A Mighty Fortress Is Our God

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore will not we fear" Psalm 46:1-2

artin Luther's journal entries inform us of his continual battle against evil forces and that Psalm 46 was a great comfort to him. As he meditated on the words of our text, the thrust of a mighty son was born that openly declared victory in the great battle: <u>A Mighty Fortress Is Our God</u>."

A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing; Our helper He, amid the flood Of mortal ills prevailing; For still our ancient foe Doth seek to work us woe, His craft and power are great, And, armed with cruel hate, On earth is not his equal.

The battle to be fought is "not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places" (Ephesians 6:12). Satan, along with his henchmen, is an ancient foe, "<u>a roaring</u> lion," as it were, "seeking whom he may devour" (1 Peter 5:8). But there is no need for alarm, "the LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge" (Psalm 46:11). He "is our refuge and strength" (today's text), a bulwark never failing. "For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he might destroy the works of the devil" (1 John 3:8).

Only God could accomplish this victory, for Satan is *"the prince of this world"* (John 14:30), *"the prince of the power of the air"* (Ephesians 2:2). NO MAN ON EARTH IS HIS EQUAL.

But how did the Son of God gain the victory? By taking on Himself "flesh and blood" and dying a substitutionary death, that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil" (Hebrews 2:14).

The Right Man on Our Side

"Behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not." Luke 22:31-32.

Satan wanted Peter to fall and he would (v. 34), but Christ had prayed for him that victory would come. The second verse of "<u>A Mighty Fortress Is Our God</u>" reflects our vulnerability on our own and our invincibility on His side.

Did we in our own strength confide, Our striving would be losing; Were not the right man on our side, The man of God's own choosing; Doth ask who that may be? Christ Jesus it is He, Lord Sabaoth, His name, From age to age the same, And He must win the battle.

After revealing many thrilling blessings, Paul asks: "What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us?" (Romans 8:31). Furthermore, neither "principalities, nor powers; nor anything else in all creation is "able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39). (Editor: Notice though, this does not forbid self-deception – Jeremiah 17:9: And even the unsaved are loved by God to the very point of physical death). With Him, Sa-

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tan cannot win the battle for our minds or destinies. But on our own, we cannot win.

The term Sabaoth is the Hebrew word for "hosts," in particular, the "host of heaven." The term Yahweh Sabaoth or "Lord Sabaoth occurs some 300 times in the Old Testament and constitutes a most majestic name for God. "For thy Maker is thine husband; the LORD of hosts in His name; and thy redeemer the Holy One of Israel; The God of the whole earth shall He be called" (Isaiah 54:5). This is none other than "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). Creator (Colossians 1:16), Sustainer (v. 17), Redeemer (v. 20) - He must win the battle.

His Doom Is Sure

"Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it." John 8:44.

The third verse of <u>"A</u><u>Mighty Fortress Is Our God"</u> focuses on Satan's end. God has willed triumph through His truth.

And though this world, with devils filled Should threaten to undo us, We will not fear; for God hath willed His truth to triumph through us"

The Prince of Darkness grim – We tremble not for him,

His rage we can endure, For lo, his doom is sure, One little word shall fell him.

When Satan was cast from heaven, fully a third of the angels fell with him (Revelation 12:4), such that a "legion" of them could inhabit one individual (Mark 5:9). But God has other plans for His children. He desires "to turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God, that they might receive forgiveness of sins" (Acts 26:18). He desires us to "<u>resist the devil</u>" (James 4:7) and not "<u>give place to the devil</u>" (Ephesians 4:27).

He also has plans for Satan, including "everlasting chains under darkness" (Jude 1:6), and "everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels" (Matthew 25:41). Just one word and Satan will be "cast into the lake of fire and …tormented day and night for ever and ever" (Revelation 20:10). Jesus, anticipating His execution, spoke of it triumphantly. This had been His Father's will all along. "Now shall the prince of this world be cast out. And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto Me" (John 12:31-32), and now the battle is His.

His Kingdom Is Forever

"Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us. Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith: who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God" Hebrews 12:1-2.

The final verse of "<u>A Mighty Fortress Is Our God</u>" describes our tools and comportment while in the <u>battle</u>, and the final <u>victory</u>.

That word above all earthly powers, No thanks to them, abideth; The Spirit and the gifts are ours Thro' Him who with us sideth: Let goods and kindred go, This mortal life also; The body they may kill: God's truth abideth still, His kingdom is forever.

As the Kings' soldiers, we have God-given abilities and possessions, most notably the indwelling of God's Spirit and empowering gifts. "If any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of His" (Romans 8:9). "Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit" (1 Corinthians 12:4). We should "fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul" (Matthew 10:28) and focus on Him, "denying ungodliness and worldly <u>lusts</u>; (even good and kindred (Luke 9:60-62) if need be). "We should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Savior Jesus Christ" (Titus 2:12-13).

As of yet the battle continues. "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in my throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with my Father in his throne" (Revelation 3:21), "and so shall we ever be with the Lord" (1 Thessalonians 4:17).

Cast Not Away Your Boldness!

Cast not away your boldness!

This is the sympathetic and earnest counsel which Jesus would proffer to His friends here today. He knows what boldness in our relationship toward God will mean in our battle against our sinful habits, in our work for the Lord, and in our sufferings and trials.

This boldness is a daily **miracle** which Jesus must work within our souls. It cannot be ascribed to natural inclinations, to a bright and cheerful disposition, nor to outward circumstances, such as a strong body, a secure position, good connections or money in the bank. By no means, we are here speaking of the *boldness* which we have <u>by faith</u>, that which we have by **the blood of Christ** (Hebrews 10:19).

Let nothing take this boldness from you; let not sin take it away.

If you err, take the course that you know you ought to take. Go to God immediately and be restored by the blood of Christ. Then your mistakes and failings (Ed. SINS) will be as though they had never happened.

Do not let your defeats from day to day deprive you of your boldness. As long as you speak candidly with Jesus about your defeats, you will be able to do battle boldly each day against your old sinful habits. Remember His loving words: "*Let not your heart be troubled: believe in God, believe also in Me.*"

We all know that tribulation, adversity, poverty, illness, sorrow and death take on a different meaning when we stand with Jesus. To be a child of God gives us a peculiar and glorious strength with which to meet all the various problems of life. God in His holiness lifted us from our wickedness and forgave us all our sins for Christ's sake. Then so to speak, He took us up into His lap, threw His eternal arms about us and said: "Now you can be calm both in life and in death, even in judgment. Keep nigh unto me, no matter what happens; I have espoused your cause. I will take care of you. No evil shall befall you. As you know, none is stronger than I in heaven, on earth, or in hell. I will care for mine own."

My friends! This gives boldness.

"Cast not away your boldness," says the Lord here today to His fellow workers. And we are all His co-workers, if we are His children. He needs workers that have boldness. If any one should be bold in his work, it certainly should be we who are co-laborers with the Lord.

In our work we often lose courage, in two ways in particular

In the first place, by allowing the spirit of <u>factional-</u> <u>ism</u> to creep into our work, by working for ourselves and for our group, for our church body, instead of being a glad and willing member of the church of our persuasion and <u>working for Christ</u>. By so doing, men lose their boldness both before God and their brethren. Still worse, they miss the blessing of God. And it is a heavy strain, my friends, to work for the Lord without having His blessing. Of this, we have all no doubt, had some bitter experiences.

In the second place, we lose courage in our labors for the Lord when we allow ourselves to continually look down upon our many difficulties, instead of looking up to the Lord. This has robbed many a sincere and faithful worker of his courage.

You parents, you teachers, you who are workers in the various Christian organizations, you who are members of the various governing bodies, you who preach the Word of God, you who occupy positions of leadership with their attendant responsibilities, — I feel a great desire to exhort you in the most brotherly manner possible: <u>cast not away your boldness!</u>

Remember that all of the Lord's work has had its baptism of difficulties. At the present time we are having some very special difficulties. And there are more coming. Paganism, deliberate and anti-Christian, is now penetrating both the higher and the lower strata of society in our nation. The practice of silencing and denying the old gospel of the cross is penetrating more and more into both our churches and our schools. Mammon-slavery and pleasure-madness are spreading more and more among both young and old. The depression will make it increasingly difficult to balance our budgets. Our missionary societies are losing vast sums every day on foreign exchange alone.

In the midst of all these difficulties stands the Lord and says to us: "*Cast not away your boldness!* I will give you the workers that you need and also sufficient funds to carry on all of My work. Depend upon Me! Did I not say unto you that if you believed you would see the glory of the Lord?"

TIPPING OR TITHING IN GOD'S KINGDOM VINEYARD?

"Then the king said to Araunah, 'No, but I will surely buy it from you for a price; nor will I offer burnt offerings to the LORD my God with that which costs me nothing.' So David bought the threshing floor and the oxen for fifty shekels of silver. So the LORD heeded the prayers for the land and the plague was with-drawn from Israel." (II Samuel 24:24-25b)

Today, let us borrow some information from *Matthew Henry's Commentary*, to start with!

Let us remind ourselves of the grace of our Lord Jesus, who gave Himself for our sins and GOD is encouraging us to offer to Him spiritual sacrifices is evidence of his reconciling us to Himself. and thus dealing with each of us and is dealing with us in His marvelous GRACE. David is directed to build an altar as he was now thoroughly reconciled to God, after his true repentance. If God accepted David's 'justification' as God is the Justifier; He would not have accepted his offering: Therefore would not have directed David to build an Alta'. (The word "Altar" means killing place). THUS, God is encouraging us to offer to Him spiritual sacrifices as the evidence of His reconciling us to Himself. That peace has been made between God and sinners by HIS sacrifice, even as by Christ the great *propitiation*, of whom all the legal sacrifices were types.

Araunah was likely by birth a Gentile, who became a Jebusite (Jewish religion) and therefore was allowed, not only to dwell among the Israelites, but to have a possession of his own in a city, Lev. 25:29, 30. Even though David was a king at the time, he went himself and as we know great men will never be the less respected for their humility.

Araunah, when he understood his business (v. 21), generously offered him <u>willingly</u>, not only the ground to build his altar on, but oxen for sacrifice AND other things that would be of use for David to sacrifice. (Keep in mind & heart that there is NO FORGIVENESS OF SIN, without the shedding of **BLOOD** before God – the innocent for the guilty.)

In response, King David resolved to pay the full value of the ground, thanked him, and performed the sacrifice, as he would not offer that to God which cost him nothing.

Now as we know true Christianity is not made up of

do's and don'ts in order to experience Salvation and Deliverance; but there is a <u>price to be paid</u> in order to be a true follower of Jesus.

JESUS Himself tells us that unless we are willing to daily take up our *cross*, we are not worthy of HIM! How true this is of freedom– period: Someone else had to pay the ultimate price in order to have freedom. FREEDOM NEVER COMES FREE! John 8:31-36. "*Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin*" Hebrews 10:25.

JESUS PAID IT ALL! "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, that you through His poverty might become rich" II Corinthians 8:9.

Now in reality you and I are "beggars" before a Gracious and Merciful GOD, as when we see ourselves <u>lost</u> before a thrice Holy God. We come to Him in godly repentance and plead for mercy and forgiveness, and as a promised **gift** (bonus) GOD promises the GIFT OF SALVATION.

Martin Luther mentions that if we were to receive what we deserve, we would be like a "blade of grass": and personally I don't believe we would come out that well! So "*Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider Him who endured such hostility from sinners against Himself, lest you become weary and discouraged in your souls*" Hebrews 12:1-3.

In His Eternal Word, the BIBLE, Jesus talked much about money as money matters, yet even many of His Blood bought children don't like to heed or hear about money (giving & tithing) even though it is for OUR <u>benefit!</u>

Doesn't it at times *seem* <u>like we are "tipping" to GOD</u>, <u>instead of tithing</u>! Kind of <u>like</u> *leaving a 'tip'* after a meal!

In our text, King David did not believe in stealing and giving it unto God! He gave that which he rightfully owned, not something that would not cost him nothing. <u>Proverbs 3:5-10</u>, <u>Malachi chapter three</u>. *II Corinthians 8:1-8*. Think of the lady who poured ointment/perfume on JESUS, or the "Widows mite" – as not only what she gave, but how she gave! GOD LOVES A CHEERFUL GIVER! (Be sure your giving is of the Lord; not just to a religious/Christian ministry or organization. Is it Holy Spirit led?)

The way of the world is to "live for yourself"; but God says to obey and follow HIM! The way of the world makes many promises which it can not deliver.

Out of LOVE, how we need to follow the following: "Only fear (child-like fear) the LORD, and serve Him in truth with all your heart; for consider what great things He had done for you" 1 Samuel 12:24.

One DAY we individually will meet/stand before *JESUS/GOD/HOLY SPIRIT: FACE TO FACE*.

The providence of God was seen over and over again in the settling and founding of this country. George Washington alluded to it many times. Here is just one stunning example.

In the first year of the Revolutionary War, America almost lost the entire conflict. Washington's entire army was penned up in Brooklyn Heights by General Howe. The British forces surrounded him in a great semicircle and behind him British ships could close him off at any time. There was no way of escape. They were waiting to close in on them the next day, and, thus, end the war. That night, Washington determined that he would endeavor to escape, realizing the helplessness of his position He collected every vessel he could find from row boats to sloops and set about to evacuate his troops by night. Counselors said it would be impossible because the British would see them in the moonlight and hear the splashing of their oars. But Washington determined to go ahead anyway and just as they started to put the ships in the water, a strange and unusual fog rose up and completely covered all of the ships. When General Howe gave the orders in the morning to close in on the trap, to his astonishment, he found that Washington and his entire army had disappeared.

Precisely because of many incidents like these, Washington wrote after the war: "*I am sure that never was a people, who had more reason to acknowledge a divine interposition in their affairs, than those of the United States.*" I hope you will join me in getting people to remember God's hand in the shaping of this great nation. Let's give credit to Whom it is due.

THE JUST SHALL LIVE BY FAITH

"For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, <u>"The just shall live by faith</u>" Romans 1:17.

This was the liberating Bible verse that set Martin Luther free from the work of seeking to earn SALVATION by reformation (good works) and the chains of Roman Catholicism! ChristianToday.com reports that, in addition to saying "Allah is not our God," the sign says, "Wake up, Christians. Muhammad is not greater than Jesus, and "Only the Bible is God's Word; Koran is just another book."

Michael Harrington, the 74-year-old pastor of the small Baptist church, is responsible for the sign which has caused contention in Hood River...

Mayor of Hood River Paul Blackburn said the sign made him "really annoyed and sad."

"I am annoyed that in this political season there's a solid case of ugly going on. I think it norms up this kind of behavior like: "Oh, it's okay to be a bigot now," he added.

Harrington, however, defends the sign's message...

"I'm not politically correct. I've never been politically correct, but I think I'm biblically correct, and that is what matters to me," he said. "It isn't against any particular denomination. It's just the fact that I have taught and will continue to teach that I have one God, one way of salvation and one Bible that's holy," he added.

How Long Will It Be Now?

The submarine S-4 sank in a storm off Provincetown, Massachusetts. Thirty-two men and officers were imprisoned in the submerged boat. The news was flashed to the world, and the interest and sympathy of the world responded spontaneously.

The government at Washington concentrated all its efforts upon the work of rescue. As soon as the first rescuers were on hand, communication was established with the imprisoned men by means of taping on the pipes leading to the boat.

The first message flashed back from the men was the question, <u>"Is there any hope?</u>"

What a cry from men doomed to die! For all of them did die. The government had not made adequate preparation for such an emergency. That lack of preparation let those thirty-two go to their death.

<u>Is there any hope</u>? The only hope was in the men above them in safety on the sea to whom the work of rescue was committed. They could do nothing for themselves.

<u>Is there any hope</u>? Their doom was not the less inevitable nor their despair the less real and terrible because theirs was a physical death caused by somebody's blunder.

<u>Is there any hope?</u> What a prayer! It wrings the very heart to remember it. Under color of hope the work of rescue began and continued vainly till the last one of them had perished. From time to time as the work of rescue continued, the imprisoned men tapped out another question: "*How long will it be now*?"

So hope gradually failed, and despair took its place. How long will it be now? No mind can measure the sickness of the heart as hope is deferred from hour to hour. But one by one they died there in their submarine prison.

How long will it be now? That is the tragic question of the millions who are sunk in the whelming sea of sin and suffering in the world.

To the Christian churches have been entrusted the work and the means of rescue. The means of rescue are adequate, but the preparation for rescue is all too futile, and the workers at rescue are all too indifferent.

The two cries of the submerged S-4 men are the very cries of the men who perish through sin in the world. These are the cries and prayers directed toward our churches: Is there any hope? Is there any remedy for sin? Any healing for its hurt? Any hope of recovery from its dreadful results?

We eagerly flash back the answer, "Yes, there is *hope.*" But then we get busy on our antiquated methods and use our energies upon secondary matters and stop to bewail the fact that somehow we do not get the job of rescue done.

And the millions of the post perish while we experiment and waste energy upon matters of small importance. And the perishing millions continue to cry, "*How long will it be now*?" Don't our churches care? Will we never be done with the red tape of our inefficiency?

Back to the main business, back to some desperately in earnest work to get men delivered – **how long will it be now?** It is the perishing who cry. It is to us that they cry. Explicit directions for rescue were delivered nineteen centuries go, and every Christian has them in hand in the first two chapters of the Book of Acts.

No amount of pious wailing that souls are perishing eternally will deliver us who know the way of deliverance from the judgment of God at the Great Day.

It's time to stop mourning what's lost and start celebrating what may still be found. It's time to recognize the insanity around us, but at the same time to remember nothing is new under the sun. But more importantly, it's time to remember that Jesus is risen and that the Sovereign Lord of the Universe is even now seated at the right hand of the Father in heaven.

Yes, the world is seemingly in headlong flight from any notion of biblical morality. Yes, the social fabric in place since the founding of America – one based upon a Christian consensus – has been seemingly rent asunder in just one generation. Yes, the fundamental freedoms secured by our Constitution are under attack as never before. Yes, the darkness seems to be gathering.

But I repeat: this is no time to wring our hands and mourn. When the darkness grows deeper, the light must shine that much brighter. This is a time to exalt the Person and the work of Jesus Christ. This is a time to live out our faith. This is a time to stand and be counted for Christ.

I say all this fully aware that the generations alive today are witness to the seeming disintegration of the Christian cultural consensus that made America unique among the nations of the Earth. We seem to be on the cusp of cultural chaos, with many boldly calling good things evil and evil things good.

While it is cold comfort, we cannot forget that Jesus was born into a world deeper in darkness than our own. With few exceptions, in the ancient world personal freedom existed only for the rich and powerful. Women and children were routinely treated as chattel property. The lives of many, if not most, were, as described Thomas Hobbes: nasty, brutish, and short.

Into this long dark night came the Light of the World, calling people out of darkness to walk in His marvelous light. And what did these followers of Jesus do? They lifted the cross of Christ high for everyone to see, and they proclaimed new life in His name.

Want to see revival? You will see it when the church repents in deep humility and seeks the face of God. You will see it when the church understands that the call of Christ is to victory -a victory over sin and death purchased for us at the cross.

You will see it when the body of Christ remembers we are children of the Great King. Then the world again will see an unaccountably bold, loving, and faithful witness for Christ.

What does that witness look like? Some emphasize a priority of good works, quoting Saint Francis's famous aphorism: <u>"Preach the Gospel every day; if neces-</u> <u>sary use words."</u> So which is it? Does the world need to see our good works, or does it need to hear the Word of Life? Yes, and yes.

Jesus exhorted us to, "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven" (Matthew 5:16). But while good works are important, they are not enough. Jesus also said: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

One need only look at the early church to see the priority of the Gospel message. In Acts chapter eight we read that the believers went everywhere... doing what? Doing good works? No, they went everywhere preaching the word.

Want to see revival in this generation? So do I. Revival begins with prayer and is followed by a faithful witness. When, from the overflow of our hearts, we can no longer remain silent, then will the forces of darkness flee from the face of the *soon-coming* King.

Love does more than make "the world go round," as an old song says. It also makes us immensely vulnerable. But the apostle Paul gives a clear and simple reason to pursue love: "These three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love. Follow the way of love" (1 Cor. 13:13-14:1).

As we "follow the way of love," we'll find ourselves often turning to God, the source of love, and to Jesus, the greatest example of love. Only then will we gain a deeper knowledge of what true love is and find the strength to love others like God loves us.

God, thank You that You are love and that You love me so much. Help me to love others the way Jesus showed us so that the whole world will know I am Your child.

9). *Without natural affection* – showing more affection toward materialistic things, same-sex marriages, homosexuals, lesbians, animals, etc. than toward respect for the God-given opposite sex.

10). *Trucebreakers* – will promise anything but will not honor commitments, breaks promises.

11). *False accusers* – slanders; destroys the character of others.

12). *Incontinent* – no self-control; no self-discipline; no self-restraint.

13). *Fierce* – savage; cruel; heartless, wild' impetuous – For example: Terrorist, ISIS, etc.

14). *Despisers of those that are good* – those who mock or have contempt for godly people.

15). *Traitors* – no convictions; changes sides for personal advantage or gain.

16). *Heady* – reckless; headstrong; stubborn.

17). *Highminded* – full of self; proud; puffed up; worship the intellect.

18). *Lovers of pleasure more than lovers of God* – sensual; pleasure seeking; self-gratification is their god; not willing to submit to or obey God; pleasing themselves rather than God.

19). *Having a form of godliness; but denying the power thereof* - being religious – *maybe Sunday forenoons* – especially living for themselves, the world and the Devil the rest of the week; having an outward religious display but experiencing no real life-changing power by the Holy Spirit and the Word of God. The BIBLE teaches no one to be religious, but to have a personal relationship with JESUS!

20). **Deception** – deceiving and being deceived as there are many false prophets doing 'miracles' and seeking to deceive the very elect if possible.

Lessens From a Sheepdog

It was pointed out at the beginning of this book that, as the owner of "Fairwinds," I quickly realized I would need help to run the ranch and handle the flock efficiently. That assistance had to come from a faithful, loyal border collie, bred and disciplined for this unique and important work. Though I was an energetic young man with a strong set of legs and excellent lungs, I simply could not round up the sheep alone. The flock often scattered and fled in five directions when I tried to gather them up alone on foot No matter how fast I ran or how loud I shouted, the sheep still strayed in their own stubborn way.

So I was obliged to find a co-worker, a helper – an

"under-shepherd," if you will – in a sheep dog who would carry out my will and my wishes in managing my stock. Working together with each other in harmony, good will, and mutual delight, one good sheep dog and myself could accomplish as much as five men.

In a touching, moving way, the same precise principle holds true in God's dealing with the world of men and women. The Lord called Himself the Good Shepherd. He pictured Himself or us as the one who had come to care for the "lost sheep." He carefully instructed His disciples to be His co-laborers who were to feed and tend His ewes and lambs.

It will be recalled how, after His resurrection, Jesus met His young friends beside the Lake of Galilee, and there prepared them a breakfast of fresh baked fish and chapatties. When the meal was over He turned to the big, rough fisherman Peter, asking him three times:

Peter, do you really love me? Are you really my friend?" When the burly young man assured the Master of his loyalty and love, Jesus responded three times by saying;

"Peter, feed my lambs."

"Peter, feed my sheep."

"Peter, feed my sheep."

This was the special labor, the unique work, the specific purpose to which he was assigned.

It has been well said that "God has no hands in the world but our hands. He has no feet here but our feet. He has no lips but our lips." This is but another way of stating the rather obvious case that, in a mysterious yet wondrous way, our Father God chooses to carry on His purpose upon the planet through the fallible agency of common people most of the time.

He can, and on rare occasions does break through into human affairs in supernatural ways. Yet in the main agency, He chooses to use ordinary people to accomplish His grand designs. Seen in this dimension, we begin to perceive the enormous honor and divine dignity He bestows on those of us chosen to become His co-workers.

Legislating Morality

The God of Israel said ... 'He who rules over man justly, who rule in the fear of God... '" 2 Samuel 23:3.

Does the Bible Teach Socialism?

Some Christians say that the Bible teaches socialism. They invariably appeal to the passage in Acts 4 and 5 dealing with Barnabas and Ananias. Barnabas sold a

piece of land and brought the money and gave it to the apostles. Ananias and his wife sold a piece of land but kept back a part of the price. They brought only a portion of it to the apostles and lied about it.

The basic concept of socialism is that the state either owns or controls property or the means of production. One of the early French socialists of the 19th century, Proudhon, famously declared that <u>"property is theft.</u>" Marx and Engels and all the rest inveighed mightily against the concept of private ownership or control of the means of production.

What does the Bible say? In the Ten Commandments, we have the repudiation of this. The commandment, "*Thou shalt not steal*," as virtually every theologian for twenty centuries has declared, is a divine guarantee of private property. I cannot steal something from you if you do not own it. Furthermore, in the Decalogue we also have the command, "*thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house,... nor any thing that is thy neighbor's.*" Again, here is a clear teaching of private property.

In Acts, chapter 5, is private property repudiated or is it taught? First, notice what Peter said to Ananias: *"While it remained unsold, was it not your own?"* It is difficult to imagine any clearer statement of the ownership of property than that! While it remained unsold ... Was it not your own? ... Could you not do with it whatever you will? Even after you sold it, was not the money your own? Peter was showing Ananias he even had the control of that which he had received in the sale. The Bible clearly teaches the right of private property. God has given the whole world unto mankind as a stewardship to use and for which he is responsible to God.

Secondly, we note that this action was voluntary. They did not <u>have</u> to sell their property. There was no commandment to sell it.

Thirdly, consider the disposition of the money. They sold the property and brought the money and laid it ... at the feet of Pontius Pilate?... at the feet of Caesar? They brought it to the local tax collector? NO! The Bible says they *"placed it at the apostles' feet."* I can think of nothing more perfectly designed to give Karl Marx apoplexy than the idea that people should sell all their property and give the money to the church. If there is anything antithetical to the whole spirit of modern socialism, it is precisely that. And yet, people have the incredible temerity to say that this passage in Acts teaches modern state socialism. Nothing, indeed, can be farther from the truth.

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
