitting and mine uprising. Thou understandest my thought afar off. Thou compassest my path and my lying down, and art acquainted with all my ways. For there is not a word in my tongue, but, lo, O Lord, Thou knowest it altogether. Thou has beset me (surrounded me) behind and before, and laid Thine hand upon me."

If you are inclined to ask the question, "<u>What does the future hold</u>?", this most blessed passage of God's Word tells you that you are the object of His care. There is so much that we cannot anticipate concerning the future. Many things are before us that we cannot in any way anticipate. But isn't it wonderful to know that God will be with us whatever is before us? As time speeds by, we may be assured of His saving, keeping, sustaining, sanctifying, providential concern for us.

Pogo, that quaint little opossum philosopher, observes that they do not make years that last as they used to do. They do speed by and, as they end, and new ones begin, it is wise to take stock to look back, to look forward, to learn lessons and to prepare for coming experiences

Look back, not in lazy, listless, wishful thinking, not in self-congratulation and, certainly, not in vain regrets. Look back and learn the lessons that the past should have taught you.

Look ahead – not imagining that there is a magic power that can change yesterday and that you can experi-

ence a remarkable and instantaneous transformation, making you something else than what you have allowed yourself to become.

Perhaps you have heard of the traveler in a rustic mountain area, who asked an old farmer, "Where will this road take me?" The old man stopped his mules and answered, "Where do you want it to take you?" Each of us must ask himself that question, "*Where do you want it to take you*?" This being true, set your affection on things above. Put God first.

Remember, our faith can grow with the passing of time. How can it grow? Surely by deep desire and by firm support of God's Word and through service and exercise. God says to us as He said to Moses, "*My presence shall go with thee.*"

In that fifth verse of the 139th Psalm, which you read a moment ago, the Psalmist described so beautifully that presence as he said, "*Thou hast beset me behind and before, and laid Thine hand upon me.*" This is a military metaphor, and "beset" is the key word. It can be taken to mean besieged or barricaded or arrested. But there is a more accurate translation which means "enfold". Now look at it, "*Thou hast 'enfolded' me behind and before and laid Thine hand upon me.*"

Isaiah 52, verse 12, has a blessed and heartening line, too. *"The Lord will go before you and the God of Israel will be your rear guard."* There it is, <u>God in front</u>, and <u>God behind</u>, and "your marching soul in the midst," as Stewart put it, encircled by God, surrounded by God as by a wall of steel and iron.

God is before us - to lighten the way, to surprise us with His love and with His care (which should never surprise us). We speak timidly of the unknown future, but

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whatever the future brings, it will bring the grace and peace and presence and protection will be seen in our tomorrows, as it has been seen in our yesterdays, and is seen in our present hour.

He is before us, but that is not all. He is also behind us. Thank God for that! Think of Israel, fleeing Egypt, pursued by Pharaoh, apparently helpless. Then God placed the pillar of cloud behind them and led them to safety, even taking off the wheels of Pharaoh's chariots. God is behind me, protecting me from old sins, old bondage, evil habits, stubborn temptations, besetting sins, haunting, horrible memories. I need not dwell among the tombs of yesterday's mistakes and sins and failures and successes. He says, "I have blotted out, as a thick cloud, thy transgressions. I will remember them no more." (Ed. 'for His Name sake.') He deals with my blunders and transforms my poor, human efforts.

Yes, before me, behind me and beside me. He has laid His hand upon me and He is a very present help in time of trouble, taking care of this hour and of His servant at this moment, to save, to rule, to restore, to protect, to uphold.

There have been times in your life and mine when we have been staggered by events. But nothing has come and nothing will come which is greater than His grace. He will hear us and He will defend us. He will help us and He will strengthen us every day, all the way. He has been with us in the past. He is with us at the present moment and, whatever is before us, we have the blessed assurance that He will never leave us (Ed. BUT we have a 'freed will/free choice' as believers and can FALL AWAY from **HIM!)** nor forsake us and He will never, ever fail us.

Dear Friend highly esteemed in our Savior,

You (Ed. Who) are a child of the King of kings and Lord of lords. This makes you a Citizen of Heaven. I know you are aware of that reality, but I believe it is well for all of us to be reminded of that act during these unsettling days. Our beloved country is in chaos and, because of our terrible national iniquity, will soon come under the judgment of our God. I know that many beloved Christian leaders are calling and praying for national repentance, and I commend them for their call to righteousness. Certainly our God has the power to bring about repentance if He wills to do so. However, I fear that our national rejection of some of the most basic things – such as the sanctity of life in the womb, marriage only between a man and a woman, and what only can be viewed as the moral insanity of our government – has taken us beyond the point of no return.

As I look carefully out on our world, what comes to mind are the words of King David when in the second Psalm he wrote: "Why do the heathen (nations) rage (rage conveys the idea of insurrection), and the people imagine a vain thing? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD (the Father), and against his anointed (the Son), saying, Let us break their bands asunder, and cast away their cords from us" (vv. 1-3). This is the imagery of a restless animal that breaks its harness and throws off its yoke. Men and women want neither the Lord nor His Son to rule over them. They want the freedom to do their own thing and be accountable to no one, not even their Creator. Such an attitude is a direct frontal attack against divine Sovereignty.

As King David concludes his psalm, he pleads with his readers with the words, "*Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and ye perish from the way*" (v. 12). To "<u>Kiss the Son</u>" means to revere the Son or pay homage to the Son. Men are to acknowledge the Son to be who He actually is. Men and women are to bow the knee, humble the heart, and accept the Son of God as Savior and King.

Our country and world are on a collision course with their Creator. Here at Zion's Hope, (Editor: Morning Glory/HLIF) our central message is of Christ – a living Savior for a dying world. We make no apology to anyone for that message, nor will we compromise with corrupt governments or false religious teachers.

It's All in the Bible for Us to Consider

Throughout the Scriptures God has given us signs and descriptions of end-time events. Jesus pointed to the immoral and wicked days of Noah to describe world conditions immediately prior to His return. The Bible also points to the rise of Islam in the last days as well as to a worldwide hatred of Israel and the Jews.

Discerning Christians cannot fail to recognize the prophecies of Ezekiel, Daniel and Zechariah regarding the main players that will be on the world scene immediately prior to Christ's return, each with an inexhaustible appetite to attack and destroy Israel. These main players include Russia, Iran, Libya, several African nations and Turkey. Reading Ezekiel 38 and 39 today is much like reading or watching the morning news concerning the Middle East. These nations are all at the forefront of news reports concerning momentous events unfolding today.

For the past several years Vladimir Putin has been quietly rebuilding Russia's military infrastructure. Today Russian and Iran (Persia) are linked together by treaties and trade. Ezekiel 38 and 39 discloses how Iran will become part of a confederation of nations led by Gog of the land of Magog and Rosh. Magog is identified by the first-century historian Josephus as being in the area of existing Islamic states that were once part of the old Soviet Union, while Rosh is linked by Bible scholars to modern-day Russia.

Ezekiel described a prince named Gog leading a mighty army from "<u>the remote part of the north</u>" against Israel. Prophecy scholars have pointed to the fact that the northern-most country from Israel is Russia. But as strange as it may seem, Russia is trying to claim the entire North Pole region because of its oil and gas reserves. If Russia's claim is successful, it will give an entirely new meaning to the Bible's description of Gog leading an army from "<u>the remotest parts of the north</u>."

Wars And Rumors Of Wars

Not only does the Bible identify nations that will be key players in world events prior to the coming of Christ, the Bible makes clear that wars and rumors of wars will ultimately give rise to the coming of the Antichrist. During the last 100 years the world has experienced wars and destruction like no other time in history. Even though the world experienced nuclear war at the close of World War II, the bombs dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki will pale in comparison to war the Book of Revelation describes at the close of the age.

For a long time nuclear weapons were controlled by two countries – the United States and Russia. Today the nuclear bomb is in the hands of China, India, Pakistan and rogue nations like North Korea. It is a known fact that for years North Korea has been selling weapons and nuclear technology to the highest bidder. Unless Iran is stopped soon, nuclear weapons will soon be not only in their hands but in the hands of assorted terrorist organizations as well.

Modern technology has brought another dimension to military arsenals – cyber warfare. A cyber attack could inflict heavy damage or collapse the industrial and financial institutions of even the most powerful nations. It is speculated that Israel and the United States conducted such a cyber attack on Iran's nuclear installations in 2013, setting their program back at least two years.

Nations also fear an EMP attack, (electro-magnetic pulse) a type of nuclear explosion in the atmosphere that would strike suddenly, collapsing a nation's entire infrastructure – industries, military centers, household electrical systems, water and sanitation plants, power stations, banking, etc. It would take years to recover from such an attack.

The Collapse Of The World Economy

One strategic terrorist attack alone could send the world's economy into a tailspin. Add to that the fact that the US economy is being artificially propped up by the Federal Reserve's printing of billions of dollars. Such monetary policy can only work so long before the whole house of cards come crashing down. Whatever type of economic collapse plays out, it will be worldwide and catastrophic.

The Bible warns such events will come upon mankind with very personal consequences: "Come now, you rich, weep and howl for your miseries which are coming upon you. Your riches have rotted and your garments have become moth-eaten. Your gold and your silver have rusted; and their rust will be a witness against you and will consume your flesh like fire. It is the last days you have stored up your treasure" (James 5:1-3).

It is into the setting that the Book of Revelation describes an order by the Antichrist requiring everyone to be given "<u>a mark on their right hand or their forehead in order</u> to buy or sell." Revelation 6:6 describes how a quart of wheat will cost a week's wage, while three quarts of barley will require a day's wage. The Antichrist will rise to save the day when the world is in chaos, and desperate people everywhere will believe and follow him.

Making War On The Saints

Various Scriptures make plain that hatred of Christians will be the norm prior to the coming of Jesus Christ. Throughout the Western world, including the United States, there is a growing hostility toward Christianity and the name of Jesus Christ. Any public mention of Jesus Christ or even the name of God draws an immediate vitriolic response.

In a recent speech, Pope Francis stated that Christians are now facing persecution greater than existed in the first century. John describes in Revelation 13 how the Antichrist will "<u>make war on the saints.</u>" Daniel describes the same events in chapter 7 of his prophecy.

A most revealing passage in Revelation 20 offers details about the favorite method of executing saints at the time of Christ's return being *"beheadings"*. Throughout the centuries Islam has used this method of execution on their enemies, and they still use it today. The recent conquest of Mosul, Iraq by the ISIS terrorists forces included the killing of many Christians by beheadings. Such scenes have been reported throughout the Middle East and in the heart of Islamic territory in African nations. And for whatever reason, the radical jihadists go to great lengths to display victims who were beheaded.

God Has The Last Word!

Christians need not fear any of these things. Just read the Bible and you will discover —-<u>WE WIN!</u> Satan and all the forces of evil will soon be crushed under foot, and our Lord will gather His own from the four corners of the earth and take us to the home He has prepared for us.

GOD'S DWELLING PLACE

"For I am the LORD, I do not change;" — "Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today, and forever." (Malachi 3:6a & Hebrews 13:8)

1. God's Tabernacle

Just *briefly* let us look at God's Tabernacle in the Old Testament, although it most certainly is worthy of a

'thorough' meditation.

Notice how 'detailed' the 'Architect' gives instruction to the building and carrying for the same. Especially 'instructions' how a *Worship Service* was to be conducted. God goes into minute 'details' for the 'believer' in the Old Testament.

As YOU search the 'Scriptures', please notice some of the 'furniture', like the 'alter', Candle-light, the *vail*, the <u>Ark of the Covenant and what was inside of the</u> <u>same</u>, what the cover of the 'Ark of the Covenant' was called: (*Mercy Seat*) AND who was to enter beyond the 'Vail' with WHAT?

Then notice how the (*Tabernacle*) - 'Ark of the Covenant' was to be transported and by whom!

ONE of GOD'S names is **HOLY** and HE is **HOLY** and so HE always will be **HOLY**!

2. God's Temple

Much more permanent, but instructions pretty well stayed the same as we find in Exodus 26-27, 35-38.

One definition of word <u>temple</u> is "A building reserved for a highly valued function." (As I understand it 'literally means **God's Dwelling Place**)! Now don't come to any definite conclusion yet with the information written thus far in this Editorial.

3. Church Building

"And He (Jesus) said to them, 'It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer,' but you have made it a 'den of thieves.'" Matthew 21:13, Mark 11:17, Luke 19:46.

WHEN God speaks about entering into your 'prayer closet/room), HE is telling 'us' to seek of HIM many 'goodies' in your 'pantry/storehouse.

You see 'heaven' is laden with 'blessings' that we as 'forgiven' sinners fail to really begin to tap! Can you *imagine* a beggar (mercy) asking the king for a 'meal' and the King graciously invites 'him' to a 'banquet' and the 'beggar' only asks for a 'bowl of broth'; BUT with gratitude and THANKSGIVING? Although notice in Mark 11:17 & Luke 19:46 that 'they' have made it a '<u>den of thieves'</u>! AND then likely you and I 'wonder' what has gone "wrong" with 'our' church, community, state, Nation!

IN DIVINE LOVE(AS ALWAYS IN DIVINE LOVE) **JESUS** <u>cleansed the 'temple' TWICE</u> in the New Testament.

Martin Luther speaks of the BIBLE as a closed 'book' unless we are willing to deal with SIN!

Today the 'Christian church' has become a place of Entertainment, Activities, Suppers, Emotions, etc. **but** where is the 'upper room/PRAYER MEETING; which was likely (tragically) the 'first' to leave/pushed-out of the congregation's programs.

I am reminded of the story of a Roman Catholic Official showing to a Christian how well the church/congregation was doing financially. And the Christian had to acknowledge that was true but said: "*neither can you say 'in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk.*" Acts 3:6a.

Occasionally I hear that the 'message' is okay, but there seems to be something missing: could it be the 'Anointing of the Holy Spirit'; that because of wanting to please the people (popular/false love/numbers that the Holy Spirit is 'grieved/quenched')? Mechanics are OK, but Jesus is on the outside seeking for re-admittance.

In a sense the <u>church building</u> is built upon '<u>holy</u> <u>ground</u>' as our fore-fathers prayed, sweat, sacrificed, over this parcel of ground and labored diligently to build the building as a 'house of prayer'.

Years ago, I will 'remember' the late Pastor A. E. Windahl stating so very clearly that a lot of 'clergy' would stay with the liberal Lutheran merger(s) because of Position, Prestige and Pension! Today there are so many 'sermons' that lack Inspiration, because of lack of perspiration, in preparation for presentation.

Today we have a New Covenant (New Testament) from God; but keep in mind that Christ did not come to destroy/destruct the LAW, but fulfill it in our behalf. So He did not change His Mind, but gave us (Grace) to a *Better Covenant!* Thank God for the privilege of living on this side of CALVARY and there still is a 'High Priest' in our behalf and a 'Mercy Seat' (Throne of

GRACE).

When we think of the temporal building that we often call 'church', the up-keep/maintenance of the same does 'reflect' (to a certain degree) our respect/attitude/<u>Reverence</u> toward our Holy God!

Almost in its' entirety when the Bible speaks of '*church*', it is speaking of the 'called-out one': Those that are specifically under the <u>*Blood*</u> of the crucified and risen ONE and know JESUS as their personal savior!

4. You are the *Temple* of GOD

"Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's" 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 & <u>II Co-</u> rinthians 3:17-18, 6:11-18 Isaiah 51:1a, & chapter 58.

"For thus says the High and Lofty One who inhabits eternity, 'whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, With him who has a contrite and humble spirit, To revive the spirit of the humble, And to revive the heart of the contrite ones'" Isaiah 57:15. (The word "Altar" means 'killing place').

As we talk about the Biblical $\underline{church} - \underline{called out}$ <u>ones</u>' – as we gather 'together' in 'one accord'; GOD has promised special blessings for the same.

As I mentioned just a little bit ago 'our' *reflection* towards an 'earthly building'; even so much more our physical body which the third Person of our Holy Trinity dwells. Our 'eternal being/Soul' is in this physical body which will live FOREVER in either Heaven OR Hell – the 'real' YOU. Even though this physical body will one day return unto 'dust', the YOU will carry on! Even though the Holy Spirit does not dwell in 'temples/tabernacles made with 'hands' (*Acts 7:48);* YET saved sinners, by faith know the reality of **II Corinthians 5:1-11.** So in reality how do you care for/use/ or abuse this 'dwelling place' of the <u>Holy Spirit?</u> For example: Are you the master of your work or is work the 'master' of you? Entertainment? Life-style? ETC.?

God intends that the 'church' should be a 'feeding/refreshing' station for hungry, down trodden weary 'pilgrims/strangers' in this present world – ALSO admonition, edifying and warning. (Psalm 133:1, Hebrews 10:19-25, etc. – wherever **2 or 3** are gathered "In His Name" For example 'church in thy house'). The *church* should be like a 'city of refuge' OR an Oasis in a barren desert. For example: *"serving the Lord will all humility, with many tears and trials which happened to me by the plotting of the Jews; how I kept back nothing that was helpful, but proclaimed it to you, and taught you* publicly and from house to house, testifying to Jews, and also to Greeks, repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ." "'For I have not shunned to declare to you the whole counsel of God."" "Therefore watch, and remember that for three years I did not cease to warn everyone night and day with tears. So now, brethren, I commend you to God to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and give you an inheritance among all those who are sanctified." Acts 20:19-21, 27, 31-32. Much 'better' to be fore-warned than to be 'caught' unprepared by surprise!

JESUS tells 'us' believers "Occupy till I Come" which is a privilege/challenge/commission/responsibility and command! So in the 'waiting period' as fellow 'team mates' we are to keep in mind/practice that 'we' live in a sinful world as foreigners/pilgrims and strangers. THUS as 'ambassadors' (II Corinthians 5:14-21, Romans 1:14-16) we NEED to watch 'our' behavior, attire, conduct, words, etc.; for He states 'be ye holy as I AM 'holy'. The only way we can be 'holy' in this sinful world is to be IN Christ Jesus (His Righteousness) constantly under the BLOOD OF THE CRUCIFIED AND RISEN ONE WHO IS COMING AGAIN!

In the meantime we are to forget the past (Phil. 3:12-16) looking unto JESUS as the Author and Finisher' of the FAITH and unto an Eternal City whose builder and Maker is GOD! Nothing unclean, unholy, sinful will EVER enter therein, only 'sinners' washed in the BLOOD of Jesus as *forgiven sinners* – **Revelation 4:8b** And they do not rest day or night, saying, "Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, Who was and is and is to come!'"

ALSO **Revelation 20: 9 – 14, 20:11-15 & 22:6 – 20.**

There will always be some critics you just cannot please. A critic is someone who is inclined to examine, judge critically or find faults. Do you know some critics?

After a sermon on spiritual gifts, one woman said to the pastor, "My gift is criticism." He quickly agreed.

A pastor said to a deacon, "Just once I wish you would say something positive." The deacon said, "Well, I am positive that it will not work."

Critics seem to focus on miss-spelled words, bad grammar, long sermons, problems, or people. They miss the major blessings as they focus on minor problems. The Lord did not please the critical scribes, lawyers, priests, and Pharisees; but He did please God (Mark 1:11).

An Aesop's fable tells of an old man and his son bringing a donkey to market. Passing some people, they hear a remark. "Look at that silly pair, walking when they could be riding."

The idea seemed sensible, so the old man and the boy mounted the donkey. Soon they passed another group, and someone said, "Look at that lazy pair, breaking the back of that poor donkey."

The old man slid off but soon heard criticism from a passerby: "What a terrible thing, this old man riding and making the little boy walk."

The old man and the boy finally continued their journey carrying the donkey on a pole between them. As they crossed the bridge, the donkey broke loose, fell into the river and drowned.

Aesop's moral: You can't please everyone.

What do you do with criticism? You should consider the source and purpose of criticism. Some criticism can be harmful, but some can be helpful, and you can learn from all criticism.

It is said that <u>constructive</u> criticism is when I correct you; destructive criticism is when you correct me There are times I need criticism from board members, preachers and friends; but most of all I need it from my wife and the Lord.

<u>Words of wisdom on criticism</u>: "If it's untrue, disregard it; if it's unfair, keep from irritation; if it's ignorant, smile; if it's justified, learn from it.

Let the Lord be your primary critic. Learn to trust in the Lord as He directs your ways and paths (Prov. 3:6). When He says to stop and you continue, you will be in the flesh. When He says to start and you hesitate, you will be in doubt.

Wisdom is knowing the difference. We will be wise to learn that we cannot please everyone, but we can please God.

In January this year (2014), the Pew Research Center (PRC) –a prestigious think tank based in Washington, D. C. (which provides information on social issues and demographic trends shaping the world) – published its report, "<u>Religious Hostilities Reach Six-Year High.</u>"

In this important document, the worldwide public-opinion surveyors chronicled the steady growth of religious persecution around the world and found that social hostilities involving religion are currently most frequently directed against people of Christian faith...

Besides the Middle East, the Pew findings detail an escalation in the United States from the lowest category of government restrictions on Christian expression as of mid-2009 to an advanced category in only three years, where it appears poised to continue upward at this time... National Review Online posted a critical review by Raymond Ibrahim, a Shillman fellow at the David Horowitz Freedom Center, who cites the 2014 World Watch List (which ranks the fifty nations where Christians are most persecuted) determined that the U.S. has become "the chief facilitator of the persecution of Christians around the world today." While Ibrahim's assertion mostly reflects American involvement in foreign conflicts, examples of repression in the U.S. against people of Christian faith are growing.

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The Just Shall Live by Faith

"Behold, his soul which is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by faith." Habakkuk 2:4

This great principle – "the just shall live by faith" was the Scripture that so inflamed the soul of Martin Luther that it became the watchword of the Reformation. It occurs first here in the small prophecy of Habakkuk, but is then quoted three times in the New Testament. The term "just," of course, means "justified" or "righteous." God says a person is enabled to live righteously by his faith.

The nature of this faith is clarified by three quotations. The first is Romans 1:17: "For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, 'The just shall live by faith.'" The phrase "from faith to faith" means "from the beginning of faith to the end of faith," and the context indicates that the foundational item of faith is faith in "his eternal power and Godhead," which "from the creation of the world are clearly seen" (Romans 1:20).

Similarly, in the last occurrence: <u>"Now the just shall</u> <u>live by faith; but if any man draw back, my soul shall have</u> <u>no pleasure in him</u>" (Hebrews 10:38). Then the writer notes that the basic tenet of faith is special creation: "Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things which do appear" (Hebrews 11:3).

The middle occurrence is Galatians 3:11: "But that no man is justified by the law in the sight of God, it is evident: for, The just shall live by faith." Paul's lengthy explanation to the Galatian legalists begins with Galatians 2:16: "Even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ."

Thus, justifying, saving, living faith begins and centers in Jesus Christ, first as Creator of all things, then as the Savior who *"hath redeemed us from the curse of the law"* (Galatians 3:13). Henry M. Morris, Ph.D.

2 Cor. 5:21. Him who knew no sin he made to be sin on our behalf; that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

Rom. 3:24. (They are) justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus."

"But to him who does not work but believes on Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted (credited) for righteousness." Romans 4:5. "THE JUST SHALL LIVE BY FAITH." Rom. 1:17b. Also Ephesians 2:8-9, Hebrews 11:1, 6-10.

God's Word says, "*And this word, Yet once more, signifieth the removing of those things that are shaken, as of things that are made, that those things which cannot be shaken may remain (Heb. 12:28).*

In these days when a veritable tidal wave of uncertainty and disillusionment is sweeping many to the brink of despair, no true believer has cause for alarm; for we rest secure on His Word which says, "Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, 'The Lord knoweth them that are His." Furthermore, believers who obey the Word will heed God's clear command, "And, Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity" (2 Timothy 2:19). 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Historical Documents Regarding the American Traditions of Thanksgiving

Thanksgiving of the Pilgrims in 1621...

"In the name of God, Amen. We, whose names are underwritten, the Loyal Subjects of our dread Sovereign Lord, King James, by the Grace of God, of England, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, etc.

Having undertaken for the Glory of God, and Advance-

ment of the Christian Faith, and the Honour of our King and Country, a voyage to plant the first colony in the northern parts of Virginia; do by these presents, solemnly and mutually in the Presence of God and one of another, covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil Body Politick, for our better Ordering and Preservation and Furtherance of the Ends aforesaid; And by Virtue hereof enact, constitute and frame, such just and equal Laws, Ordinances, Acts, Constitutions and Offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the General good of the Colony; unto which we promise all due submission and obedience.

In Witness whereof we have hereunto subscribed our names at Cape Cod the eleventh of November, in the Reign of our Sovereign Lord, King James of England, France and Ireland, the eighteenth, and of Scotland the fifty-fourth. Anno Domini, 1620."—<u>The Mayflower Compact, November 11, 1620</u>

Our corn (i.e. wheat) did prove well, and God be praised, we had a good increase of Indian corn, and our barley indifferent good, but our peas not worth the gathering, for we feared they were too late sown. They came up very well, and blossomed, but the sun parched them in the blossom. Our harvest being gotten in, our governor sent four men on fowling, that so we might after a special manner rejoice together after we had gathered the fruit of our labors. They four in one day killed as much fowl, as, with a little help beside served the company almost a week. At which time, amongst other recreations, we exercised our arms, many of the Indians coming amongst us, and among the rest their greatest king Massasoit, with some ninety men whom for three days we entertained and feasted, and they went out and killed five deer, which they brought to the plantation and bestowed on our governor, and upon the captain and others. And although it be not always so plentiful as it was at this time with us, yet by the goodness of God, we are so far from want that we often wish you partakers of our plenty. - Edward Winslow December 21, 1621.

The First National Proclamation of Thanksgiving was given by the Continental Congress in 1777

FOR AS MUCH as it is the indispensable Duty of all Men to adore the superintending Providence of Almighty God, to acknowledge with Gratitude their Obligation to him for Benefits received, and to implore such farther Blessings as they stand in Need of: And it having pleased him in his abundant Mercy, not only to continue to us the innumerable Bounties of his common Providence; but also to smile upon us in the Prosecution of a just and necessary War, for the Defense and Establishment of our unalienable Rights and Liberties; particularly in that he hath been pleased, in so great a Measure, to prosper the Means used for the Support of our Troops, and to crown our Arms with most signal success. – Selected

Then when some believed in Him, He turned to them and said, that if they wanted to be His true disciples, they must abide in His Word: only then could the truth make them free. But they would not agree to this, and their faith changed to anger and hatred.

So Jesus leaves these brain-worshipping slaves of the letter, and goes out among the people, to the helpless. When He meets people who are in trouble, no one says that He has a devil or is possessed, but even the evil spirits who must flee before His Savior – might cry out that He is the Son of the living God.

Just as impossible as it is for the conceited person to submit to Him, just so loud do those who are in trouble call upon Him. As warmly as He is loved by the latter, so ardently is He hated by the former.

No one has been so loved and so hated as Jesus. Some see in Him their pretest antagonist, others their only <u>salva-</u><u>tion and eternal welfare</u>. Some give property and life in order to get Him, His Word, and Spirit, and power out of the world. Others sacrifice everything; life and property, father and mother, home and fatherland, in order to <u>make</u> Him known among the peoples. I pray you to ask yourself: What is Jesus to me?

O Bringer of salvation, Who wondrously hast wrought, Thyself the revelation Of love beyond our thought: We worship Thee, we bless Thee, To Thee, O Christ, we sing; We praise Thee, and confess Thee Our gracious Lord and King
