or a Christian life, is a battle. No one who is desirous of doing the Lord's will can go through life without meeting opposition. The powers which still rule in and about the earth are enemies of God's people. The Bible admonishes us to fight the good fight so that we may stand after having emerged victorious over all opposition. *"He that overcometh shall thus be arrayed in white garments; and I will in no wise blot his name out of the book of life, and I will confess his name before my Father, and before his angels."* Rev. 3:5. . . .

Many a Christian warrior has found life's sweetest honey in the midst of battle; he has been given a clearer vision, a new fire in the heart and a new power in his life. I dare say that if you want a Christian full of fresh vigor and with an unimpaired spiritual vision search among those who have been in battle and have returned with victory. They have tasted the honey of life and their eyes have been enlightened.

The greatest joy and purest gratitude is found in the heart of a Christian who has been in battle and has won the victory. It is not in times of peace that a Christian comes closest to his God, but in the victorious battle. If this were clear to all of us, many problems would be solved, many tears wiped away, and man, a discouraged soldier of the Cross, would wield his sword with greater vigor.

The battle is not against flesh and blood (Ed. IN itself!). It is not a war among people as we usually think of war, ... It is a spiritual warfare. No cannon is seen or heard; no saber glitters in the sunshine, and no bayonet is used against the enemy. But it is war nevertheless; anyone who is anxious to save his soul will soon discover that.

The hosts of wickedness arrayed against the Christian can possibly be divided into two groups. The one group is described in our text as principalities, powers, and world rulers of this darkness. This must be those people who live outside of fellowship with God.

It is still true that in most places on this earth true Christianity has not penetrated very far into the life of the people. Those who rule are usually worldly people. They have the power in this age, and it is likely that we shall have no change until Christ returns. Only rarely do they rule in harmony with God's Word and Spirit. The spirit of the world is like a boa constrictor that is ready to crush its victim; Christians meet it on every hand. As long as there is a spark of spiritual life in your and my heart we shall have to battle against this evil spirit; if we do not, our Christianity will soon be a thing of the past.

The Christian needs to be clad in the full armor of God at all times; his battlefield is in the worldly home, the worldly business places, in worldly society, in town hall or the halls of Congress. Briefly, a Christian must be prepared for war wherever he is. He who thinks himself spiritually secure will soon discover that the world is a strong and dangerous enemy of everything that is from God.

Christians of a generation or two ago were very much afraid of keeping too much company with worldly people; possibly they went too far in that direction. They forgot

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that it was not human beings they were to turn away from, but the spirit which dominates in the world. It may be that we have gone to the opposite extreme; Christians today do not think of the world as being particularly worldly. Christianity has been made to fit into the scheme of things in the world. Christians of the present day are not afraid of being associated with worldly people in business or politics. When worldly people are reasonable in their attitudes as they frequently are, it is so easy for the Christian to lay the sword aside. But then he does not have to go much further before he is a friend of the world and an enemy of God

The friendship of the world is enmity with God.

It appears so innocent to be friendly with the world, it looks so refined too. But it is not long before the friendship of the world is found to be more delectable than the company of Christians. When that happens we are on slipperv ice; only God's grace can keep us from falling. As a fly is caught and loses its life in a web of exceedingly fine threads woven by the spider, so have many Christians been caught in the web of worldliness and have lost their lives. They died quietly, yet so surely. They forgot that they were at war; this was the tragedy that spelled their doom.

Here – precisely here – many present day Christians are in great danger; many have already been deceived, perhaps even without knowing it. While they are boasting of having progressed far beyond the gloomy spirituality of the pietists, they have landed in a veritable black death; they have pinned a Christian badge on the lapel of a worldly spirit. They still want to be known as Christians. Thus humbug is frequently paraded as Christianity that has been liberated from ignorance and superstition; it is Christianity that has grown to maturity.

"Blessed is he that watcheth, and keepeth his garments, lest he walk naked, and they see his shame."

To resist with all might On every hand Is both proper and right For him who will stand. But it takes more than this a wreath to win, Persistency alone will conquer sin.

As a nation we are moving from a self-reliant people to a people dependent on government for just about everything. A report from the Heritage Foundation shows that since 1960 the number of individuals receiving government funding has gone from 21.7 million to 67.3 million. Approximately 70 percent of the federal budget goes to assorted social and assistance programs. At the same time, 49.5 percent of all Americans pay no income tax.

One in five or 47.73 million persons are now receiving food stamps, with a price tag of \$81 billion per year. There has been an increase in food stamp recipients of 51.7 percent since 2008. Recently the government has been running ads on television encouraging more people to sign up for food stamps. Some liberal politicians falsely state that food stamps are an effective way to stimulate the economy.

While our nation should provide help to those truly in need *(Ed. OR the church)*, it would seem today's liberal politicians have an ill-advised plan to turn people from self-reliance into a people dependent on big government for their very survival.

Thank sgiving

It is 'beneficial' for 'us' to <u>know</u> where 'we' came from, in order to give 'us' a sense of 'direction' of where we are going!

ONE Autumn night in 1607, a furtive group of men, women and children set off in a relay of small boats from the English Village of Scrooby, in pursuit of 'freedom' in a fresh start; numbering no more of 50 to 60, as we know today as <u>Pilgrims.</u>

Heading across the North Sea to the Netherlands with a chance to build new lives, and to 'Worship' as they chose, and to avoid the fate of fellow Separatists; who were hanged for their religious beliefs in 1593...

In 'our' great USA since 1863, 'Thanksgiving' has been observed as a 'holiday.' There are some who actually claim that *Thanksgiving day (?)* began at El Paso, Texas, in 1598.

Actually the first 'Thanksgiving' *day* (here in USA) was in 1623 – when they gave 'thanks' when a much needed rain ended a drought.

ESPECIALLY in years gone by, 'Thanksgiving Day' was observed by church worship service; rather *than feasting*!

President George Washington actually proclaimed the FIRST **Thanksgiving Day** *in* <u>'our' beloved land</u> in 1789.

Very 'early' in the morning of 8/25/13 (app. 3:40 a.m.) 'our' telephone rang, which informed 'us' that a severe thunderstorm and lightning was in the making for 'our' area with possible high wind and hail. (Actually we had a very 'wet' spring and a dry summer up to this point): <u>BUT</u> in essence 'we' did not receive a drop of rain!

NOW why is it that we readily appreciate the 'Fore-Casters' – fore-cast; BUT have such difficulty taking GOD AT HIS WORD (the Bible)?

"...They are clouds without water, carried about by the winds; late autumn trees without fruit, twice dead, pulled up by the roots; raging waves of the sea, foaming up their own shame, wandering stars for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever." Jude 12b & 13.

YET

Seemingly (at large) 'we' fail to realize 'we' are living in these days of 'Apostasy,' falling away!

Now I want to emphasize the word **REMEMBER**, because "thanksgiving" is not *necessarily* what you and I possess (stewards) now; but memory of the heart!

I recall being told about a lady, probably in her 'eighties'

who was experiencing the pain of a toothache and under her 'breath' she was grumbling/complaining to the LORD in regards to her discomfort and then suddenly realizing she had never had a 'toothache' before in her entire life. So quickly she began thanking and praising her LORD!

REMEMBER you and I (and everyone else) were born 'sinners' (Psalm 51:5, 58:3, Isaiah 53:6, Romans 3:10-20) and with 'our' *spiritual eyes blinded!*

It is good to keep this in 'mind/heart' when 'we' pray for lost loved one, neighbors, friends and whoever; but don't 'dwell' on that in your 'own' personal life; but what are YOU now! There is a *danger* on dwelling too much of what I was, because the very important thing is where am I standing now today, spiritually before 'our' thrice HOLY GOD, <u>now</u>? The BIBLE clearly states that 'we' are to examine 'ourselves' in the light of His Word! Scripture is clear in stating the terrible experience that it is possible for the 'Spirit of the Lord' to leave a person and that person is not even aware of it – how tragic! Thus 'we' need to keep in mind that 'our' heart is deceitful and desperately 'wicked' Jeremiah 17:9 and not gamble with 'our' eternal Soul!

Martin Luther shares that a living faith (**LIVES**) as long as it struggles and that a person will always end up back at CALVARY. ALL 'redeemed' sinners find that the ground is level at the foot of CALVARY! Isaiah 43:25-26, 44:22, 1 John 1:7-9, Col. 2:9-10, 1 Cor. 1:30-31 & 1 Thess. 2:4.

"Enoch walked with God"! What a 'testimony', <u>In God's</u> <u>Grace, can that be said about YOU?</u> Remember what you <u>ARE</u> speaks so loud that often they can not hear what you say! 11 Corinthians 5:7.

<u>REMEMBER</u> we definitely are living in what the BIBLE calls '*Perilous Times*', which means very difficult times! Days of 'deception and Apostasy/falling away.

IN the 'Lukewarm' church today; if those who are in 'leadership' sense or realize you are about to 'leave' because of what Scripture states; likely they will seek to put you in a role of leadership; like a Sunday School teacher, Deacon, Trustee, etc. Thus likely 'human reasoning' will say you must stay now as a Light and Salt; while the Bible (God) says: "And I heard another voice from heaven saying, 'Come out of her my people, lest you share in her sins, and lest you receive of her plagues. For her sins have reached to heaven, and God has remember her iniq*uities.* "Revelation 18:4-5, 11 Thessalonians 3:5-6, 1 Samuel 15:22-24, Rev. 2:4, 3:3. ONE has said that IF there is a time in your life and you loved Jesus more than you love Him now; you are in a back-slidden position.

BUT 'remember' when you have to leave a congregation/group; you do so because of what Scripture states and not at all a 'personality difference' or any 'root' of bitterness, etc. LOVE is tested by 'obedience' to His Word!

"'<u>Sanctify</u> (set apart & unto) <u>them by Your truth.</u> Your <u>word is truth</u>."" John 17:17. <u>Remember</u> 'Freedom' both physically and spiritually is never FREE! (Salvation is free (God's Grace)); but there definitely is a cost involved in true discipleship. Most certainly 'we' are in a intense spiritual battle/warship!

<u>REMEMBER</u> that at the time of the institution of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, when JESUS said one of you are going to 'betray me'; they did not point their finger at Judas, but asked the very heart searching question: "*Lord*, *is it I*?" Martin Luther also shared that the one who does not 'fear himself' has the greatest reason to 'fear' of all! Proverbs 3:5-6, Hebrews 4:11-16, *Psalm 80:18b-19*, *119:149*.

How tragic, but realistic that 'deception' in our 'day' is rampant, which shouldn't catch 'us' by surprise; because God in His Infinite LOVE tells 'us' in His Holy Word about false prophets, those who follow 'signs and wonders' that the very 'elect' shall be deceived IF possible! Matthew 24 & 25. Yes, there are those who are 'deceiving and being deceived' themselves: especially so in 'perilous times'. *"For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ. And no wonder! For Satan himself transforms himself into an angel of light."* 11 Corinthians 11:3, 13-14, Galatians 1:1-9.

<u>REMEMBER</u> while you go through various 'afflictions' that cruel tool is held with nail pierced 'hands' for 'our' good with one of two purposes in Infinite LOVE and that is either to show us our need of a 'Living Savior' and/or to

GREEN PASTURES

(Continued from last issue of MG)

Green pastures are literally <u>"pastures of tender grass.</u>" ... Moffat says, "He makes me lie in meadows green."

The green pastures are the young, tender, tasty, nutritive grass upon which the sheep feed.

For us, we repeat, the green pastures are the tasty, nutritive Scriptures.

The Psalmist said, "How sweet are thy words unto my taste! Yea, sweeter than honey to my mouth." "They shall hear my words for they are sweet." Food gives us physical strength; so also food gives us spiritual strength.

When there was a scarcity of copies of the Bible and a copy was chained to a pillar in St. Paul's Cathedral, there was chained to that pillar green pastures where the sheep of God might come and eat to the full.

We read the experience of a Catholic boy of many, many years ago. Some pages of the Bible fell into his hands. He read them and believed them, and experienced the great change that comes in regeneration. His mother, a fanatical Catholic, could not understand the change that had taken place in her son. She thought that maybe it had something to do with the secrecy of his room at night, for he retired to his room every evening and locked the door. One night she peeked through the keyhole, saw him take some papers out of the mattress where they were hidden. She watched him read with a smile on his lips and a shine in his eyes. The next day, while her son was away, she went into his room and removed the pages of the Book from the hiding place in the mattress. She took them to her priest, with the result that her son was brought before the cruel Inquisition and condemned. That boy was a sheep of God feeding in the green pastures of the Word, but more than that: he was honored by being counted worthy to "suffer for His sake," and even when tied to a stake in the valley of the shadow of death he feared no evil, for the Good Shepherd was with him, watching over His sheep.

The trouble with too many sheep of God today is that they wander in fields where there is no pasture. They are like Mephibosheth, the son of Jonathan, who lived in Lodebar, which means "no pasture."

The world is nothing but a howling wilderness in which a child of God can never find nourishment. Too many are like the prodigal son who turned his back on father and on father's home to walk his own path of self-will, wasting his substance in riotous living until at last he came, not to the green pastures where the sheep fed, but to the fields of husks where the swine fed. Swine's food will never nourish a sheep of God.

Too many times the sheep wander in fields where noxious weeds grow. They become poisoned with the false doctrines of the day. There is no nourishment in error-only deadly danger.

Some pastures are withered and dry. Newspapers, magazines, man's books do not nourish spiritual life. I am not saying that we should not know the news, that we should not read sermons and commentaries, that we should not follow our Father's work in the world, but I am saying that the spiritual nature of God's sheep demands the green pastures of God's Word.

The test of real food is its sustaining power. One may eat a great deal of food that neither strengthens nor sustains. I have read that on one occasion when the Jews were driven from Russia without even the bare necessities of life, they ground up weeds, mixed them with clay, to try to satisfy their hunger. The terrible edge of appetite was dulled in this way, but the people still died for there was no food value in what they ate.

The pastures of God are always unfailing in supply. We cannot walk with our Shepherd without finding them. Two disciples on the way to Emmaus had lost all their spiritual zest, but as they walked with Him they were led by Him into the green pastures of the Word, and they returned to Jerusalem filled with zeal. God's pastures are ready at every hour of need.

"He maketh me to lie down" gives to us a picture of repose. It is a picture of fullness and satisfaction. Sheep will not lie down when they are hungry. If you see a sheep lying down in green pastures, you may be sure the sheep is satisfied. Sheep do not eat lying down. If you put a tuft of sweet, tender grass under the nose of a lying sheep it will not eat it unless it first rises to its feet. Such fullness and satisfaction can only come to us through the Word.

The rest of the sheep is not an idle rest. Sheep do not lie down to feed, but they chew the cud. They bring up from the first stomach the grass they have eaten and chew it over and over and over again. The sheep is a ruminant. Remember that in the Law of Moses God declared that the clean animals were the ones that chewed the cud and divided the hoof. That refers to proper digestion and a steady walk. It is these things that make us clean in the sight of God. In Psalm 1 we read: "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. His delight is in the law of the Lord; and in his law doth he meditate day and night." That word "meditate" is really "ruminate," and merely means chewing the cud. Too many times we read the Word of God hastily. Too many times we read a large portion merely to say we have read so much. The Bible should be read, but it would be better to take one verse and chew it over and over and over again to get the sweetness and strength out of it than to read three chapters or a whole book and not know what we have read when we have finished...

The shepherd is satisfied to have the sheep lying down chewing the cud, for he knows they are putting on fat and growing wool. Our Shepherd delights in our soul-fatness, too, and in the wool of our service and praise by which He is enriched.

"He maketh me to lie down." This is a lying down under loving constraint and compulsion. It seems that sometimes we need to be made to lie down that He might accomplish His purpose in us. Paul was made to lie down in green pastures in a Roman prison. Out of those green pastures came the fatness of Ephesians, Philippians, and Colossians. John Bunyan was made to lie down in green pastures in the Bedford jail, and out of those green pastures came the wool of "Pilgrim's Progress." Dr. J. R. Miller said, I found green pastures in the little white bed of the hospital." So sometimes He puts us on beds that we might ruminate. Too many times men break down spiritually because they will not lie down. The disciples, at our Lord's command, could make five thousand sit down upon the tender green grass to satisfy their natural hunger from His abundance. There is blessed constraint in that "maketh me," for it means to satisfy our spiritual hunger out of His abundance.

He has given us his very great and precious promises 2 Peter 1:4

When a shipbuilder erects a boat, does he do so only to keep it on the scaffolding? No, he builds it to sail the seas and to weather the storms. In fact, if he does not think of strong winds and hurricanes as he builds it, he is a poor shipbuilder.

In the same way, when God made you a believer, He meant to test you. And when He gave you promises and asked you to trust them, He made His promises suitable for times of storms and high seas. Do you believe that some of His promises are counterfeit, similar to a life vest that looks good in the store but is of no use in the sea?

We have all seen swords that are beautiful but are useless in war, or shoes made for decoration but not for walking. Yet God's shoes are made of iron and brass, and we can walk all the way to heaven in them, without ever wearing them out. And we could swim the Atlantic a thousand times in His life vest, with no fear of ever sinking. His Word of promise is meant to be tried and tested.

There is nothing Christ dislikes more than for His people to publicly profess Him and then not use Him. He loves for us to make use of Him, for His covenant blessings are not simply meant to be looked at but should be appropriated. Our Lord Jesus has been given to us for our present use. Are you making use of Him as you should? O beloved, I plead with you not to treat God's promises as something to be displayed in a museum but to use them as everyday sources of comfort. And whenever you have a time of need, trust the Lord. Charles H. Spurgeon

But When You Sin

"And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous." 1 John 2:1

There is no suggestion anywhere in Scripture that any person can be sinless. "*All have sinned*" (Romans 3:23), the Bible boldly declares. "*There is none righteous, no, not* <u>one</u>"(Romans 3:10). Repentance toward God (Acts 20:21) and salvation by God (2 Corinthians 7:10) eternally settles the issue of the sinful *condition* inherent in us (Ephesians 2:1-8). However, even though we have been "<u>made the righteousness of God in him</u>" (2 Corinthians 5:21), we still commit sinful acts (1 John 1:8-10)!

Hallelujah for the *Advocate*! What a blessed promise it is that is recorded for us that the same Jesus Christ who died for our sins, who rose from the grave in glorious victory over sin, "*is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us*" (Romans 8:34).

Although our security in the completed work of Christ Jesus is "for ever" (Hebrews 10:12), our great High Priest (Hebrews 4:14) stands ready to rebut the constant efforts of Satan to flaunt our sins before the holy throne of God (Revelation 12:10). We have no standing there on our own. Our life, even though forgiven and "rescued" from sin, still is tainted with the deeds and consequences of evil choices. Even the body in which we live houses "no good thing" (Romans 7:1).

The child of God, though redeemed by "*the precious blood of Christ*" (1 Peter 1:19), has no ability to plead Christ's work in person before the throne. "<u>Wherefore he (Jesus) is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them</u>" (Hebrews 7:25).

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Our Eternal Bodies

Only those religions which believe in special creation – that is, Orthodox Judaism, Islam, and Christianity – also believe in a bodily resurrection. Of the three creationist/resurrectionist religion, however, only the CHRISTIAN FAITH acknowledges that the resurrection can be possible only when the <u>CREATOR</u> becomes the atoning Savior,

dying for sin and thereby defeating death.

When Christ arose from the tomb, He could proclaim, "*I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore*" (Revelation 1:18). His resurrection body was the same physical body that had been in the grave, able to be touched and even retaining its crucifixion scars. Nevertheless, it was different, a "spiritual" body (1 Corinthians 15:42-49), controlled by spiritual forces. The psalmist David thanks the Lord for those who admonish and correct: "Let the righteous smite me; it shall be a kindness; and let him reprove me; it shall be an excellent oil ..."(V. 5). Solomon concurs; "Faithful are the wounds of a friend" (Prov. 27:6). The best friends are not necessarily those who are ready to commend, compliment and say whatever is required at the moment to make us feel better. The friend indeed is the one who will speak the truth in love, even if that means we might be pained for a time due to a needed word of exhortation or even rebuke. "The righteous" who thus speak are exactly that, "righteous" - they speak what is right and what is required according to God's truth. The counsel of godly associates, even if it "smites: or hits us right where it hurts, in invaluable; such exhortation is an "excellent oil" - it is just what is needed to medicate our backsliding heart or to prod us in the right way. Godly fellowship are a blessing and spiritual help (vv. 5b, 6); however, compromised associations always result in spiritual debilitation (1:1, 4-6; 119:63).

The psalmist concludes by saying that even though he may be facing a desperate situation in which it appears that his enemies have gained the victory, his eyes are still on the Lord (vv. 7-8). When the prospect of deliverance seems impossible, God's provision is near. The Lord will certainly not leave His child to be a prey for the adversary, and we can trust our God to deliver us from the entrapments of the wicked (vv. 9-10). God can counter anything the Devil throws our way, but we must turn to Him as did the psalmist David. May this marvelous petition of Psalm 141 be ours today.

Does A Pastor Have Authority to Forgive Sins?

"But in order that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." (Mark 2:10)

In some liturgies, after the confession of sin, the pastor stands in front of the congregation and pronounces something similar to this:

"Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, **I forgive you all your sins**, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost."

Note that he is not just pronouncing God's forgiveness, but he himself is forgiving the listeners their sins. Does he have the authority under God to do this?

Were you to question a pastor on this, he would probably tell you that Jesus promised the apostles that they could forgive and retain the sins of others. "If you forgive the sins of any, their sins have been forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they have been retained." (John 20:23) It is called "The Office of the Keys" where the pastors are said to have this authority to "bind and loose, or forgive and retain," the sins of others based upon John 20:23.

Please note two important things about this verse. First, it is pronounced to the apostles only, not to the pastors of churches. Both Timothy and Titus were pastors and the apostle Paul never said anything of this sort to them. We would only believe this would be true for pastors today if we believed in Apostolic Succession – which is the false notion that the apostolic office continues through the pastors today.

Secondly, there is no record in Scripture of the apostles themselves ever forgiving or retaining the sins of others. Rather, Scripture records where they pronounced (preached or wrote) what God had said in His Word about repentance of sin and faith in Jesus in order to receive forgiveness of sins from God.

On the day of Pentecost, Peter preached to the crowd assembled in Jerusalem. They were pricked to the heart of their sins and their need for salvation. They then asked the apostle Peter what they must do. Peter's reply was this: *"Repent, and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."* (Acts 2:38). Notice that Peter did not forgive these people their sins, rather he told them what they must do in order that God could forgive them their sins. Also, the apostle Paul pronounced what God would say about people and their sins: "And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is worthless, you are still in your sins." (1 Cor. 15:17) Paul was making a rhetorical argument for the resurrection of Christ and stating that, if Jesus were not raised, you would still be in your sins. Notice that he did not tell them, "I retain your sins, and therefore you are still in them;" rather he was stating that only the resurrected Christ can forgive sins, and if He be not risen, then you are in your sins. (Thank God that Christ is risen!)

Notice in these two examples of the apostles forgiving and retaining sins that they were simply pronouncing what the Scripture records: Anyone who comes to Jesus in repentance of sin and faith in Him has the promise of Scripture of forgiveness of sins from Jesus, not through any other agent.

Since only God has the authority to forgive people their sins (Mark 2:7) and this is through Jesus, Who is God in the Flesh (Mark 2:10), the apostles and the church merely declared what God does. When a man repents of sins and accepts Jesus, his sins are forgiven. If he does not, he does not have forgiveness of sins. A pastor (or other Christian) can simply repeat what Scripture says: "If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1:8-9) This is called a "Declaration of Grace" where the pastor tells the listeners what God says in His Word about those who confess their sins and believe in Jesus. Note that the apostle John did not absolve the people of their sins, rather he pronounced the truth of God: If you deny sin, you are not forgiven. If you confess your sins, God will forgive you.

Lest we think this is a small matter, some even take this to the point that, if an unbeliever simply believes the absolution from the pastor, his sins are forgiven, whether or not he has repented of his sins or come to Christ. This leads to false conversions and people deluded about their eternal destiny. Before Luther's conversion, he confessed all of his sins at length to Staupitz, yet never had peace of heart that his sins were forgiven, even though Staupitz would have forgiven him. It wasn't until Luther came to personal faith in Jesus through the Word of God that he knew his sins were forgiven, because Jesus had then forgiven him and given him that assurance of salvation.

I once knew a man who believed in a priest having this authority to forgive or retain sins. I asked him once,

"What would you do if you confessed your sins to the priest and he didn't forgive you?" His reply was, "I would find another priest!" Isn't this the heart of the matter? We are depending on a human agent to do what only God can do.

Are you relying on this for forgiveness of your sins? Are you relying on the fact that your pastor has pronounced to you that your sins are forgiven, when you have not repented of your sins before God and come to Jesus in faith? Then hear what Jesus Himself says about this: "*I* said therefore to you, that you shall die in your sins; for unless you believe that I am He, you shall die in your sins." (John 8:24)

For the spiritually mature, the blessing comes not from the gift itself, but from the love and sacrifice that it represents.

It is More of a Blessing to Give

Let me try to sell you on this great truth: the happiest people in the world are not the getters but the givers. Why is this true?

Givers are more blessed because they control their

<u>personal happiness.</u> If you are only happy when you are receiving, then you will only be happy when someone decides to give you something. Your happiness is at the mercy of the generosity and thoughtfulness of others.

But if you are happier giving, you can be happy whenever you like, because you can choose to give whenever you like.

Several years ago, I had two young ladies in our youth group who were about the same age. One was constantly moody. It seemed that she was only happy when someone was complimenting her or in some way shining the spotlight on her.

The other young lady always seemed to have a smile on her face. She spent her time encouraging and uplifting others around her. She often did things secretly for teens in our youth group when she found out they had a need.

I have never met a happier young lady. Why? Because she had died to self and was constantly living for others, she was living a more blessed life.

<u>Givers are more blessed because they spend their time</u> <u>thinking of others.</u> Try to spend some time each morning planning to be a giver. Think of people you will come in contact with how you can lift their burden or make them smile.

Let me share an observation: selfish, self-centered people are the most miserable people in the world! Two great secrets to happiness are dying to self and living for others.

Hanging On Nothing

Read: Job 26:5-14

He stretches out the north over empty space; He hangs the earth on nothing. Job 26:7

A world map published by National Geographic Society has this notation: "Earth's mass is 6.6 sextillion tons." And what supports all that weight? **Nothing.** The planet we inhabit spins on its axis at 1,000 miles per hour as it hurtles through space in its orbit around the sun. But it's easy for that to remain unnoticed in the midst of our daily concerns about health, relationships, and how to pay the bills.

The Old Testament character Job repeatedly considered God's creation in his struggle to make sense of the numbing loss of his health, his wealth, and his children. "(God) *stretches out the north over empty space*," Job said. "*He hangs the earth on nothing:* (Job 26:7). Job marveled at the clouds that did not break under the heavy water inside them (v.8) and the horizon "at the boundary of light and darkness" (v.10), but called them "the mere edges of His ways" (v. 14).

Creation itself did not answer Job's questions, but the heavens and the earth pointed him to God the creator, who alone could respond with help and hope.

The Lord who upholds the universe by the "word of His power" (Heb. 1:3; Col. 1:17) is in control of our everyday lives. Experiences that seem "empty places" are all undergirded by our heavenly Father's power and love. — David McCasland
