We immediately think of our redemption through Jesus Christ. First Peter 1:18-19 "knowing that you were ransom from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot."

Yes, Jesus was the perfect sacrifice and the only way that man could be redeemed by God. As Christians we realize how truly precious the blood of Christ is, and yet how often do we think about that precious blood and what it bought for us? A number of years ago at a Bible conference time was given for testimony and Scripture to be shared. The pastor that was leading the meeting asked for Scripture that spoke about the blood of Christ. I still recall that there were very few that could share. Not that the Christians were not aware of how precious the blood is, but so few had memorized verses on it and I found myself guilty in this respect also. We need to take to memory much more Scripture for our own edification and strength.

Hebrews 9:22 "Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins."

Revelations chapter 5:9 "And they sang a new song saying, worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals; for you were slain and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation."

Just think of every kindred, tongue, people and nation

under the precious blood that was shed for all so that they could belong to the family of God. All who will accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are redeemed by His blood. Acts 20:28 admonished the spiritual leaders to feed the Church of God which He has purchased with His own precious blood.

Forgiveness is also purchased by His blood. Ephesians 1:7: "...in whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace." Not only do we have the forgiveness of our sin in part, but the whole. All the sin debt is paid in full, the past sin, the present sin and the sin that is yet to be committed; even the sins we are not aware of as well as known sin. Now this does not mean that we can live in sin and expect a continual forgiveness - not by any means. Paul asked the question in Romans 6:6 "What shall we do then? Shall we continue in sin so that grace may abound? God forbid! How shall we who have died to sin live any longer in it?" Verse 16, "Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin which leads to death or of obedience which leads to righteousness?" To continue in sin would only prove that we are not truly walking in fellowship with God. For a Christian there is victory over a life of sin when we walk close to Jesus.

Deliverance was also purchased for us. What joy, what peace we experience when Jesus has set us free from a life in spiritual darkness to a life of spiritual life. We experience deliverance from the power of the devil. He may tempt us and at times cause us to fall into sin but then "*if we confess our sins he is faithful and just to forgive us*

Let us also consider the phrase, "for good works."

This new creation of God in Christ is to be transferred to us; we receive it by faith, and it is to be built up in us. The foundation was laid in us when we were born of God. As time goes on, and God's power is made perfect in weakness, God works in us so that we live not after the flesh but after the Spirit. All that a Christian does as the love of Christ constrains him is the work of Christ in us; indeed it is Christ in us.

A Christian becomes a servant of Christ, a channel through which God's power flows, a candlestick which carries God's light of salvation, and an agent for the works before prepared that we should walk in them. All that is done out of such a life with Christ in God is done by God in us. Since it is of God it shall never perish, but follows the Christian into eternity. All else will burn as straw in the day of judgment; only that which is of God shall abide.

Two people can be engaged in identically the same activity; in our eyes their deeds may be exactly the same. Yet the one may be done in and for self and the other done in Christ. The first shall not stand because it is not done in God, while the other shall abide because it is done in God.

"Yea saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors; for their works follow with them." Revelation 14:13.

"And they that are wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever." Daniel 12:3.

The halo of glory which they shall receive who have turned many to righteousness is not the basis of their salvation, but the fruit of a life in God's grace. It <u>seems</u> that there shall also be those in heaven who will not shine with brightness. All who believe in Christ shall be saved, but there shall be a difference in glory according to the faithfulness with which we have served God. We are saved on the basis of Christ's merits; but it is God's will that we shall be obedient servants and present ourselves as an offering to God. As Christ gave Himself completely for us, so ought we to give ourselves wholly to Him; this we should do, not only for salvation, but also for service.

We are created for good works. May no Christian ever forget this.

Then we have the great hope that one day all our work shall be perfect We shall not only be saved by faith in what another has done; we shall one day stand before God with a soul and body that is a perfect work of God. *We shall be like Him.* Even the earth with its myriad forms of life shall whirl through space as a perfect work of God. Every flower and blade of grass shall proclaim the glory of Him who bought us with His blood.

The Christian hope is truly great. All suffering and strife is as nothing compared to the glory that awaits us.

DISTURBING WITH A CONCERN/BURDEN!

"And because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold." (Matthew 24:12)

HOW TRUE THIS WAS IN THE REALITY OF NOAH'S TIME and it is manifesting itself once again!

When I was privileged, and with the responsibility of standing behind the 'sacred-desk' on a regular basis for a long period of time; I would try to (as the Holy Spirit led) tell the flock as an 'under-shepherd' some of the "signs" of the times that would take place before the <u>Rapture</u>.

BUT at that time, I shared it as a 'coming-event'; now it is at our very front-door! I didn't think I would live to see these 'signs' fulfilled and <u>now it is present-tense</u>. *Coming*: "*And then the lawless one will be revealed*." *The coming of the lawless one is according to the working of Satan, with all power, signs, and lying wonders*" 2 Thess. 8a, 9.

To say the least that some of these 'signs' are <u>disturbing</u> <u>with concern (a burden)</u> and I ask myself if it is true in my own life! There is a definite lack of taking seriously God at His Word, even among 'fellow-believers'. Sobering but true; today, there are even numerous good things that hinder actual Christian Fellowship.

There is a difference in translations of God's Holy Word, the BIBLE, but 'iniquity' appears in place of 'lawlessness'. Iniquity (sin) is not always boldly out-front; but hidden to fellow-believers within the 'heart'.

For example: When we are privileged to have a Hauge Bible Conference in a given area; the door of opportunity is 'open'; the Host Congregation is with encouragement making plans for the same: BUT when the actual time comes – the local members of the congregation are absent! Why??? Is there a misunderstanding of what the Hauge Lutheran Innermission Federation intends to be to the local host congregation and community?

We, by the GRACE of God, want to be an encouraging and blessing and nurturing 'ministry' in the Lord's Kingdom Work'! What's wrong? Is it lack of communication/understanding/indifference, complacency or what? How can a person be blest and an 'encourager' by their absence? Don't we really care?

According to God's Word, we are to assemble even more frequently around and under the hearing of God's Word as we see the DAY APPROACHING! (<u>Hebrews</u> <u>10:24-25</u>). Not assembling is direct violation/disobedience of His Command! Now, very likely some of you readers are not going to like what I just exhorted you with; but give me a Bible verse that states otherwise! (God knows our limitations and looks upon our naked heart and motivations) Not taking advantage of the same; does that tell us we are committing the SIN of Omission? Does neglecting the privilege and responsibility show our LOVE for JESUS, His Word and fellow-believers? You know when it comes to assembling/gathering with fellow-believers, it is not only what am I receiving spiritually; but am I also encouraging others?

The 'time' may not be too far in the distant future, there may be a heavy price to do the same! May this 'firm' and yet strong admonition be a warning to the wise who have a caring and loving heart!

Again notice what the 'agape' God says in Malachi 3:16-17: **"Then those who feared** (Ed. A godly 'child-like' fear, out of LOVE) the LORD spoke to one another, And the LORD listened and heard them; So a book of remembrance was written before him For those who fear the LORD And who meditate on His name. 'They shall be Mine,' says the LORD of hosts, 'On the day that I make them My jewels. And I will spare them As a man spares his own son who serves him.'".

I know that the following Bible verses have been fulfilled; but I believe it also is a (even now) coming event/experience: Amos 8:11-12: "'Behold, the days are coming.'Says the LORD GOD, 'That I will send a famine on the land, Not a famine of bread, Nor a thirst for water, But of hearing the words of the LORD. They shall wander from sea to sea, And from north to east; They shall run to and fro, seeking the word of the LORD, but shall not find it.'" God has created us for NEED for Fellowship; first to have fellowship with Him and then also with other fellow-believers!

CASUAL CHRISTIANITY. Today, there is much of 'casual Christianity'. There is much talk about Freedom, but it is a freedom to sin; rather, it should be Freedom to serve our risen Savior and being removed from the Law's Condemnation. Hans Neilsen Hauge stated that we are removed from the Law's condemnation, not compliance to obey it. (See Romans 8:1) There is a FINE LINE between 'legalism' and 'pietism'. The first one states what you have to do, the other states what you do by love in obedience. The Roman Catholic Church (which is not a *Christian church*) is held together by fear, while the Christian church by love!

Since there is a fine-line, how is a believer is to walk in <u>obedience</u> to the Word of God; but not <u>under</u> the Law?

By the way: WHY is it that almost 100% of born-again folk believe we are not too steal, kill or commit adultery; but practice disobedience to the Third Commandment? Where did we get the privilege to pick-and-choose? Yes, the Law that GOD gave through Moses was very good, but it is inadequate to provide SALVATION as James 2:10. Isaiah 64:6, Romans 3:10-20, 6:23, 5:12. Once again let us go back to Matthew 5:17 – where Jesus states that He came to fulfill, but not bring to an end to the Law. WHEN we live and fail the Law, AND God's Law is much more than just the Ten Commandments, then we need Matthew 3:19, which literally express godly repentance. Without repentance there is NO salvation, 1 John 1:7-2-2. Notice the promises in II Chronicles 7:14, as God always keeps His Promises, but not when we become 'casual Christians'. We are to walk as Christ walked – 1 John 2:6: "He who says he abides in Him ought myself also to walk just as He walked."; as we are little "ambassadors", II Cor. 5:14-21. 1 John 2:7-11. How about the very first part of this wonderful and tremendous Hope for our day and country; but when we are indifferent/careless/complacent, it doesn't apply. God says, 'If my people'... II Chron. 7:14.

This is the only real hope for the USA and the world, which is in turmoil. If we are casual in our Christianity, then we are stumbling-blocks (<u>bait</u>) to those we offend. <u>1 Corinthians 8:9-12</u>.

Some believe Jesus came and did away with the Law -

Matt. 5:20. They <u>misunderstand</u> John 1:17. It is clear that Jesus did not abolish it, as He states in Matt 5:17. We cannot ignore the Law just because we are under grace – Rom 6:1-2. But Christ has fulfilled the Law for us – Rom. 8:3-4. With the Holy Spirit in us, we follow His commands *out of love* and let the Light shine through us as we *are* light/salt to a darkened/sinful world.

Among my burdens/concerns is that we so often take Christian Fellowship for granted and that the First Amendment to the great USA Constitution will always be there!

It should touch our hearts more — the news that some of our brothers and sisters in Christ are <u>now</u> being persecuted, tortured, and killed for their love of Jesus.

It has been estimated that more Christians have been killed for their faith during the last one hundred years than in all the other centuries combined since the time of Jesus Christ's Incarnation. One reason is the great expansion of Christianity in the last few centuries – often into places of great unbelief and hostility. Another reason is the rise of militant people and political governments which are anti-Christian.

"Let brotherly love continue. Remember the prisoners as if chained with them – those who are mistreated – since you yourselves are in the body also."

"Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution." Hebrews 13:3, II Timothy 3:12.

God created us with a **need**, both for Himself and fellow-believers. You can try to swim across the Atlantic or Pacific Ocean, or take a boat with fellow passengers.

See John Chapters 14 & 15 and remember how they loved one another.

An Excellent Quote On Dancing

Years ago I was given a booklet which, inside it, had this following excellent quote on the evils of modern dancing.

"For the time past of our life may suffice us to have wrought the will of the Gentiles, when we walked in lasciviousness, lusts, excess of wine, revelings, banquetings, and abominable idolatries." 1 Peter 4:3.

<u>Revellings</u> comes from the Greek root word meaning 'will jumpings,' and <u>banquetings</u> comes from the word meaning 'wild parties.' It is not the typical banquet such as we have in our churches where one eats a meal. What Peter is saying is that salvation saves a man from the lustful pleasures he once enjoyed when his lifestyle centered around the satisfying of bodily appetites, including lusts, sex, liquor, wild parties. The wild jumpings took place similar to modern dancing where the victims shake their torsos at one another connotating sex." Copied.

I wish that we could hear and read more things in this day and age denouncing the evils of the modern dance and how sensual and evil it really is! That verse, 1 Peter 4:3, sounds like the typical dance hall of our day and age!

Do You Have A Family Altar In Your Home?

Richard Baxter was one of England's greatest ministers. In early life, he went into a large parish and a community which was composed almost entirely of rich, cultured people.

He found the congregation cold, and all was not as he had expected it to be in the ministry. He was disappointed and disheartened.

The young pastor determined that the way to save the church and this community would be to establish religion in the homes of the community and to build the family altar. Thus Baxter spent three years in his visitation and in his determination to establish a family altar in every home in that community.

He succeeded amazingly, and this condition in the homes was the fountainhead that filled his church to overflowing and started that magnificent ministry and life.

Fundamentally, religion must involve the family relationship. You cannot even build a church altar that is an attractive center without the family altar. Baxter was right and proved it.

Now I will take you to the opposite side. Thomas Boston was likewise a great minister; but, unlike Baxter, he spent the years of his early ministry in the slums of a city among the poor people. There he discovered the same condition – the church was cold and empty. He had no influence. He was disheartened and discouraged.

He said that the only way to save the church was to save the family; so he went all through that poor community and established family altars where they worshiped God in the home every day of the week. He built up the altars, and he says he spent three years doing it.

Then Thomas Boston's church started to revive, and the community was filled with spiritual power and influence.

Family Altars and Missionaries

One of the noblest missionaries was John G. Paton. No man evidenced more heroism and sacrifice than did that kingly, wonderful soldier of the cross.

Read the biography of this devoted missionary. You will find on the first page the secret of that life of service, the one memory around which all the rest of Paton's ministry centers. That recollection is of his father with his old family Bible twice a day at the family altar, children all around him hearing the message of God, then down on their knees together.

Paton says that in that old home his father's mighty religious influence made him all he was and started his missionary life and work. As you read the rest of his biography, you will find this spiritual influence in operation all through his life.

Henry W. Grady visited Washington, D.C.; and when he went back to Atlanta, Georgia, he wrote an editorial about the Capitol at Washington, described it beautifully and called it "the home of this great nation, the center around which the nation moves."

Some months passed, and he went back to his old home in Athens, Georgia; then when he returned to Atlanta, he wrote another editorial, and in it he said that he made a tremendous blunder when he wrote that first editorial. He said that <u>"the center of this country is not in the</u> <u>United States Capitol</u> – it is in the hovels and in the cottages and in the old farmhouses and in every home in this land in which there is a family altar."

The Christian home is the center of American life from which all the rest of it moves and radiates. And Henry Grady was justified in apologizing for his mistake.

A Precious Heritage

I know two men who lived in a country home in their boyhood, who became rich when they went away from home. They went occasionally to visit their father and mother living in the old home.

Finally the father and mother went to Heaven The sons did not know what to do with their old home. One of them said to the other, "IF you'll sell out your interest to me I'll tear down the house, build a summer home there and let you come out to it when you want to."

Accordingly, they took a trip out to the old homestead to tear it down. Around that spot there swept many sacred memories. Then these two brothers, past middle life and rich, went into the house and looked around through it. One walked up and down in front of the old fireplace, and the other sat down.

Finally one said to the other, "You know, Bob, what I'm thinking about? I've changed my mind since I've been here. We're not going to tear down this old house. This house is going to stand here; it's not going to be torn down."

"That's a strange thing," the other brother said, "for when I was walking up and down in front of the fireplace, that is the same thing I was thinking about."

He looked over to the chair in which his father used to sit. "Here is the old chair that Father sat in when he read the Bible, when we had family worship – the chair around which we knelt as Father lifted his heart to God."

They stayed there two hours to talk things over. They both got down on their knees by the old chair, repented and poured out their hearts to God. They went back saved men and gave their money to God and lived for Him. And the old house stands. Not a single thing was moved out. It was too sacred to touch, because the family altar had stood there.

It is a great thing to go back to the old house. If you cannot go back any way but in memory, go back.

I can make such a journey tonight. I am back there now, on the banks of the Hudson River, in that old farmhouse, in that kitchen, round that great fireplace – father, mother and children, twice a day, the old family Bible and the wonderful prayer lifted to God! I am remembering that old house, that old center, that marvelous influence.

Do not be surprised when I tell you that every one of those children was saved by the grace of God. Four of them became preachers of Jesus Christ; all the rest of them, Sunday school teachers and God's chosen men and women; and they all found that inspiration and life at the family altar when Father opened the Bible and then lifted his heart to God. That is the greatest heritage in this world.

The greatest influence is the influence of Christian blood and life, moral character and spiritual, uplifting power. Now if your old home gave you that, you do not need to have a dollar. My father and mother never left me a dollar, but they left me the greatest riches in the world.

Do we clap for the preacher sharing the Law and the Gospel? The list could go on. "On the contrary, it is much truer that members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary; and those members of the body which we deem less honorable, on these we bestow more abundant honor, and our less presentable members become much more presentably, whereas our more presentable members have no need of it. But God has so composed the body, giving more abundant honor to that member which lacked, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another." 1 Corinthians 12:22-25.

As you are more certainly richly blest by certain individuals in your personal life, take the time and put forth the effort to personally go to that person and thank those for being willing to be <u>vessels</u> in the worship of our Living SAVIOR! RES

An Open Letter To The Leaders Of The ELCA

Dear ELCA Leaders,

I left the Lutheran Church in America, where I had served as a Pastor for 20 years, over false doctrines and unbiblical practices prior to the formation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Along with fellow pastors and laity in the early 1980s, I worked tirelessly to influence the development of the new Lutheran church that eventually came to be called the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (*ELCA*). (Ed. Actually the ELCA left him). Every one of our concerns regarding the absolute authority of Scripture was put off or rejected as outdated theology, as was the removal of an unalterable article in the American Lutheran Church's constitution that stated the Bible is: "<u>the inspired, infallible and</u> <u>inerrant Word of God</u>."

You may think having left your church, I have no right to address any concerns to you, but I still have family members and numerous friends who belong to the ELCA, and I care about their souls and yours.

My remarks here are not the words of an idealistic pastor whose time has come and gone I build what I say on the changeless Word of God, and in the hope that at least some of you wil heed my pleas. Furthermore, by expressing these concerns, I am living up to the ordination vows I made in 1964 to preach and teach the whole counsel of God.

A press release from the ELCA News Service, dated March 14, 2016 stated: "The Conference of Bishops of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is discerning the denomination's future directions and priorities in new process known as "Called Forward Together in Christ.' The conference is an advisory body of the ELCA that includes 65 synod bishops, the presiding bishop and secretary ... The process is designed to invite more than 3.7 million-member ELCA into a discernment about the church's future."

With no ill will intended, I assure you that the ELCA has no future, unless you repent! As Jesus said to the Church in Ephesus, <u>"Therefore remember from where you have fallen, and repent and do the deeds you did at first; or else I am coming to you and will remove your lampstand out of its place – unless you repent"</u> Revelation 2:5).

The aforementioned report went on to address concerns about how the ELCA might become more "inclusive and diverse." From its very inception, the ELCA abandoned the principle of "<u>SCRIPTURE ALONE</u>" in

matters of faith and practice and, instead, opted to make church assemblies a consensus of your assemblies the final authority within your church body.

Interestingly, the March issue of *The Lutheran* was devoted to the theme "All are Welcome." But only a cursory reading of the magazine was required to realize that you are not only advocating that your congregations welcome sinners, but clearly you are advocating that they welcome their sins as well. Welcoming all sinners into our churches is right and proper according to the Scriptures in order that they may come to a knowledge of the truth. Welcoming their sins as acceptable behavior is not, according to the same Scriptures.

Yet you have opened your doors to deviant sexual behaviors that are condemned by the very Scripture you claim to follow. You have chosen to ordain into the gospel ministry homosexuals and transgendered individuals whose sins defy and defile the Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions. For years you have sanctioned and allowed same-sex marriages to be performed in your churches. Furthermore, you tolerate goddess worship, as well as teachers who even deny the substitutionary atonement of Christ and other foundational doctrines of the Bible. This includes the foul-mouthed, tattooed, ELCA pastor who was referenced positively in the March issue of *The Lutheran* and who is often a featured speaker at ELCA youth events.

In your news release, you mentioned the purpose of your latest effort was to plan your future through the influence of your 3.7 million members. Point-in-fact, when you started in 1988, you had 5.2 million members. Your denials and defiance of God's Word, as well as your evil practices that you accepted and embraced, caused over 1.5 million of your members to flee for their spiritual lives, people whose consciences were bound by the Word of God. In addition, you have lost more than 1,500 congregations. Many of those who left were your finest member in their loyalty to Christ and in their stewardship.

In the March issue of *The Lutheran*, there was an article entitled "Sin," by Peter W. Marty. He rightly pointed out, "The Bible does not depict God forgiving mistakes, poor judgment or lapses of one kind or another. God forgives sin. And sin is what keeps us from becoming the people God wants us to be." That is a sound and biblical statement.

But let me tell you this – *You, the leaders of the ELCA, do not get to decide what is and is not a sin!* God alone decides that, and sin is clearly defined in His Word. In the ELCA, sin has become whatever the consensus of the ELCA says it is, or whatever your church assemblies decides it is. Thus, I tell you again – the ELCA has no future until such practices are stopped, repentance is forthcoming, and you walk in obedience to God's inspired, infallible and inerrant Word.

GOD'S WORD DECLARES

"...For You have exalted above all things Your name and Your Word." (Psalm 138:2).

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works." (2 Timothy 3:16-17). "But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving and being deceived. But continue thou in the thing which thou has learned and has been assured of, knowing of whom thou has learned them; And that from a child thou has known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Jesus Christ." "What do You Know?"

(Radio Sermon by Pastor R. Norheim)

When people ask the above question they could be in for a longer session than they asked for. Long before Christ died and rose from the dead, Job said, "I know that my Redeemer liveth, and that He shall stand at the latter day upon the earth." Job 19:25. He didn't know him by His name; his bible was much smaller than ours, but still he knew that the One we call the Lord Jesus Christ was his Redeemer. He also knew that he, and all people, needed a Redeemer, because all were sinners. He did not worship dead idols; His God was alive! By divine inspiration he said more than he knew, namely, that the Redeemer would come to this earth, live here, die and rise again from the dead and live forevermore. Hundreds of year later, when Jesus died and ascended into Paradise, Job could "say it again" - "He lives - He is alive forevermore!" What do you know?

If We Know Him:

(1) We know all things. "But ye have an unction from the Holy One, and ye know all things. 1 John 2:20. Really, we know more than we know we know. We know what I called the <u>"body of truth"</u>, centered in the person of Christ. He did not contradict this when, in Acts 1:7, He said to His disciples, "It is not for you to know the times and seasons the Father has put in His *power*". You see, they knew the One that knew all things. When asked to prove something, we reply that we have the facts in our files; we have all the facts in the person of Christ. "<u>Talk to my attorney</u>!" Christ is the answer!

(2) We know where He is; not only in heaven, but "hereby we know that He abideth in us by the Spirit which He has given us." 1 John 3:24. The ever-living, ever- present Lord Jesus Christ is never absent. "Out for lunch"? – NEVER! Appointments need not be made to speak to Him.

(3) We know who we are. "And we know that we are of God...and we are in Him" 1 John 3:24. We are VIP people – Very important Persons – His children, citizens of heaven; but we don't go there in order to be with Him-not yet.1 John 3:19.

(4) We know where we are. "Seated in heavenly places in Christ Jesus" Ephesians 2:6. Because of the limitations of our earthly bodies we exist on earth, but because of the new birth we were grafted into the "True Vine" (John 15), and we are spiritually living in heavenly places. Nothing unclean enters heaven, we know. But Christ is our holiness, and we are, "in Him", accepted there. We don't need to feel it to know it. It's revealed by the Holy Spirit through the Word, and we know it.

(5) We know we are saved. Many religious people hope they are saved. But God's children know it. "These things have I written unto you who believe on the name of the Son of God, that ye may know that ye have eternal life." 1 John 5:10-13.

(6) We know We Shall Be Like Him. "We know that when He shall appear we shall be like Him..." 1 John 3:1-2. <u>Read 1 Cor. 15:41-57</u>. John the Apostle, who knew the Lord Jesus so well, used the word "know"
42 times in the <u>five</u> chapters he wrote by divine inspiration. Surely we should know! It's all related to, first of all, knowing Christ as our Redeemer and Savior.

Their speech became unintelligible.

Today, I am compelled to write this post out of sheer

frustration at "babbling" of our own culture. Nothing highlights this spirit of confusion and brings it to the surface more than what we are seeing now at this latest chapter in Islamic terrorism, the Orlando tragedy.

All of the fingers of blame are now pointing everywhere except where they should be pointing.

In response to the Orlando tragedy, we see fingers pointed at God, pointed at Islam as a whole, or in the one of the more bizarre accusations from a Planned Parenthood offshoot, *pointed* at a "toxic masculinity and global culture of imperialist homophobia."

And to top it all, an ACLU staff attorney blamed <u>con-</u> <u>servative Christians</u>. Directing his comments to Christians on Sunday, Chase Strangio <u>tweeted</u>: "You know what is gross – your thoughts and prayers and Islamophobia after you created this anti-queer climate."

Then, as with now, confusion ensued. Even prophets pointed fingers and blamed each other for the disaster.

All the false prophets who opposed the prophet of God, Jeremiah, wanted to kill him because his prophecy had come to pass.

Now during this tragic time when so many of our fellow citizens are bereaved, we must earnestly pray for them and offer our deepest condolences. In the midst of their loss, we should pray that they will know God as their Comforter.
