# Religion Without Salvation

n our roadhouses, night-clubs and nudist camps of today, and in the Hollywood cesspool and Reno divorce-mill, we have reached *perhaps* still lower depths of sin, shame and vice, than among the old heathen nation. Now, as at the time of Christ, it is really devils that are worshipped; and God's people should have no fellowship with devils. 1 Cor. 10:20.

In this dreadful darkness we discern three classes of people:

- 1. Those who clung fanatically to their heathen worship some even in the depth of their superstitious fear sacrificing their own children to their gods, e. g. to Moloch, the fire-god. How cruel the devil is; and how deceitful.
- 2. Those who went to the other extreme, worshipped nothing, but gave themselves up to doubt, unbelief and infidelity. "What is truth?"
- 3. Those who had a sincere longing after the true God, yet they knew not God. Some such longing souls had even built an altar to "An Unknown God" in Athens. Acts. 17:23. Some came all the way from Greece to Jerusalem because they "desired to see Jesus." John 12:21

We have the same three classes today. Some, like the heathen Buddhists, cling in superstitious reverence to their religious ceremonies and bring their sacrifices. Others, even preachers, go to the other extreme and abandon themselves to doubt, unbelief and infidelity. Then we have a few longing souls groping in darkness after the true

God and salvation. May they find Him! <u>"Earth has no sadder sight than that of a man who does not know his best</u> Friend."

But not only among the heathen were men lost in sin, lost with religion, lost and without salvation, but among the Jews as well. There were *three religious parties among the Jews* – all full of religion but without salvation, although they had the great advantage of possessing the Word of God. Rom. 3:1-2.

- 1. The Pharisees who trusted in themselves that they were righteous clung "tooth and nail" to their ceremonies and ordinances. But they rejected Christ, rejected the new birth and were lost in sin with all their religion.
- 2. The Sadducees who cut the Bible to pieces and denied the resurrection in Acts 23:8, because they "neither knew the Scriptures nor the power of God." Matt. 22:19. They were indifferent, cold and hard persecuting God's people. Acts 4:1-3.
- 3. The Essenes, a less-known religious party, who went deeper than the Pharisees stressing simplicity, self-denial, obedience, prayer, meditation and separation from the world. They had a very good religion, but without salvation just the same, as so many today.

All told, what a mix-up in the religious world with utter confusion when Christ appeared – both among the Jews and Gentiles. It was a world full of religion, yet utterly lost, and continually sinking deeper and deeper into sin and darkness. And where salvation is not experienced

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

#### **HUMANISM**

Cursed is the man who trusts in man and makes flesh his strength... Jeremiah 17:5

To understand humanism's impact on our culture, we

must understand its basic doctrines. First, humanism touts the doctrine of *atheism*. Whereas our catechism says that humankind's chief end is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever, the humanist says that humankinds' chief end is to glorify humankind. The originator of humanism, the ancient Greek philosopher Protagoras, said, "Man is the measure of all things." Humanism also asserts the doctrine of evolution. Humanists believe the universe is self-existing and not created, and that humans simply evolved from lesser forms and are, therefore, nothing more than animals. The third doctrine of humanism is amorality. Humanists don't believe in absolutes, but, instead, view truth as relative. Finally, humanists believe that we must have a collectivist society, sacrificing individual well-being for the common good. Some have said that humanism is nothing other than communism in philosophical garb.

Is humanism a religion? The *Humanist Manifesto* of 1933 calls it such nine times. Not only is humanism a religion, it is an insidious one. It uses our public schools as church buildings and many teachers serve as its ministers, while its high priesthood is the National Education Association. Every year our nation spends tens of billions of dollars to propagate humanism's doctrines and tenets. Humanism is particularly dangerous because, unlike any other religion in America, it is endorsed in the public schools and established in every department of the government of the United States.

We know Who wins in the end, but tragically, many souls will be lost under humanism's influence. Pray that Jesus will save those who promote this false religion and those who believe in it.

# Memories of my friend, Lucille

I first met Lucille when members of our church and I stopped by her assisted living apartment to sing Christmas Carols to her. She smiled, greeted us and when we handed a plate of Christmas cookies, thanked us. Members of the church told me that at one time she and her husband had even joined the church. However, when he died, she stopped coming. Now it was tradition to take her a plate of food at Thanksgiving and cookies at Christmas. She was around 90 years old at the time and quite frail.

When I began visiting folks at the apartments, I decided to stop in to make her acquaintance. The first day I visited her I began to talk a little about Jesus and she quickly cut me off by saying she did not believe in Him so did not want to talk about anything spiritual. I couldn't believe what I was hearing and, after going home, felt very burdened that I needed to share my personal testimony with her. After praying about it for some time, I took my Bible and went back hoping to witness to her. After chatting a bit, I told her I felt compelled to talk to her about Jesus. She told me once again, she did not believe in Jesus but believed that when she died she simply was going into the ground and that would be her end. I told her I understood what she believed, but I wanted to share with her what I believed. Reading verses from my Bible I told her how I, a sinner, had come to Jesus, believing that on the Cross He shed His blood to forgive me. I read John 3:16, 1 John 1:9 and Rev. 3:20 as I shared. When I finished she once again clearly told me she did not believe any of it and did not want to talk about it any further. I left that day with a heavy heart, but continued to pray consistently for her. I decided I would visit her as a friend and not share anymore spiritually unless the Lord clearly opened the door.

Then one day, I took my granddaughter along to visit the Plaza residents. We went from room to room talking and praying with each one before we left. Before I entered Lucille's apartment, I reminded Meggie that I might not talk about Jesus there, but would simply visit with her about other things. We did that and then unbelievably, just as we were about to leave, Lucille told me I could pray if I wanted to. Meggie says I looked so surprised she wondered if I was going to be able to pray out loud. I did, thanking Jesus for dying on the Cross, for His forgiveness and His love to everyone who reaches out to Him. From that day on she asked me to pray when I was ready to leave and sometimes I felt like God gave me a mini-sermon in my prayer.

She reached her 94th birthday and still seemed to

have no faith in Christ. I continued to pray daily for her salvation. Then a few months ago I was ready to travel out west for a couple weeks and once again went to see her. She was very frail and I could see she had only a short time to live. I approached her bed and asked her if she was ready to meet God. She bluntly told me, "I told you I don't believe in God." I answered, "But I do, and I love you enough that I don't want you to go to hell." Again I left with a heavy heart!

When I was gone I prayed for her often, calling once to find her family was now staying with her. When I arrived home she was in Hospice, and once again God prompted me to go and visit Lucille. I went. She was conscious and responded to my questions with a nod, so I knew she could hear. Then I said, "Lucille, you are soon going to die. Are you saved? Are you ready to stand before God?" She did not respond. Then I told her I was going to pray the sinner's prayer with her. If in her mind and heart she knew she was s sinner and was willing to put her trust in Jesus for Salvation, she could simply believe and Jesus would forgive her sin and take her to Heaven to be with Him. After I prayed, I opened my eyes to see tears running down Lucille's cheeks. The Holy Spirit was at work in the heart of my hardheartened friend. Lucille died that evening. I don't know for certain that she turned to Jesus, but I know Jesus loved her much more than I did. I am reminded of the thief on the cross who said, "Remember me when you come into your Kingdom." And Jesus replied, "Today, you will be with me in paradise." I know God saw her softened heart and I'm believing I will see her in Heaven someday!

Lord adds further, "Whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life." If you believe this, the assurance is offered that you have everlasting life.


(A Living) faith rests upon the Word (the whole BIBLE), and the believer possessing the Word possesses everything that the Word promises.



# Religious Liberty Matters in U.S. too, Mr. President

An Attorney who represents Religious Liberty cases says it's appalling that the Obama Administration claims to be concerned about religious freedom.

The State Department earlier this month released its annual report on global religious freedom, documenting violations in almost 200 countries. The annual Report on International Religious Freedom cited countries, many of them Muslim, for violating "recognized human rights."

Yet the Obama administration has failed to defend religious liberty abroad and here at home, says Jordan Lorence, senior counsel at <u>Alliance Defending Freedom</u>.

"The Obama administration has at best been dragging its feet in defense of religious liberty on the international stage," Lorence complains. "It is relatively better than what they've been doing on the domestic stage here in the United States."

Some examples include the Little Sisters of the Poor and its fight over the contraception mandate, and the administration's fight against a Lutheran church after it fired a teacher working in its private school.

National Review writer David French wrote about Little Sisters and Hosanna-Tabor Evangelical Lutheran Church in a <u>May article</u>, when the U.S. Supreme Court vacated previous rulings and sent the case to a lower court. The high court ruled unanimously for the Lutheran church, too.

"The Obama administration has pushed hard against religious liberty – on occasion too hard even for the Supreme Court's more liberal justices," French, an attorney, wrote.

Religious liberty, Lorence insists, is much more than protecting people from torture and murder.

The Chief Rabbi of Israel Urges Rebuilding of the Temple

Rabbi David Lau, the Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi of Israel, has stated that he wants to see the temple rebuilt on the Temple Mount. According to Rabbi Lau, it could be built without removing any of the Muslim structures now standing on the Temple Mount. "There is plenty of room for Jews, Christians, Muslims, everyone," he told the Knesset Channel in a recent interview.

Rabbi Lau's comments about rebuilding the temple are remarkable, since his predecessors operated with a very different mindset on that subject. Since becoming Chief Rabbi, Lau has visited the Temple Institute in Jerusalem, another amazing event, since that organization and the chief rabbinate have been at odds for years over rebuilding the temple.

The Temple Institute is an organization of Orthodox Jews that is working to see the temple rebuilt on the Temple Mount. They have prepared many of the implements and vessels that will be used once the temple is in operation.

Lau and all the chief rabbis before him have followed a strict view that Jews should not go onto the Temple Mount. A sign at one of the entrances to the Temple warns Jews against going there. Furthermore, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has pledged to maintain the status quo that prohibits Jews from praying at the site. Thus a public pronouncement by Rabbi Lau that he would like to see the Temple rebuilt is ponderous indeed, as is his visit to the Temple Institute, because its leaders all regularly go onto the Temple Mount.

When I learned what Rabbi Lau said about wanting to see the temple rebuilt, and when I learned that he had visited the Temple Institute, all kinds of bells went off in my mind. For years in my books and lectures on Israel and prophecy, I have set forth the proposition that the temple could be erected on the Temple Mount without disturbing either the Dome of the Rock or the al Aqsa Mosque. The large area immediately north of the Dome of the Rock may, in fact, be the location where the original temple stood, and it is vacant today.

Needless to say, any attempt to rebuild the temple there would be met with the full fury of present-day Muslims around the world. However, it has been my contention that as we move closer to the formation and acceptance of a unified global religion, such a temple could be erected there, but only under the authority of a world dictator, described by the Bible as the antichrist. Indeed, it would take a person of unassailable power, influence and authority to cause the temple to be built.

In recent years we are all witnesses to an assortment of prophetic signs of Scripture being fulfilled. The daily news makes it ever more clear as well that Jesus Christ is coming soon. It is amazing that a growing consensus among religious Jews in Israel regarding the rebuilding of the temple should become so pronounced today. Surely the biblical signs relating to Israel, the temple and the coming antichrist are in evidence today. That discussions about rebuilding of the temple by Jewish leaders are evident at the same time ought to make all Christians realize the truth that the coming of Messiah Jesus is approaching.

# "I Delight in the Law of God in My Inmost Self"

I will put my law in their inward parts, and in thy heart will I write it. Jeremiah 31:33

Is not "God's law" "God's will" also? We are made aware that God's law is written in the heart and mind only by this manifestation that the heart loves God's will and that our attitude is such that we fervently pray: would that I could keep Thy will with my whole heart! Would that I might be able to do God's will!

We are not claiming that a Christian is a perfect person. No, no, there is much in his inner life and outward mode of loving which is rather unsound or shaky. Nevertheless take note! If he understands what the will of God is then this law becomes his life-guide; then he also wants to fulfill it. We must necessarily cling to this that a Christian heart and mind are such.

We speak only of the mind of the inner man. In the very Chapter (Roman 7) where the Apostle's complaint reaches a climax or reaches a peak where the Apostle complains about "the law of sin in my members," he says "For to will is present with me" – "For I delight in the law of God after the inward man." This is the prevailing condition in a Christian even though he may become careless so he does not think about God's will, proving thereby that he is sleepy. Of this the Lord God said, "They all slumbered and slept" – even the wise virgins.

But a Christian's whole life certainly cannot be asleep. He may often bitterly deplore the weakness of his will, the littleness of his earnestness and zeal with which to do God's will and the putting to death of the flesh. This may even bring him to the brink of distrust. But in such a situation his failing will and failing earnestness will become the objects of His concern and prayer.

It is concerning this mind we are speaking here. The Lord knows all hearts; He knows the secrets of men. In our day it is rather easy to extol Christianity, to speak and think something spiritual; but we must ever remember that "the kingdom of God is not in word but in power." (1 Corinthians 4:20). And a concern to do His will and a prayer for grace to do this is something found in most frail children of grace. This is the respiratory area of the new man, which cannot be still as long as there is a trace of life.

A secular author was researching the subject of gratitude. As he did, he examined two large dictionaries of modern psychology and could find no mention of the terms "gratitude," "thankfulness," or "giving of thanks." He then scanned the card catalog of a large university library containing hundreds of thousands of volumes. Through his search, he found not one single card giving any reference to the terms "gratitude" or "thankfulness." Indeed, as one humorist put it, "If you're looking for gratitude, you'd better look in the dictionary. That's the only place you're going to find it."

Someone once said that thankfulness is the least of the virtues and ingratitude the worst of the vices. We consider gratitude an easy virtue to attain, yet so few people distinguish themselves by their thankfulness. Paul, in cataloging the descent of humankind into the mire of depravity, begins by saying that "although they knew God, they did not glorify Him or give thanks to Him as God" (Romans 1:21). He then describes humanity's fall into all sorts of base immorality. The slide from godliness into wickedness begins with ingratitude.

Shakespeare once said, "How sharper than a serpent's tooth it is to have a thankless child!"

But the Bible repeatedly calls upon us to remember our blessings and express gratitude. It says, "Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits" (Psalm 103:2).

What blessings can you thank God for today? Beginning now, cultivate a grateful heart. Make it a regular practice to thank the Lord for who He is and for all He had done for you.

nected from it, the doctrine of justification becomes a pernicious error."



## **Temptation Comes In All Sizes**

One of the assurances which comes from Scripture is that Christ, too, was tempted. The book of Hebrews describes it, "We have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin" (Heb. 4:15). Christ knows and understands what it means to be tempted. Because he has experienced it, He can understand how difficult it is. He can sympathize with us. The Devil is a smart cookie and knows where our Achilles heel (weakness) is.

In His very short and to the point style, Mark 1:12 tells of the Devil tempting Jesus when He was driven into the wilderness without food for 40 days. There Satan tempted Jesus three different ways.

The temptation was enormous. For forty days Jesus was alone, being tempted by Satan. But He withstood the test. He quoted verses from the Old Testament. They were verses He had memorized as a child. The first verse He gave to Satan was Deut. 8:3, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God." The next temptation found Jesus quoting Deut. 10:20, "You shall worship the Lord your God, and Him only you shall serve." The third verse quoted by Jesus is found in Deut. 6:16, "You shall not tempt the Lord your God." Notice Jesus quoted Scripture to resist Satan.

Our temptations come in many different shapes and sizes. But in each of them we can have the assurance of the presence and help of Christ. Paul shares with us in 1 Cor. 10:13, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is faithful who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear it." Yes, when temptation comes, there is always a way to escape. We must look for it. Because Christ was able to endure, so can we.

We can use the Bible to help us resist the Devil by memorizing verses. I have heard the statement since I was a little boy; "You can't keep a bird from flying over your head, but you sure can keep the bird from building a nest on top of your head. (Editor: Quoting Martin Luther!) This is a very true saying.

# THE SOLDIER'S EXAMPLE — PAUL WAS A GOOD SOLDIER OF JESUS CHRIST

By J. Vernon McGee

Here is Paul's example for us from his own experience:

And for me that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly, to make known the mystery of the gospel, For which I am an ambassador in bonds: that therein I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak (Eph. 6:19-20).

(This is ALSO true of I/we who are privileged and responsible for the 'printed-page' – Editor)

"And for me." Paul now asks for prayer on behalf of himself. As he comes to the conclusion of this epistle, he moves into the area of the personal. He was a prisoner in Rome, and he suffered from a thorn in the flesh. Yet he does not ask for prayer that these physical handicaps be removed, but that he might proclaim courageously the mystery of the gospel.

<u>"To make known the mystery of the gospel."</u> The gospel is a mystery that was not revealed in the Old Testament as it is now. The New Testament reveals that Christ died for all sins, was buried, rose again on the third day. This is the gospel and the message Paul was preaching.

<u>"I am an ambassador in bonds."</u> (Ed. Every born-again person who is walking by 'faith' with Jesus/Word is an "ambassador"). Paul had just written about the spiritual warfare, and now we see that he was experiencing the on-slaught of the enemy at the very moment he was writing.

<u>"That therein I may speak boldly"</u>." Paul asks for prayer that he may speak the gospel with boldness. We need that same prayer. We need a boldness to declare the Word of God.

But that ye also may know my affairs, and how I do, Tychicus, a beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord, shall make known to you all things; Whom I have sent unto you for the same purpose, that ye might know our affairs, and that he might comfort your hearts. Eph. 6:21-22.

Tychicus not only carried the epistle to the Ephesian believers, but he also gave a personal account of the conditions of and the prospects for the apostle Paul. Tychicus, the pastor of the Ephesian church, is an example of the many faithful servants of Christ in the early church. The apostle Paul had great confidence in him.

<u>"That he might comfort your hearts."</u> Tychicus would allay any fears that the Ephesians might have about the condition of the apostle Paul. The brotherly love exhibited in the early church is the undertone of all of Paul's epistles. Paul had a real concern for the brethren.

#### BENEDICTION

General Douglas MacArthur said that old soldiers do not die; they just fade away. Listen to Paul's farewell.

Peace be to the brethren, and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace be with all them that love our Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity. Eph. 6:23-24.

Paul's own swan song is found in 2 Timothy 4:6-8: "For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: hence forth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love His appearing." Paul reflected what a good soldier of Christ should be and what rewards awaited him.

He closes with a twofold benediction. Most of the great words of the gospel are contained in it: peace, love, faith, grace. Hope is absent, for the believer is in the heavenly places where all is realized.

**"Peace"** was the form of greeting of the Jewish world. A sinner must know the grace of God before he can experience the peace of God. This is the peace of God which passes all understanding.

"Love" in verse 23 means love for the other believers. This is a fruit of the Holy Spirit.

"Grace" is the key word of the epistle. It opened the epistle (Eph. 1:2) and is the subject of the epistle (Eph. 2:7-8). It now concludes the epistle. It is a fitting word because it is God's grace which saved us and which sustains us today.

# Martyrdom of John Huss

Huss was born in Bohemia in 1369, studied at the Prague University, became a professor in 1398 and a priest in 1402. The Waldense lay-preachers had reached Bohemia around 1200. Our spiritual father, Peter Waldo, had preached the Gospel there – where he also died in 1217. But under the horrible persecutions the spiritual life movement had gone underground and we hear no more of it till the Wicklif revival in England started about 1380. Then God's people in England sent over some friends to encourage the Bohemian Christians who had gone under-ground and dug their Bibles down. At night they dug their Bibles up again and read them in the candlelight. Then before morning they dug them down again - telling nobody, for the dreadful "gestapo" church spies were around, and if they were found reading their Bible it meant imprisonment, torture and death.

In John Huss the spiritual life movement in Bohemia got a great God-given champion. Some few years before the conversion of Huss, God's people had built a prayer-house – Bethlehem Chapel – in Prague where hungry souls gathered and heard the Gospel in their own language. Here Huss soon became the spiritual leader, preached living Christianity out from the Bible and preached against the sins of the time. He preached against the monks. He preached against the sins of the priest. He preached against granting forgiveness of sin (indulgences) for money. He preached against the pope's claim that he was Peter's successor and Christ's regent. The church is founded not on Peter, but on the Confession of Peter that Christ Himself is the Son of the living God, Huss proclaimed.

We are sorry to have to relate that in the mighty revival that followed, as the ice was broken and the dam that had held back the truth for centuries was broken down, some of the converts went to unnecessary extreme. During a church service in which a priest praised the forgiveness-of-sin-trade, three young Christians cried out aloud, "You lie, Huss is teaching us something entirely different." These zealous believers were arrested at once – and executed. This caused a tremendous stir. Some smeared the blood of these martyrs on their clothes and ran in among crowds of people. The bodies of the young men were carried in public on a golden stretcher and buried in the Bethlehem Chapel, an enormous multitude being present. Huss got the blame for all this...

In 1414 Huss was cited to appear before the great synod meeting (church council) at Constance, Bavaria. Emperor Sigismund sent him a safe-conduct. Huss went in a bold spirit to the meeting, thinking he should get a chance to win a great victory for the TRUTH. But his enemies had laid some deep, infernal plots. Shortly after his

arrival he was thrown into an awful, stinking dungeon. His books, even his Bible, was taken away from him, just like the Lutheran church did with (Hans Neilsen) Hauge in Norway long afterward.

In the meantime the synod meeting continued to condemn. All of Wicklif's writings were condemned to be burnt and so was all that Huss had written. Besides all this Huss was to be burnt at the stake unless he took it all back (retracted). Upon examination Huss confessed and answered like Luther 100 years later ...

July 6, 1414, Huss was taken into the cathedral, and the bishop of Lodi, Italy, preached a sermon against him on Rom. 6:6, "that the body of sin may be destroyed." The bishop told the audience in his sermon that it was most pleasing to God to burn Huss to death, for he was full of the most awful poison – spreading like a creeping cancer. Then all the clergymen voted. The verdict was unanimous.

Huss should die at the stake. Six bishops then went on to disrobe Huss of his vestments they just before had put on him. Then they put a paper cap on his head with painted devils, and the inscription: "A ring-leader of heretics." ... After straw and wood had ben piled high around his body, the Duke made a final offer of life, if he would recant. But Huss refused and said: "I shall die with joy today in the faith of the Gospel I have preached." ...

As the high priests of old went on after crucifying Jesus, to persecute His disciples, so did the priests but now it was in the name of Jesus. In their dread blindness and hatred they continued to burn God's people. But the Gospel light had been lit, and no enemy could put it out.
