The Generational Divide

A Godly Example

ow let's consider the young Timothy whom the apostle Paul called "my own son in the faith" (1 Timothy 1:2) because he was following after Paul and learning about the gospel ministry from Paul. (ED. And maybe Paul was the 'vessel' God used to bring him to Jesus for Salvation).

Timothy gives us an example of faith passed on from generation to generation. Paul commends Timothy for having the same sincere faith of his grandmother, Lois, and his mother, Eunice (II Tim. 1:5). This is what can and should happen rather than a generational divide!

Can you imagine Timothy saying to Paul, "Hey, Dude, we are wanting something cool and edgy! You are too divisive. You need to step aside and let me run this ministry. I know how to do it!"

Didn't happen! Paul taught him not to let anyone despise his youth, but to be an example of the believer in word, conduct, love, spirit, faith and purity (II Tim. 4:12). Another instruction that Paul gave to the young Timothy is how to treat others.

'Rebuke not an elder, but intreat him as a father; and the younger men as brethren; The elder women as mothers; the younger as sisters, with all purity" (II Timothy 5:1-2).

Responding to Authority

"Remember them which have the rule over you, who have spoken unto you the word of God: whose faith fol-

low. Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves for they watch for your souls." Salute all them that have the rule over you." Hebrews 13:7, 17, 24.

These instructions are saying to respect, obey and honor your leaders.

Paul also told the young Timothy to pass on what he had been taught. He didn't tell him to go and find out what the people wanted or what tickled their fancy but to give them the Word that he had been given by Paul.

"Thou therefore, my son be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus, And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also" (II Tim. 2-1-2.

Do you see a pattern here? It was not to go out and find out what was trendy and palatable! It was to give them truth and give it straight as he had heard Paul teach.

But millennials, they say, are looking for a preacher who will take off his tie, untuck his shirt, sit on a barstool and give them skits, funny stories and "gospel life" talks.

In music, they don't want the hymns filled with biblical truth. They want barely Christian, emotionally stimulating music with a beat that is so much like worldly music that you can hardly tell any difference.

You may have heard of parallelism. That is a method of teaching that is being used now in some churches. They take worldly images and try to attach Christian principles to them. It is like saying that our ideas are not that different from what you're accustomed to seeing in the world.

Parallelism tries to show a similarity in direction,

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tendency and character between the world and Christianity. Some people try to say that Paul used it on Mars' hill at Athens. I suggest you read that passage again (Acts 17:15-34). It is not so!

The movie *Willow* uses a baby Moses in the bulrushes storyline. In the movie, however, it was a girl who was to be the savior of the land. That defames and diminishes the Gospel. It weakens and degrades the truth of the Bible.

We should also beware of the rising acceptance of the occult, evil spirits and mysticism in our culture. It is being promoted in entertainment, movies and children's games. It is subversive and designed to steal our children from us, to turn their loyalty away from our faith, our values and our traditions. They are trying to make the bizarre become acceptable and desirable. This is dangerous!

Closing the Generational Gap

So what's wrong with change, connecting and relevancy? What's wrong with innovation, seeking commonality and new styles? Nothing, if we do not sacrifice biblical principles in the process! But too often the message of salvation from sin is changed to beginning a relationship with Christ.

Too often change means conforming to the world rather than being transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit. Romans 12:2 says, "Be not conformed" (Ed. Squeezed) to this

world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God." ...

May God help us return to the spirit of Psalm 84:2, which says, "My soul longeth, yea, even fainteth for the courts of the LORD: my heart and my flesh crieth out for the living God."

What's More Important?

Truth or trends? Reverence or relevance? Convictions or connections? Substance or style? Commands or creativity? Doctrine or deference? Principles or presentation? ...

So you see, we are not opposed to creativity, change or new things, as long as we follow biblical principles and do not weaken the Gospel Message or the Doctrines of the Bible. We must not follow people who are not faithful followers of the Lord.

"He appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom He had cast seven devils (demons)" Mark 16:9.

MARY of Magdala was the victim of a fearful evil. She was possessed by not one devil (demon) only, but seven. These dreadful inmates caused much pain and pollution to the poor frame in which they had found a lodging. Hers was a hopeless, horrible case. She could not help herself, neither could any human succor avail. But Jesus passed that way, and unsought, and probably even resisted by the poor demoniac, He uttered the word of power and Mary of Magdala became a trophy of the healing power of Jesus. All the seven demons left her, left her never to return, forcibly ejected by the Lord of all. What a blessed deliverance! What a happy change! From delirium to delight, from despair to peace, from hell to heaven! Straightway she became a constant follower of Jesus, catching His every word, following His devious steps, sharing His toilsome life; and withal she became His generous helper, first among that band of healed and grateful women who ministered unto Him of their substance. When Jesus was lifted up in crucifixion Mary remained the sharer of His shame: we find her first beholding from afar, and then drawing near to the foot of the cross. She could not die on the cross with Jesus, but she stood as near it as she could, and when His blessed body was taken down, she watched to see how and where it was laid. She was the faithful and watchful believer last at the sepulcher where Jesus slept, first at the grave

whence He arose. Her holy fidelity made her <u>a favoured beholder of her beloved Rabboni</u>, who deigned to call her by her name, and to make her <u>His messenger of good news</u> to the trembling disciples and Peter. Thus grace found her a maniac and made her a minister, cast out devils (demons) and gave her to behold angels, delivered her from Satan, and united her forever to the Lord Jesus. May I also be such a miracle of grace!

As a Christian, when you may come in contact with 'demon' warfare ABSOLUTELY make sure you are under the covering of the <u>BLOOD OF</u> **JESUS** – besides, 'we' need that constantly ALL the time anyway!

Spiritual Imposters!

"But evil men and imposters will proceed from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived." (2 Tim. 3:13)

Paul warned his disciple Timothy that there would be imposters who would come and deceive God's people. They are deceived from the truth themselves and they go about deceiving others into believing a lie. What is more, their deception will increase, they "will proceed from bad to worse." Once they get people to believe a little deception, they can then lure them into greater deception. Just how crafty is this deception from these imposters? Paul had to warn the church at Corinth to be on the look out for these imposters. "But I am afraid, lest as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, your minds should be led astray from the simplicity and purity of devotion to Christ. For if one comes and preaches another Jesus whom we have not preached, or you receive a different spirit which you have not received, or a different gospel which you have not accepted, you bear this beautifully." (2 Cor. 11:3-4) Notice that the purpose of this deception is to lead you away from a sincere and pure devotion to Christ. Its aim is to water down the call of Jesus to be the Lord of your life and for you to be entirely devoted to Him with your whole life unto the death. The way it works is that these deceived imposters come and preach another Jesus to you than the Jesus from the Scriptures. The "Jesus" they talk about will mirror the real thing in many ways, but their "Jesus" is not the Lord God Almighty who is worthy of all honor, praise, adoration, worship and surrender of life.

There is a "spirit" that accompanies their ministry, but it is not the Holy Spirit. Rather, it is a spirit which is aimed at giving credence to these men rather than to the Lord Jesus Christ. It will stir the emotions of the listeners, but not their heart. People can go home from the meeting with a smile on their face and happiness in their soul, yet with an empty heart. That is because the "gospel" that these imposters preach is not the gospel from the Scriptures. The imposters will talk about simply believing in Christ or making decisions for Christ, but not about repentance of sin and faith in Christ. It is a "gospel" that invites Christ to come in to be your friend and help you with life's problems, but it is not the gospel that brings forgiveness of sins and freedom from life dominating sins and changes the lives of those who embrace it. The "gospel" the imposters preach is void of repentance.

What is more, these imposters look and act like the real thing, yet they are really agents of Satan himself! Paul went on to describe these people like this: "For such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. Therefore, it is not surprising if his servants also disguise themselves as servants of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their deeds." (2 Cor. 11:13-15)

What was warned against in the first century is happening in our time as well. Spiritual Imposters are going about as though they are the genuine thing. They look and act like real ministers, yet they are imposters. They stand and talk about Jesus and the gospel, but it is not the Jesus and gospel from the Scriptures, and the spirit accompanying them is not the Holy Spirit. They are agents from Satan himself. Spiritually dead or backslidden souls with little or no spiritual discernment can sit under these people and not know any difference. After all, they look and sound just like the real thing and they do talk about Jesus. In fact, they will prefer the imposters to the real thing because the imposters don't stir up any conviction.

How about you, dear reader. Are you sitting under an imposter? Are you listening to an agent of the devil, imposing as an agent of God? Can you tell the difference? How can you tell the real from the false? – From the Scriptures! In this same text (2 Timothy) that Paul warns of these imposters, he also lays out the guidelines for the true minister of God. You can use these guidelines to evaluate those whom you are listening to. They are as follows:

1) Do they have a testimony of salvation? Paul told Timothy, "From childhood you have known the holy Scriptures which are able to make you wise unto

salvation which is through faith in Christ Jesus." (2 Tim. 3:14) To this same one who came to initial faith as a child, Paul also said, "Lay hold of eternal life unto which you were called." (I Tim. 6:12) Do the ministers you are listening to have a testimony of a time when they came personally to the Lord for salvation? It is a question of whether they have experienced conversion, a time when they came under conviction of sin and turned to Jesus as their Lord and Savior from their sin.

- 2) Are they preaching the Word of God to you? Paul told Timothy, "Preach the Word." (2 Tim. 4:2) Are they expounding Holy Scripture to you, or just fanciful stories? Paul knew that people would gravitate to these imposters, that is why he warned Timothy to be on guard for those who tickled the itching ears of the listeners. Namely, are they telling the people what they want to hear, or what they need to hear?
- 3) Are they preaching the whole counsel of God? Paul told Timothy, "Reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine." (2 Tim. 4:2) True ministers will preach both the Law in all its sternness and the Gospel in all its sweetness. To "reprove" and "rebuke" means that they will warn you to flee from the wrath that is to come. They will tell you about the holy dictates of God's Law and the dire consequences that awaits every one who breaks them. They will also tell you about God's love for you in Jesus Christ and His means of forgiveness. He will tell you BOTH of God's Wrath and God's Love. Many ministers today are telling people about God's Love, and never mention God's wrath. Scripture tells us what kind of people these are. There is also a real tendency today not to talk about doctrine, because doctrine is an absolute truth and it divides those who will accept it from those who won't. Imposters don't want division, but rather unity at all costs and do not stand on absolute truth. This is the path of compromise and God never blesses compromise of His Truth!
- 4) Do they have a burden for lost souls? Paul told Timothy, "Do the work of an evangelist, fulfill the duties of your ministry." (2 Tim. 4:5) Can they tell you how to be saved? Are they doing so, both publicly in the pulpit and privately in visitation? A true minister will explain the way of salvation to his people and do what he can to see that everyone knows how they can make it to heaven.

Evidence of Salvation – Also Prevenient Grace

Please prayerfully read Luke 15:1-7

<u>First things first</u>: How often don't we hear to 'turn your life over to Jesus Christ for a better- life!' Put 'your' faith in Him! Decide to follow Jesus! OR 'if' you have never trusted in Jesus, accept Him today! AND we have found a better 'ministry' than through Evangelistic Meetings! It doesn't matter what you wear OR don't wear; just come to hear the Word of God!

It really doesn't matter what 'religion' you are a part of as long as you are sincere and follow its doctrines; they all lead to Heaven as a God of love will not cast anyone into Hell! Christianity is only a 'magic'! When someone 'dies' we often hear the words 'passed away' – well the question is where they go and for how long? "Passing away" is foreign to the Bible.

Are these 'biblically' based statements??? Do as the Bereans did many years ago: Search the SCRIPTURES daily to see IF these things are so! (Acts 17:11) As true 'biblically born-again Lutherans' we need the Holy Spirit's enlightenment (as well as everybody else); but also we believe in using Scripture to interpret Scripture. YES, 'faith' cometh by hearing the Word of God – Romans 10:17; but almost all the time in the Bible the word 'hear (ears)' is more than physical 'ear-hearing', but it includes obeying God's Word from the heart out of love!

<u>First things First:</u> Notice, first of all the tax collectors and sinners (Luke 15:1 & 2) drew near to hear God's Word through His beloved Son Jesus.

In verse <u>two</u> it was the 'Pharisees and scribes' who murmured/complained about the 'evidence' of the action (evidence/involvement) of Jesus. THUS Jesus was speaking/responding to whom? Which 'thought of themselves that they needed NO repentance'; for a true Christian 'repentance' is a <u>daily</u> experience.

A 'parable' is an earthly-story with a heavenly meaning. What is left when the 'shepherd' leaves the ninety and nine; that is in 'Christendom or a Christian'? Just a *form of godliness!*

There are times/promptings by the Holy Spirit when a person can get saved.

WHO seeks Who? Isaiah 55: "Seek the LORD while He may be found, Call upon Him while He is near." Yes, there is a time when a person can so harden their

heart, that God quits calling. It is when God has been working behind the scene (awakening/prevenient grace) that a needy-lost 'sinner' has the empowerment to respond, by the working of the Holy Spirit: to 'respond' positively to the 'prompting/calling of the Holy Spirit.

Actually ALL three parables in Luke 15 have as the basic bottom-line: The value of ONE soul/each person!

When ONE precious 'soul' finds its way to Calvary with a 'repentant' heart, then Satan is defeated and reioicing takes place even among the inhabitants of Heaven; along with the Blessed Little Flock that JESUS calls His own (Verses. 7 & 19 IN Chapter 15)! Prior to this, that 'soul' was in captivity in Satan's realm, but the **Blood of Jesus** has broken the shackles of sin and set him free! For by faith we walk, not sight or learning. Salvation/deliverance is not by goodworks' – Isaiah 64:6, Titus 3:5. For I can not come to Him by my own reason or strength! The old-nature is never converted; but actually the old-nature grows. It depends upon which 'nature' a believer 'feeds' the most, who wins the Spiritual Battle and IF feeding the 'new-nature' most; then is found by our all-knowing GOD as 'faithful' unto the end.

First things First: As you have noted it is not reformation that we are emphasizing but TRANS-FORMATION! New direction, purpose, etc. – II Corinthians 5:17. When you find the word 'therefore' in Scripture; stop and ponder as it means 'as a result'. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation (creature); old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." So "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things shall be added to you." Matthew 6:33. "But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:20-21. In the 'light' of God's Word, the Bible, what is your heart? A triangle: your intellect, will and emotions!

As a result, a person will experience a real love for the Word of GOD, the BIBLE, also for and of the breth-

ren: "We know that we have passed from death to life because we love the brethren. He who does not love his brother abides in death" 1 John 3:14. Also, 'see how they loved one another'!

Now a person will find out by experience that he/she has two natures; the old-nature and the new nature and a real inner-battle takes place. The 'old-nature' looks out for three characteristics: Me, Myself and I. SIN takes on a new dimension – Romans chapter seven.

There is no question whatsoever, this person will now have a burden/concern for lost sinners.

With a watchful care a new person IN Crist will take seriously and heed the last verse in Hebrews chapter one and the very first verses of chapter two as it is written specifically to Christians and then all folk. As you know the Bible is inspired by the Holy Spirit and in love for the benefit of ALL humanity and it is God's Incorruptible Seed that will not return unto Him void. First things First:

II Corinthians 5:17 – 21, Ephesians 2:8-10.

FIRST OF ALL!

God in his LOVE tells 'us' to examine "ourselves" in the light of Holy Scripture!

Caution: Stop, Look and Listen to the last part of Luke 15 as the "older son" was 'angry' and would not come


There are many whose latter days have been their



Wells Fargo Resists Pressure From American Federation of Teachers

The American Federation of Teachers has threatened to pull its business from Wells Fargo unless it severs ties with the National Rifle Association and gun manufacturers, but so far the bank is resisting.

"We're issuing Wells Fargo an ultimatum," said AFT President Randi Weingarten... in a (recent) statement. "They can have a mortgage market which includes America's teachers, or they can continue to do business with the NRA and gun manufacturers. They can't do both."

Wells Fargo CEO Tim Sloan offered to meet with her without acceding to her demand to stop offering loans and other services to the NRA and firearms companies.

...Mr. Sloan said in an April 3 letter, "In fact, as I have publicly stated, I do not believe that the American public wants banks to decide which legal products consumers can and cannot buy."

He declined to confirm or discuss the bank's relationship with firearms companies, citing customer confidentiality.

The Burning Bush - Part II

This is the second in a series of articles about the encounter of Moses with God at the Burning Bush in Exodus chapter three. This encounter will show us the character and nature of God. This should be the goal of every true Christian – To know God for Who He is in His fulness – as expressed in John 17:3, "And this is eternal life, that they may know Thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom Thou hast sent."

God is a Marvelous Sight

Moses is in the desert wilderness when he comes upon a bush burning but not consumed (v. 2). He has a desire to see what is going on – I MUST SEE (v. 3). Moses describes this as a MARVELOUS Sight – Literally a Great Sight. That is because this is no ordinary fire that is burning inside the bush. Moses can tell that this is a supernatural fire – Something beyond nature – And beyond himself as a natural man.

It is the Lord who is in this bush (v. 4) — That is the key to this whole episode. He alone is the reason for all this supernatural happenings in this ordinary bush. It tells us that the Lord is not ordinary in His vary nature and makeup. Moses is quite taken back about the extra-ordinary character of such a fire. Here you see the desire of people in the world – Drawn to the supernatural. People have a desire to see – And to know – God in His supernatural character. I think that any of us would jump at the chance to see a sight like this.

God desires that we have this revelation of Himself. As Moses is seeking to see this marvelous sight – Something very interesting happens (v. 4) – The Lord calls Moses BY NAME. In fact – He repeats it for emphasis. This tells us that God is all-knowing – Omniscient. He knows all things about everything – He has wisdom beyond what any man can even grasp – enough to create all things and maintain them in perfect balance. What is even more amazing is that this all-knowing, eternally wise God knows each of us individually, even to call us all by name!

John 10:3 says, "The sheep hear His voice, and He calls his own sheep by name, and leads them out."

The Lord knows who you are and will call you by your name – A personal address. The Lord's desire is to have a personal relationship with people. God created mankind in the beginning in order to have fellowship with Him. He would be our God and we would be His people. We would exist in a relationship – not a best friend relationship – but as a family relationship – that of a Father to child.

But alas – There is something standing in the way of this happening!

God is Holy

God orders Moses to Stop (v. 5). Moses walks toward the bush and a Voice comes out of the Bush – STOP! – Don't draw near! God knows something that Moses doesn't know yet – that there is something different about God. He is un-approachable by natural man – He is separate and Distinct. There is a division between God and all His creation – Including you and me. It is demonstrated by what God orders Moses to do (v. 5) – Remove your sandals because the ground is holy – **Because God is Holy.** There was nothing unique about that soil. Rather it was the Presence of God that made it holy and anything that God touches is now also Holy.

What does it mean when we say that God is Holy? The word means "separate." To say that God is Holy means that He is entirely perfect in all that He Is and Does. There is no defect in Him in His very being, character and makeup. Every decision and act are entirely perfect and without defect of any kind. God is absolutely Pure and Perfect.

Because God is Holy – He is now separate from all people. The natural cannot even touch where God is – not even a sandal. Natural man cannot be in the same place that the Holy God is. This revelation of the Holiness of God reveals to us the crux of the matter: **God is Holy and we are Not.** God in His Holiness cannot be in the presence of those who are not holy.

When Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate the forbidden fruit – They were no longer Holy, so God banished them from the Garden and His presence. When Satan and his evil angels revolted against God they were kicked them out of heaven down to the earth. When God dwelled in the Tabernacle and anyone except the High Priest tried to enter the Holy of Holies – they were struck dead on the spot. Only the Levites were commissioned to carry the furniture and the Ark of he Covenant. Anyone else who even touched that Holy furniture was killed on the spot. God is absolutely separate from everything that is not holy

Because God is Holy – He must judge each and every act of un-holiness. It is why God has **that thing called wrath** – which is largely forgotten today. Romans 1:18 says, "For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness." This God is going to execute His wrath and Judgment upon the great nation of Egypt. There will be ten plagues unleashed – the culmination being the death of the first-born of man and beast.

God will judge each and every act of people that is

not holy — Nationally and individually. Ultimately that will take place on Judgment Day. Anyone who is not holy will be separate from God — just like Moses was ordered to stop. They will be forever banished from the presence of God, which is the very essence of hell. God is Holy and can't exist together with anyone who isn't holy.

God's Holiness Met

This revelation of God's Holiness means that all mankind is now separated from God. Because, if a great man like Moses can't come into God's Presence – who can? Romans 3:10-12 says, "There is none righteous, not even one; There is none who understands, There is none who seeks for God; All have turned aside, together they have become useless; There is none who does good, There is not even one."

So how are you going to be AS HOLY AS GOD HIMSELF? It isn't a question of how good of a person you are – Or how many good deeds you have done – Or what kind of a testimony you have before people – Or what good character you may have. The standard is that you must be as holy as God Himself. Jesus said it this way: "Be ye therefore perfect, even as my Father in heaven is perfect." (Matt. 5:48)

How are you going to do that? If you can't, you won't be in God's Presence – because you are not holy – and He IS. The only way that Moses and Israel would be able to stand the Judgement of God on Egypt was through the Passover. An innocent lamb would be slaughtered and the blood applied to the top and sides of the door where the Israelites were. God declared, "When I see the Blood I will Pass over you." (Ex. 12:13) God's righteous requirements were met with that innocent lamb and the life given with the shedding of blood. God was able to look upon all inside as being holy as Himself and pass over the Judgment.

The same is true for each one of us today. God has provided an innocent, sinless victim to pay the price for our un-holiness. This Lamb of God was none other than Jesus Christ. It is the holiness of God that drove Jesus to the Cross. He died for our sins – our acts of un-holiness against God. Jesus gave His very life's blood to fully atone for our evil before God – And in so doing, He now brings to us THE VERY HOLINESS OF GOD HIMSELF TO US!!!

Romans 1:16-17 "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "But the righteous man shall live by faith."

This is exactly what Justification is: God declares you holy in His sight because Christ is Holy. God adds the very Holiness of Christ to the account of your life and

takes away all your un-holiness, so that God sees you as perfect as Himself – Since Christ is God Himself. This is true ONLY IF you have faith in Jesus as your Personal Lord and Savior.

2 Corinthians 5:21 says, "He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." This is demonstrated in Exodus. When God commanded Moses to take off his sandals (v. 5), his feet were now in direct contact with the holy ground with nothing in-between. This is only possible when God has bridged the gap between His holiness and our unrighteousness.

Have you had a revelation of the Holiness of God and what God has done about it in Jesus?

What Does Faith Do?

What is faith? How does it come? What does it do? Faith makes all things possible. We read in Mark 9:23: "All things are possible to him that believeth." Did you know that by faith a Christian can literally tap the resources of Heaven?

"And whatsoever ye shall ask in My name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If ye shall ask any thing in My name, I will do it" John 14:13-14.

I am afraid that to many Christians God is not real. Think about the people you know. Think about the people of your church. Do they live, act and pray as if God were real?

Lady Summerset faced this problem. "Lord, I believe, and I'm saved but I want to know that God is real!" One day it seemed that a still small voice silently spoke to her heart, saying, "My child, act as if I were real, and you shall know that I am."

God must be real to a child of God. And faith makes God real. It links us with omnipotence. Faith says, "*I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me*" Philippians 4:13. This is the victory that overcometh the world even our faith" 1 John 5:4.

The three Hebrew children lived down in Babylon. They lived in the world, but they were not of the world. One day Nebuchadnezzar the king told them, "We are going to put you in this fiery furnace unless you denounce the name of God." The three answered, "Our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king. But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up." Daniel 3:17-18.

They were not going to denounce their faith in their God, their hope, their trust. 'We believe God is able.' So the three Hebrews were put in the fiery furnace while God up in Heaven was looking down.

God must have said, "Amen! I'm proud of Shadrach, Meshack and Abednego!" The Lord said, "I believe I'll just go down and get in there with them." They had heated it "seven times more than it was wont to be heated" (vs. 19) and cast them in. It burned and "slew" those men that threw them in (vs. 22). Forgive me, but I like that! It burned them up!

After a while the Babylonians thought, "They ought to be well done. Let's see how the cooking goes." When the furnace door was opened they saw not three but four men walking in the midst of the fire unharmed. The only thing burned was the binding put on them. Not a hair of their heads was singed.

"How many did we throw in there!"

"Three."

"How many are now in there?"

You're crazy! You can't see straight. Somebody else count them."

"One, two, three, four – there's four!"

"You're nuts too. Let me count them! One, two, three, four. Yes, you're right. Who's the fourth One? How'd He get in there?"

The Bible says, "The form of the fourth is like the Son of God" (vs. 25).

Nebuchadnezzar now knew "there is no other God that can deliver after this sort" (vs. 29). Then he promoted Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego in the province of Babylon.

Faith sees the invisible, believes the written Word and attempts the impossible! That's what faith does!

Diligence

"Giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge, etc." 1 Peter 1:5, 6

IF thou wouldest enjoy the eminent grace of the full assurance of faith, under the blessed Spirit's influence, and assistance, do what the Scripture tells thee, "Give diligence. "Take care that thy *faith* is the right kind – that it is not a mere belief of doctrine but a simple faith depending on Christ, and on Christ alone. Give diligent heed to thy *courage*. Plead with God that He would give thee the face of a lion that thou mayest, with a consciousness of right, go on boldly. Study well the Scriptures, and get *knowledge*; for a knowledge of doctrine will tend very much to confirm faith. Try to understand God's Word; let it dwell in thy heart richly.

When thou hast done this, "Add to thy knowledge temperance" Take heed to thy body; be temperate without. Take heed to thy soul; be temperate within. Get temperance of lip, life, heart, and thought. Add to this by God's Holy Spirit, patience; (Ed. Patience also means 'perseverance') ask Him to give thee that patience which endureth affliction, which, when it is tried, shall come forth as gold. Array yourself with patience, that you may not murmur nor be depressed in your afflictions. When that grace is won look to *godliness*. Godliness is something more than religion. Make God's glory your object in life; live in His sight; dwell chose to Him; seek for fellowship with Him; and thou hast "godliness," and to that add brotherly love. Have a love to all the saints: and add to that a *charity*, which openeth its arms to all men, and loves their souls. When you are adorned with these jewels, and just in proportion as you practice these heavenly virtues, will you come to know by clearest evidence "your calling and election, "_"Give diligence," if you would get assurance, for lukewarmness and doubting very naturally go hand in hand.

"That He may set him with princes." Psalm 113:8 OUR spiritual privileges are of the highest order. "Among princes is the place of select society." Truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with His Son Jesus Christ." Speak of select society, there is none like this! "We are a chosen generation, a peculiar people, a royal priesthood." "We are come unto the general assembly and church of the first-born, whose names are written in heaven." The saints have courtly audience: princes have admittance to royalty when common people must stand afar off. The child of God has free access to the inner courts of heaven.
