## Ye Shall Receive Power

*ACTS 1:6-9*

**T**hese are the very last words Jesus spoke before He went back to the Father. “And when he had spoken these things, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight.”

These last words contained (1) a correction; (2) a promise; (3) a commission.

The disciples were all taken up with: “When will you restore the kingdom to Israel?” They were very curious, and He rebuked their curiosity. He said to them, “You have nothing to do with dates and days, calendars and predictions” (v. 4).

“Well, what are we to do then?”

“You are to wait, to tarry at Jerusalem.”

“You are to be my witnesses, and I will equip you for this work; I promise to send you the Holy Spirit, and when He comes upon you, you shall receive power to be my witnesses both in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and even to the uttermost part of the earth.”

The body in which He began to do and to teach passed out of sight. It vanished to make way for the body in which He would continue to teach and to do, which is His church. A new training was now to begin. They were to believe on Him without seeing Him, so he vanished from their sight.

As He left He seemed to be concerned about one thing, that His disciples might become effective witnesses.

Is He concerned about this today? Indeed He is. His main concern after we have been saved, is that we should become good witnesses. That is His main purpose with our life. If it wasn't for this He would have taken us home the day He saved us.

“When the Holy Ghost power comes upon you ye shall be witnesses unto me.” Not unto yourself. The more you get of the power of the Spirit the less you say about yourself, and the more you say about Christ. The Holy Spirit did not come to glorify Himself, or you, but Christ alone.

My, how important it was for Paul that the Christians had a powerful, clear testimony about Christ. When he writes to the Ephesian church he says: “Pray for all saints; and for me, that utterance may be given unto me, that I may open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel” (Eph. 6:18-20).

You know what happened to Peter when the Holy Ghost's power came upon him. That weakling, who before did not dare to testify to a common working girl, stood there on the day of Pentecost and testified boldly to thousands. What a wonderful manifestation of God's power in a weak vessel!

But Peter did not lose sight of personal work. We read about John and Peter who went to a prayer meeting, and they saw a beggar sitting outside of the temple (Acts 3). Peter said: “Look on us!” The beggar looked at them and began to expect something. The world is looking at us Christians today, and they are expecting something; they have a right to. They see you going to church and coming from church, but do you ever stop to speak to them.

Many people are standing outside of the church today, and they will never get inside to hear the Word of God unless someone helps them. That beggar would never have gotten inside of the temple if it had not been for Peter and John.

I say to every born again Christian today: “Don't miss the personal effort. Speak to that boy; speak to that girl; speak to that man; speak to that woman; concentrate on winning one soul at a time.”

So one winter he prepared a whole series of sermons for the specific purpose of striking home to the heart of this lawyer. He preached regular highbrow sermons a whole win-

ter with this object in mind. When the services were all over this man came to the pastor and said, "Doctor, I want to join your church."

"Thank the Lord," said the preacher, "Which sermon did it?"

"None of them at all; the sermons never interested me a bit."

"Well, what in the world ever influenced you to become a Christian?" the minister asked.

The man said, "Do you know that widow in your church, the one who has to walk with two sticks?"

"Oh yes, I know her," said the preacher.

"Well, she was going out of the church one morning and one of her sticks fell from her hand. I caught her just in time to save her from falling. When I held her up and gave her the two sticks again she said:

'Thank you, sir, I hope you love my Jesus.'

"Your sermons didn't do it, but that dear old widow's kind word did it."

It is not the great eloquent sermons that will do the miracle, but that personal, spirit-filled, love-penetrating testimony from an everyday Christian.

Oh, I wish we had many witnesses like that woman with the sticks in our churches.

Will you be one?

### THUS SAITH THE LORD

IS HISTORY REPEATING ITSELF?

Look at this passage in Jeremiah 5:30-31 and see: *A wonderful and horrible thing is committed in the land; The prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests bear rule by their means; and my people love to have it so: and what will ye do in the end thereof?*"

Certainly history is repeating itself! False prophets are on every hand, beguiling unstable souls and preaching their false messages from within the church (2 Pet. 2:1-21). The ministry has been degraded into a "profession" rather than a "calling," and those who should be "undershepherds" have become "overlords" (1 Pet. 5:2-3).

"*And My people love to have it so.*" How true today! The masses of people are content to have the false prophets tell them what they want to hear (2 Tim. 4:3-4) even though they do not speak the truth. And perhaps worse yet, many of God's ministers who know the truth are

afraid to "cry aloud and spare not."

A church that has grown "lukewarm" (Rev. 3:16-17) and ministers who have become "*dumb dogs that cannot bark*" (Isa. 56:10) need to be awakened by the certainty of God's coming judgment. God's true servants will be sounding the alarm and crying aloud, "*Come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord:* (2 Cor. 6:14 - 18). Selected

THE Lord may be found as long as the time of grace lasts. The door that He opened for us in Christ stands open for all. As impossible as it is for anyone else to open the door, so impossible is it for others to close it. He has the keys of death and of hades, and only He opens and closes.

You who no doubt wish to go heaven, but who yourself want to determine the time of your conversion, you forget that this is Satan's deception. Many, many who thought as you think were never saved. It is when the Lord seeks you that you can seek Him. Today is our day, God alone owns tomorrow.

You and I too who found salvation, we too have gotten our "while." We too must redeem the acceptable time. If we draw back from the grace of God danger stands also at our door.

# Editorial

## RES *Priorities* (Sports??)

“...lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God.” (II Tim. 3:4a)

IN the third chapter of 11 Timothy, in God’s inspired WORD we have a graphic listing of ‘outstanding’ SINS during the time that God calls ‘Perilous Times’, which likely could be **present RIGHT NOW!** Let me give you a realistic example: A ‘congregational leader’ told me when a certain ‘sport’ comes around you will not see me in church and/or leaving the Worship Service early! No question about the decision as that already had been made! NOW is this pleasing to God as a Christian man, as this was; to put ‘physical’ (sport) above and beyond worshipping GOD in ‘spirit and truth’??

NOW on ‘another’ occasion a somewhat ‘religious’ man told me that he could ‘worship’ God as thoroughly out in ‘nature’ as in ‘church’, fishing OR hunting! This same ‘individual’ would ‘stomp’ out of church and ‘slam’ the door IF the worship service was not over at such a time. Well, going back to the earlier statement I tried to ask him in a direct and loving way IF he wanted his ‘sons’ to be like him and *tears trickled down his cheeks*.

Before we go any further in this ‘editorial’, I clearly want to state that I am not against ‘sports’ at all; as long as they are in the correct order of priorities! Most important IS SCRIPTURE! Actually ‘sports’ have likely been a part of humanity; since Creation, app. 6,000 years ago. Let me give you a few examples where different terms of sport are used in the Scriptures: Fight a good fight: I Timothy 6:12, II Timothy 4:7; Run the race – Hebrews 12:1-2; Beating the air (boxing) – 1 Corinthians 9:26; wrestling – Genesis 30:8, Ephesians 6:12.

A couple of definitions of ‘sport’ is: 1) An activity involving physical exertion and skill that is governed by a set of rules or customs and often undertaken competitively, 2) An active pastime, recreation.”

Any type of ‘sport’ can become a ‘god or idol’. In my words what’s an ‘idol’? ANY one or thing that keeps you from putting God first! Martin Luther’s Small Catechism puts it this way: “Anything that man worships, fears, loves, and trusts in instead of the one true God.”

ON another ‘occasion’ after a blest Worship Service, refreshments were served and a lot of ‘chatter’ took place; thus I asked a fellow Christian gentleman sitting next to me, “Do you think they are talking about the LORD”? In essence his answer was: NO, likely ‘sports’ (that’s their

idol) and IF they were talking about our Lord things would be different!

YES, **Scripture clearly** instructs ‘us’ at times to ‘come apart and rest’ awhile. I believe ‘we’ need these ‘breaks’ Spiritually, Physically & Emotionally. For example: Hebrews 4:9–16. Definitely on a daily basis, ‘we’ NEED to feed and refresh the ‘soul’ that ‘we’ in – bathing, reading, meditating, Memorizing, etc. the WORD OF GOD. “Your word is a lamp to my feet And a light to my path” Psalm 119:105. “Your word I have hidden in my heart, That I might not sin against You” Psalm 119:11. “The entrance of Your words gives light; It gives understanding to the simple” Psalm 119:130. “**Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers**” 3 John 2. **COLOSSIANS 2:1 – 10.**

And then enter into God’s **PANTRY/STOREHOUSE:** Matthew 6:6.

You know that it used to be that the ‘Public School System’ felt they were ‘fortunate’ IF they could have an activity/practice one night a week and now notice how the ‘tables’ have turned to include Wednesday night and even Sunday; and then some wonder what has happened to our country!

EVEN in church ‘activities’ what gives way FIRST when the schedule is full: **the Prayer Meeting!** **NO wonder JESUS** in LOVE had to cleanse the ‘temple’ in His earthly missionary journey and clearly state:

“**My house is a house of PRAYER!** (*How about today, what does HE SEE?*). God says: “For the time has come for judgment to begin at the house of God; and if it begins with us first, what will be the end of those who do not obey the gospel of God?” 1 Peter 4:17

As already referred to this chapter depicts ‘signs’ of what could be called ‘almost the midnight hour’ or shortly before the Lord’s return or ‘perilous times’ which means very difficult times! These (today) ‘very difficult times’ certainly are prevalent today and that is not only religiously/spiritually but also ‘physically’. BUT in spite of the conditions of our day, we must not give up or forfeit but continue to press on in **contending for the faith** and keeping ‘our’ eyes fixed upon the Author and Finisher (Captain) of the faith and the high calling in Christ Jesus focused on the ‘eternal goal’ of Heaven and Home. Thus

'we' of the HLIF/MG persevere in 'contending' for the old time Christianity and making no apologies for the same as it will be worth it all. (Jude & Philippians 3).

Regardless IF it 'sports' or **anything else** in your 'Christian life' in-relation to **priorities**; WE each need to recognize not only who we are, but who I am and that is a needy sinner (daily) in need of GOD'S **mercy & grace** **and** that I am a 'sinner' to the very core of my being. "*The heart is deceitful above all things, And desperately wicked; Who can know it?*" Jeremiah 17:9. (Please read also Jeremiah 17:5-8). "*that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts, and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and that you put on the new man which was created ac-*

*ording to God, in true righteousness and holiness"* Ephesians 4:22 - 24. YES I NEED JESUS as my personal Savior every day or else I am LOST! Praise GOD my SINS are under the **blood of the crucified and risen ONE**, lest you and I experience the following: "***But there shall by no means enter it*** (Heaven) ***anything that defiles, or causes an abomination or a lie, but only those who are written in the Lamb's Book of Life***" Revelation 21:27. (Psalm 25). "You will guide me with your counsel, And afterward receive me to glory" Psalm 73:24. NOTICE the person who is **HOLY SPIRIT filled (controlled)** will be ever more sensitive toward SIN. "**But the path of the just is like the shining sun, That shines ever brighter unto the perfect day**" Proverbs 4:18.

## Texas Governor Will Sign "Merry Christmas Bill" Despite Atheist Protest

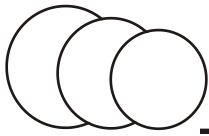

The bill would permit officials like teachers in public schools to say "Merry Christmas" and put up religious symbols, so long as they do not constitute a state preference for one particular religion...

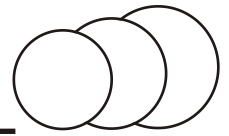

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## Those Who Have False Assurance

Jesus said, (Matt. 7:21-23) *“Not everyone who says to Me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, ‘Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?’ And then I will declare to them, ‘I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!’”*

Notice first of all that this group numbers “many.” “Many will say to me in that day.” How sad that there are “many” that are in the class of those who have false assurance. Is it any wonder that Jesus pleaded, (Matt. 7:13-14) **“Enter by the narrow gate; for wide is the gate and broad is the way that leads to destruction, and there are many who go in by it. Because narrow is the gate and difficult is the way which leads to life, and there are few who find it.”**

What sobering words: “many” and “few”! Many lost and few saved. Surely these words should arrest the attention of every one of us. Could it be possible that anyone reading these lines is in the class of those who have a false assurance?

Notice also that these people with false assurance were even preaching. “Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name?” In other words, “Lord, Lord, did we not preach?” Not only did they preach – they preached in Jesus’ name, yet they were not saved. The name of Jesus was often on their lips. They had the head knowledge to be sure, but not the heart knowledge. Any person with the gift of speech and a normal mind can stand up and talk in religious terms, but that does not prove he is saved. The apostle John warns us to try the spirits because **“many false prophets are gone out into the world”** (1 John 4:1). Remember, Jesus warns us there will be “many” such “workers of iniquity.” One of the signs of the last days is that (Matt. 24:11-12) **“Many false prophets will rise up and deceive many. And because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold.”**

These “false assurance” people were very active in religious work. Their very results helped to deceive them. Even the demons were subject to them. What a feeling of satisfaction must have been theirs when they by Jesus’ name cast out demons. It would have been foolish of the devil not to have been obedient to the demands of these “many” if he could thus deceive them and keep them in false assurance. Satan will do anything to deceive people. Remember, he is known as the deceiver.

This group of “false assurance” people are deceived into believing that they have done “many mighty works.” Their joy evidently was in their own accomplishments. They failed to see that their rejoicing should be in what Jesus had

done rather than in their own works, **“For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast.”** (Eph. 2:8-9).

They could well remember “many mighty works.” How different this is from the attitude of God’s children, who will someday say, **“Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?”** (Matt. 25:27-29).

The “false assurance” group has a horrible ending. Jesus will profess to them, “I never knew you: depart from me, you that work iniquity.” Notice, He did not say, “I knew you when you worked in my name; no, “never knew you.” Any work done for Jesus by anyone who is not His child is worthless, for **“they that are in the flesh cannot please God”** (Rom. 8:8). No one with a false assurance, regardless of what he does in the name of the Lord, can please God. He is a worker of iniquity. He is living in sin. He has refused to walk the way of repentance. He has despised the way of the cross, which is the way of confession and dealing with sin. To all such the Lord has but one answer, “Depart from me.” They deceived themselves with a false assurance; they deceived others with their “mighty works”; but Christ they did not deceive. Therefore they hear the most fearful words that can ever come from our Saviour’s lips, “Depart from me.”

I know of no better way to sum up false assurance than by the answer Jesus gave to the question, **“Then one said to Him, ‘Lord, are there few who are saved?’ And He said to them, ‘Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I say to you, will seek to enter and will not be able. When once the Master of the house has risen up and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and knock at the door, saying, ‘Lord, Lord, open for us,’ and He will answer and say to you, ‘I do not know you, where you are from,’ then you will begin to say, ‘We ate and drank in Your presence and You taught in our streets.’ But He will say, ‘I tell you I do not know you, where you are from. Depart from me, all you workers of iniquity.’”** (Luke 13:23-27).

What a blessing if those with false assurance could wake up before “the master of the house is risen up, and has shut the door.” That day may be very near at hand. It’s important for every one of us to check so we are certain we do not have a false assurance. Let us not forget that the devil is a deceiver and has “many” in this snare. Let us beware lest we take ourselves for granted and eventually be lost.

## Some Principles for Christian Music

The world is now dictating the church's standards for music. The very style of music that appeals to the unregenerate has become increasingly appealing to professing believers and has crept into thousands of churches. The question we must ask is this: How can the very music that moves, energizes and fuels the fleshly appetite of the old nature of the unbeliever edify the believer who is a "new man: and is indwelt by the Holy Spirit of God?"

Believers hear from numerous sources that music is amoral, that the form of style of Christian music is inconsequential and that Christian music does not need to be reverent or respectful. Both "Christian" and secular musicians freely admit that today's "Christ" rock, "Christian" hi-hop, "Christian" metal and contemporary "Christian" music (CCM) is hardly distinguishable from secular rock music in its various forms. The popular "Christian" rock band Audio Adrenaline, when asked to define the difference between secular rock music and "Christian" rock music, answered, "The only difference is the lyrics, and even then, the difference is sometimes subtle." (Pensacola News Journal, 3-1-98). CCM musician Michael Card admitted that the lyrics of Christian rock music are "the only unique, defining characteristic feature of Christian music: and added, "Stylistically, there is nothing that sets it apart (from secular rock music)" (CC magazine, 5-96). How is the faithful, obedient believer to respond to the music that is becoming so prevalent with Christendom today? The church must embrace some Biblical principles concerning true, God-honoring Christian music.

1. The Bible reveals that God's people use music to glorify Him and that those who involve themselves in the act of worshiping God through music are ministering to the Lord (1 Chron. 16:1-43, Psa. 95:1).

2. The Word of God clearly states what the role of music ought to be in the life of the Christian. Music is a means by which believers communicate with God, worship Him (Eph. 5:19) and even teach and admonish one another (Col. 3:16). Thus, it plays a vitally important role in the life of the local church as well as in the personal life of every individual believer. The psalmist wrote, "It is good to sing praises unto our God" (Psa. 147:1). In fact, the entire book of Psalms contains songs written for the purpose of worshipping and communicating with God. Therefore, the music to which God's people listen and in which they participate must be music that honors God, glorifies Him and edifies other believers through instruction and admonition.

3. Because God is not the author of confusion (1 Cor.

14:33) but is the author of "every good gift and every perfect gift" (Jas. 1:17), the music to which believers subject themselves should be orderly and appropriate. The melody should be pleasant and easily discernible. The harmony should create a sound void of tension and discord. The rhythm should be predictable. God-honoring Christian music should always emulate the orderliness of the Creator.

4. While the melody, harmony and rhythm of the music to which believers listen must be orderly and edifying, the words, or lyrics, of the music must be theologically correct and centered on the person and work of the Creator. Any lyrics that focus upon the individual in a self-centered manner or do not agree with the doctrinal truth of Scripture must be rejected as being not only unprofitable but even harmful to the spiritual life and growth of the believer. The child of God must consent to "wholesome words," described in Scripture as "the words of our Lord Jesus Christ: and "the doctrine which is according to Godliness" (1 Tim. 6:3).

5. All music to which the believer listens must be reverential in both word and style. The believer must reject any music lacking a profound attitude of respect and reverence to God, for such music does not fulfill its purpose of honoring and glorifying the Lord. Our Savior is worthy of utmost respect and reverence, and He alone is to receive all honor and praise (Psa. 18:3; Rev. 4:11). Because music is a means by which we honor and glorify Him, all music must be reverential and respectful.

6. The purpose of Christian music is not to entertain the listener or bring glory to the individual participating in the ministry of music. To do so is to distort the very purpose for which music was created and is to be used in the life of the Christian and in the local church. Believers should be changed by the message brought forth through the music, not conformed to the world as a result of it.

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## The Shepherd and the Supply

“*The LORD IS My Shepherd; I Shall Not Want.*” Psalm 23:1

### THE SHEPHERD

The word “shepherd” has in it the thought of rule or authority. Some of the translations of these words are very interesting. Fenton, in his beautiful translation, makes it, “My Lord attends me.” The Arabic is, “The Lord feeds me.” The Vulgate, “The Lord ruleth me.” Adam Clark quotes the Scotch, “The Lord governs me.” Moffatt translates it, “The eternal Lord shepherds me.”

Our Savior is a Shepherd. He is a Provider, A Protector, a Preserver of His sheep. He is a true Shepherd for He never forgets, never fails, never forsakes one of His own. He knows His sheep; He knows their needs and is able to supply them. He understands the dangers that threaten. He became the tenant of a body like ours. He understands us. He was tempted in all points like as were are; He remembers our frame that we are dust; He knows all about your heart-hungers and sorrows. His shepherd heart is moved by our need.

He has a shepherd’s heart pulsating with love; He has a shepherd’s eye that is always upon the whole flock; He has a shepherd’s voice and we hear that voice and know Him; He has a shepherd’s memory, for He calleth His sheep by name; He has a shepherd’s knowledge, for He understands all our needs better than we do ourselves; He has a shepherd’s nearness for He is about us and among us day and night; He has a shepherd’s strength and so is able to keep us; He has a shepherd’s faithfulness so that we may fully trust Him; He has a shepherd’s tenderness, carrying the little ones in His bosom and nourishing life from feebleness to strength.

Probably the most striking word in the whole Psalm is **MY**. It is true that the Lord is A Shepherd, but what a difference it makes to be able to say, He is My Shepherd.” He might be A Shepherd and not be MY Shepherd, but He is mine. This is not the song of the flock. It is the song of the individual sheep in the flock.

What a difference it makes when we can use that pronoun of personal possession – MY! A group of women are gathered around the cradle. In that cradle is a beautiful,

healthy, kicking baby, trying to swallow now its fist, now its foot. All the women are interested, but there is one woman in that group who looks upon that little bundle of life with eyes different from the rest. The other women say, “He is some baby!” But the one woman, with eyes lighted up with the radiance of mother love says, “He is *my* Baby.” When you were a little child you talked about “my toys”; a little later about “my bicycle” still later about “my sweetheart; then about “my wife.” What that personal pronoun means...

### THE SUPPLY

“***ISHALL NOT WANT.***” In the passing of the years the meanings of words change. Today the word “want” means desire, but three hundred years ago when our Bible was translated it meant just what we mean today by the word “lack.” This statement does not mean that I shall have whatever I want, but that I shall have every needful want supplied. What the little girl said might not always be true – “The Lord is my Shepherd, I’ve got all I want.” Sometimes we want things we do not need. No real need will be left unsupplied. One translation puts it, “Therefore can I lack nothing.” According to the Arabic it is, “He will not suffer me to want anything.” Briggs translates it, “I have no want.”

George Henderson puts it this way: “I shall not want rest, for He maketh me to lie down in green pastures; I shall not want refreshment, for He leadeth me beside still waters; I shall not want preservation, for He restoreth my soul; I shall not want guidance, for He leadeth me; I shall not want peace, for I will fear no evil; I shall not want companionship, for Thou art with me; I shall not want comfort, for thy rod and Thy staff they comfort me; I shall not want sustenance, for Thou prepares a table before me; I shall not want joy, for Thou anointest my head with oil; I shall not want anything, for my cup runneth over; I shall not want happiness now, for goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; I shall not want glory hereafter, for I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.”

“I shall not want.” That is an absolute negative. The little boy who was not very much interested in memorizing Psalm Twenty-Three expressed it in our twentieth century slang. He forgot the words, but he had the thought when he said, “The Lord is my Shepherd. I should worry.”

“I shall not want.” Why? Because I have a bank balance? Because I have a good job? Because I have influential friends? I shall not want because the Lord is my Shepherd.

1 Peter 2:16

Our liberty in Christ is not freedom to sin whenever we so choose, but rather freedom from our former bondage to sin. “*Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness*” (Romans 6:18).

Although our nation is rapidly becoming anti-Christian in belief and practice, we Christians can still best serve our nation and our Savior by practicing and proclaiming Christ’s wonderful saving gospel of free salvation from sin and regeneration unto righteousness. HMM

## When You Walk

*When you walk, your steps will not be hampered; when you run, you will not stumble.*"

Proverbs 4:12

The Lord only builds a bridge of faith directly under the feet of a faithful traveler. He never builds the bridge a few steps ahead, for then it would not be one of faith. "We live by faith, not by sight" (2 Cor. 5:7).

Years ago automatic gates were sometimes used on country roads. They would securely block the road as a vehicle approached, and if the traveler stopped before coming to the gate, it would not open. But if the traveler drove straight toward it, the weight of the vehicle would compress the springs below the roadway, and the gate would swing back to let him pass. The vehicle had to keep moving forward, or the gate would remain closed.

This illustrates the way to pass through every barrier that blocks the road of service for God. Whether the barrier is a river, a mountain, or a gate, all a child of Jesus must do is head directly toward it. If it is a river, it will dry up as he comes near it, as long as he still forges ahead. If it is a mountain, it will be removed and "cast into the sea" (Mark 11:23 KJV), providing he approaches it with unflinching confidence.

Is some great barrier blocking your path of service right now? Then head straight for it, in the name of the Lord, and it will no longer be there. – Henry Clay Trumbull

We sit and weep in vain, while the voice of the Almighty tells us to never stop moving upward and onward. Let us advance boldly, whether it is dark and we can barely see the forest in front of us, or it leads us through the mountain pass, where from any vantage point we can only see a few steps ahead.

Press on! And if necessary, like the ancient Israelites, we will find a pillar of clouds and fire to lead the way on our journey through the wilderness. God will provide guides and inns along the road, and we will discover food, clothing, and friends at every stage of our journey.
