Preaching From The Print Shop

If Luther hadn't used the new printing technology, would there have been a Reformation?

ithout printing, would there have been a Protestant Reformation? Would Luther have even survived?

Only a century earlier, both John Wycliffe and John Huss spawned movements of intense spiritual fervor. Wycliffe and Huss wrote prolifically also.

But the absence of adequate printing technology limited the distribution of their works. As a result, their ideas did not spread as rapidly or as far as they might have. Wycliffe was condemned, Huss was burned at the stake, and history casts them as only harbingers of the Reformation.

Would Martin Luther have joined their ranks without access to a "modern" press? Would his revolutionary ideas have been contained? John Foxe, sixteenth-century author of the famous *Book of Martyrs*, would probably have said yes. "Although through might (the pope) stopped the mouth of John Huss," he wrote, "God hath appointed the Press to preach, whose voice the Pope is never able to stop with all the puissance of his triple crown."

Luther himself understood that books and pamphlets spoke long after he had left the pulpit. He referred to printing as "God's highest and extremist act of grace, whereby the business of the Gospel is driven forward."

Young technology

It was only in the 1450s that Johann Gutenberg introduced technical printing advancements that made mass reproduction practical. When Luther posted his 95 Theses some sixty years later, two dozen printing centers dotted Europe. Wholesale booksellers had developed distribution centers, and legions of raveling book hawkers crisscrossed the continent.

Ironically, Luther's introduction to the press's effectiveness may have been haphazard. Within two weeks of the posting of his 95 Theses, they were printed, without his permission, and distributed throughout Germany. Within a month, they had flooded Europe. Six months later Luther explained to Pope Leo X, "It is a mystery to me how my theses ...were spread to so many places. They were meant exclusively for our academic circle ..." In a letter of March 1518 he admitted he "had no wish or plan to publicize these Theses," and that he had left it up to his friends to decide whether they would be "suppressed or spread outside."

Flooding Germany

Even if the printing of Luther's Reformation "manifesto" was unintentional, Luther quickly grasped print's potential for soliciting grass-roots support. He began writing prolifically — more than four hundred works, including commentaries, sermons, and pamphlets that attacked Catholic doctrine and promoted Reformation distinctives. Between March 1517 and the summer of 1520, thirty of his pamphlets ran through a total of 370 editions. If each edition was one thousand copies, then almost four hundred thousand of his pamphlets alone flooded German during the first crucial years. From 1517

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through 1523, the first six years after Luther posted the 95 Theses, publications in Germany increased by seven times. Half of these writings were by Luther.

Luther's opponents knew the impact of his printed works. A nervous Charles V banned Luther's works in May, 1521. In a letter that September, Catholic theologian Johann Cochlaeus complained, "Nearly all printers are secret Lutherans; they do not print anything for us without pay and nothing reliable unless we stand beside them and look over their shoulders."

Journalistic Savvy

Luther has sometimes been called the first great journalist. Why did his writings succeed?

1. He spoke in the common language. Luther, a highly-trained academic, was fluent in Latin, the academic's language. Most writings of the era were printed in Latin and thus reserved for society's scholarly elite. Indeed, in 1500 probably only 5-10 percent of Europeans could read at all.

But Luther's passion to promote the priesthood of even the most common believer could be satisfied only by appealing through the common language.

The church has gone from preaching about sin, righteousness and judgment, to preaching about attitudes, feelings and relationships.

He insisted on writing many of his works in German, particularly his monumental translation of the Bible. Soon shoemakers, tailors, and peasants could read the Scriptures and Luther's writings in their own tongue.

- 2. He used a common format. A second element in Luther's success was his use of the pamphlet format. He expanded the existing single-page "broadsides" to multiple pages in quarto and octavo sizes. His pamphlets also featured some of the finest woodcuts and engravings of the times, so that even the semi-literate could catch the gist of his message. And in keeping with the need to reach all strata of society, his pamphlets were inexpensive. Like the broadsides popularized decades earlier, Luther's pamphlets were snatched up (or shared) by those of even the most humble means.
- 3. He was known by common people. Luther's crowning achievement was a German New Testament. Although it was not the first German translation of the Scriptures, Luther's fame apparently secured its success before the ink dried. Three thousand copies were printed in the fall of 1522 with a second edition following in December.

In the words of adversary Johann Cochlaeus, Luther's work was "so propagated and widely spread by the book printers that even tailors and shoe-makers, indeed women and other simple idiots, who had accepted this new Lutheran gospel ...read it eagerly, as if it were a fountain of all truth. Some carried it in their bosoms and learned it by heart."

Ultimately, Luther's message of justification by faith filled a longing in the German people that the established church's teaching did not satisfy. His common pamphlets in the common language ignited hope among common people. Martin Luther spoke to Europe from two pulpits – one in the church, and one in the print shop.

Christian History

TACTFUL!

"Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves. Therefore be wise as serpents and harmless as doves." (Matthew 10:16)

AS ALWAYS be open to the prompting/leading of the *Holy Spirit* in compliance/harmony/openness to God's **eternal WORD**, *the BIBLE!!* The Holy Spirit will NEVER lead you contrary to God's Infallible Word.

Just briefly let 'us' take a look in the dictionary and get a definition of the word tactful: = (having or showing tact) – tact, 'a keen sense of what to do or say in order to maintain good relations with others or avoid offense.' It implies delicate and considerate perception of what is appropriate when remarks were untimely. Skill and grace in dealing with others. <u>BUT</u> the word 'tactful' is not found in the Bible nor even in a Bible dictionary! Still 'we' need the 'skill' to avoid needless offense; but make sure that 'we' are not so 'tactful' that 'we' make no contact!

Fairly frequently you hear folks say 'we are in this world, but not of the world', seemingly 'trying' to quote Scripture, which is not found verbatim. Worldly living has had a very definite influence in the 'Christian church' and in our vocabulary in most instances we are unaware. We hear so often preached/shared, 'be sure you build a 'friendship' before you seek to win them for Christ'! YES, be *kind, honest, loving, but* caring. Actually you can not experience 'Calvary's LOVE (Agape) without not being involved.

NOW let 'us' get down to the 'nitty gritty' of what God tells 'us' in His Holy WORD.

"And do not be conformed (squeezed) to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God" Romans 12:2.

WHY? Well we are a 'light' in this sin darkened world and the world loves 'darkness' rather than light. <u>Light reveals/exposes!</u> So let 'us' look at JESUS first who wants to be 'our' personal Savior and secondary 'our' example. "He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked" 1 John 2:6.

<u>FIRST of all</u> let me clearly state in regards to the *false idea*, that as you are led of the Lord; the recipient(s) will always be receptive to God's Word – how ridiculous – almost ALL of the time, it is a subtle <u>dart/arrow</u> from our enemy! (For example: Remember the 'four' types of soil).

Now as a 'berean' (searching the Scriptures) you will

clearly notice in the life of Jesus that many folks were offended at Him and hated Him. (John 15:18-25) HE was called numerous disrespectful 'names', chased out of town, and many wanted HIM killed before HIS appointed (Galatians 4:4). BECAUSE JESUS always spoke/speaks the *truth* in Love! He tells things exactly as they are; both for time and in the light of eternity! For example: "But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, 'Brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?" Matthew 3:7. (Matthew 12:34). "But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to sin, it would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were drowned in the depth of the sea"" Matthew 18:6. (Please read the entire 23rd chapter of Matthew).

Other examples: Jeremiah, Jonah, Elijah, the twelve Apostles; Apostle Paul – possibly the greatest 'missionary' ever, other than the person of JESUS.

Think of how Martin Luther was treated after 1517 A.D. or Hans Nielsen Hauge who was put in jail/prison 28 times for sharing the liberating Gospel of Jesus Christ (Law & Gospel). And basically the sole reason for their stand and testimony was the benefit of fellow human beings – not for things done 'wrong' but for doing that which could liberate fellow citizens. (John 8:31-36).

Relating only one experience of Hans Nielsen Hauge at this time, but in his travels in sharing the Living Savior, he found lodging in a home for the night during a hazardous winter storm and another gentleman also found lodging in the same home. The other lodger did not appreciate Hans Nielsen Hauge – neither Hauge's stand nor the message God had entrusted him with and hit Hauge with his fist. Hauge responded 'I have fists too, but I do not use them'! So Hauge took his few belongings and left the house out into the night's winter storm. Jesus says: "'And whoever will not receive you nor hear your words, when you depart from that house or city, shake off the dust from your feet" Matthew 10:14. (Luke 10:1-16).

Many times situations are somewhat <u>similar</u> in the house hold of 'faith', e.g.: Psalm 39:11, Proverbs 29:11, 19:25, 25:12, Ephesians 5:11-13, 11 Tim. 4:2, 1 Corinthians 5:1-5, James 5: 19-20, Proverbs 3:11-12 & Hebrews

12:1-11.

AS 'believers' the real danger in our day and society is that 'we' become so *tactful* that 'we' make **no contact at all.** Please read **Ezekiel chapters 3 & 33.** At times 'tolerance becomes treason'! Be sure as you are led to share your personal testimony that you definitely quote/read SCRIPTURE with it for the WORD of GOD is not bound. **Romans 1:16.** YES, do so in LOVE, but be not ashamed. Matthew 10:32-33 and move as the Holy Spirit leads!

Just think if Phillip had not been obedient to the Holy Spirit in going to the barren desert and there meeting the Treasurer of Ethiopia: What a blessing and opportunity would have been missed and maybe another soul would have gone into Hell! (By the way wouldn't it be embarrassing to ask the 'treasurer' IF he understood what he was reading)? OH, how 'we' need to ask the Lord to take away 'our' jelly-fish back bone (spiritually) and replace it with iron in our blood. God tells 'us' to tell the 'truth' in love.

I am reminded of a 'mission board' that had the following practice that when a candidate would want to become a 'missionary'. They would ask the person why he desired to be a missionary: love and was not enough. BUT <u>obedience to the Word of God</u> was the deciding factor to be accepted or not. Our love for JESUS is tested by 'our' love/obedience to His Word.

<u>Please prayerfully read/mediate on the following</u>: **Jeremiah 33:3, 9:1, Matthew 4:17, Romans 9.**

I hold firmly to the conviction that Satan nor the world (as a whole) will not prompt you to testify with God's Word and invading his <u>wrongfully</u> held territory – thief that He is!! **Under the BLOOD of the crucified and risen ONE** Satan **is defeated!**

Paul (naturally under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit) shares in the first chapter of Romans that he (we) are <u>indebted</u> to share the liberating Gospel of Jesus Christ and that His Word is the power (dynamite) unto salvation. To be <u>indebt</u> there is a *legal* obligation (His Grace empowered by the Holy Spirit). What a privilege & responsibility!

Paul (God inspired, infallible Word) further states in Romans 9:1-3, "I tell the truth in Christ, I am not lying, my conscience also bearing me witness in the Holy Spirit, that I have great sorrow and continual grief in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed from Christ for my brethren, my countrymen according to the flesh."

'WE' are in a spiritual warfare (battle) over the souls of men, women, boys and girls (yours & mine, as well) for time and ETERNITY! In this warfare there is absolutely no *hint* of *being tactful! IN Ephesians 6;* I understand that the battle is so fierce/intense; that it is like bayonet combat. We have a friend who was in the Second World War and

shared that in one battle; they never took their 'combat boots' off for 37 or 38 days! (I am not suggesting that 'we' are to be rude, cruel, argumentative, etc. – but be sure we are making contact = that the INCORRUPTIBLE SEED comes in contact with the SOIL!) (*IF* you are under the BLOOD of Christ, you and I are intended to be the *vessels* and GOD makes no mistakes!) Let the redeemed of the LORD say so! Jeremiah 9:1, Psalm 126:5-6. GOD tells 'us' to go into the highways and by ways and compel them to come in! Also to pray to the Lord of Harvest to send forth (thrust) 'laborers' into the Harvest field. *Romans* 10:9-10, 11 Timothy 3:12 & Acts 4:12 – 13; because of John 14:6 & 3:18 & 36.

Remember *if you are a citizen of HEAVEN*; you are now living in a foreign land, just journeying through.

As you study the book of ACTS (not resolutions), you will notice that those 'vessels' who were filled (controlled) with the Holy Spirit, spoke the **Word boldly!** No wonder that Paul asks for this in <u>Ephesians 6:18-20</u>.

I know this is getting to be a 'lengthy editorial' but I want to close with part of the testimony of Hans Nielsen Hauge and a few more Bible references.


Hans Nielsen Hauge was being ridiculed as a farmer who was led by God to preach. His response was that God called 'fishermen' to follow Him, so God could use an unlearned farmer to at least plant the SEED; and he further stated that he had promised obedience to the Holy Spirit and that he wanted to try to fulfill the same.



Making A Difference, And Making It Last!

Hans Nielsen Hauge

The Lutheran Church in Norway desperately needed revival when God sent Hans Nielsen Hauge, a humble farmer, to labor in the fields of the Norwegian Lutheran Church that were overgrown with traditionalism, formalism and dead orthodoxy.

Hans Nielsen Hauge, born April 3, 1771, in Tune Parish, Norway, was reared in a devout home and nurtured in the Word of God. Even so, his conversion to Christ came at age 25 while working on his father's farm. That very day he led his sister Anna to the Lord and a short while later he led his brothers and parents into a living relationship with the Savior.

Hauge's passion to win people to Christ caused close friends to wonder about his state of mind. He struggled with God's will for his life, questioning why God should not send "a bishop or other high person to convert people." Out of that struggle came the sure conviction that the call of God to preach the gospel was upon him.

Hauge walked about Norway witnessing the gospel of Christ in homes and on the streets. Shortly before Christmas of 1797, he was arrested by the order of a parish pastor and thrown into prison. A law dating to 1741 had banned lay preaching in Norway. While in prison Hauge led several prisoners to Christ. Upon release he was ordered not to preach again. He refused to follow that order.

Hans was arrested and imprisoned several times in 1798 and 1799 for proclaiming the gospel. After a lengthy imprisonment in Trondheim, Hauge walked 300 miles to his home in tune Parish. People followed him along the way so they might hear him talk about Christ. Revival broke out in one town requiring Hauge to delay his homeward journey. Soon revival fires were burning across Norway, bringing no end of consternation to pastors in the State Church of Norway who referred to the revival as "the Hauge movement."

Eventually Hauge crossed over to Denmark where he preached for awhile, but letters from Norwegian clergy were sent to Denmark to dissuade people from attending his meetings. After preaching several weeks in Denmark, Hauge returned to Norway where he was arrested again. This time his imprisonment would last 10 years.

At his trial in 1804, Hauge was offered his freedom if he would promise to stop preaching. He responded: *I cannot promise to discontinue my devotional meetings and my prayers, and I cannot see that these should be detri-*

mental when so many gatherings are permitted where people carouse, get drunk and swear."

Hauge was first jailed in Hougsund; then transferred to an Oslo prison. His treatment in prison was severe and conditions were cruel. He was permitted no books, no writing materials and no visitors. He lost his teeth and hair, and eventually his health weakened to the point of death. In the space of nine years, Hauge was subject to 28 trials. He was set free December 23, 1814, broken body but not in spirit.

Friends helped Hauge purchase a farm just outside Oslo where he lived his last 10 years in very poor health. Though he was never able to publicly preach again, his house was continuously filled with people who wanted to hear him share the gospel. Even church officials visited him, having come to recognize his contribution to the churches in Norway.

Hans Nielsen Hauge died at age 53, on March 28, 1824. At the time of his death, lay-fellowship groups and prayer meetings had been organized in every one of Norway's 600 parishes. Hauge was buried in a cemetery near Oslo. On his tombstone is the following:

"Until his last breath he held fast to the faith, hope and love he had spread among others by word, deed, writings and Christian life. He lived in the Lord; he died in the Lord; by the grace of Jesus does he receive eternal salvation."

The influence of Hans Nielsen Hauge continues to this day in Norway and throughout the world. Norwegian immigrants to Europe and the United States faithfully witnessed the gospel, encouraging people to have a personal conversion to Christ and to live out their lives in holiness before God and man. Many Lutheran congregations to-day highly esteem their Haugian heritage.

The Hauge Lutheran Innermission Federation publishes a magazine <u>The Morning Glory</u>, conducts spiritual-life seminars and sponsors tent-evangelistic meetings.

Massachusetts Town Levies Fines for Public Profanity

One Massachusetts town has decided to make it easier for police to enforce a no-swearing by-law in an attempt to cut down on cussing in public.

According to Chief of Police Bruce Gates, the people of Middleborough, Massachusetts, voted by a five-to-one margin in favor of the change at a town meeting on June 11. A by-law against public profanity has been on the books in the town since October 1968, but because it is considered criminal offense, it has been difficult for police to enforce...

Wisconsin Church Faces Court Battle

Grace Lutheran Church, Eau Claire, WI passed its second vote, 316 - 0, May 30, 2012, to leave the ELCA. The next day they went to court asking that a lawsuit filed by dissidents within the congregation be dismissed.

The dissident group is suing over property, assets and the Grace Foundation which controls a large sum of money. The judge ruled against the dismissal motion and ordered the two sides into mediation.

The dissident group, comprised of about 70 persons, formed Amazing Grace Lutheran Church, a new congregation loyal to the ELCA. The group is being led by a former pastor at Grace, Gordon Thorp. Grace Foundation funds and operates a licensed daycare, retirement housing, assisted living programs, skilled nursing care, community based residential facilities for the care of the elderly, and adult day services for old adults all across Chippewa Valley.

Numbers Show Changes In The ELCA

An editorial in The Lutheran, June 2012, described

the plummeting rate of bequests received by congregations of the ELCA. In the year 2004, ELCA congregations received 8,409 bequests; in 2004 bequests dropped to 2,991, totaling \$83.9 million, but rose to 3,517 in 2010, totaling \$94 million in that year. Not revealed are the scores of bequests the ELCA will never receive from members of the 1,000 or more congregations that left the ELCA since its formation in 1988.

Since 2009, 915 congregations have taken a first vote to leave the ELCA. According to the editor of *The Lutheran* 684 first votes passed and 231 failed. He reported the total of congregations actually leaving the ELCA through May 2012 stands at 631. Of those, 621 have been removed from the ELCA roster.

Obama Holds "Gay Pride" Reception at White House

President Barack Obama is telling "gay" supporters that they will have a friend and "fellow advocate" in the White House as long as he is president.

Obama spoke to lesbian, "gay," bisexual and transgender guests during a White House reception marking LGBT Pride Month. He touted his administration's work on homosexual rights issues, including repealing the military's ban on openly homosexual service members. He said even though it may have taken more time than they would like, homosexuals have seen progress and lasting change under his administration.

The president also referenced his recent public embrace of same-gender "marriage." He said that while some Americans may still be "evolving" on same-sex marriage, he and wife, Michelle, "have made up our minds on this issue."

Denmark Forces Churches To Perform Same-Sex 'Marriages'

The government of Denmark has voted to force churches in the established Evangelical Lutheran Church to perform same-sex 'marriage' ceremonies, although one-third of all the denomination's pastors say they will not participate in such rituals.

The vote in the Danish Parliament was 85 - 24 to compel churches to carry out 'marriage' ceremonies for same-sex couples that are identical to heterosexual marriage celebrations. Under the law, a pastor may opt out of

performing the 'wedding' service for theological reasons, but the bishop must arrange for a replacement. The Danish people oppose the legislation, as do 8 out of 10 bishops. The Evangelical Lutheran Church is Denmark's official state church.

Sixty-Six Members of Congress Confront Attacks on Faith in the Air Force

Congressman Randy Forbes, founder and co-chairman of the Congressional Prayer Caucus, along with Congresswoman Dian Black and Congressman Todd Akin, sent a letter signed by 66 members of Congress urging Secretary of Defense Leon Panetta to investigate a pattern of hostility toward faith in the United States Air Force. The letter calls on Secretary Panetta to issue clear Department of Defense policy guidance, consistent with our Constitution, to preserve the place of religious expression in the military at large.

...Congressman Forbes stated: "The Air Force has repeatedly capitulated to demands from groups that seek to remove all traces of faith from the military and the public square. When viewed individually, any of these actions is concerning. But taken together, they highlight an alarming pattern in the Air Force that we do not see in the other branches of the military. Those who sacrifice so much for our nation must be assured that they need not leave their faith at home when they volunteer to serve."

I have often learned more in one prayer that I have been able to glean from much reading and reflection.

Next to faith, this is the highest art: to be content in the calling in which God has placed you. I have not learned it yet.

Open Doors

"Withal praying also for us, that God would open unto us a door of utterance, to speak the mystery of Christ, for which I am also in bonds" That I may make it manifest, as I ought to speak." Colossians 4:3-4.

This was Paul's prayer request of the Colossian Christians, that God would open the door for His testimony. Paul had written earlier: "when I came to Troas to preach Christ's gospel, and a door was opened unto me of the Lord" (2 Corinthians 2:12). The purpose of an open door is thus to preach the gospel of Christ and to speak the mystery of Christ.

Furthermore, these passages indicate that such doors are opened by the Lord, not by human devices. In fact, Christ Himself is "he that openeth, and no man shutteth, and shutteth, and no man openeth" (Revelation 3:7). Doors of testimony are opened by the Lord in answer to prayer, but He also specifies three criteria for keeping the door opened. "I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name." (Revelation 3:8).

These conditions mean, literally, having little strength of one's own and thus depending only on God, jealously guarding the integrity of God's Word, and upholding the name of Christ as Creator, Savior, and coming King.

Even when the door is kept open by God, there is no assurance of ease in entering it. Paul wrote that "a great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaries" (1 Corinthians 16:9). This is the reason prayer is needed, relying on God, not man!

The Lord is also seeking an open door into churches that think they "have need of nothing...Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him" ...(Revelation 3:17, 20). HMM

We're people of the light

"Pastor Jeff, does our church have a position on Halloween?" That question comes up about this time every year. With all the delights of October and rich experiences of fall and the harvest season, also come the "Halloween dilemmas." What is an appropriate Christian response? In case you don't finish this article, I'll give away my main point early: Christians are people of the light and [have] no business celebrating the deeds of darkness.

What makes this issue complicated for many families is the fact that Halloween has been the source of fun. Family memories have been created making costumes, carving pumpkins, bobbing for apples, and handing out candy to neighbor kids. I have my own collection of warm memories of harmless fun.

So what's the problem? Can't we enjoy the "harm-less" aspects of this celebration and just ignore the really dark, evil stuff that some people are apparently attracted to? What's the matter with my little guy dressing up like a cowboy and walking around the block "trick or treating" at the neighbor's homes?

As awkward as it can be to think through a Christian response to Halloween, this can be a teachable moment for our families. This can be an appropriate time to talk about how we are "different" as Christians. We are people of the light. We don't celebrate the deeds of darkness. What does that mean when the culture we're living in has embraced Halloween so warmly? (By the way, Halloween is approaching Christmas in terms of the revenue it generates for the economy.) (Editor's Note: actually I wonder if it doesn't surpass it now)!!

Where did Halloween come from anyway? Where is it rooted? (Much of the information that follows about the history of Halloween was gathered by Carl J. Moses for a handout to students in schools of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod).

The history can be traced back before the time of Christ to the pantheistic Celtic people of the British Isles and France. On their calendar, the year began November 1, which meant October 31 was New Year's Eve. On that evening they worshipped their god of death to signify the end of the old year. They believed that for this one night this god resurrected the people who died in the previous year. These "zombies" would supposedly attack people, who might be able to escape if they assumed disguises, especially if they disguised themselves as one of the zombies. The resurrected ones would demand food for themselves or they would cast a spell on the house. Some-

times people would hollow a pumpkin or squash, carve a scary face on it, and put a candle inside to ward off the evil ones. For these ancient people with their godless superstitions, Halloween was no laughing matter.

It became horrendously frightful when the Druids (priests and teachers of the Celts) would approach a house and demand a female member of the household to sacrifice that night. Reliable sources indicate that human sacrifice to the god of death was a part of their worship on Halloween. Sometimes people wore costumes of animal heads or skins during the ceremony. After the animals and humans were burned that night, their remains were examined to predict the future.

Witches, Satanists, and modern Druids perform similar ceremonies today. October 31 marks the highest festival for these groups. Some practice the blasphemous Black Mass, which ridicules and reverses things sacred to Christians.

Since the Celtic people did not release such strong superstitions easily, many customs related to the worship of the god of death remained even after the people became Christians. To combat these, in 843 AD the Christian church named November 1 All Saints Day. On that day we remember those who have died in the faith. The evening before was named All Hallow E'en, which has been shortened over time to Halloween. Unfortunately, Christian customs haven't replaced some of these superstitions. The Lord of Life at times seems forgotten on Halloween while the pagan god of death is remembered.

So what do we do? I can't imagine a good reason for Christians to celebrate darkness, witchcraft, death, evil or fear. Real witches aren't funny. The real terror of death is not a joke. Symbols of darkness, including witches, vampires, ghosts, etc. point in a spiritual direction that is as contrary to Christ as darkness is to light.

"So what are you getting at, Pastor? Are you saying we should turn off the lights and pretend we aren't home and save the money we'd spend on candy for the neighbor kids?"

Let me suggest a guideline as opposed to a list of "do's and don'ts." How can I honor Christ, the Light of the World, when my culture is having fun celebrating themes rooted in deeds of darkness?

You may choose to plan an alternative for your kids that is not "dark" and even more fun! When many are darkening their homes and focusing on the "spooky," *you may choose to light up the entry way and create a happy, hopeful sense at your door – a moment that is life giving rather than death focused.* And if others think you're killjoy, bear it as an honor, because you choose to celebrate the light rather than the deeds of darkness.

What Halloween does is heighten our awareness of

spiritual reality. We believe that the enemy of our souls is no joke. We realize he has used "harmless fun" like Dungeons and Dragons games to draw some into the darkness of demonic possession. We take the reality of deeds and dangers of darkness seriously.

Yet we don't live in oppressive fear. We live confident in Christ's victory over darkness for us. And because of Christ, we are called to walk in the light as He is in the light and to put away the shameful deeds of darkness. When we're surrounded by reminders of darkness, let's remember who we are in Christ and let His light shine through us.

This would be a great time to review Scripture passages that deal with light, such as: John 1:1-14, John 3:16-21, Romans 13:12-14, 2 Corinthians 6:14-18, Ephesians 5:8-21, 1 Peter 2:9-12, 1 John 1:5-7.

Talk about your response to Halloween with other Christians in your life. Let's encourage each other! When people ask "Why aren't you into Halloween?" A good response would be, "We're celebrating life, not death. We like the light a lot better than the darkness." Some may think you're weird. ...but some may be drawn towards the light.

IF traitors, seditionists, and revolutionaries let their full purpose and motive be known, they would attract only the kind of warped followers who are moved by the same hatreds and frustrations and who are as much lovers of discord and violence as they themselves are. Lenin pretended to be much concerned for the welfare of the laboring man, yet nowhere are workers more exploited and indeed, enslaved than in Communist countries. A cursory study of what goes on in totalitarian countries should and would disillusion the most ardent Marxists and they would realize the total lack of humanitarian concerns of any sort on the part of Communist governments. There are, however, thousands of gullible people ready to be

taken in by false and lying propaganda; and, there, they become ready supporters of world revolution and Soviet tyranny.

This is a generation that calls good evil and evil good. The basest sort of selfish and evil men are promoted by the news media as heroes and loving idealists. Good men who stand for righteousness, decency, Constitutional liberties, and human welfare are ignored or ridiculed and misrepresented by the news media. Radio, television, and the public press are quick to promote any liberal cause, but biblical Christianity is despised and hated by them. That which is most radical is described as "moderate" while any conservative is described as "an extreme conservative" or as being a member of the "radical right" or the "lunatic fringe."

Nowhere is the effect of these steamroller tactics more apparent than in the establishment of the national holiday in honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Senators and Congressmen – either stupid, cowardly, or both – voted to honor in this way a man whose record with the Justice Department may not be opened for a number of years yet. Surely the American people are entitled to know what is in his record that must be hidden from public scrutiny. Nevertheless, we are seeing the sorry spectacle this year and for years ahead of government offices closing to honor him.

Why? Because God has given this country over into the hands of men who love darkness rather than light and who are ever quick and ready to shun truth and embrace falsehood. The Old Testament prophet has something to say about those who offer their dreams as revelations from God. Men are quick to accept a deceiver's dreams but slow to search for God's truth or to embrace His Word.

Great Swelling Words

"These are murmurers, complainers, walking after their own lusts; and their mouth speaketh great swelling words, having men's persons in admiration because of advantage." Jude 16.

This picturesque phrase, "great swelling words," is the King James Version translation of *huperonkos*, which literally means "super-massive," with the implied noun "words" added because of the context.

The word is used only one other time in the New Testament, in the parallel passage in 2 Peter 2:18; "For when they speak great swelling words of vanity, they allure through the lusts of the flesh, through much wantonness, those that were clean escaped from them who live in

error."

Both apostles, in context, are warning against false teachers who, after somehow obtaining positions of influence among the spiritually immature believers in the body, would then seek to lead them back into worldly ways of thinking and acting. Peter compares those who heed such words to washed sows going back to wallow in the mire (2 Peter 2:22).

Such teachers may appear very intellectual and charismatic, with their "feigned words: (2 Peter 2:3), promises of "liberty" (1 Peter 2:16), and flatteries (see text above), but is a deadly mistake to follow them. Both Peter and Jude give various ways by which to recognize them. They may actually deny the redemptive work of Christ (2 Peter 2:1), or seek to undermine those whom God has placed (Ed. Admitted) in authority (2:10). Perhaps most commonly, they are interested in worldly gain or prestige for themselves (2 Peter 2:14; Jude 11). They also may practice and encourage carnal lifestyles (Jude 4).

Other characteristics of these deceptive teachers are given in these two key chapters and, by all means, young (Ed. ALL) believers need to be alert to this danger, staying close to God's Word and obedient to His will.

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Strength

"The Lord God is my strength; He will make my feet like deer's feet, and He will make me walk on my high hills" Habakkuk 3:19.

The annotation in my Bible adds this: "He will give those who live by faith the same confidence that a sure-footed deer has in climbing mountains." I have always admired these magnificent creatures and the ability God has given them to climb the rocky terrain and not fall. If we have Jesus as our personal Savior, we can have the same sure-footedness in our journey here on earth. Nahum 1:7 assures us, "The Lord is good, a stronghold in the day of trouble; He knows those who take refuge in Him."

The story is told about the California coastal cities that have often experienced the feel of an earthquake. Some time ago, San Francisco and other Bay Area cities suffered tremors. At first it was reported that the Golden Bay Bridge had suffered considerable damage. Then a little later, officials commented that the bridge had taken the

earthquake in stride with no apparent sign of damage to the span itself. A score of plate glass windows were shattered in the administration building and in the tall collector booths on the San Francisco side. Still no one was injured. The big thirty-six inch suspension cables slapped and swayed in the fierce blasts, but the span weathered the tremor with ease.

The bridge towers are anchored in huge blocks of concrete sunk down in the bedrock. The suspension construction of the span gives it considerable flexibility. A number of years ago when a seventy-five-mile-an-hour hurricane hit the bridge, it bent twelve-and-a-half feet out of line under the terrific force of that wind. Its designer, a New York engineer, made this comment: "That bridge bent but it did not break, because it was built to sway at least eighteen feet under wind pressure."

The same thing can be said about a soul securely anchored in God's heart of love. When storms attempt to shake us loose, we may bend, but we will never break. There is always a power and strength that comes to us through faith in God. It may seem that we come close to the breaking point, but God is beside us all the while. We are securely fastened to a power that is unchangeable and immovable...

RELIGIOUS, But not right with God?

That may sound strange to you, but there are many religious people "hiding" from God. They may be sincere, but sincerity is not enough; they need the truth of God's Word.

Some people think that they are Christians automatically because they had Christian parents. Others presume that attending church or being baptized or sharing in Communion makes them Christians. These are all important Christian responsibilities, but if people have never committed their lives to Christ, their efforts are hopeless.

The Bible – from beginning to end – teaches that to be right with God we need a sacrifice for our sins:

"Without the shedding of blood there is no remission (of sins)" (Hebrews 9:22b). God has provided salvation through His Son who "once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God" (1 Peter 3:18).

Trying to be religious without Jesus Christ as one's Savior can be like taking a drug that distorts a person's reasoning. It is a delusion to think that performing a religious duty can make us right with God. Even leading a respectable life can never erase our sins. We all need a Savior.

The Bible teaches that salvation is God's gift that we do not deserve, nor can ever earn. The Lord taught that salvation is through faith in Him alone: "He that believeth on me hath everlasting life"

(John 6:47). His apostle Peter declared, "Through his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins" (Acts 10:43). The apostle Paul wrote of his Savior: In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins" (Ephesians 1:7). The apostle John testifies, "As many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name" (John 1:12).

God's good news turns us from our own vain attempts to earn His pardon to Christ's complete salvation. John Wesley, the great evangelist of eighteenth century England, strove for years to make himself acceptable to God by his own efforts. But he never found peace until he could say, "I trusted Christ and Christ alone for salvation. And an assurance was given me that He had taken away all my sins."

Are you religious but not right with God? Then come to Him today – just as we all must approach God, as sinners in need of a Savior. You can pray to God right where you are, believing that Jesus Christ died for your sins and claiming Him as your Lord.

Jesus promises, "He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life" (John 5:24).

Please read Proverbs 1-3

Our loving heavenly Guide, who would lead us to the best in life, addressed this message to My Son (Proverbs 2:1). As to a child who has the utmost confidence in the loving wisdom of a parent, God urges: *Receive My words and hide* (take to heart) *My commandments so that you incline your ear unto wisdom and apply your heart* (and mind) *to understanding......Yes, if you cry out for knowledge* (Insight) *and rise your voice for understanding, if you seek wisdom as you would silver and search for wisdom as for hidden treasures, then you will understand the fear of the LORD and find the knowledge of God (2:1-5).*

The *fear of the LORD* is a primary theme throughout the Old Testament, (Editor: and definitely a 'practice' in the New Testament). It manifests itself in an attitude of reverence which leads one both to worship

the Lord and to obey His Word. We are urged to receive...treasure...incline...apply...cry out...lift up our voices...seek...search for wisdom as for hidden treasures (2:1-4). Our choice is of utmost importance. Our Lord is saying "Take My Word seriously." We must be so very careful what we read, for by choosing to read one book, we have thus chosen not to read another book. The Word of God should always come first. Then shall you understand righteousness, and judgment, and equity; yes, every good path. When wisdom enters into your heart, and knowledge is pleasant unto your soul; Discretion shall preserve you, understanding shall keep you (2:9-11). This brings us into a right relationship with God.

In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct your paths (3:5-6). Our sincere, simple trust in God will put us in direct touch with the wisdom and power of God to keep us from evil.

Spirituality does not diminish the intense energy by which worldly success is gained. On the contrary, it encourages us to invest as much energy seeking the wisdom that God alone can give as we would seeking silver or precious treasures. This means a lifetime of progressive spiritual effort – *studying to show ourselves approved unto God, workmen that need not be ashamed* (11 Timothy 2:15). Then as we receive the Word and wisdom of God in our lives we need to lift up our voices in prayer that we may accomplish the purpose for which He created us.

Nothing that we gain in this world – *though we gain the whole world* (Matthew 16:26; Mark 8:36, Luke 9:25) – can compare to the eternal value of true spiritual wisdom. This wisdom can be gained only as the Holy Spirit enlightens our understanding through meditating upon His Word (John 16:8-13).

Be not wise in your own eyes: fear the LORD, and depart from evil (Proverbs 3:7).
